New JFK, King assassination probe appears to be a flop

WASHINGTON — The House Select Committee of Assassinations, in operation for eight months, has come up with virtually no new information or evidence on the deaths of President John F. Kennedy or the Martin Luther King Jr., a well-placed committee source claims.

And the committee has discovered that much of the "new information" on which Congress based its decision to reopen the investigations is in error, according to the source.

An examination by The New York Times has determined that Mark Lane, author and lecturer, provided most of the "new leads" on the basis of his published works.

Moreover, according to several officials familiar with the genesis and scope of the committee's investigation — and Lane himself — Lane was the primary force behind forming the committee and was the architect of the direction the investigation should take.

Lane, a former New York state legislator, failed for two years in his attempts to get Congress to reolen an investigation into Kennedy's death.

But early last year he began looking into King's

death and persauded the civil rights leader's widdw Coretta to solicit support from the Congressional Black Caucus for a reinvestigation of both assassinations.

Shortly after such an investigating committee had been formed, Lane and comedian Dick Gregory began work on a book about King and his assassination.

work on a book about King and his assassination.

The book, "Code Name Zorro," was published recently — at about the time the committee, according to minutes of one of its executive sessions, was seeking favorable public and congressional reaction to its request for funds.

From the committee's inception, staff members acknowledge, Lane's books, theories and private investigations have provided the "working manuals" and the "working hypotheses" for the investigation.

Internal problems that resulted in the resignations of committee chairman Rep. Henry Gonzalez (D-Tex.) and chief counsel Richard Sprague had delayed the active investigation phase of the committee's work until' the "past two or three weeks," the committee source



CHICAGO - A lie detector test indicates James Earl Ray killed Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. and acted alone, Playboy Magazine interviewers said Monday in a story prepared for the magazine's September issue.

The polygraph test was the first Ray has taken since he was arrested June 8, 1968, Playboy said. It said the questioning was done at Brushy Mountain Penitentiary in Cennessee June 22.

The key sequence is:

Did you kill Martin Luther King Ray: No.

Do you know for sure who killed Martin Luther King Jr.?

Ray: No.

Officials of John E. Reid and Associates, the polygraph firm that handled the test, said Ray's involuntary responses indicated he lied,



Playboy reported.

"It is the opinion of the examiner, based on the subject's polygraph records, that he is not telling the truth . . . ," they were quoted.

The next sequence is:

Did anyone ask you to kill Martin Luther King Jr.? Ray: No.

Did you arrange with anvone to

kill Martin Luther King Jr.? Ray: No.

Did anyone give you any money to kill Martin Luther King Jr.?

Ray: No.

The experts said that on the basis of the polygraph reading, "He is telling the truth on the above listed questions.'

Playboy's authors, summarizing the findings, said "the polygraph tests indicate that Ray did, in fact, kill Martin Luther King Jr. and that he did so alone."



THE FBI, which used electronic skulduggery in an effort to discredit Martin Luther King Jr., tried to employ similar illegal tactics to catch his murderer.

Long-buried FBI documents reveal that then-director J. Edgar Hoover personally proved a break-in and illegal electronic bugging a med at innocent relatives of James Farl Ray, who was later convicted of killing King.

For years, Hoover had conducted a vicious smear campaign against King. The FBI peddled malicious anti-King stories to the press and had sent doctored tapes concerning King's personal life to his wife. When King was slain in 1968, whispers about possible FBI involvement put Hoover under great pressure to find the assassin.

While FBI agents were hot on Ray's trail, a May 10, 1968 memo, prepared for top Hoover aide J. P. Mohr, outlined elaborate illeral plans to catch the murderer.

AS PART of the overall investigation, code-named MURKIN - an acronym for murder and King memo was written which declared: *Consideration is given to micro-phone installations on certain properties of Albert and Carol Pepper," the brother-in-law and sister of James Earl Ray.

"The proposal," cautioned the memo, "raises a question concerning the legality of any action taken against the subject of this case on the basis of information obtained from the microphones." "Be aware," the memo warned, "that since this search and seizure is unconstitutional as to the Peppers, they have at least a theoretical cause of action for damages against those who installed the (bugging) devices by trespass." "Trespass" is FBI lingo for a break-in.

IF the Peppers sued the FBI and won, the memo insisted, the tax-payers would bail them out. "The government of the United States should surely be willing to pick up the tab for any judgment against those who installed the micro-phones," the memo concluded. At the bottom, Hoover scrawled "OK," and added his characteristic "H." Six other FBI officials also initialed their approval.

We have been unable to determine whether the FBI actually bug-ged or burglarized the Peppers' home. Indeed, assassinations expert Harold Weisberg has developed evidence indicating the Justice Department vetoed the plan. But inside sources insist the FBI did use dubious and possible illegal means to capture Ray, who later pleaded guilty to murdering King and was sentenced to 99 years in prison.
