The Newark Division on April 20, 1968, advised that CYNTHIA LOUISE BRONSON was in the Miami area, and that T. R. CRANE would be in the Miami area.

On April 20, 1968, SA DAVID N. JELLISON was advised by Captain J. CRANE, who had previously been identified by EAL officials at Miami and New York as T. R. CRANE, that he flew Flight 106 from Atlanta to Montreal on April 5, 1968. She advised that BRONSON could be contacted at 8396 118th Street, Apartment 2-D, Kew Gardens, New York after 2:00 AM on April 21, 1968.

The Charlotte Division on April 22, 1968, advised that PETER S. Upon reviewing the photograph of JAMES EARL RAY, he advised he was sure that RAY was a passenger on this flight and was the only person to leave the plane at Houston, Texas.

The Atlanta Division on May 1, 1968, requested EAL flights from Montreal, Canada to Atlanta or Birmingham be reviewed for period August 22, 1967 through August 26, 1967 to determine if subject on board a flight under his name or aliases.

On May 2, 1968, SA.A. A. ARMSTRONG, JR. reviewed the records of EAL which reflected that Flights 109 and 131 were scheduled Montreal to Atlanta on August 22, 1967 through August 26, 1967. These flights being from Montreal to Atlanta at which time Birmingham passengers would connect with a flight for Birmingham.

A review of the tickets for the flights during the period August 22-26, 1967 did not reflect that the subject, using his mome or aliases, was a passenger aboard any of the EAL flights.

VIII. UNIDENTIFIED LATENT FINGERPRINT CHECKS AT POLICE DEPARTMENTS AND SHERIFF'S OFFICES IN THE MIAMI DIVISION AGAINST THE FINGERPRINTS OF JAMES EARL RAY MM 44-1854 DNJ/dmc 1

On April 29, 1968, the following investigation was conducted at all police departments and sheriff's offices in the Miami Division with regard to any unidentified latent fingerprints maintained in their files. These agencies were requested to compare any unidentified latent fingerprints in their records with the fingerprints of JAMES EARL RAY.

All police departments and sheriff's offices in the Miami Division advised that they had checked all latent fingerprints in their files since April, 1967, with the prints of JAMES EARL RAY and all checks met with negative results.

IX. INVESTIGATION REGARDING LONG DISTANCE TELEPHONE CALLS MADE FROM THE TELEPHONE BOOTHS IN THE ST. FRANCIS HOTEL, LOS ANGELES, CALIFORNIA

The Los Angeles Office of the FBI advised on April 29, 1968, that JAMES EARL RAY resided in and near the Saint Francis Hotel, Los Angeles, California during January, February, and March, 1968. It was determined that telephone number 630-3182, Oxon Hill, Maryland, was called from a telephone booth in the Saint Francis Hotel on February 11, 1968.

The Baltimore Office of the FBI on May 4, 1968, determined that this telephone number is listed to a JUDY MENDELSON who received a telephone call from her father MAX MENDELSON on February 11, 1968, who was then residing in the vicinity of the Saint Francis Hotel, Los Angeles, California. It was determined from JUDY MENDELSON that her father was currently residing at 1120 NE 159th Street, North Miami Beach, Florida.

MAX MENDELSON was located at Miami, Florida at the Interstate Collection Bureau, 2707 Biscayne Boulevard where he is employed as a credit manager. MENDELSON advised that he resided with his sister at 1727 Garfield Place, Apartment 6, Los Angeles, California during the months of February and March, 1968.

MENDELSON advised that he used a public telephone in the Saint Francis Hotel to call his daughter JUDY in Oxon Hill, Maryland. The only occasion MENDELSON had to enter the Saint Francis Hotel was to use the telephone. At no time did MENDELSON ever see anyone who resembled the photographs of JAMES EARL RAY.

TELEPHONE BOOTHS - SAINT FRANCIS HOTEL LOS ANGELES, CALIFORNIA

The Los Angeles Office of the FBI advised on April 29, 1968, that telephone number 564-2371, Fort Lauderdale, Florida, was called on February 15, 1968, from a telephone booth in the Saint Francis Hotel, Los Angeles, California. JAMES EARL RAY resided at and near the Saint Francis Hotel during January, February and March, 1968.

The following investigation was conducted at Fort Lauderdale, Florida by SA RICHARD B. STULL on April 30, 1968:

Current Fort Lauderdale, Florida telephone directory indicates that telephone number 564-2371 is the listed telephone number for the Holy Cross Hospital, 4725 North Federal Highway, Fort Lauderdale.

Hospital officials advised that no record is maintained of persons receiving telephone calls coming into the hospital through the hospital switchboard.

Photographs of subject JAMES EARL RAY were displayed to hospital officials and employees of the hospital, and none were able to identify the photograph of RAY.

Hospital patient records were reviewed with reference to RAY and all aliases used by RAY. These records contained no information identifiable with RAY or any of his aliases. A wanted flyer of RAY was furnished to hospital officials who posted this wanted flyer on the hospital bulletin board.

X. INVESTIGATION REGARDING JAMES EUGENE GAULT WHOSE DATE OF BIRTH IS JULY 20, 1931, THE SAME DATE OF BIRTH USED BY SUSPECT ERIC STARVO GALT.

On April 18, 1968, the St. Louis Office of the FBI through a check of Missouri Drivers Licenses identified JAMES EUGENE GAULT as a suspect in this case in view of his birth date July 20, 1931, which is the same birth data used by ERIC S. GALT.

Investigation at St. Louis indicated that GAULT's current address is General Delivery, Ludlam Branch, Miami, Florida.

The following investigation was conducted by SA JOHN J. MC BREEN at Miami, Florida, from April 19, 1968, to April 23, 1968:

After several negative attempts to contact GAULT at various addresses and hospitals in the Miami area, he was located at the Turf Motel, N. W. 27th Avenue and was eliminated as a suspect in this matter on the basis of his physical appearance and facial characteristics.

XI. INVESTIGATION REGARDING GUY E. RAY AT MIAMI, FLORIDA, AND FLORENCE, ALABAMA

OLIVER BRIGHT, Vice President, Hialeah-Miami Springs Bank, Hialeah, Florida, advised on April 25, 1968, that his bank handled a matter in the name of GUY E. RAY on April 3, 1968, in which RAY furnished a Miami address. This address was determined to be fictitious. A previous address was listed as Route 2, Box 148, Killen, Alabama, and Route 1, Owens Cross Roads, Alabama. BRIGHT contacted a BUFORD GARNER, State National Bank of Muscle Shoals, Muscle Shoals, Alabama, with regard to RAY.

The following investigation was conducted by the Birmingham Office on April 26, 1968:

JESSE A. KELLER, Attorney, Florence, Alabama, advised on April 26, 1968, that he has known GUY ERSKIN RAY for about two years. RAY operates a construction company in Muscle Shoals, Alabama and resides in Killen, Alabama, and travels extensively for business purposes.

KELLER described RAY as being 29 years old, 6'1" tall, weighing 210 pounds, and has a noticeable scar on his mouth and jaw. He in no way resembles JAMES EARL RAY.

The following investigation was conducted at Miami, Florida, on April 22, 1968, by SA GAY R. SHAHAN:

Copies of Identification Order #4182 containing photographs, fingerprints and physical description of JAMES EARL RAY along with wanted flyer also containing photographs and description of RAY were furnished to all airlines and all car rental agencies at the Miami International Airport on April 22, 1968. Copies of the identification order and wanted flyer were also distributed to the U.S. Immigration and Naturalization Service, U.S. Public Health Service and the U.S. Customs at the airport.

Copies of the identification order were given to each individual latent fingerprint examiner at the Dade County, Florida, Sheriff's Department and additional copies were provided for distribution to the Detective Bureau and detectives investigating narcotics-type cases.

Copies of the identification order were given to latent fingerprint examiners at the Miami and Miami Beach Police Departments and additional copies made available for distribution to detectives in each of these two departments.

Copies of the identification order and wanted flyer were furnished to the various Federal Government agencies in the City of Miami who are involved in law enforcement. This included the Alcohol and Tabacco Tax Unit of the Treasury Department; the Federal Narcotics Bureau; the Federal Bureau of Narcotics and Dangerous Drugs; the U. S. Coast Guard; the U. S. Customs Agency Service; the Immigration and Naturalization Service; the U. S. Border Patrol; the U. S. Postal Inspectors; the U. S. Secret Service and the Office of Security, U. S. State Department.

XIII. EFFORTS TO LOCATE WALTER LOHMEYER THROUGH JOHN B. SWIFT, TAVERNIER, FLORIDA MM 44-1854 THS/jgj 1

On April 13, 1968, the New York Office advised that efforts to locate WALTER LOHMEYER had determined that LOHMEYER was employed at Fairchild Camera, Syosset, New York, and that LOHMEYER could be located possibly at Tavernier, Florida.

The following investigation was conducted by SA GILBERT E. TODD:

On April 13, 1968, Mr. JOHN B. SWIFT, Tavernier, Florida, advised he has had no contact with WALTER LOHMEYER since 1959. Mr. SWIFT stated that he last heard that LOHMEYER was employed with Fairchild Camera, New York. Mr. SWIFT could not furnish the current address, nor could he furnish the name of anyone who may know of LOHMEYER's current whereabouts.

Mr. SWIFT stated that LOHMEYER had one brother, CARLTON LOHMEYER, who was approximately 55 years of age and who worked in a steel mill in a city in Pennsylvania, city unknown. Mr. SWIFT described WALTER LOHMEYER as being in his sixties and having been married several times, but not believed to have had any children through these marriages.

Mr. SWIFT stated that possibly STEVE SABATELLI, New York City telephone number 745-0700, might be contacted inasmuch as LOHMEYER formerly carried automobile insurance with the Aetna Casualty Insurance Company through SABATELLI's firm.

Mr. SWIFT advised that WALTER LOHMEYER married his first wife, THELMA CAVITE ANDERSON, in South Norwalk, Connecticut in approximately 1935 and that his parents may still be residing there.

XIV. INVESTIGATION REGARDING MICHEL ST. PIERRE AND A CADILLAC BEARING VIN F7112795 STOLEN IN MONTREAL, CANADA, AUGUST 21, 1967

> INVESTIGATION REGARDING MICHEL ST. PIERRE AND STOLEN 1967 CADILLAC, BEARING VEHICLE IDENTIFICATION NUMBER F7112795

On April 30, 1968, the Atlanta Office of the FBI advised that on November 30, 1967, a 1967 Cadillac DeVille, VIN F7112795, bearing 1967 Florida license 1W 179130, was found abandoned at the Atlanta Airport. It had been determined that this car was stolen on August 21, 1967, from Montreal, Canada, while in the possession of LOU EISENBERG.

Investigation reflected this car was registered to a MICHEL ST. PIERRE, 2151 N.W. 119th Street, Miami, Florida. It had been determined that the Famous Door Lounge was located at this address, however, no one by the name of ST. PIERRE was known at that address. Mail had been received at the Famous Door Lounge, in particular, correspondence from the Phillips 66 Petroleum Company for ST. PIERRE.

On May 1, 1968, the Kansas City Office determined that Phillips Petroleum records reveal that a MICHEL ST. PIERRE, 2151 N. W. 119th Street, Miami, Florida, made three purchases of Phillips products using a Shell credit card. This card number was determined to be 555-047-067. The card was used three times for boat rentals on September 1, 2, and 3, 1967, at Craft Limited, Inc., Oakland Boulevard Bridge, Ft. Lauderdale, Florida.

On May 1, 1968, checks in the vicinity of 2151 N. W. 119th Street, Miami, Florida, were conducted regarding a MICHEL ST. PIERRE by SA DAVID N. JELLISON, and all checks met with negative results.

On May 2, 1968, SA WILLIAM B. PULLEN conducted the following investigation at Ft. Lauderdale, Florida:

A MICHEL ST. PIERRE, 2240 Coulonges Ville de and 34 Prudential-Vemont (local address 2151 N. W. 119th Street, Miami), rented boats from Crafts Limited, Inc., Ft. Lauderdale, Florida, September 2 and 3, 1967. He used a Shell credit card 555-047-067 to pay for these rentals and gas and oil.

Agents for Crafts Limited, Inc. viewed photographs of RAY and were unable to identify. Telephone number appearing on contract was 514-663-2288. Area code 514 determined to be area code for Montreal, Canada vicinity.

JENNIFER WARNER, Title Clerk, Scott Motors, Hallandale, advised she handled transfer of title for MICHEL ST. PIERRE at request of ANGELO CIULLA, owner, Autorama, Ft. Lauderdale, Florida. Autorama was determined to be out of business and CIULLA is currently being sought for interview in connection with an automobile ring involving Canadian cars. His present whereabouts is unknown.

In connection with this car ring case, it was determined that CLAUDE DAOUST, an alias of JEAN-CLAUDE BISSONNETTE, was arrested on September 12, 1967, in Montreal, Canada. When arrested, BISSONNETTE had in his possession a Shell credit card in the name of MICHEL ST. PIERRE, 2151 N. W. 119th Street, Miami, Florida, and a Florida registration issued August 31, 1967, for a 1967 Cadillac convertible, VIN F7112795, Florida registration 1W 179130.

On May 2, 1968, two rental agreements between Crafts Limited, Inc., Ft. Lauderdale, Florida, and a MICHEL ST. PIERRE dated September 2-3, 1967, bearing renter signature MICHEL ST. PIERRE together with three Shell credit card invoices bearing the same signature were furnished to the FBI Laboratory for handwriting examination.

On May 6, 1968, the FBI Laboratory concluded that the MICHEL ST. PIERRE signatures on the credit cards and the rental contracts were not prepared by JAMES EARL RAY.

On May 9, 1968, the FBI Laboratory advised that none of the latent fingerprints developed on the credit cards or rental agreements were identical with the fingerprints of JAMES EARL RAY.

On May 6, 1968, the Albany Division of the FBI located MICHEL ST. PIERRE in Vemont, Quebec, Canada. ST. PIERRE advised at this time he lost his credit cards on August 1, 1967.

It was further determined from the Montreal Police that CLAUDE DAOUST, who was also known as JEAN CLAUDE BISSONNETTE, is a leading car thief in the Montreal, Canada area and his last known whereabouts was the Palm Beach County Jail, West Palm Beach, Florida, as of February 29, 1968.

On May 6, 1968, SA ROGER B. COLTON determined from Palm Beach County, Florida authorities that CLAUDE DAOUST was released from their custody on the evening of April 4, 1968. The current whereabouts of DAOUST was not known to the Palm Beach County authorities.

On May 1, 1968, the Albany Office advised that Captain MAURICE DECARIE, Montreal Police Department, Auto Theft Squad, had developed no suspects or additional information regarding the theft of this Cadillac in Montreal on August 21, 1967.

XV. INVESTIGATION REGARDING TERRENCE ALVIN SMITH AND DONALD JACKSON CARPENTER WHO JOKINGLY TOLD HAZEL PEACOCK, A GIRL FRIEND OF CARPENTER, THAT THEY HAD KILLED MARTIN LUTHER KING

On May 3, 1968, the Birmingham Office of the FBI advised they had received a letter from HAZEL V. PEACOCK, Okeechobee, Florida, advising them she had possession of urgent information and desired to talk to an Agent of the FBI.

On May 3, 1968, the following investigation was conducted by SA HAROLD K. PARSON at Okeechobee, Florida:

HAZEL V. PEACOCK, secretary, Okeechobee School for Boys, stated that at about midnight, April 4, 1968, she received a telephone call from her former fiancee, DONALD JACKSON CARPENTER from Birmingham stating he and TERRENCE ALVIN SMITH were on the run. She said that CARPENTER told her MARTIN LUTHER KING was dead and that they did it. He asked her to hide them out for a few weeks. He mentioned a payoff of \$100,000 to be delivered to them near Dothan, Alabama on April 5, 1968, and said they would see her the next night.

SMITH and CARPENTER allegedly are members of an unknown secret organization.

The Atlanta Office of the FBI determined on May 4, 1968, that SMITH and CARPENTER both were at work at Gray, Georgia, on April 4, 1968. SMITH's employer, LEE WILLIAMS NURSERY, advised SMITH told him on April 5 or April 6, 1968, that CARPENTER had played jokes on his girl friend in Okeechobee, Florida. He stated CARPENTER had said he and CARPENTER had killed Doctor KING and needed to be hidden out. WILLIAMS advised he reprimanded SMITH stating these kind of joking statements could cause trouble.

TERRENCE SMITH was interviewed and confirmed the joke telephone call and also confirmed that CARPENTER has been telling his girl friend, HAZEL PEACOCK, horror stories. SMITH stated all was false about any secret organization and made apologies and promised to disassociate himself from CARPENTER.

Some of the foregoing information was received by Detective RALPH BROWN, Milwaukee, Wisconsin Police

Department on April 16, 1968, after he had been in contact with SAM HUGHES, an official at the Okeechobee School for Boys, Okeechobee, Florida. This information was immediately furnished by the Milwaukee FBI Office to the Miami Office by telephone.

XVI. INVESTIGATION AT HIPPY HANGOUTS MIAMI DIVISION

On April 24, 1968, information was developed that JAMES EARL RAY was a narcotics addict using injections of Amphetimine.

The following investigation was conducted by Special Agents DAVID N. JELLISON and THOMAS H. STOY on April 25, 1968, at Miami, Florida:

All hippy hangouts and psychedelic art and trinket shops in the greater Miami area were contacted and furnished with wanted flyers of subject JAMES EARL RAY. None were able to identify subject although they all agreed to post the wanted flyers in their respective business establishments.

On April 25, 1968, all hippy hangouts and psychedelic art and trinket shops were contacted throughout the Miami Division and wanted flyers of subject RAY were furnished to the proprietors without effecting an identification. All agreed to post the wanted flyers in their shops.

XVII. INVESTIGATION OF SUBSCRIBER TO TELEPHONE NUMBER 813-657-3181, IMMOKALEE, FLORIDA, CALLED FROM A TELEPHONE BOOTH ON TEXAS INTERSTATE HIGHWAY TEN, VIDOR, TEXAS, BETWEEN DECEMBER 15-17, 1967

PUBLIC TELEPHONE CHECKS ALONG INTERSTATE 10, TEXAS, DECEMBER 15 - 17, 1967

On May 5, 1968, the Houston Office of the FBI advised that CHARLES STEIN and JAMES EARL RAY traveled on Interstate 10 between December 15 and 17, 1967. A telephone call was made from a public telephone at Vidor, Texas, telephone number 769-9108 to Immokalee, Florida, telephone number 813-657-3181.

The following investigation was conducted by SA ERNEST HARRISON, JR. at Inmokalee, Florida, on May 7, 1968:

Mr. CHARLES MARKLE, Foreman, H. L. Hunt Packing Co., telephone 657-3181, advised he has never heard of Vidor, Texas, and does not recall receiving a telephone call from there on December 15, 1967, and has no way of checking such a call to determine the identity of the caller. He stated he was lining up a crew in and around McAllen and Farr, Texas during the middle of December, 1967, and it is possible that a business call was made in that regard, but he does not recall it.

XVIII. INVESTIGATION REGARDING DONALD STOUT WHO ALLEGEDLY THREATENED TO KILL DOCTOR KING IN 1966 IN THE PRESENCE OF STEWART LINDH, A HITCHHIKER

On April 26, 1968, the Pittsburgh Division developed information from HARRY P. STEWART, former employee, U. S. Secret Service, that his nephew, STEWART LINDH, claimed he and two others through a newspaper advertisement, obtained a ride in 1966 with one DONALD STOUT. While traveling through Kansas City, Missouri, STOUT disappeared with their belongings. Before STOUT disappeared, he allegedly told them he was going to shoot KING. The Pittsburgh Office of the FBI determined that HARRY P. STEWART was currently residing at Route 1, Sebastian, Florida.

The following investigation was conducted by SA HAROLD K. PARSON at Sebastian, Florida, on April 26, 1968:

HARRY P. STEWART, Route 1, Sebastian, Florida, advised that when his nephew, STEWART LINDH, was hitchhiking from San Francisco to Vermont in 1966, the above described incident occurred. STEWART was unable to recall any reference to MARTIN LUTHER KING. He advised his nephew, STEWART LINDH, was currently residing at $4010\frac{1}{2}$ Van Dyke, San Diego, California, and was attending college there.

XIX. INVESTIGATION REGARDING JAMES HARVEY WHITE AT FT. LAUDERDALE, FLORIDA, WHO ALLEGEDLY HAD INQUIRED OF A KU KLUX KLAN OFFICIAL IN 1966 HOW MUCH MONEY THEY WOULD PAY TO KILL MARTIN LUTHER KING

THREATS TO MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR.

On September 9, 1966, information was received in the Miami Office of the FBI that JAMES WHITE, a barber in Ft. Lauderdale, Florida, had allegedly inquired of an official of the United Klans of American, Knights of the Ku Klux Klan, how much money they would pay to kill MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR.

JAMES HARVEY WHITE was interviewed at his place of employment, Lauderdale Harbors Barber Shop, 1650 S. E. 10th Terrace. He was advised of his rights by SA ROGER B. COLTON as shown on an unexecuted warning and waiver form. He was advised that the purpose of the interview concerned his attempt to join Klavern #6 of the United Klans of America, Inc., Ft. Lauderdale, Florida, and a statement reportedly made by him inquiring how much money the Klavern would pay to have MARTIN LUTHER KING killed.

WHITE stated he would furnish any information and desired to cooperate fully since he had nothing to hide whatsoever, consequently, he advised as follows:

About a year and a half ago, perhaps sometime in September, 1966, he became quite concerned about the racial situation in Ft. Lauderdale, Florida, and was upset regarding the racial integration of schools in Ft. Lauderdale and the effect thereof on his daughter.

He expressed an interest in joining the Ku Klux Klan of Ft. Lauderdale and through a nursery man, DAN ZBIN, he believes that he submitted written application for membership. Subsequent to submission of his application he was contacted telephonically by an unknown person concerning his application.

He was not recontacted concerning the Klan and was not accepted for membership. As far as he knows, the Klan would not accept him and did not want him as a member. He advised that the reason for his rejection was probably because he is an alcoholic. He admitted that he has been an alcoholic for quite awhile and is attempting to "stay on the wagon," however, he has not been able to completely conquer this problem.

He does not recall making any inquiry of anyone regarding how much the Klavern would pay to kill MARTIN LUTHER KING. He advised that he may have made derogatory

statements concerning KING during this period of time, however, he denied saying that he would ever kill KING or wanted to know how much would be paid for killing KING.

He advised that his statements must have been misconstrued or taken out of context.

He advised that on April 4, 1968, he was working at the Lauderdale Harbors Barber Shop and denied being in Memphis, Tennessee.

He further denied he had anything whatsoever to do with the killing of Doctor KING or being involved as a conspirator. He stated that his presence in Ft. Lauderdale on April 4, could be verified through his employer, JIMMY COSTOS, and co-worker, NORMA FREEMAN.

He reiterated that he had made application to join the Klan in Ft. Lauderdale but denied that he ever inquired of the Klan how much money they would pay to kill KING.

On April 12, 1968, JOSEPH JAMES GAULT and SIMONE MATTE GAULT, 718 S. W. 14th Street, Miami, Florida, was interviewed by SA DAVID N. JELLISON. Mr. and Mrs. GAULT advised they were not related to or acquainted with anyone named ERIC STARVO GALT or KARL GALT and do not know anyone by those names. Mr. GAULT advised he was born in Scotland on February 7, 1899, and stated that GAULT and GALT are both accepted versions of spelling and are often used interchangeably.

He advised he has a son by a former marriage, DONALD CAMERON GAULT, born in 1925, He is apparently in the U. S. Navy and whom he has not seen since 1928. He further advised that his former wife and mother of DONALD CAMERON GAULT is Mrs. GEORGE STEADLEY, who resides at 158 Beach Street, New Jersey, and in all probability knows the whereabouts of DONALD CAMERON GAULT.
