REASON FOR HIS CONCERN IS THAT HE HAD HEARD INDIRECTLY THAT A NEW ORLEANS "HITMAN" RAFAEL MARTINEZ (NO RELATION TO RAOUL MARTINEZ) WOULD CAUSE HIM OR HIS FAMILY A LOT OF TROUBLE IF THE STORY BREAKS. HE SAID HIS NEW SOURCE TOLD HIM OF A CONFIDENTIAL MEMO BELIEVED FROM DALLAS, TEXAS, PD OR SO TO NEW ORLEANS IN WHICH MARTINEZ WAS DESCRIBED AS A VERY EXPERIENCED HITMAN.

LAMONICA ADVISED BY SAC OF THE WITNESS PROTECTION PROGRAM AND THAT HE SHOULD PROBABLY NOTIFY INVESTIGATORS FOR SELECT COMMITTEE OF HIS FEARS BUT TO CHECK WITH THIS OFFICE UPON HIS RETURN THIS COMING FRIDAY.

New JFK, King assassination probe appears to be a flop

WASHINGTON — The House Select Committee on Assassinations, in operation for eight months, has come up with virtually no new information or evidence on the deaths of President John F. Kennedy or the Martin Luther King Jr., a well-placed committee source claims.

And the committee has discovered that much of the "new information" on which Congress based its decision to reopen the investigations is in error, according to the source.

An examination by The New York Times has determined that Mark Lane, author and lecturer, provided most of the "new leads" on the basis of his published works.

Moreover, according to several officials familiar with the genesis and scope of the committee's investigation — and Lane himself — Lane was the primary force behind forming the committee and was the architect of the direction the investigation should take.

Lane, a former New York state legislator, failed for two years in his attempts to get Congress to reopen an investigation into Kennedy's death.

But early last year he began looking into King's death and persuaded the civil rights leader's widow Coretta to solicit support from the Congressional Black Caucus for a reinvestigation of both assassinations.

Shortly after such an investigating committee had been formed, Lane and comedian Dick Gregory began work on a book about King and his assassination.

The book, "Code Name Zorro," was published recently — at about the time the committee, according to minutes of one of its executive sessions, was seeking favorable public and congressional reaction to its request for funds.

From the committee's inception, staff members acknowledge, Lane's books, theories and private investigations have provided the "working manuals" and the "working hypotheses" for the investigation.

Internal problems that resulted in the resignations of committee chairman Rep. Henry Gonzalez (D-Tex.) and chief counsel Richard Sprague had delayed the active investigation phase of the committee's work until the "past two or three weeks," the committee source said.

This was true, the source said, even though the committee issued a report March 28 saying it was pursuing "new leads" and had processed "new information."

Medal of Freedom to Be Given Dr. Salk, Martin Luther King

PRESIDENT CARTER Monday announced he is awarding the presidential Medal of Freedom to Martin Luther King Jr., "the conscience of his generation," and to Dr. Jonas E. Salk, whose vaccine wiped out polio epidemics.

The announcement of the medals, the government's highest civil award for meritorious contributions to the nation, was timed for Independence Day. The actual medals will be presented to Salk and posthumously to King at a future White House ceremony.

The King citation read in part:

"Martin Luther King Jr. was the conscience of his generation. A Southerner, a black man, he gazed upon the great wall of segregation and saw that the power of love could bring it down.

"From the pain and exhaustion of his fight to free all people from the bondage of separation and injustice, he wrung his eloquent statement of his dream of what America could be ...

"His life informed us, his dreams sustain us yet."

The citation to Salk read:

"Because of Dr. Jonas E. Salk, our country is free from the cruel epidemics of poliomyelitis that once struck almost yearly. Because of his tireless work, untold hundreds of thousands who might have been crippled are sound in body today.

"These are Doctor Salk's true honors, and there is no way to add to them. This Medal of Freedom can only express our gratitude, and our deepest thanks."

Polygraph Tests Indicate Ray Killed King, Magazine Says

CHICAGO — A lie detector test indicates James Earl Ray killed Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. and acted alone, Playboy Magazine interviewers said Monday in a story prepared for the magazine's September issue.

The polygraph test was the first Ray has taken since he was arrested June 8, 1968, Playboy said. It said the questioning was done at Brushy Mountain Penitentiary in Tennessee June 22.

The key sequence is:

Did you kill Martin Luther King Jr.?

Ray: No.

Do you know for sure who killed Martin Luther King Jr.?

Ray: No.

Officials of John E. Reid and Associates, the polygraph firm that handled the test, said Ray's involuntary responses indicated he lied.

Playboy reported.

"It is the opinion of the examiner, based on the subject's polygraph records, that he is not telling the truth . . ." they were quoted.

The next sequence is:

Did anyone ask you to kill Martin Luther King Jr.?

Ray: No.

Did you arrange with anyone to

kill Martin Luther King Jr.?

Ray: No.

Did anyone give you any money to kill Martin Luther King Jr.?

Ray: No.

The experts said that on the basis of the polygraph reading, "He is telling the truth on the above listed questions."

Playboy's authors, summarizing the findings, said "the polygraph tests indicate that Ray did, in fact, kill Martin Luther King Jr. and that he did so alone."

Ray, informed of the results of the examination, was quoted as saying he does not believe lie-detector tests are accurate.

FBI Planned to Spy On Assassin's Family

THE FBI, which used electronic sordidness in an effort to discredit Martin Luther King Jr., tried to employ similar illegal tactics to catch his murderer.

Long-buried FBI documents reveal that then-director J. Edgar Hoover personally approved a break-in and illegal electronic bugging aimed at innocent relatives of James Earl Ray, who was later convicted of killing King.

For years, Hoover had conducted a vicious smear campaign against King. The FBI peddled malicious anti-King stories to the press and had sent doctored tapes concerning King's personal life to his wife. When King was slain in 1968, whispers about possible FBI involvement put Hoover under great pressure to find the assassin.

While FBI agents were hot on Ray's trail, a May 10, 1968 memo, prepared for top Hoover aide J. P. Mohr, outlined elaborate illegal plans to catch the murderer.

AS PART of the overall investigation, code-named MURKIN — an acronym for murder and King — a memo was written which declared: "Consideration is given to microphone installations on certain properties of Albert and Carol Pepper," the brother-in-law and sister of James Earl Ray.

"The proposal," cautioned the memo, "raises a question concerning the legality of any action taken against the subject of this case on the basis of information obtained from the microphones." If Ray called the Peppers and the bugged conversations were used to arrest him, the memo said, Ray "then could claim that the surveillance vi-

olated his right of privacy." This could prejudice the court case against him.

But if certain precautions were taken, the memo continued, "the worst that could happen" is that the arrest would be declared illegal. Using tortured logic, the document insisted that Ray could still be convicted despite the FBI lawbreaking.

The FBI plotters bluntly admitted that the whole scheme was unconstitutional and a "technical violation" of the law. "Be aware," the memo warned, "that since this search and seizure is unconstitutional as to the Peppers, they have at least a theoretical cause of action for damages against those who installed the (bugging) devices by trespass." "Trespass" is FBI lingo for a break-in.

IF the Peppers sued the FBI and won, the memo insisted, the taxpayers would bail them out. "The government of the United States should surely be willing to pick up the tab for any judgment against those who installed the microphones," the memo concluded. At the bottom, Hoover scrawled "OK," and added his characteristic "H." Six other FBI officials also initialed their approval.

We have been unable to determine whether the FBI actually bugged or burglarized the Peppers' home. Indeed, assassinations expert Harold Weisberg has developed evidence indicating the Justice Department vetoed the plan. But inside sources insist the FBI did use dubious and possible illegal means to capture Ray, who later pleaded guilty to murdering King and was sentenced to 99 years in prison.

Footnote: The FBI has acknowi-

edged that abuses occurred in the past. Since 1973, however, the present director, Clarence Kelley, has halted most of these practices. We were unable to reach the Peppers.

Congressional Staff Interrogates Ray

PETROS, Tenn. — The staff of the House Select Committee on Assassinations met with James Earl Ray for seven hours Monday and agreed to arrange a lie detector test for the convicted killer of civil rights leader Martin Luther King Jr.

The meeting was the sixth held with Ray since March 22 at Brushy Mountain State Prison, where he is serving 99 years for pleading guilty to the 1968 slaying.

Robert Lehner, spokesman for the four committee staffers who met with Ray, said the lie detector test will be given Ray after the current series of interviews. Another interview will be held Dec. 2.
