Re DYRELL DENNIS, page 5 of referenced airtel:

On 4/27/68, the writer and SA JOHN J. MARKEY went to the Towne Hotel, 723 North 3rd Street, where it was learned that DYRELL DENNIS had checked out of said hotel at approximately 1:41 p.m., 4/26/68. This information was furnished and substantiated by the following: GRACE BIZNELL, Housekeeper; CLARA PADDEEN, Maid; and CAROLINE STICK, Desk Clerk, all of the Towne Hotel.

Mrs. STICK advised further that DENNIS had checked out on request of the manager of the Towne Hotel, MARGUERITE LARSEN. STICK also advised that DYRELL DENNIS left the hotel with a white male, blond hair, 30s, 6' or better, with a slim build. She stated that DENNIS had paid through 4/29/68 and was given a two day rent refund. STICK made available a letter addressed to DYRELL DENNIS at the Royal Hotel, Milwaukee, which had been forwarded to the Towne Hotel. STICK advised that since DYRELL DENNIS had checked out of the hotel and had furnished no forwarding address, she would make the letter available to us. The envelope was examined and found to contain an envelope addressed to Mrs. DYRELL DENNIS, c/o 1124 8th Avenue, Grafton, Wisconsin. The envelope showed return address of JOSE G. RODRIGUEZ, P. O. Box A-38949, Represa, California, Zip Code 95671. The envelope was postmarked Represa, California, April 17, 1968. Further examination revealed that this envelope contained a letter dated April 15, 1968, signed "Your husband, Jose G. Rodriguez." A Xerox copy of this letter and Xerox copies of said envelopes are attached to this memo.

On the same date the writer contacted TOM LUBENOW, City Desk, Milwaukee Journal, in an effort to obtain information as to the present whereabouts of DYRELL DENNIS. LUBENOW stated that he had seen DENNIS leave the Towne Hotel on the afternoon of 4/26/68, with a white male known to him as RONALD W. JOCIS of 5040 North 41st Street, Telephone 463-5942. He stated that JOCIS was known to him in Sheboygan, Wisconsin, where he, JOCIS, is a former all-state basketball player who has recently tried out for the Chicago Bulls. He stated it was his theory that JOCIS is possibly a pimp for DYRELL DENNIS. LUBENOW also stated he had asked JOCIS where he was taking DENNIS and where he could talk to her and was advised that DENNIS could talk to him only through Attorney LAWRENCE K. GARDNER of 7230 West Capitol Drive (Office), Telephone 463-3000 (Office), and Attorney DICK KUPPER (phonetic). Efforts to contact JOCIS, GARDNER or to identify KUPPER on 4/27/68 were negative.

On the same date CURTIS PAUL, son of DYRELL DENNIS, was contacted at the home of his grandparents, Mr. and Mrs. ROBERT PAUL, 1145 North 12th Street, Telephone 933-8427. PAUL advised that the last he had seen or heard from his mother was on Sunday afternoon, April 21, when he visited with her in her room at the Towne Hotel. He said he had expected to hear from her since then as she told him she was going to get a job and stay in Milwaukee. He stated, however, that he has not heard from or seen her since. He advised he would immediately notify the FBI concerning her whereabouts should he find out.

On the same date Captain FLOYD ENGBRETSON, Special Assignment Squad, Milwaukee PD, advised that he and his squad would do everything within their capabilities to locate DYRELL DENNIS. He stated he had a reference on RONALD JOCIS for issue of worthless checks, and a photograph of JOCIS was available. He stated he and members of his squad would immediately notify the writer should they locate DYRELL DENNIS.

James Earl Ray, a Missouri prison escapee who has been sought under the alias Eric Starvo Galt in connection with the gunshot slaying of civil rights leader Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., is one of the FBI's "Ten Most Wanted Fugitives."

FBI Director J. Edgar Hoover ordered the special addition of Ray to the "Ten Most Wanted Fugitives" list, which already contains ten fugitives, to insure the widest possible dissemination of Ray's photograph and description to help effect his prompt location. Ray has been the subject of a massive search since the gunshot slaying of Dr. King on April 4, 1968, as he stood on the balcony of a Memphis, Tennessee, motel.

An exhaustive FBI fingerprint search, comparing latent fingerprints uncovered in the Dr. King case against fingerprints of over 53,000 persons on whom FBI wanted notices have been posted determined that Galt and Ray are identical.

A Federal warrant, issued at Birmingham, Alabama, on April 17, 1968, charges Ray, under the alias Eric Starvo Galt, with conspiring to interfere with a Constitutional Right of a United States citizen. Ray, who escaped on April 23, 1967, from the Missouri State Penitentiary, is also sought for unlawful interstate flight to avoid confinement after conviction for armed robbery.

Possessing an arrest record dating back to 1949, Ray has been convicted of burglary, armed robbery and forging United States Postal Money Orders.

A 40-year-old white male, reportedly born in Illinois on [redacted] Ray is approximately 5'10" tall, weighs from 163 to 174 pounds, has blue eyes and short brown hair. He has a nervous habit of tugging at an ear lobe and his left ear protrudes noticeably.

Described as a "loner and "drifter," with a "rural" quality in his speech, Ray has worked as a baker, laborer and color matcher. He has taken dancing lessons and completed a course at a school of bartending.

Consider Ray armed and extremely dangerous. Report any information concerning him to the nearest FBI office.

James Earl Ray, a Missouri prison escapee who has been sought under the alias Eric Starvo Galt in connection with the gunshot slaying of civil rights leader Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., has been added to the FBI's list of "Ten Most Wanted Fugitives."

FBI Director J. Edgar Hoover ordered the special addition of Ray to the "Ten Most Wanted Fugitives" list, which already contains ten fugitives, to insure the widest possible dissemination of Ray's photograph and description to help effect his earliest possible location.

Ray has been the subject of a massive and intensive search since the brutal gunshot slaying of Dr. King on April 4, 1968, as he stood on the balcony of a Memphis, Tennessee, motel. One rifle bullet, believed fired from the window of a nearby rooming house, felled the victim.

An exhaustive FBI fingerprint search, comparing latent fingerprints uncovered in the Dr. King case against fingerprints of over 53,000 persons on whom wanted notices have been posted in the FBI's Identification Division, succeeded in determining that Galt and Ray are identical.

A Federal warrant, issued at Birmingham, Alabama, on April 17, 1968, charges Ray, under the alias Eric Starvo Galt, with conspiring to interfere with a Constitutional Right of a United States citizen. Ray is also sought for unlawful interstate flight to avoid confinement after conviction for armed robbery, based on a Federal warrant issued on July 20, 1967, at Jefferson City, Missouri. He had been confined at the Missouri State Penitentiary, Jefferson City, Missouri, in March, 1960, with a 20-year sentence following conviction for armed robbery and operating a motor vehicle without permission of the owner. In September, 1966, while serving the sentence, he was confined for a time in the maximum security ward at the State Hospital, Fulton, Missouri. He was reported missing from the Missouri State Penitentiary since April 23, 1967.

Ray, who has an arrest record dating back to 1949 and has been convicted of burglary, armed robbery and forging United States Postal Money Orders, has also been confined in the Los Angeles County Jail, the Joliet and Pontiac, Illinois, State Prisons and the United States Penitentiary, Leavenworth, Kansas.

He served in the Army between February, 1946, and December, 1948, received a three-month sentence at hard labor for being drunk and breaking arrest and was given a General Discharge due to ineptness and lack of adaptability for military service.

Ray is a 40-year-old white male, reportedly born in Illinois on [REDACTED]. He is approximately 5'10" inches tall, weighs from 163 to 174 pounds, has blue eyes and brown hair which he has worn cut short. He has a small scar on the center of his forehead and a scar on the palm of his right hand. He has been described as having a straight, narrow nose and straight and even teeth and to have a nervous habit of occasionally tugging at an ear lobe. His left ear protrudes noticeably.

Acquaintances describe him as a "loner" and "drifter" whose language and diction reflect a "rural" quality and indicate he has had limited education.

He is reportedly a fan of western and country music, drinks vodka and beer, dresses neatly and claims past employment as a merchant seaman and cook on Mississippi River vessels. He is known to have worked as a baker, laborer and color matcher.

He is known as an avid dancer who has taken dancing lessons. He also completed a course at a school of bartending in the Los Angeles area early in 1968.

Ray should be considered armed and extremely dangerous. Anyone with information concerning this fugitive is requested to immediately contact the nearest office of the FBI, the telephone number of which may be found on the first page of local telephone directories.

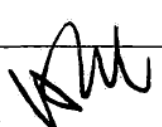

He stated that the numbers "02B-6" and "D2B-6" are not numbers which would appear on tapes of his laundry as the first number would not be "O" and no letter is used at the start of the sequence.

He noted the presence of this machine at his establishment and the location of any other machine in Wisconsin would be known to PETE WUKOVICH, District Sales Manager, Textile Marking Machine Company, Syracuse, New York. He stated WUKOVICH is located at 756 Hawthorne Avenue, Elmhurst, Illinois.

His laundry manager, GEORGE EBBENS, could furnish details as to the marking system used.

On 4/11/68, GEORGE EBBENS, Manager, Gunderson Cleaning and Laundry, 41 Main Street, furnished samples of red tape with numerals and letters from Thermo-Seal marking maching serial # 34227.

He advised that the following system is used for marking laundry. The tape is affixed to garments only when a complete processing, including pressing, is desired. It is affixed to undergarments if those are to be pressed. When a tape is affixed the old tape is removed, if there is still an old tape on the garment. The code used consists of first a LOT NUMBER. This is a one or two digit number appearing first in sequence. The laundry of 10 successive customers is used on one color of tape and then the color of the tape is changed, 10 different colors of tape being used. After the lot number there appears a letter to designate the week. After the letter there is one or more dashes and a one or two digit number to identify the customer, running from 1 to 10. After the number 10 is reached, the customer numbering starts over with a different color of tape being used. Thus a typical number might be 12B-10. He noted the machine has 6 places and that where a one digit number appears instead of two, the other space will appear as a dash (-) or double dash (==). He stated that the numbers or letters used do not always fall in the same place so that the symbol could appear as _9B_6 or 9_B-6_, for example, but that something should appear for each of the six spaces.

He stated that laundry has been returned for customers during the weeking starting 4/8/68 with the letter "B" in the sequence, but that all letters of the alphabet are used so that it would have been 25 weeks since the letter "B" would have been used previously.

He stated that the numeral "O" is never used in front of a one digit number at the start of the sequence and no letter ever appears as the first item in the sequence.

THE CRIMES: Ray escaped from the Missouri State Penitentiary, Jefferson City, Missouri, on April 23, 1967, while serving a 20-year sentence for armed robbery and operating a motor vehicle without the owner's permission. He subsequently allegedly conspired, under the alias Eric Starvo Galt, to violate the civil rights of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., shot to death on the balcony of a Memphis, Tennessee, motel on April 4, 1968.

THE CRIMINAL: A 40-year-old white native of Illinois, who is known as a "loner" and "drifter" and has taken elaborate steps to establish a false identity, Ray has an extensive criminal record, including convictions for burglary, robbery and forging U. S. Postal Money Orders. Outstanding characteristics include a straight narrow nose, straight and even teeth, a noticeably protruding left ear and a nervous habit of tugging at an ear lobe. He has taken dancing lessons, attended bartending school, enrolled in a correspondence course in lock-smithing and traveled widely in a 1966 Mustang recovered in Atlanta, Georgia, a week after Dr. King's murder. Ray likes western and country music, drinks vodka and beer and has worked as a baker, laborer and color matcher.

PROCESS: A Federal warrant issued at Jefferson City, Missouri, on July 20, 1967, charges Ray with unlawful interstate flight to avoid confinement for robbery. Another Federal warrant, issued at Birmingham, Alabama, on April 17, 1968, charges Ray, as Eric Starvo Galt, with conspiring to interfere with a Constitutional Right of a citizen.

King Suspect 'Was Early Rebel

New York, N. Y. —AP— James Earl Ray, suspected assassin of the Rev. Martin Luther King, jr., began his rebellion against authority during a poverty stricken childhood in the midwest and was always known as a troublemaker, an article in the current issue of Life magazine disclosed Sunday.

Ray, alias Eric Starvo Galt, continued his troublemaking career in the army, then turned to a life of small time, usually unsuccessful crime, the article said. Life quoted one of Ray's brothers as saying that if he killed King, it probably was for money.

The article said Ray was absent from school 25 to 30% of the time when a child. Virgil

Oscar Graves, who was principal of the Ewing (Mo.) school Ray attended, was quoted as saying, "He was a rebel. He rebelled against authority and his approach to most of his teacher's was very bad. . . . But he was a sensitive boy. I remember one day he came up to my desk wearing patched overalls and asked whether I thought the other kids would pay attention to his appearance."

Ray, the article said, was the eldest of nine children of George and Lucille Maher Ray. Ray's father died in 1951, probably of alcoholism, Life said, and his mother in 1961. One of his sisters and one brother are dead; two other brothers also have been in jail.

One of these two, Gerald, was quoted as saying Ray knew that if he were recaptured he faced a stiffer prison sentence, even without a murder accusation.

"A deal with a lot of money would have looked pretty good to a man in that circumstance," the brother said. "He sure didn't have any love for colored people, but I know he wouldn't have put himself in a spot like this unless there was something in it for him."

The article said that Ray's military career was spent mostly in Germany and that in 1948 he received a general discharge that cited his "ineptness and lack of adaptability to military service."

In 1949, the article said, Ray went to Los Angeles and began a series of "almost clownish crimes." Ray was caught almost every time he tried a robbery, the magazine said, and did not succeed until 1959 when he and a partner stole \$800 from a grocery store in St. Louis.

Shortly after that success, the article said, Ray tried another holdup which turned out to be typical of his failures. During his escape, the article said, "Ray forgot to shut his car door and fell out as he swerved the car sharply around a corner."

In prison, having been sentenced late in 1959 to 20 years in the Missouri state penitentiary, Ray "distinguished himself only by a series of solitary escape attempts which earned him the nickname, 'the mole.'"

Finally, a year ago, he succeeded in escaping by hiding in a truck from the prison bakery.

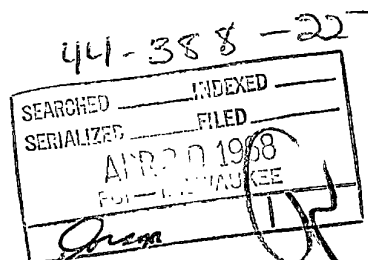

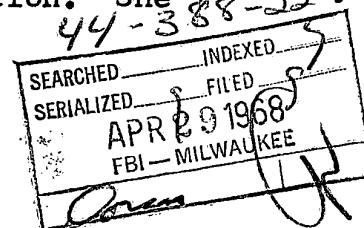

Woman in Hotel Here Quizzed on Ray

A Los Angeles woman now staying in a Milwaukee hotel has been named by a newspaper columnist as James Earl Ray's girl friend.

Louis Lomax, writing for the North American Newspaper Alliance, identified the girl as Jerrie. He said she checked into the Royal hotel, 435 W. Michigan st., under an assumed name.

Ray, an escapee from the Missouri state prison who has also used the name Eric Starvo Galt, has been charged in Tennessee with the murder of Dr. Martin Luther King in Memphis on Apr. 4.

The woman is now at another Milwaukee hotel. A Mil-

waukee Journal reporter, accompanied by an FBI agent and a detective from the special assignment squad of the Milwaukee police department, talked with her there Thursday.

Names Not Known

She said she did not recognize pictures of Ray and had never heard the names James Earl Ray, Eric Starvo Galt or

any of the other aliases Ray has used.

The woman said she was 41, a native of Janesville and had moved to Los Angeles in 1942. She said she had a 17 year old son living with his paternal grandparents in Milwaukee.

FBI offices in Milwaukee, Washington and Los Angeles said they knew about the woman but they refused to comment. Milwaukee police also had no comment.

The woman admitted to having been arrested in San Francisco and other places in California, but would not be specific.

Checked In Apr. 14

Records at the Royal showed that the woman, who Lomax said used the name Jerrie in Los Angeles, checked into the Royal at 1:45 a.m. Apr. 14.

Lomax wrote that he had traced the "mysterious blond" to Milwaukee.

Mrs. Lois Eheler, 2336 W. National av., who works in the Royal coffee shop, said a man who looked like Ray stayed at the hotel at least four days at the beginning of last week. She said she remarked on the likeness of the hotel resident to pictures of Ray published in newspapers.

She said the pictures were published after the man checked out of the hotel. She said she mentioned the likeness at the time to her husband, Herbert, but that he discounted them. She did not notify authorities, Mrs. Eheler said.

Clark Holds to Theory of Single Killer

From Press Dispatches

Atlanta, Ga. - Atty. Gen. Ramsey Clark said Saturday that there was no significant evidence that the assassination of the Rev. Martin Luther King, jr., "goes beyond the single actor" who fired the fatal shot.

Clark made the statement at a news conference here in reply to a question concerning reports of a possible conspiracy of southern businessmen.

The attorney general did not mention by name James Earl Ray, the man sought in connection with the slaying, and did not elaborate on the investigation except to say that he still felt confident that an arrest would be made soon.

"I was hopeful an arrest would be obtained before now," Clark said. "The individual being sought is in a very difficult situation and it will be difficult for him to avoid arrest."

In another development, the FBI said Saturday that a man matching the description of Ray spent Thursday night with a blond woman near Bismarck, N. D.

Mrs. Richard Bushee, an employe at the Modern Frontier motel, said the man looked like pictures of Ray shown her Friday by an FBI agent.

FBI Finds King Home on Ray Map

Los Angeles Times News Service

Washington, D. C. — A map of Atlanta with the areas of the Rev. Martin Luther King's residence and church circled has been linked to accused assassin James Earl Ray by the FBI, it was learned Tuesday.

The Los Angeles Times learned that the map was part of the FBI's evidence in its civil rights conspiracy case against Ray.

The map tends to support a theory by some investigators that Ray stalked King for some time before shooting him.

The areas circled included the Ebenezer Baptist church on Auburn av. in a Negro business area on the eastern edge of downtown Atlanta and the area of King's residence several miles southwest of downtown Atlanta. King and his father, The Rev. Martin Luther King, sr., served as co-pastors of the church.

Ray has been the object of a nationwide manhunt since Apr. 17 when the FBI charged him — in a complaint listing him under the alias of Eric Starvo Galt — with conspiring to violate King's civil

rights. Memphis police followed up with a murder charge.

How the FBI obtained the Atlanta map with its markings is not known. It apparently was either left by Ray as he fled the murder scene or was found in a car he abandoned in Atlanta.

Search in Australia

Canberra, Australia —AP— Australian police are making a nationwide search for James Earl Ray, wanted in the United States on a charge of killing the Rev. Martin Luther King, jr.

Police officials said the FBI cabled that it had information indicating that Ray might have fled to Australia.

Australian police have also begun an intensive examination of all entry documents filed at points of entry since King's assassination, but officers say nothing positive has turned up yet.
