On 4/23/68 Mrs. SCHOOLEY advised SA RICHARD B. KELLOGG that she had not seen the individual she had in mind since 4/19/68. She said, however, they changed films on 4/21/68 and she would be alert to this man's presence there and arrange to get a license number or something by which to identify him. She said the film would change again on 4/26/68 and about every five days after that. Mrs. SCHOOLEY said she believed this man to be a recent arrival in Florida as he wore shorts and did not have a proper tan for a Floridian. On the two occasions she saw him he was by himself and purchased food for only one person. She said the first time he looked a little "sloppy" and the next time was more neat. She believed him to be about 5'11" tall, medium build, with light brown hair. She recalled no lack of symetry in his ears and paid no particular attention to his nose. JAMES HARVEY WHITE was interviewed at his place of employment, Lauderdale Harbors Barber Shop, 1650 S. E. 10th Terrace. He was advised of his rights by SA ROGER B. COLTON as shown on an unexecuted warning and waiver form. He was advised that the purpose of the interview concerned his attempt to join Klavern #6 of the United Klans of America, Inc., Ft. Lauderdale, Florida, and a statement reportedly made by him inquiring how much money the Klavern would pay to have MARTIN LUTHER KING killed.

WHITE stated he would furnish any information and desired to cooperate fully since he had nothing to hide whatsoever, consequently, he advised as follows:

About a year and a half ago, perhaps sometime in September, 1966, he became quite concerned about the racial situation in Ft. Lauderdale, Florida, and was upset regarding the racial integration of schools in Ft. Lauderdale and the effect thereof on his daughter.

He expressed an interest in joining the Ku Klux Klan of Ft. Lauderdale and through a nursery man, DAN ZBIN, he believes that he submitted written application for membership. Subsequent to submission of his application he was contacted telephonically by an unknown person concerning his application.

He was not recontacted concerning the Klan and was not accepted for membership. As far as he knows, the Klan would not accept him and did not want him as a member. He advised that the reason for his rejection was probably because he is an alcoholic. He admitted that he has been an alcoholic for quite awhile and is attempting to "stay on the wagon," however, he has not been able to completely conquer this problem.

He does not recall making any inquiry of anyone regarding how much the Klavern would pay to kill MARTIN LUTHER KING. He advised that he may have made derogatory

statements concerning KING during this period of time, however, he denied saying that he would ever kill KING or wanted to know how much would be paid for killing KING.

He advised that his statements must have been misconstrued or taken out of context.

He advised that on April 4, 1968, he was working at the Lauderdale Harbors Barber Shop and denied being in Memphis, Tennessee.

He further denied he had anything whatsoever to do with the killing of Doctor KING or being involved as a conspirator. He stated that his presence in Ft. Lauderdale on April 4, could be verified through his employer, JIMMY COSTOS, and co-worker, NORMA FREEMAN.

He reiterated that he had made application to join the Klan in Ft. Lauderdale but denied that he ever inquired of the Klan how much money they would pay to kill KING.

She stated that a co-worker there resembles JAMES EARL RAY, in her opinion. She advised she has been working at this location for about three weeks, and that the male employee referred to above was working there when whe started. However, she has gotten the impression that he is a new employee. He is employed on the same shift as she, 3PM--11PM.

GOODMAN advised that Police Department ID cards and health cards are required of employees working at this location, but, thus far, she has not had to show her ID card to her employers.

She stated that person resembling RAY goes by the name WILLIAM O' BRIAN. He is in his late 30's, a white, male, about 5'4", 140 lbs., dark hair. She stated he speaks with a kind of "brogue", which is perhaps a Northern accent. She did not feel he spoke as though he came from the XK "country". He has mentioned to her his home is Niagra, NY, and has spoken to her of Canada.

An About Face On King Suspect

ASBURY PARK, N.J. —
(AP) — Asbury Park police said — and then denied — today they received an FBI report saying James Earl Ray, charged with the slaying of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr., might be in New Jersey and associating with hippies.

Deputy Police Chief Thomas Flanagan told an Associated Press newsman, "The FBI has information he (Ray) may have settled in New Jersey. He may be associating with hippies."

Later Flanagan denied to the same AP newsman he ever made those remarks. In the interim an FBI official reported he had talked with Flanagan. Another officer had given other newsmen similar accounts of the FBI flyer before Flanagan was reached first.

Allen Warren, reporter for the Asbury Park Press, said he learned of the flyer on a routine check of police headquarters.


He said he was flipping through "wanted" posters when he noted an alert underlined in red which said: "The FBI has reason to believe that James Earl Ray is associating with hippies in New Jersey."

Warren said when he went back an hour later the alert had been ripped from the bottom of the poster.

Flanagan said his department received a standard flyer Tuesday from the Washington office of the FBI on Ray, including the latest photos.

R. W. Bachman, special agent in charge of the FBI in New Jersey, said in Newark he had no knowledge that Ray was in the state. Bachman said he did not know of the flyer.






