On April 24, 1968, the San Francisco Office of the FBI advised that they had received information to the effect that witnesses at Douglas, Georgia believed JAMES EARL RAY hitchhiked through Douglas, Georgia on April 20, 1968.

He allegedly stayed overnight at the Ivy Manor Hotel using the name WILLIAM R. STEKLY and gave his address as Lupin Lane, Carmel Valley, California.

His parents were contacted by the San Francisco Office and they advised their son WILLIAM RAYMOND STEKLY was currently employed at the Boca Raton Hotel Club, Boca Raton, Florida and furnished a photograph of their son.

The following investigation was conducted at Boca Raton, Florida by SA ROBERT SCHACHNER on April 24, 1968:

Mrs. NAOMI CAMPBALL, Personnel Director, Boca Raton Club and Hotel, advised her records reflect WILLIAM RAYMOND STEKLY went to work for the hotel April 3, 1968, as a houseman. He worked until April 19, 1968, when he left, leaving a forwarding address of, in care of WANDA JEAN STEKLY, Lupin Lane, Carmel Valley, California, a sister. She advised his supervisor was Mrs. HILDA FENNEY. She stated he is described as a white male, born February 12, 1944, 5'11" tall, 182 pounds, brown hair and brown eyes. His Social Security Number is 563-60-7964.

Mrs. HILDA FEENEY, Supervisor, Boca Raton Club, advised after viewing a photograph of RAY, that STEKLY was not similar in appearance to RAY. She stated STEKLY was definitely at the Boca Raton Club and working for her on April 3, 4, 5, 1968, and through April 19, 1968, when he left to return to California.

She advised she met JOSEPH LUNCEFORD in Clinton, North Carolina, about the last week in March, 1968. She stated since that time she has been with LUNCEFORD every day both in Clinton, North Carolina and in Boca Raton, Florida. She advised they came to Florida together and plan on getting married when she is divorced from her separated husband. She advised LUNCEFORD was definitely in Clinton, North Carolina, with her on April 3, 4, 5, 1968.

She advised LUNCEFORD is working at the Palms Gulf Station.

JOSEPH LUNCEFORD was located at the Palms Gulf Station and eliminated as being subject by fingerprint comparison.

On April 19, 1968, the Jacksonville Office advised that North Carolina Highway Patrol Trooper HARRY L. MARY ELLIOTT, Tilford Flying Service, Palm Beach International Airport, West Palm Beach, Florida, advised persons identifying themselves as JOHN C. PRICE, JR., and his wife, MARY PRICE, arrived at that airport during the late afternoon of April 5, 1968, in a private Beechcraft Debonair, Number 653V, from Memphis, Tennessee, en route to the Bahamas. They returned from the Bahamas during the afternoon of April 8, 1968, intending to return to Memphis that date, but learned the Memphis airport was closed. They did depart West Palm Beach in the above aircraft, which Mr. PRICE was piloting, to go on towards Memphis, but did not file a flight plan, which is not required, so their exact immediate destination was not known.

Mrs. ELLIOTT said PRICE was using a credit card in the name of J. CARY PRICE, JR., Post Office Box 11243, Memphis, Tennessee, which is the address of Argromauts, Inc., Memphis. She described Mr. PRICE as about 40 years of age, 5'10" tall, 185 pounds, with a fair complexion and brown or sandy-colored hair. She said his hairline was somewhat receded and thinner in front than in back, making it appear somewhat sandy in front and more brown in back. The hair was combed straight back. He is built wider in the hips than in the shoulders, and appeared to be slightly knock kneed and had a slight paunch. Mrs. PRICE was described as about 27 years of age, 5'8" tall, 145 pounds, with brown hair. Mrs. ELLIOTT noted neither Mr. nor Mrs. PRICE were wearing wedding rings.

Mrs. ELLIOTT said when Mr. PRICE first arrived at the terminal in West Palm Beach and she learned he was from Memphis, she mentioned what a nasty thing the killing of MARTIN LUTHER KING was. PRICE took an attitude of no remorse about this, and indicated KING got just what he deserved; that he was just making things bad in Memphis, and that was the reason they got out of Memphis for a while. Mrs. ELLIOTT then said she would not want to shoot anyone or have anyone shoot her, and no response was made to this, but Mrs. PRICE gave her a very "dirty look." On learning on his return trip that the Memphis airport was closed, apparently because of the KING matter, Mr. PRICE again voiced disgust, indicating

KING was the fault of this, and such actions following the death of KING are not justified.

Mrs. ELLIOTT said after she first saw PRICE, she observed in a local newspaper an artist's conception of the person who killed KING, which drawing she believed was attributed to a newspaper in Memphis. When she saw this drawing she was struck by the resemblance with PRICE. She said a combination of all these things made her believe the matter should be reported for what it was worth.

He is not currently employed and has not been employed since he resigned his position with the Hartford Insurance Group with whom he worked as an insurance adjustor from October, 1966, through April, 1967.

ROOD broke a rib shortly following his resignation and was "laid up" for four weeks. He then became involved in marital difficulties with his wife, RITA NOE ROOD from whom he separated in July, 1967, and who divorced him in August, 1967. Following his divoce he was unable to find a suitable position and remained unemployed until December 1, 1967, when he entered the Veterans Administration Hospital on Montrose, New York. He was treated at the hospital for his general physical run down condition and for his condition due to a nervous disorder. He was released from the hospital on January 3, 1968. He straightened up his personal affairs in New York State, including the sale of his former residence at 7 Jervin Drive, Stony Point, New York, and he came to Vero Beach, Florida, at the end of January to reside with his mother and stepfather.

He has resided with his mother and stepfather since the end of January, 1968, and has taken motrips out of Vero Beach, which have lasted more than one day.

ROOD advised that he had not been outside the State of Florida, since the end of January, 1968. He did not recall his activities on March 29 and 30, 1968, but he did recall that on April 4, 1968; he slept until

On April 12, 1968, Mrs. MARGARET SARGENT, ROOD's mother, and Mr. MURRAY SARGENT, ROOD's stepfather, both of whom reside at 1827 South U. S. 1, Vero Beach, Florida, were interviewed separately. Each advised that THOMAS ROOD had spent every night at the above residence since he first came to live with them in late January, 1968. They recalled that he had slept late on the morning of April 4, 1968, and that he had eaten dinner with them on the evening of April 4, 1968. They also recalled that he had spent the evening of April 4, 1968, watching television in his room.

On April 15, 1968, Mrs. BETTY ROGERS, Librarian, Vero Beach Public Lib ary, advised that she is acquainted with THOMAS ROOD. She stated that in recent weeks he has frequently visited the library. She advised that she does not recall whether or not he was in the library on April 4, 1968. She stated that he did not withdraw any books on April 4, 1968, but that he frequently came to the library without withdrawing books.

She further advised that it was very possible that he may have been at the library on the day in question.

On April 15, 1968, JACK O'HARE, Manager, O'Hare's Office Machine Store, 1422 20th Street, Vero Beach, Florida, advised that he had rented an adding machine to Mrs. MARGARET SARGENT, the manager of Sargent's Antiques, which is an antique store on Highway 1, south of Vero Beach. He advised that Mrs. SAREENT's son had picked up the rented machine and to the best of his recollection this had been on April 4, 1968. He stated that he could not be sure of the exact date because of the fact that no written record was made of the transaction.

The following investigation was conducted by SA DAVID N. JELLISON concerning an individual who placed a note in some stationery destined for the Pittsburgh Plate Glass Company, Miami, Florida, regarding anonymous note that stated, "_____ KING will be dead by 4/4/68", which note was subsequently determined to be authored by GEORGE CHARLES GRAY, Ashland, Ohio.

On April 10, 1968, KATHRIN HOBSON, Pittsburgh Plate Glass Company (PPGC), 17851 N.W. Miami Court, Miami, Florida, advised she had ordered some stationery supplies from the A. L. Garber Company, Printers, Ashland, Ohio, through the PPGC and that this stationery arrived at PPGC, Miami, Florida on April 10, 1968.

Mrs. HOBSON advised she opened the outer package and removed one inner package and started to remove a second inner package when she noted a 3" x 1/2" piece of paper which had been ripped from the package copy of the shipping bill. Written on this slip of paper was "Dr. Rev. MARTIN L. KING will be dead by 4/4/68." This slip of paper together with the shipping bill was taped with cellophane tape to a package of paper pads.

Mrs. HOBSON advised that the Garber shipping number was 52360 and that this package was picked up by the United Parcel Service on April 5, 1968, and delivered on April 10, 1968.

The above described items were forwarded to the FBI Laboratory in Washington, D. C. for comparison and examination purposes.

On April 18, 1968, the El Paso Office advised that an individual named DAVID (NMI) HAWKINS was reportedly "on the run" and that he had left New Orleans the morning of April 18, 1968. It was further reported that HAWKINS allegedly fitted the description of the subject.

The following investigation was conducted by SAs WILLIAM B. PULLEN and DENNIS J. O'SHEA:

Mrs. EVA HAWKINS, 1098 N.E. 34th Court, Fort Lauderdale, Florida, advised that hermson, DAVID HAWKINS, resides with another son, BERNARD HAWKINS, Box 18, Wellborn, Florida. Mrs. HAWKINS advised she last saw DAVID just before Christmas, 1967. She said that DAVID was very thin at that time and in no way did he look similar to the photograph of ERIC STARVO GALT which was displayed to her. Mrs. HAWKINS displayed a photograph of DAVID noting that this photograph did not resemble the subject.

Mrs. HAWKINS stated that DAVID was formerly in the U. S. Army for about ten years; however, he was discharged about ten years ago. She described him as a white male, born June 5, 1928, at Suwannee County, Florida. She said that DAVID was about 5 feet 9 inches, weighed 130-135 pounds, had sandy hair and very thin features.

On April 23, 1968, the San Francisco Office advised that DAVID MC DONALD, Ticket Agent, National Airlines (NAL), Houston, Texas, had observed around Noon, April 21, 1968, an individual resembling subject boarding a flight to the West Coast en route to either San Francisco or Los Angeles, California. This individual was described as a white male, 6 feet 1 inch, brown hair, cowboy straw hat, horned rimmed glasses with dark shaded lenses, wearing beige Levi jacket and having a neatly trimmed goatee.

The following investigation was conducted by SA STUART GODWIN:

On April 23, 1968, NAL stewardesses MONA LEVINE, SUSAN CARBONE, JOANN HARRINGTON and JOANNE MC CLAIN were interviewed upon arrival of NAL Flight 48 at Miami, Florida.

These stewardesses advised that they had been aboard NAL Flight 47 on April 21, 1968, and they all stated that they had not seen or noticed any person on NAL Flight 47 that fitted the above described individual.

Photographs of subject and WALTER T. RIFE, were exhibited to each of the above mentioned stewardesses and they advised that no one on NAL Flight 47 on April 21, 1968, resembled either photograph to the best of their recollection.

On April 21, 1968, Mr. SAMUEL RIVERO, 1450 N.W. 111th Street, Miami, telephone number 688-6044, furnished the following information.

Around 3:00 p.m. on April 21, 1968, while working at his place of employment, Hudson Service Station, 85th Street and N.W. 7th Avenue, Miami, he observed two white males, one of whom fitted the description of subject, driving a 1952 or 1953 blue Dodge bearing Alabama license number 312-9188. Mr. RIVERO advised that one of the occupants of this vehicle inquired of him if he knew of a way to bypass the city to make connections with U. S. Highway 41.

Mr. RIVERO further advised that he conjectured that possibly these two individuals may have been en route to Tampa, Florida.

On April 22, 1968, the New York Office advised that THEODORE SULLIVAN, Bethpage, New York, and his wife had observed an individual at the Sea Ranch Hotel, Lauderdale-by-the-Sea, Florida, whose name was GALLAHER. According to Mr. SULLIVAN, GALLAHER arrived at this hotel on April 16, 1968, and departed on April 19, 1968, and GALLAHER resembled a photograph of ERIC STARVO GALT.

On April 23, 1968, RICHARD OSEN, Manager, Sea Ranch Hotel, Lauderdale-by-the-Sea, Fort Lauderdale, Florida, advised SA ROGER B. COLTON that Mr. and Mrs. G. J. GALLAHER, 5505 Briar Drive, Houston, Texas, stayed at the hotel from April 16, 1968, to April 19, 1968.

Upon viewing a photograph of GALT, Mr. OSEN advised that there was no resemblance between GALLAHER and GALT. Mr. OSEN advised that the GALLAHERs may still be vacationing in the Miami area; however, their whereabouts were unknown to him.

Information was developed through interview of LOUIS RAYMOND DOUDA at Marietta, Georgia, who was acquainted with JAMES EARL RAY in the Missouri State Prison, which indicated that another former inmate of the Missouri State Prison, PAUL ALVIN LAIL, JR., was currently residing at 34 Barbados Drive, Palm Springs, West Palm Beach, Florida.

The following investigation was conducted at West Palm Beach on April 26, 1968, by Special Agents ROBERT W. WISEMAN and PATRICK A. PHILBIN:

PAUL ALVIN LAIL was informed of the identities of the interviewing agents and the nature of this interview.

LAIL advised he is presently living at 34 Barbados Drive, Palm Springs, with his wife BETTY and five month old baby.

LAIL stated he had been an inmate in the Missouri State Penitentiary for three years and while confined there he had met and known JAMES EARL RAY. He stated he was not very close or friendly with RAY but he did eat with him a number of times when he was in the kitchen visiting with his friend, LEWIE "WHITEY" DOWDA. He said he also watched a number of ball games and television programs with RAY.

LAIL described RAY as being a guy who knew his way around but was not one of the wheels or leaders in prison; that RAY was a sharp intelligent guy who hung around with the boys who were always up to something and were in on all of the deals. LAIL advised RAY never seemed to have a lot of money but always seemed to have enough to get whatever he wanted.

LAIL said most of the guys (he cannot recall their names) that he, RAY, was with most of the time were on dope and were peddling it.

LAIL continued by saying that RAY's big buddy was NEAL ABBEY who was a "big wheel" and the guy who ran the prison kitchen with "an iron hand." LAIL stated ABBEY was the guy who got RAY into the kitchen which was a good deal (job).

LAIL advised that LEO BARNETT handled dope and peddled it in the Missouri State Penitentiary and he believes he is now in prison somewhere in Florida. He said that BARNETT would know for certain if RAY had been on dope and where and who he got the dope from.

LAIL further advised that FRED MILLER, "a cut and dried con," who worked in the tag plant of the prison, was one of the leaders and knew RAY well and he might be able to furnish information about him if he would talk to the FBI.

LAIL related that WHITEY DOWDA also knew RAY pretty well and would know more about him than he did since they both worked in the kitchen together for quite a while. He said WHITEY had been living in Merietta, Georgia, and he recently heard that WHITEY is now in jail in Merietta on a robbery charge.

LAIL stated there had been trouble with some of the Negro prisoners in the Missouri State Penitentiary who were Black Muslims so some of the prisoners decided to teach them a lesson and three or four of the Negro leaders were killed. LAIL stated he did not know if RAY was in on the actual killing, but he was close with the ones that did it and therefore could have been in on the killing or at least he knew who did kill the Negroes.

LAIL would not make any further statements about the killing of the Negroes in the Missouri State Penitentiary and he stated he could not furnish any names or identities but he did say there were ten inmates who were in on the killing of the Negroes.

LAIL said he could not recall RAY saying too much about Negroes and he does not believe from his conversations with RAY that he, RAY, was a racist, however, all of the inmates in the Missouri State Penitentiary did not like the Negroes because of their belligerent attitude and animosity toward the white inmates.

LAIL stated RAY liked to wear his hair short in the summer months and long in the winter. He said RAY used to have a "butch" cut in the summer months.

LAIL stated from his association with RAY that he felt RAY would have a .45 automatic "stashed" on his person somewhere and he would not give up or be taken without a fight. LAIL said RAY is a "killer" in his opinion and that RAY would not be easy to catch or find. LAIL said RAY is "a city boy" and he does not figure him to be hiding out in the country. However, LAIL stated he would not figure RAY would hide out in a really big city like New York, but would pick one about the size of Houston, Texas.

LAIL said he could not recall RAY telling him or mentioning any place in particular he, RAY, always wanted to go to or visit, but he felt RAY would be in a warm climate rather than a cold one.

LAIL stated he had not been contacted or heard from RAY since he got out of the Missouri State Penitentiary over two years ago and to the best of his knowledge RAY would not know where or how to contact him.

LAIL advised he had visited WHITEY DOWDA in March, 1968, in WHITEY's home in Merietta, Georgia, for a few days. He said that WHITEY is his best friend.

LAIL continued by saying he recognized the name of SCHAFFER and he thinks SCHAFFER was a captain in the prison guard force, but he did not know him and/or if SCHAFFER peddled dope in the pen.

LAIL stated he felt that there was a possibility RAY's escape was engineered by and assisted by outside help but he did not have any knowledge about it. Also he stated just about anything is possible with outside help and money, however, escape from the Missouri State Penitentiary is something else and is just about impossible in his opinion.

LAIL stated he did not feel badly about MARTIN LUTHER KING getting killed, but he was sorry it happened in Memphis, Tennessee, and he would have rather seen KING killed in some Northern city. LAIL said he is a Southerner and his feelings are Southern.

LAIL stated that he is of course interested in the reward money and he could certainly use it. However, he said he really does not know if he would turn RAY in or not for the reward money if he had the opportunity. LAIL stated he was certain RAY did the killing of KING himself and not involved with anyone else. LAIL stated that he wanted to be honest with the FBI and he would have to think about this a couple of days as to whether or not he would or would not turn RAY in if he knew his possible or current whereabouts.

LAIL stated he really does not know where RAY is and he said that RAY had not contacted him and he had not seen RAY for over two years.

LAIL continued by saying he was a little surprised when he learned from the newspaper and television that RAY had been identified as KING's killer because he always figured RAY as being a guy that would be too smart to leave any clues or evidence around so that the police or the FBI would be able to trace and/or identify him.

LAIL examined the photographs of RAY and said he would never recognize him with the tuxedo and bow tie outfit on and further he said he never saw RAY with his hair long as it is either. However, he said the guy with the bow tie and tuxedo on is RAY.

LAIL said after thinking it over that he is very interested in the money and if he thinks of anything or comes up with anything concerning RAY, he will contact either Special Agent PATRICK A. PHILBIN or ROBERT W. WISEMAN.

On April 12, 1968, JOSEPH JAMES GAULT and SIMONE MATTE GAULT, 718 S. W. 14th Street, Miami, Florida, was interviewed by SA DAVID N. JELLISON.
Mr. and Mrs. GAULT advised they were not related to or acquainted with anyone named ERIC STARVO GALT or KARL GALT and do not know anyone by those names. Mr. GAULT advised he was born in Scotland on February 7, 1899, and stated that GAULT and GALT are both accepted versions of spelling and are often used interchangeably.

He advised he has a son by a former marriage, DONALD CAMERON GAULT, born in 1925. He is apparently in the U. S. Navy and whom he has not seen since 1928. He further advised that his former wife and mother of DONALD CAMERON GAULT is Mrs. GEORGE STEADLEY, who resides at 158 Beach Street, New Jersey, and in all probability knows the whereabouts of DONALD CAMERON GAULT.

THREATS TO MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR.

On September 9, 1966, information was received in the Miami Office of the FBI that JAMES WHITE, a barber in Ft. Lauderdale, Florida, had allegedly inquired of an official of the United Klans of American, Knights of the Ku Klux Klan, how much money they would pay to kill MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR.

JAMES HARVEY WHITE was interviewed at his place of employment, Lauderdale Harbors Barber Shop, 1650 S. E. 10th Terrace. He was advised of his rights by SA ROGER B. COLTON as shown on an unexecuted warning and waiver form. He was advised that the purpose of the interview concerned his attempt to join Klavern #6 of the United Klans of America, Inc., Ft. Lauderdale, Florida, and a statement reportedly made by him inquiring how much money the Klavern would pay to have MARTIN LUTHER KING killed.

WHITE stated he would furnish any information and desired to cooperate fully since he had nothing to hide whatsoever, consequently, he advised as follows:

About a year and a half ago, perhaps sometime in September, 1966, he became quite concerned about the racial situation in Ft. Lauderdale, Florida, and was upset regarding the racial integration of schools in Ft. Lauderdale and the effect thereof on his daughter.

He expressed an interest in joining the Ku Klux Klan of Ft. Lauderdale and through a nursery man, DAN ZBIN, he believes that he submitted written application for membership. Subsequent to submission of his application he was contacted telephonically by an unknown person concerning his application.

He was not recontacted concerning the Klan and was not accepted for membership. As far as he knows, the Klan would not accept him and did not want him as a member. He advised that the reason for his rejection was probably because he is an alcoholic. He admitted that he has been an alcoholic for quite awhile and is attempting to "stay on the wagon," however, he has not been able to completely conquer this problem.

He does not recall making any inquiry of anyone regarding how much the Klavern would pay to kill MARTIN LUTHER KING. He advised that he may have made derogatory

statements concerning KING during this period of time, however, he denied saying that he would ever kill KING or wanted to know how much would be paid for killing KING.

He advised that his statements must have been misconstrued or taken out of context.

He advised that on April 4, 1968, he was working at the Lauderdale Harbors Barber Shop and denied being in Memphis, Tennessee.

He further denied he had anything whatsoever to do with the killing of Doctor KING or being involved as a conspirator. He stated that his presence in Ft. Lauderdale on April 4, could be verified through his employer, JIMMY COSTOS, and co-worker, NORMA FREEMAN.

He reiterated that he had made application to join the Klan in Ft. Lauderdale but denied that he ever inquired of the Klan how much money they would pay to kill KING.

The following investigation was conducted by SA ROGER B. COLTON on May 2, 1968, at Ft. Lauderdale, Florida:

NORMAN FREEMAN, Lauderdale Harbors Barber Shop, 1650 S. E. 10th Terrace, advisedshe is acquainted with JAMES WHITE who is a barber at this barber shop and who as far as she knows was working with her on April 4, 1968, and April 5, 1968, and could not possibly have been in Memphis, Tennessee on those dates.

On April 26, 1968, the Pittsburgh Division developed information from HARRY P. STEWART, former employee, U. S. Secret Service, that his nephew, STEWART LINDH, claimed he and two others through a newspaper advertisement, obtained a ride in 1966 with one DONALD STOUT. While traveling through Kansas City, Missouri, STOUT disappeared with their belongings. Before STOUT disappeared, he allegedly told them he was going to shoot KING. The Pittsburgh Office of the FBI determined that HARRY P. STEWART was currently residing at Route 1, Sebastian, Florida.

The following investigation was conducted by SA HAROLD K. PARSON at Sebastian, Florida, on April 26, 1968:

HARRY P. STEWART, Route 1, Sebastian, Florida, advised that when his nephew, STEWART LINDH, was hitchhiking from San Francisco to Vermont in 1966, the above described incident occurred. STEWART was unable to recall any reference to MARTIN LUTHER KING. He advised his nephew, STEWART LINDH, was currently residing at $4010\frac{1}{2}$ Van Dyke, San Diego, California, and was attending college there.

PUBLIC TELEPHONE CHECKS ALONG INTERSTATE 10, TEXAS, DECEMBER 15 - 17, 1967

On May 5, 1968, the Houston Office of the FBI advised that CHARLES STEIN and JAMES EARL RAY traveled on Interstate 10 between December 15 and 17, 1967. A telephone call was made from a public telephone at Vidor, Texas, telephone number 769-9108 to Immokalee, Florida, telephone number 813-657-3181.

The following investigation was conducted by SA ERNEST HARRISON, JR. at Immokalee, Florida, on May 7, 1968:

Mr. CHARLES MARKLE, Foreman, H. L. Hunt Packing Co., telephone 657-3181, advised he has never heard of Vidor, Texas, and does not recall receiving a telephone call from there on December 15, 1967, and has no way of checking such a call to determine the identity of the caller. He stated he was lining up a crew in and around McAllen and Farr, Texas during the middle of December, 1967, and it is possible that a business call was made in that regard, but he does not recall it.

On April 24, 1968, information was developed that JAMES EARL RAY was a narcotics addict using injections of Amphetimine.

The following investigation was conducted by Special Agents DAVID N. JELLISON and THOMAS H. STOY on April 25, 1968, at Miami, Florida:

All hippy hangouts and psychedelic art and trinket shops in the greater Miami area were contacted and furnished with wanted flyers of subject JAMES EARL RAY. None were able to identify subject although they all agreed to post the wanted flyers in their respective business establishments.

On April 25, 1968, all hippy hangouts and psychedelic art and trinket shops were contacted throughout the Miami Division and wanted flyers of subject RAY were furnished to the proprietors without effecting an identification. All agreed to post the wanted flyers in their shops.

On May 3, 1968, the Birmingham Office of the FBI advised they had received a letter from HAZEL V. PEACOCK, Okeechobee, Florida, advising them she had possession of urgent information and desired to talk to an Agent of the FBI.

On May 3, 1968, the following investigation was conducted by SA HAROLD K. PARSON at Okeechobee, Florida:

HAZEL V. PEACOCK, secretary, Okeechobee School for Boys, stated that at about midnight, April 4, 1968, she received a telephone call from her former fiancee, DONALD JACKSON CARPENTER from Birmingham stating he and TERRENCE ALVIN SMITH were on the run. She said that CARPENTER told her MARTIN LUTHER KING was dead and that they did it. He asked her to hide them out for a few weeks. He mentioned a payoff of \$100,000 to be delivered to them near Dothan, Alabama on April 5, 1968, and said they would see her the next night.

SMITH and CARPENTER allegedly are members of an unknown secret organization.

The Atlanta Office of the FBI determined on May 4, 1968, that SMITH and CARPENTER both were at work at Gray, Georgia, on April 4, 1968. SMITH's employer, LEE WILLIAMS NURSERY, advised SMITH told him on April 5 or April 6, 1968, that CARPENTER had played jokes on his girl friend in Okeechobee, Florida. He stated CARPENTER had said he and CARPENTER had killed Doctor KING and needed to be hidden out. WILLIAMS advised he reprimanded SMITH stating these kind of joking statements could cause trouble.

TERRENCE SMITH was interviewed and confirmed the joke telephone call and also confirmed that CARPENTER has been telling his girl friend, HAZEL PEACOCK, horror stories. SMITH stated all was false about any secret organization and made apologies and promised to disassociate himself from CARPENTER.

Some of the foregoing information was received by Detective RALPH BROWN, Milwaukee, Wisconsin Police

Department on April 16, 1968, after he had been in contact with SAM HUGHES, an official at the Okeechobee School for Boys, Okeechobee, Florida. This information was immediately furnished by the Milwaukee FBI Office to the Miami Office by telephone.

INVESTIGATION REGARDING MICHEL ST. PIERRE AND STOLEN 1967 CADILLAC, BEARING VEHICLE IDENTIFICATION NUMBER F7112795

On April 30, 1968, the Atlanta Office of the FBI advised that on November 30, 1967, a 1967 Cadillac DeVille, VIN F7112795, bearing 1967 Florida license 1W 179130, was found abandoned at the Atlanta Airport. It had been determined that this car was stolen on August 21, 1967, from Montreal, Canada, while in the possession of LOU EISENBERG.

Investigation reflected this car was registered to a MICHEL ST. PIERRE, 2151 N.W. 119th Street, Miami, Florida. It had been determined that the Famous Door Lounge was located at this address, however, no one by the name of ST. PIERRE was known at that address. Mail had been received at the Famous Door Lounge, in particular, correspondence from the Phillips 66 Petroleum Company for ST. PIERRE.

On May 1, 1968, the Kansas City Office determined that Phillips Petroleum records reveal that a MICHEL ST. PIERRE, 2151 N. W. 119th Street, Miami, Florida, made three purchases of Phillips products using a Shell credit card. This card number was determined to be 555-047-067. The card was used three times for boat rentals on September 1, 2, and 3, 1967, at Craft Limited, Inc., Oakland Boulevard Bridge, Ft. Lauderdale, Florida.

On May 1, 1968, checks in the vicinity of 2151 N. W. 119th Street, Miami, Florida, were conducted regarding a MICHEL ST. PIERRE by SA DAVID N. JELLISON, and all checks met with negative results.

On May 2, 1968, SA WILLIAM B. PULLEN conducted the following investigation at Ft. Lauderdale, Florida:

A MICHEL ST. PIERRE, 2240 Coulonges Ville de and 34 Prudential-Vemont (local address 2151 N. W. 119th Street, Miami), rented boats from Crafts Limited, Inc., Ft. Lauderdale, Florida, September 2 and 3, 1967. He used a Shell credit card 555-047-067 to pay for these rentals and gas and oil.

Agents for Crafts Limited, Inc. viewed photographs of RAY and were unable to identify. Telephone number appearing on contract was 514-663-2288. Area code 514 determined to be area code for Montreal, Canada vicinity.

JENNIFER WARNER, Title Clerk, Scott Motors, Hallandale, advised she handled transfer of title for MICHEL ST. PIERRE at request of ANGELO CIULLA, owner, Autorama, Ft. Lauderdale, Florida. Autorama was determined to be out of business and CIULLA is currently being sought for interview in connection with an automobile ring involving Canadian cars. His present whereabouts is unknown.

In connection with this car ring case, it was determined that CLAUDE DAOUST, an alias of JEAN-CLAUDE BISSONNETTE, was arrested on September 12, 1967, in Montreal, Canada. When arrested, BISSONNETTE had in his possession a Shell credit card in the name of MICHEL ST. PIERRE, 2151 N. W. 119th Street, Miami, Florida, and a Florida registration issued August 31, 1967, for a 1967 Cadillac convertible, VIN F7112795, Florida registration 1W 179130.

On May 2, 1968, two rental agreements between Crafts Limited, Inc., Ft. Lauderdale, Florida, and a MICHEL ST. PIERRE dated September 2-3, 1967, bearing renter signature MICHEL ST. PIERRE together with three Shell credit card invoices bearing the same signature were furnished to the FBI Laboratory for handwriting examination.

On May 6, 1968, the FBI Laboratory concluded that the MICHEL ST. PIERRE signatures on the credit cards and the rental contracts were not prepared by JAMES EARL RAY.

On May 9, 1968, the FBI Laboratory advised that none of the latent fingerprints developed on the credit cards or rental agreements were identical with the fingerprints of JAMES EARL RAY.

On May 6, 1968, the Albany Division of the FBI located MICHEL ST. PIERRE in Vemont, Quebec, Canada. ST. PIERRE advised at this time he lost his credit cards on August 1, 1967.
