Referenced telephone call requested interview he had with REESE GAULT, 9395 S. W. 168th Street, Perrine, Florida, to determine if he was possibly related to an ERIC STARVO GALT.

On April 15, 1968, inquiry in the meighborhood of 9395 S. W. 168th Street, revealed that GAULTs no longer resided at this address and pretext neighborhood inquiry developed no information as to their possible whereabouts.

On April 17, 1968, inquiry at the U. S. Post Office, Perrine, Florida, revealed that REESE GAULT and wife had moved to 7475 S. W. 167th Street, Perrine, Florida.

GAULTS were located and interviewed on April 17, 1967, at which time Mr. and Mrs. REESE GAULT said they did not know anyone by the name of ERIC STARVO GALT and had no relatives by this name. (Case Agent was telephonically advised of results of interview).

Other Offices receiving copies of this airtel were not furnished rerep and so the following background information is being set forth to assist these Offices in conducting the requested investigation:

Investigation has determined that the subject, using the name of ERIC GALT, left Los Angeles, Calif., on 12/15/67, driving his Mustang automobile, in the company of CHARLES J. STEIN, of Los Angeles. STEIN had formerly been a resident of New Orleans and the alleged purpose of this trip was for STEIN to pick up two children of his sister's who were residing in New Orleans and return them to California. According to STEIN, they arrived in New Orleans on 12/17/67 and left New Orleans on 12/19/67. STEIN stayed with relatives and investigation has determined that subject registered at the Provincial Motel, 1024 Chartres Street, New Orleans, on 12/17/67 as ERIC S. GALT and was assigned room 126. The registration card indicated GALT's automobile to be a Mustang bearing Alabama license 1-38993 and his address as 2608 Highland Avenue, Birmingham, Ala. The subject, as GALT, stayed at the motel until 12/19/67 when he checked out.

Interviews of motel employees in regards to the subject have been negative in that they cannot recall him.

There is set forth under a caption for each Office the identity or identities of persons staying at the Provincial Motel from 12/17 through 19/67. The identities of these persons were obtained from the motel registration cards as well as other information which is set forth under the name. The date listed under each name is the date the individual or individuals stayed at the motel. Each Office should locate and interview these individuals for any knowledge or contact they may have had with the subject. Various photographs of JAMES EARL RAY, which have been furnished to all Offices, should be displayed to these individuals to ascertain if they recall RAY.

In order to assist Memphis, the Office of Origin in this matter, each Office should set forth the results of this investigation in report form with copies of the reports designated for the Bureau and Memphis.

In the preparation of these reports, it is suggested that an appropriate predication for this part of the investigation be utilized in the details prior to reporting the results of contacts with these individuals. As an example, the following information might be used for this predication:

Information was Received from the New Orleans Office of the FBI that (insert name and address of person) had registered on (insert date) at the Provincial Motel, 1024 Chartres Street, New Orleans, Louisiana.

Of course, if any pertinent information is developed as a result of these contacts, this information should be brought to the attention of the Bureau and Memphis by the most expiditious means.

Each Office is reminded that previous Bureau instructions are that leads in captioned matter should be covered within 24 hours.

A photograph of JAMES EARL RAY was exhibited to Mrs. BUTTE and she stated that SHIELDS positively was not RAY and that he did not resemble him.

On 5/10/68, EARL B. SHIELDS telephonically contacted the Boston FBI Office and said that he could be reached at 110 Squantum St., Milton, Mass.

SHIELDS was interviewed on 5/10/68 and advised the following:

He said that he left Pompano Beach, Florida, on 4/2/68 and that he is an electrician. He travelled to Chattanooga, Tennessee, with a fellow worker, EARL HARE, Pompano Beach, Florida, to secure a job with the TVA. He arrived at Chattanooga the same night. Union Hall told him there was no immediate work. He left Chattanooga, Tennessee, on 4/3/68 and went to Hamilton, Ohio, and checked into the Country Club Motel on Route 4 on 4/3/68. He secured worth through the Union with Armco Steel Corp., Middletown, Ohio, where he worked for about two weeks.

SHIELDS is staying at the residence of his brother, 110 Squantum Road, Milton, Mass., before departing for New York City, N.Y., to seek employment.

Result of examination:

It was concluded that the hand printing on Q2 was prepared by the writer of Ql, previously submitted in this case.

Although some hand printing differences were noted in the questioned hand printing on Q1 and Q2, a definite conclusion could not be reached whether this hand printing was prepared by JAMES EARL RAY, FBI#405942G, because of insufficient comparable material and the presence of distortion in the hand printing on Q1 and Q2.

Q2 has been photographed and is being returned to Miami separately.

Synopsis:

On 5/6/68 the "Miami News" made available an unsigned U. S. postcard addressed to the "News" and received in the U. S. Mail. The writer of this card, who claimed to have six months to live, stated he was the individual who had shot Rev. KING, and he was leaving Miami to kill AMERNATHY before the latter got to Washington. The anonymous writer claimed that he would then "get BROWN and POWELL". FBI Laboratory advised anonymous writer of this card was identical to the author of a postcard mailed to the "Miami News" on or about 4/23/68. The postcard of 4/23/68 made similar threats. No latent fingerprints were found on the second postcard. No conclusion could be reached as to whether or not the hand printing in the cards was identical with one suspect in this matter.

On May 6, 1968, Mrs. MYRTLE RATNER, Secretary, Office of the Editor, "Miami Daily News", Miami, Florida, made available to SA MORRIS W. HADDOCK an unsigned US postcard, not postmarked, but reported by her to have been received in the US mail that worning by City Editor HOWARD KLEINBERG. Mr. KLEINBERG turned the card over to Mrs. RATNER. This card was addressed to the "Editor, Miami News, Miami, Florida" and read as follows:

"As I said before I have less than 6 months to live and will do America a favor.

"I shot Rev King now I will leave Miami to kill Abernathy before he gets to Washington, Then I'll get Brown and Powell.

"Good luck F.B.I."

This second postcard was submitted to the FBI Laboratory for examination. It is noted that a similar postcard was received by the "Miami News", mailed at Miami, Florida, on or about April 23, 1968.

On May 10, 1968, the FBI Laboratory concluded that the hand printing found on the second postcard was prepared by the writer of the postcard received by the "News" on or about April 23, 1968. The FBI Laboratory additionally advised that a definite conclusion could not be reached whether the hand printing found in both cards was prepared by JAMES EARL RAY, FBI #405 942 G, because of insufficient comparable material and the presence of distortion in the hand printing on both cards.

On May 10, 1968, the Identification Division, Latent Fingerprint Section, advised that they were unable to find any latent impressions on the second postcard submitted by the Miami Division.

Chief Engineer PAUL RAINVILLE advised he did go into the Golden Earring Lounge in Jacksonville, Florida, on two nights around the first of May, 1968. The first night he was accompanied by his wife and the second night he was accompanied by the Third Mate of this ship, HARRY BINGHAM. RAINVILLE advised he was not in the Golden Earring at any other time and did not drink in that lounge with anyone other than the above two people. RAINVILLE viewed a photograph of JAMES RAY and advised he had never known anyone who looked similar to the photograph or the accompanying description of RAY.

HARRY BINGHAM, Third Mate, was interviewed and was observed to have a physical description quite dissimilar to that of JAMES RAY. BINGHAM viewed the photograph and description of RAY and stated he knew of no one similar to RAY.

Captain PETE McGUIRE viewed a wanted flyer for JAMES RAY and advised he was certain there were no personnel on his ship who were in any way similar to RAY.

Armed and Dangerous

On April 24, 1968, the Tampa Office of the FBI advised that DAVID O. CONGER, III, of North Largo, Florida, had furnished information to the effect that on April 8, 1968, he had flown from Miami, Florida, to St. Croix, Virgin Islands. He flew on Pan American Airways (PAA) Flight 429 and believes he saw a person identical to JAMES EARL RAY sitting in Seat 7F or Seat 9F.

The following investigation was conducted at Miami, Florida, by SA DAVID N. JELLISON at PAA, Miami International Airport, Miami, Florida, from April 25 to April 29, 1968:

FRANK WARFIELD, Assistant Passenger Manager, PAA, advised his records indicate that Seat 7F on Flight 429 from Miami to St. Croix, Virgin Islands, was occupied by CARL NULL on April 8, 1968. WARFIELD further advised that it would take approximately two or three days to determine where NULL was residing at the time he made his reservation. Seat 9F on this flight was not occupied.

On April 29, 1968, FRANK WARFIELD advised that CARL NULL left as a contact point telephone number 933-5561 at Pompano Beach, Florida, which number is listed to Adapt-O-Core Precast Co.

The following investigation was conducted by SA ROGER B. COLTON at Pompano Beach, Florida, on April 29, 1968:

Mr. LAWRENCE FITZSIMONS, Personnel Manager, Adapt-O-Core Company, Pompano Beach, Florida, advised that CARL T. NULL was employed on a job in Pompano Beach, Florida, on April 4 and April 5, 1968, from 7 a.m. to 5:30 p.m.

FITZSIMONS described NULL as a white male, 6' tall, slender build, who has two fingers missing on one hand and one finger missing on the other as a result of a 1963 accident. He stated that there was a possibility that NULL resembled JAMES EARL RAY, however, he positively stated that NULL is not identical to JAMES EARL RAY.

On April 20, 1968, the Milwaukee Office of the FBI advised that Mr. DANIEL S. KELLY telephonically furnished the following information to the Milwaukee FBI Office:

Mr. KELLY stated he and his wife had recently returned from a vacation in Florida. They stayed at the Sun Castle Club, 1380 South Ocean Boulevard, Pompano, Florida, which Mr. KELLY stated was operated by an ERNEST CASTLE.

Mr. KELLY stated after seeing photographs of JAMES EARL RAY that a bellboy at the Sun Castle Club closely resembled RAY both in looks and general description. He stated that this bellboy's name was EARL and that he had told people at the club he was leaving to work as an electrician in Tennessee.

The following investigation was conducted by SA EUGENE L. PAYNE at Pompano Beach, Florida from April 23, 1968, to April 29, 1968:

HERB BLONSTRUM, Assistant Manager, Sun Castle Motel, 1380 South Ocean Boulevard, Pompano Beach, Florida, advised that the individual named EARL was probably EARL B. SHIELDS of 15 Almond Drive, Randolph, Massachusetts. His Social Security Number was listed as 014-22-9081.

After an exhaustive search for pertinent records, BLONSTRUM determined SHIELDS was employed from March 28, 1968, to April 1, 1968, as a bellboy. He remembered that SHIELDS mentioned going to Tennessee but could not remember the name of the city.

BLONSTRUM was unable to locate the employment application for SHIELDS and admitted his records were extremely disorganized. His motel has highly transient help and in fact the supervisor of SHIELDS had since departed.

BLONSTRUM viewed a photograph of JAMES EARL RAY and said he did not believe this photograph was identical

with SHIELDS. He indicated SHIELDS has more shallow checks and a wider nose.

Credit and criminal checks at Pompano Beach and Ft. Lauderdale, Florida, regarding SHIELDS met with negative results.
