





Thirty-four of the money orders stolen from the felleralise, illinois foot office were found hidden under the dash above the glove compartment in this automobile. All of them had been stamped with the validating stamp. Some were made out ready for eaching while others were not.

On March Ch. 1955 Rice executed a statement for costal inspectors in which he addition he had progared, forged and uttored the postal money order presented to the Chairee Office Supply Company in Tangas City. He schitted preparing the same, order which was attered on forgad endorgement at askin's alothing Generally, . ansar lity, Missouri. He solutions that he mud prepared the ince of the money orders made ready for cashing and which were found in the automobile in which he was arrested. He admitted eaching numerous other noney orders on forged andorsements in the states of Florida, .ouisiena, /rkaneas, and Fiscouri. We recalled unsuccessfully attempting to each the money order at Alto, Illinois on March 4, 1955. In his statement he admits that he purchased in Cuincy, Illineis the stolen mency orders. They were cold to him by an unidentified men for \$20. On March 21, 1955 Ray, deali ing to execute statement for postal inspectors, did verbally state that he had participated with 'd o in the cashing of the stolen money orders in the various status. He defined actually knowing that the money orders were stolen. However, he shalltedly presented that they were for he had been told by Rife that they had been purchased for 123. He admitted that it was be who forged and uttered the sonry order presented it Askin's Flothing Company in Kausas City, Hissouri. He stated that he curchered for 'l in St. Louis, Missouri from a "Wino" named Willerd J. McBride the identification he and Rife used in uttering the money orders.

The two accept orders attered by Rife and Ray in Farsas City, Plescuri and as well the money order Rife attempted to utter in Alton, Illinois have been recovered. As noted previously thirty-four of the enemy orders were recovered in the automobile. On April 15, 1955 when reinterviewed by postal inspectors Rife and Ray gave particulars relating to the cashing of twenty-seven additional stolen money orders located by the Regional Accounting Office. The particulars are as set out in the following table:

Two of the stolen money orders have not you been recovered. They, houses, are cocounted for as Ray has admitted eaching one of them at a luggage store in famous City, Kansas and Rife admits cashing one of them of High Beach, Florida.

It is pertinent to note that following the apprehension of Rice and Ray postal inspectors obtained from the ream which they eccupied a quantity of merchandica they had acquired by passing the stolen memby orders. Found in their ream wave a typewriter, several pieces of luggage, a radio, a camera, a wristratch, a considerable quantity of now wearing appared for man, and other items. They have authorized the postal inspectors to return this merchandies to the stores or individuals from them it was obtained.

VI. RELICION:

Defendent demiss any effiliation. His nother was Cathelia, and his father was Protestent. While in military service he infrequently attended Cathelia corriers.

VII. INTERESTS AND ACTIVITIES:

VIII. HEALTH:

Defendent is 5° 10%" tell, weight 170 lbs., has a ruldy complemen, blue eyes, and brown hair. There are no apparent marks or scars of identification. Es apparently is in good health. As states that before becoming involved in the instant offense he was in the process of potitioning for admittance to a Veterans Hospital in Illinois for a general physical chackup. He denies a bistory of ourgery other than a tempillactory in Chicago in 1952. He denies a history of veneral discass or the use of nevertles. He states that he is a "mederale drinker."

IX. EMPLOYMENT AND MILITARY HISTORY

Defendant states that at Alten, Illinois on February 19, 1966 he emlisted in the U.S. Army. He resolved his basic training at Comp Cramber, Miscouri. He was then transferred to Comp Kilmer, Now Jersey to await transportation to the European Theater of Operations. He states that he left the centimental limits of the United States for Commany in July of 1966. Gverseas he was attached to the 382nd Military Police Battalion. He admits that he was once ANOL for a period of two days which resulted in a suspended centeres to confinement for period of sixty days. He returned to the United States from Commany in Describer of 1968 and was, he states, on Describer 23, 1968 given a general discharge under honorable conditions.

Defendent states that his last employment was with an uncle when he refuses to identify but who resides in Guincy, Illinois. He worked for this uncle as a painter for a period of time in the cummer of 195h.

He claims that from August 1951 to May 1952 he was employed by the Berg Erichcon Corporation, Chicago, Illinois. This employeems was terminated then he was arrested for robberg, which eventually resulted in a positiontiary contents.

He states that from July of 1950 to June 1951 he was employed by the Arbey Corporation, Chicago, Illinois. He was discharged from this employment for absentecism caused by his arrest in Alton, Illinois for vagrancy then visiting in that city.

He claims that from April 1950 to July of 1950 he was employed as a laborer of a wage of 90% per hour by the Hee Produce Company, Chicago, Illinois. Es claims to have left this employment to accept more lugrative employment.

From July 19h9 to September 19h9 defemient states he was employed as a laborer at a wage of \$1.10 per hour by the Dayden Rubber Company, Chicago, Illinois. He quit this job to move to California.

He purports that from May 19hh to December of 19h5 he was employed at a wage of 65¢ per hour by the International Shoe Company, Hartford, Illinois. He indicates he was laid off by this employer in a general reduction of forces and that he then entered the exage.

XI. SUNDARY:

This defendant, white male, age 27, no dependents, has entered a plea of guilty to an Information in one count which charges that he at Kensas City, Missouri -

on or about March 21, 1955 forged a stolen U. S. Fostel Money Order. This woney order was one of sixty-six such orders stolen in a burglary of the J. S. Fost Office, Kellerville, Illinois on March 7, 1955. Deferment explaintently deales the burglary of the post office. He states that his empenion in the instant offense, Walter T. Hife, when he not at a bar in Quincy, Illinois suggested that he accompany Hife and each the money orders which Rife rejertiely had purchased from an unknown person. Defendent states that he purchased for 11 the identification he and Hife weed in uttering these stolen orders in various states. When arrested for the instant offense defendant was in presenting of thirty-four mency orders which had been stelen from the Mellerville, Illinois Post Office. He simils the forgery and uttering of fourteen mency orders. His companion, Hife, has admitted the forgery and uttering or attempting to utter eighteen of the stelen mency orders.

Approximately one year before becoming involved in the instant offices defendant was released from service of a sentence of one to two years for armed rebory in the Illinois State Ponitentiary. In August of 195h he burglarised a cleaning establishment in East Alten, Illinois. Although he admittelly was charged with burglary he apparently has never been before the appropriate court and apparently is not presently wanted on this charge. In 1969 in Les Angeles, California he was convicted of burglary and sen most to light names in the county jail. After serving nines, days of this as sense he was released on probables for a period of two years.

Defondant shows absolutely no removes at this time. He embicipates receiving a substantial sentence for the inquent offence. In unitarie epinion he is a confirmed criminal and a menace to section when in the free world.
