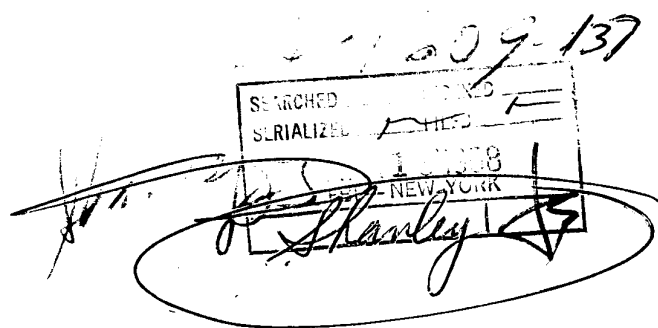

At approximately 3:15 p.m., 4/16/68, Mrs. RUBY HELDER, 67 Marianne Street, Port Richmond, Staten Island, telephone GI. 8-2355, telephonically contacted the NYO and furnished the following information:

On 4/16/68 she rented a room to one Mr. (FNU) STUBBS, a shoe salesman, employed at Michael's Shoe Store at the Port Richmond Shopping Center, Port Richmond, Staten Island. Mr. STUBBS is to occupy the room tomorrow, 4/17/68.

After having rented the room, Mrs. HELDER and a neighbor, whose name she did not furnish, noticed a picture appearing in the "New York Daily News", which appeared to them to be identical to Mr. STUBBS. The picture, according to Mrs. HELDER, was a composite drawing of the man who is supposed to have murdered Dr. KING.

Mrs. HELDER was unable to furnish any further identifying data on the individual who rented the room from her other than the fact that he speaks with a southern accent and is allegedly from Texas.

She requested that, if Mr. STUBBS is to be interviewed, the interview not take place at her home. She is available for further contact, but also requested that in this event she be telephoned first at GI. 8-2355.

King Assassin's Trail Weaves Into Mexico

The hunt for the Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.'s assassin spread from the South into the Midwest and across the border into Mexico today amid speculation that the killer may have planted false clues to confuse the hunters.

Police said the large amount of physical evidence left behind near the scene of the murder in Memphis, Tenn., was highly unusual.

That led some law officers to suspect the assassin was trying to throw pursuers off his trail.

While federal authorities assumed complete charge of the investigation and maintained silence on its progress, FBI agents were reported to be

steadily widening the search area.

One focal point was Birmingham, Ala., where gun shop records were being checked and last week's passenger lists for Delta and Southern Airlines were being scanned for several names.

A new Remington 30.06 caliber rifle was found outside the rooming house where the killer had fired a fatal shot from a bathroom window at

King, who was standing on the balcony of a nearby motel.

It was not known what names were being sought in the airline manifests, but the man believed to be the killer had signed into the rooming house as "John Willard."

Fingerprints and handprints were discovered in the bathroom used by sniper, but there was no word on what checks of these against official records has produced. Nor would authorities reveal what inspection of a piece of blue luggage outside the rooming house had disclosed.

Copies of a composite sketch drawn from descriptions provided by persons who saw the suspected sniper were distributed to officers at the Mexican border and inside Mexico.

Rolando Veloz Canales, Mexican counsel at Memphis, reported to police that a young man resembling the sketch obtained a Mexican travel card last Wednesday—the day before King was killed.

The man gave a Chicago address in his application, but the street given proved to be vague, needing a north or south to make it complete.

The applicant listed his age as 21, whereas most witnesses described the suspect as in his late 20s. He also showed an Illinois voter registration card as proof of citizenship, but a check of voter lists showed no such name.

Witnesses disagreed over whether a man who ran from the rooming house after the shooting fled in a white Mustang. Two said he left in the opposite direction from the parked vehicle.

Others said they believed he doubled back to get the car and speed off.

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HUNT FOR KILLER SPANS WIDE AREA

Check in Mexico Reported
—False Trail Possible

MEMPHIS, April 9 — The killer of the Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. may have left a trail of false clues to confuse his pursuers.

Shortly after the murder, the police said they had never seen a case where there was so much evidence left behind.

The assassin not only left fingerprints and hand prints in his room and in the toilet from which he shot Dr. King, but he also left a blue piece of luggage and a rifle on the sidewalk outside.

Today, agents of the Federal Bureau of Investigation were reported to be looking in such widely diverse areas as Birmingham, Ala., Memphis, Chicago, and Mexico for the young, long-nosed man believed to have shot the civil rights leader.

Gun Stores Checked

In Birmingham, at the request of the F.B.I., airline agents shuffled through passenger lists at Delta and Southern Airlines for last week, checking several names.

F.B.I. agents in Birmingham were also reported to be checking the records of gun shops.

Within minutes after Dr. King's slaying, the Memphis police had confiscated the Remington .30-'06 caliber rifle that the assassin dropped outside the rooming house from which he fired the fatal shot. The rifle was new.

A new weapon such as this can almost always be traced from the manufacturer to the retailer by its serial number.

In Mexico City last night, the United Press International quoted police officials as saying that they had been asked to help in the search for Dr. King's assassin.

Copies of the sketch made from the descriptions furnished to the police at Memphis were distributed to offices at the United States-Mexican border and inside Mexico, with attention focused on the western seaport of Mazatlan.

The investigation apparently spread to Mexico after the Mexican consul at Memphis, Orlando Veloz Canales, reported to the police that a

in the sketch, which he had seen in a Memphis newspaper, had got a Mexican travel card for a trip to Mazatlan on the day before Dr. King was killed.

"I remembered him because of his long nose," Mr. Veloz said.

The address and telephone number given by the man on his application for the Mexican travel permit were improper.

Mexican Gives Name

MEXICO CITY, April 9—

Secretary of the Interior Luis Echeverria tonight identified the man the Government was checking for possible entry into Mexico as John Scott Candrian.

Mr. Echeverria said it was probable that the F.B.I. had already sought the cooperation of Mexican border officials in the case. However, he said, the F.B.I. has made no formal request to the Mexican Government.

In Mazatlan, the police said they had no knowledge of the presence there of a person

answering to the description of Candrian.

Hitchhiker Questioned

JOPLIN, Mo., April 9 (AP)—A hitchhiker arrested and booked for vagrancy was questioned by the FBI tonight in connection with the assassination of Dr. King, the police said.

The man identified himself as Lynn R. Cleveland, 33 years old, a Baptist evangelist from St. Louis, he said he was a native of Palmer, Tex.

False Police Reports of Chase After Dr. King's Death Give Impetus to Conspiracy Theories

MEMPHIS, Tenn., April 10 —A false Memphis police report broadcast shortly after the assassination of the Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. last Thursday night has given impetus to speculation that the civil rights leader was the victim of a conspiracy.

The Federal Bureau of Investigation and the Memphis police have said for several days that the killing was done by one man.

Memphis policemen who were searching for Dr. King's killer on the night he was shot were drawn to the north side of the city 34 minutes after the shooting by a false report from "police car 160" that a white Mustang automobile, believed to be the getaway car, was speeding along city streets.

Detectives have been investigating the possibility that the report was relayed by an accomplice of the killer to the central police radio in an effort to draw pursuers to north Memphis while the killer escaped across the Mississippi River into Arkansas or down U.S. Highway 55 into the State of Mississippi.

Frank C. Holloman, director of the Memphis Police and Fire Departments, said such a possibility was under "intensive investigation."

"We have this aspect as well as some other aspects of this case under investigation at this time," said Mr. Holloman. "Beyond that I cannot comment."

Mr. Holloman, who is a re-

tired F.B.I. inspector, refused today to say if he now believed that more than one person was involved in the slaying of Dr. King.

Last week, Mr. Holloman agreed with a statement by Attorney General Ramsey Clark that the slaying appeared to have been done by only one person.

Although both Mr. Holloman and Attorney General Clark have said that the slaying was extremely well planned, they said that there was no evidence indicating that more than one person had been involved.

The false police report was broadcast at 6:35 P.M., a little more than a half-hour after the fatal shot was fired. At that time the police were setting up road blocks around the city.

The report said that a white Mustang was headed east in north Memphis and being chased by police car 160.

A short time before that, the police radio had broadcast an alert for a white Mustang with a radio antenna similar to those on automobiles equipped with citizen band radio receivers and transmitters.

At 6:36 P.M., the police radio reported that a blue hardtop 1966 Pontiac had joined the chase for the white Mustang.

In the next 10 minutes, several progress reports on the "chase" were relayed through the headquarters radio to other police cars headed to the area.

At 6:47 P.M., the police radio broadcast a report that someone in the white Mustang was shooting at the blue Pontiac.

That ended the broadcasts about the chase.

The Commercial Appeal, a Memphis newspaper, today quoted Lieut. R. W. Bradshaw, who was assigned to police car 160 that night, as having said that he saw no white Mustang and did not chase one that night.

Lieut. Bradshaw said today that any comment would have to come from Mr. Holloman.

A Memphis television station, WMC-TV, said tonight that a local radio equipment dealer had reported that he had been monitoring police radio

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calls immediately after Dr. King's shooting and had heard the calls supposedly made from police car 160.

The equipment dealer's monitor, the television station said, was of such a nature that it could not have received the calls if they had been made in the area where police car 160 was located at the time.

The calls, the television station said, must have been made from an automobile in the downtown area.

The radio equipment dealer declined to be interviewed, the station said, but had given his information to the police.

Radio experts said that it would be difficult for someone with a citizens band radio to transmit to police headquarters as if the message were coming from a police car. It would require extensive modification of the radio and would have to be done by someone with more than ordinary knowledge, a radio expert said.

Set Aside by F.C.C.

Radio frequencies for citizens band radios are set aside by the Federal Communications Commission to be used by private business and individuals.

It is a violation of Federal law to transmit on radio frequencies set aside for police departments.

Investigation of the false chase reports came as the F.B.I., which has refused to comment on the case, was checking angles that had been ignored for several days.

This renewed activity by the Federal agents on old leads

has been taken to mean that some, perhaps much, of the "unusually large amount of physical evidence" that attorney General Clark said had been left at the scene of the shooting may have been part of a false trail left by the sniper.

Last Friday, Rolando Veloz Canales, the Mexican counsel at Memphis, reported that a young man with a sharp nose had gotten a travel permit to go to Mexico the day before Dr. King was killed. The address and telephone number on the application for the permit were false.

4-Day Delay Reported

Mr. Veloz said that although this information was made available to the police on Friday, the day after Dr. King was killed, the F.B.I. did not check it with him until Tuesday.

The police said today that the permit had been applied for by a 19-year-old student who had given his age as 21. The address and telephone number were supposed to have been those of his father but were given incorrectly, the police said. The youth was re-

ported to be in Arizona, and the police said that he had no connection with the slaying.

Unanswered questions that tend to suggest that Dr. King's death was the result of a conspiracy include the following:

Who was the white man with "something white" over his face that Dr. King's driver, Solomon Jones Jr., saw leap from some bushes across the street from the murder scene immediately after the shot was fired?

Mr. Jones said that the man was near the bottom floor of the rooming house from which the police said the sniper shot Dr. King, and that he ran around the side of the rooming house building.

How was the assassination so "well planned" in such a short time?

The previous week, during a visit to Memphis, Dr. King had stayed in another motel and had been in the Lorraine only one day when the sniper moved into the rooming house and found the spot best suited to shoot from.

Why did the killer discard the .20-06 caliber Remington rifle and a blue suitcase with

a pair of binoculars in it on the street in front of four witnesses?

He could have left them in his room or in the rooming house toilet if he had not wanted to call attention to himself by carrying them on the street.

Man Cleared in Missouri

JOPLIN, Mo., April 10 (AP)—

A man who was questioned briefly about the slaying of Dr. King has been cleared of any connection with the case, the police said today.

The man, who identified himself as Lynn R. Cleveland, 33 years old, an itinerant preacher, received a three-day jail sentence in Magistrate's Court on a vagrancy charge.

F.B.I. Disclaims Sketch

WASHINGTON, April 10—The F.B.I. said today it had not distributed any sketch of the King assassin.

The sketch circulated in Mexico was apparently made from radio broadcasts giving the F.B.I.'s description. No sketch has been authorized by the F.B.I.

Memphis Says Police Were Hoaxed in Plot

Memphis, April 10—Police admitted today that they had been tricked by false radio messages in the chaotic period following the assassination of Martin Luther King Jr. last Thursday.

The disclosure raised the possibility that King was the victim of a conspiracy, that more than one man was involved in a carefully laid plot.

The alternatives were that the killer used a radio to confuse pursuers or that somebody unconnected with the crime gave police bogus information out of malice.

Messages Started Coming

King was shot at 6:01 p.m. Thirty-five minutes later, the police radio car dispatcher here began to receive messages he believed were from Police Car 160. They told of a blue Pontiac chasing a white Mustang through the city at high speeds. A white Mustang had already come under suspicion as the killer's getaway car.

As a result, police concentrated their attention on the northeast section of Memphis, the area in which the chase was supposed to be in progress. The messages

continued for 12 minutes, then stopped.

Later, inquiries showed that the high-speed chase never happened and the man in charge of Car 160, Lt. W. R. Bradshaw, denied that he had reported any such chase.

Chased No Mustang

"I was not chasing a white Mustang," said Bradshaw, a uniformed officer stationed in the area. "Any further information will have to come from the chief."

Police Director Frank Holloman confirmed that the story of a pursuit of a Mustang was a phony. He said the cars could not have covered the distances reported to the dispatcher, even at 100 miles an hour. Also, he said, there were roadblocks in the area of the phantom chase.

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Neither Bradshaw nor authorities would say what the officer was doing while the bogus information was being broadcast.

Decoy messages aimed at confusing police in the vital minutes after the killing could have been transmitted to police headquarters by anybody with a two-way radio using the police wave length.

Blurred but Clear Enough

The dispatcher reported that the messages were partly blurred, as if the caller was not exactly on the police wave length. But he said that, despite some breaking up, the messages were clear enough to be understood.

If the messages were part of a deliberate attempt to throw police off the track of the killer, the presumption is that he fled south or southwest, away from the area of the false chase.

This route could take him either to Mississippi or Arkansas. Some witnesses who spotted the suspected white Mustang near the scene of the crime reported that it had Mississippi plates.

FBI Impounds Car Fitting Description

Atlanta, Ga., April 11 (AP)—Federal agents impounded today a white Mustang fitting the description of a car sought in connection with the assassination of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.

The automobile, bearing an Alabama license plate, had been parked since last Friday at a public housing development near the Capitol.

Residents of the housing development who had previously joked about the car's similarity to the wanted vehicle were questioned closely by FBI agents, the Atlanta Constitution reported.

The Constitution said two residents of the development were known to have seen a young man who, they said, fit the description of the sniper.

The newspaper said the FBI agents swarmed around the car this afternoon, snapping pictures and taking fingerprints. They had the car taken to a federal building and locked up.

ALABAMIAN NAMED IN DR. KING INQUIRY

**F.B.I. Seeking to Question
37-Year-Old Man in Case
—Car Reported Found**

MEMPHIS, Tenn., April 11—The Federal Bureau of Investigation tonight was seeking a 37-year-old Alabama man for questioning in the slaying of the Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.

An F.B.I. bulletin that was released by mistake in Miami identified the man as Eric Starvo Galt. He was described as being 5 feet 11 inches tall and weighing 175 pounds.

The F.B.I. in Washington refused to comment, but sources said that Mr. Galt was sought for questioning in connection with the assassination of the civil rights leader in Memphis a week ago tonight.

At this point the man was wanted for questioning. Charges will not necessarily be lodged against him, either now or later.

The F.B.I. bulletin, which was withdrawn apparently to prevent publicity, at 10:30 P. M., said that Mr. Galt, who has blue eyes and brown hair, was late seen driving a white Mustang car with Alabama license plates Nos. 1-38993. This is the license plate issued for a car in Birmingham.

The F.B.I. bulletin gave Mr. Galt's address as 2608 Highland Avenue in Birmingham. A Birmingham reporter who went to that address said that it was a rooming house and that other residents said they had not seen Mr. Galt in about three months.

In Atlanta tonight, the police were reported to have impounded a white Mustang that had been parked near a housing project since last Friday.

The Atlanta Constitution, a newspaper, said that a resident of the housing project had noticed the car and had notified the police. Its license number was not immediately available.

According to a report today,

the bullet that killed Dr. King had been smashed and laboratory technicians of the Federal Bureau of Investigation had been unable to match it with the Remington .30-06 caliber rifle believed to have been the assassin's weapon.

Witnesses said that the rifle had been discarded by a long-nosed white man who ran from a rooming house near Dr. King's motel immediately after the shooting.

The F.B.I. refused to comment in the report that the bullet could not be identified. But the report was consistent with information furnished by a source in Memphis, who said that the bullet was soft-nosed and had been squashed, apparently when it hit Dr. King's left shoulder blade.

Soft-nosed bullets are used in big game hunting because they expand on contact and do much more damage than the steel-jacketed bullets used by soldiers.

The Remington .30-06 caliber rifle cartridges are powerful enough to kill a man at a distance of more than a half-mile.

In an other development today, the Remington Company at Bridgeport, Conn., confirmed that one of its 30-06 rifles had been traced by the F.B.I. through its serial number.

A company spokesman said, however, that employees had been told not to give out information such as where the rifle had been shipped to be sold at retail.

The rifle apparently purchased by the assassin or an accomplice in Birmingham, Ala., last week. A clerk at a gun store near the Birmingham Airport said that the F.B.I. had checked the store's records, but she denied that the rifle was sold there. "That is just a rumor," she said.

The police refused to say today whether there were any further developments in the investigation of false police broadcasts that drew police attention away from downtown

Memphis about 30 minutes after Dr. King was shot.

False reports of a dramatic car chase, including the exchange of shots between a white Mustang and a blue Pontiac, were broadcast over the central police radio shortly after Dr. King had been taken to a hospital.

Witnesses near the scene of the shooting had given statements that led police to believe that the assassin had fled in a white Mustang.

The police dispatcher making the broadcast said that the descriptions of a chase were being fed to him by "police car 160."

A review of a tape recording of the broadcast showed that at one point the dispatcher said that the officer in police car 160 had gotten information from a "complainant."

There was speculation in the Police Department today that Lieut. R. W. Bradshaw, the officer who was assigned to car 160 on the night of the murder, might have been relaying information furnished to him over a citizens band radio.

Lieutenant Bradshaw refused to comment.

Pastor Assails Inquiry

MEMPHIS, April 11 — The Rev. James Lawson, pastor of Centenary Methodist Church, criticized today local and national police officials over the handling of the investigation. "There is a basic mistrust in the Negro community concerning the Memphis police, the F.B.I. and the Mayor's office," he said, "we do not feel that these agencies consider it in their self-interest to solve the crime."

Clark 'Optimistic as Ever'

Attorney General Clark asserted last night that he was as "optimistic as ever" that the killer of Dr. King will be apprehended.

He commented before delivering a formal address at a dinner of the Anti-Defamation League of B'nai B'rith at the Waldorf-Astoria, where he received the League's 1968 Human Rights Award.

Mystery Man In the Probe Of King Death

A mysterious new element was added today to the hunt for the Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King's assassin, after the FBI abruptly canceled a pickup order for a Birmingham, Ala., man who closely fits the killer's description.

Withdrawing the alarm without comment some four hours after it had been sent throughout Florida, the FBI refused to say whether the man, identified as Eric Starvo Galt, 36, was a suspect in the King case. But the alarm noted that no warrant had been issued for Galt.

There was no indication of Galt's whereabouts.

The abortive teletype message said Galt was last seen driving a 1966 white Mustang hardtop — the same kind of vehicle believed used by King's assassin for his getaway in Memphis, Tenn., a week ago yesterday.

But the mystery was deepened by reports that an abandoned white Mustang believed to be Galt's had been impounded by the FBI in Birmingham about the same time the alarm was issued.

The impounded vehicle

was said to bear red and white Alabama license tags with the number 1-38993, registered in Galt's name. Witnesses who saw the alleged assassin flee in Memphis said his car bore Arkansas license tags, which also are red and white.

Residents at the public housing project near the state capitol, where the car reportedly was discovered, said it had been parked in the area since last Friday, the day after King's murder.

Mrs. Ernest Payne was quoted as saying she had seen a man step out of the car who was between 25 and 30 years, 5-foot-9 or 10, and 165 to 170 pounds with sandy-colored hair. But another witness was quoted as saying the man's hair was dark and curly.

King's killer was described as between 26 and 32 years, 6-foot tall, weighing 175 pounds. The alarm said Galt was 5-foot-11, 175 pounds, with blue eyes and brown hair.

Another resident of the area, Johnny, Niesen, 13, was quoted as saying there was cigaret ash all over the car floor and red mud on the interior at the drivers' side.

The youth also told of spotting two 1967 Mexican visa stickers on the car's window. His mother was said to have notified the FBI Wednesday night after being told of the stickers and remembering that a man resembling the assassin had obtained a visitor's pass at the Mexican consulate in Memphis prior to the murder.

The FBI refused to comment on the reported impounding of the car, although agents were said to have tested it for fingerprints and questioned persons in the area before the vehicle was removed from the scene yesterday.

The address given in Galt's car registration was a two-story white rooming house in Birmingham, but residents there said they had not seen him around for about three months. They could not recall what type car he owned and said they already had been questioned by FBI agents.

Birmingham police said Galt had no police record there, and inquiries elsewhere failed to produce any details about his background.

FBI agents have traced the 30.06 Remington pump-action rifle found near the Memphis murder scene to a Birmingham gun store, where records showed it was purchased a few days before the slaying.

It has not been disclosed whether the records showed anything on the identity of the purchaser, and ballistics tests ~~the FBI~~ have failed to establish whether the rifle actually

was used in the killing.

Special Agent John Hanlon of the FBI's Miami office refused comment after withdrawing the pickup order for Galt late last night.

When asked if the teletype message had released the identity of the suspect in the King murder, Hanlon said: "I cannot comment."

Lt. Charles Wells, head of the Dade Public Safety Dept. Communications Division, said the pickup order, signed by Special Agent Charles Bell, was received from the FBI. "All we did is put it out for them," he said.

New Rules

H. O. Smith, the department shift commander, said that under new rules applied earlier this month all statewide messages must originate with the Dade County communications system.

Officers said the message had been withdrawn with the explanation that it was a mistake.

The FBI offices in Memphis and Atlanta, where the headquarters of King's Southern Christian Leadership Conference is located, also refused comment on the developments.

In Washington, an aide to Attorney General Clark said the Justice Dept. chief would have no comment.

But Clark, while attending a dinner of B'nai B'rith's Anti-Defamation League at the Waldorf-Astoria last night, told reporters he was "optimistic as ever" concerning the search for King's killer.

He said "some facts should be reported to the nation soon," but when asked what facts, he added: "I said when there are some facts, they should be reported to the nation."

Clark was at the dinner to receive the ADL's 1968 Human Rights Award.

2 Men Held

Memphis police, meanwhile, had in custody two men reportedly involved in the transmission of radio messages minutes after the assassination that falsely told of a chase of the killer's getaway car.

One, a 22-year-old part-time student whose identity was kept secret because of threats against him, told of relaying the messages received on a citizens band radio in his car to a police lieutenant in a nearby patrol car.

He was quoted as saying he relayed the messages because he "felt it was my duty as a citizen," but said he realized the messages were "fake" because the radio signals did not dim as they should have when the distance from the transmitter increased as the "chase" progressed.

Police refused to comment on the man who transmitted the messages, but he was said to have been interviewed by the FBI after he was taken into custody.

The messages were believed to have impeded police efforts to locate the getaway car and arrest its occupant.

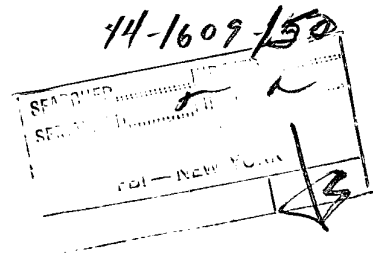

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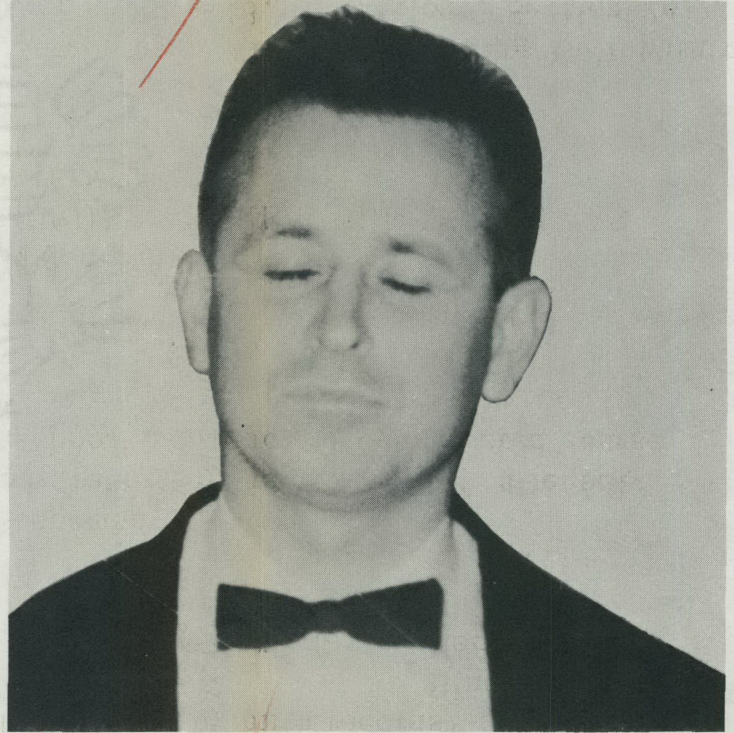

HALL stated the program was a panel-type discussion concerning the study of the march on Washington that was to be lead by Rev. MARTIN LUTHER KING in the Spring of 1968. HALL stated a white male who was a member of the panel who was sitting on the floor near a Negro who was standing and who was the moderator made several comments that dealt with KING leading the march. The white male, according to HALL, reportedly made a comment to the effect, "If KING leads the march on Washington the march will be a Negro march and the poor white people will be getting screwed."

HALL stated that upon viewing the artist's conception of the assassin of KING and comparing the description that had been set forth in local newspapers regarding the assassin, he believes the white male on the above television program who made remarks critical of KING's leadership appeared a similar description to the artist's conception of the assassin.
