



Detective JOSEPH INSALACO, Port Authority Police, who resides at 166 Lucky Hollow Drive, Paramus, New Jersey, was interviewed at the Port Authority building, La Guardia Airport, Queens, New York, and furnished the following information:

At approximately 1:50 p.m., April 6, 1968, INSALACO received a call from Patrolman FRANK PUGLIESE advising him that he had observed an individual who closely resembled the composite sketch of the assassin of Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING. Detective INSALACO proceeded from the Port Authority building, La Guardia Airport, to the Eastern Airlines Terminal at the airport, where he met Patrolman PUGLIESE, who pointed out the individual resembling the composite sketch. Detective INSALACO approached the individual and identified himself. He asked the individual if he would accompany him to the Port Authority building to answer some questions. The individual replied that he would be willing to do so and would be willing to cooperate with the police authorities in any way he could. Detective INSALACO was accompanied at the time by Captain THOMAS COFFEE, Lieutenant JOHN MAZIONE and Detective EUGENE KELLY. Upon arrival at the Port Authority building, the individual, who identified himself as JACK C. HAM, was advised by Detective KELLY at approximately 2:15 p.m. of his right to remain silent, his right to an attorney, that anything he said could be taken down and used against him in a court of law and that if he did not have sufficient funds to retain an attorney, one would be provided for him by the court. HAM advised that he was aware of his rights and would be willing to answer any questions posed to him and cooperate in any way he could with the police.

During the interview with HAM, he advised that he was in the process of getting a divorce from his wife. HAM advised that he had arrived on an Eastern Airlines Shuttle from Washington, D.C., to La Guardia Airport at approximately 1:35 p.m., and that while on the plane he might have made comments concerning the assassination of MARTIN LUTHER KING. HAM advised Detective INSALACO that he felt there were certain people in the United States who should be assassinated, and that he felt KING was a traitor to this country and that he (HAM) would assassinate KING if ordered to do so by the proper authorities.

HAM advised that he was not now and had never been a member of any organization plotting the assassination of MARTIN LUTHER KING. HAM advised Detective INSALACO that he may have been in Memphis, Tennessee, on April 4, 1968, but could not remember for sure. HAM advised he had been arrested on one occasion for driving while intoxicated in Kansas. HAM advised that if three different individuals could show him there was a necessity to commit an assassination, that he would do so without any feeling of guilt. Detective INSALACO advised that HAM appeared to be emotionally unstable and could give only a disjointed account of his whereabouts during the past week. He advised that HAM had no baggage upon his arrival at La Guardia and was carry two small airline bags when he departed the plane.

INSALACO advised that due to the possible connection with the assassination of MARTIN LUTHER KING, he notified the Federal Bureau of Investigation concerning the incident with JACK C. HAM.

On April 6, 1968, Patrolman FRANK PUGLIESE, who resides at 439 7th Street, Brooklyn, New York, Port Authority Police, New York, New York, was interviewed at the Port Authority building, La Guardia Airport, Queens, New York, and furnished the following information:

PUGLIESE advised that he was on duty in the Eastern Airlines Terminal of La Guardia Airport at 1:40 p.m. when he observed an individual in the terminal who bore a resemblance to a composite sketch of the assassin of MARTIN LUTHER KING. This sketch had appeared in the New York "Daily News." PUGLIESE was approached by two men who had a copy of the New York "Daily News" showing the above sketch. They advised that a passenger on the Eastern Airlines Washington, D.C., to New York Shuttle resembled the person shown in the composite sketch. They identified this individual as being identical with the individual PUGLIESE had observed a short time earlier in the terminal. They advised PUGLIESE that while on the plane this individual made statements that he would commit assassination if ordered to do so by the proper authorities, he also stated that he had been in Memphis, Tennessee, at the time of the shooting of MARTIN LUTHER KING, and made numerous statements concerning Dr. KING and his assassination. This individual also stated that he might be forced to take his own life. PUGLIESE further advised that he obtained a business card from one of the men which reflects the following information:

PUGLIESE then approached the individual who resembled the composite sketch and asked him to identify himself. This individual identified himself as JACK HAM, by showing a Masonic order card. PUGLIESE recorded HAM's name and keeping HAM under surveillance, telephoned the police desk at the Port Authority building at approximately 1:50 p.m.

Shortly thereafter, at about 1:59 p.m., the following officers of the Port Authority Police arrived at the Eastern Terminal: Captain THOMAS COFFEE, Lieutenant JOHN MANZIONE, Detective JOSEPH INSALACO and Detective EUGENE KELLY. Detective INSALACO asked Mr. HAM if he would mind accompanying the officers to the Port Authority building to answer some questions. Mr. HAM advised that he would be willing to do so and would be willing to cooperate in any way that he could with the police authorities. PUGLIESE then turned over custody of Mr. HAM to Detective INSALACO.

Warden Thinks King Suspect Was

Paid Killer

Suddenly, the shrouds of mystery and confusion surrounding the elusive phantom known as Eric Starvo Galt were ripped apart yesterday.

The man wanted for the murder of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. stood revealed as a man of many aliases, a ruthless criminal capable of murder for a price.

An Escapee From Pen

The discovery through a fingerprint check that Galt was in reality James Earl Ray, an escapee from the Missouri State Penitentiary, strengthened theories that King had been the victim of a paid assassin.

"There is no doubt in my mind that Ray could be a paid assassin," Warden Harold Swensen said. "He is extremely dangerous, cold-blooded and ruthless."

Additional evidence that Ray might have killed for cash came from Los Angeles, where the wanted man lived prior to the assassination. Witnesses reported they saw Ray flashing large amounts of money in bars and restaurants there.

Attempts to Escape

The picture of Ray that emerged yesterday showed a tough, habitual criminal, a man who would resist arrest until he was brought down by gunfire, a man who could not stay out of jail but had a violent hatred of confinement.

In the Missouri jail he was given the nickname "The Mole," because of his frequent attempts to escape. Twice he was reported missing, only to be discovered hiding within the prison walls.

The third attempt was successful. On April 23, 1967, Ray was working in the bakery, an assign-



ment which meant he was under close supervision.

Waiting until the guards' attention was distracted, he slipped into a bread basket six feet long and two feet wide. He covered himself with loaves of bread which were to be shipped to a prison farm.

"A Very Smart Cookie"

When the loaves were carried out of the jail, Ray went with them. His absence was not discovered for several hours. No trace of him was found.

"He was a very smart cookie," said Swenson. "He was tough, wiry and very determined to go over the wall."

"He would never accept con-

finement. He had to be out. . . free to do whatever he pleased. They called him 'The Mole' because he would dig into the earth, do anything to try to get out."

\$190 Holdup Jails Him

The warden said that Ray never showed any prejudice against Negroes. "He was a loner while in prison" Swenson said. "He was not aggressive in manner, but the general feeling among the prisoners seemed to be that he was a man to be left alone."

However, Ray was with another ex-convict, James Owens, when he held up a store on St. Louis' South Side for \$190—the

crime for which he was sent to the state pen.

When Ray was being taken to the court room by a sheriff's deputy, he tried to escape by jumping into an elevator on the third floor of the courthouse. The deputy grabbed his prisoner, handcuffed him and took him into the court room.

Crimes of Violence

Swenson said that Ray had undergone a mental examination in the fall of 1966. It revealed no personality difficulties not common to confined men.

A check of Ray's prison record showed that his previous crimes

California Alerted

El Centro, Calif., April 19 (Reuters) — The FBI alerted police in the Imperial Valley today that a man answering the description of the alleged assassin of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. was seen Monday about four and one-half miles west of here, carrying a blue bottle filled with water.

They said the man, a hitchhiker, told an unidentified El Centro man that he was headed for Yuma, Ariz. The FBI would make no further comment.

were mostly smalltime but violent.

In Chicago in 1952, he hailed a cab, put a gun to the driver's head and took \$11.

Robert Everhart, 48, a photo-engraving salesman who saw the holdup, yesterday described what happened next. "I saw the gun at the driver's neck and then saw the driver walk away," he said.

"The robber saw me following him and he ran. I chased him into an alley. He was cornered there when police joined me.

"One of the policemen told him to stop but he tried to go over a fence. The cop fired a warning shot which didn't stop him and then he fired two shots which hit him and he fell into an areaway.

Calls Him Mean, Surly

"He then said to me: 'What the hell are you going to get out of this? What are you, a hero?' He was mean and surly and I wouldn't be surprised if he committed the crime (King's assassination) he's accused of."

Ray served just under two years in the state penitentiary for the Chicago crime.

Ray was arrested for the St.

Louis hold-up in a boarding house in a run-down section of the city. Detectives found him coming out of a communal bathroom.

They ordered him to stand still but he started running down a corridor, cursing at the police. He was grabbed but put up violent resistance, knocking one policeman to the ground.

Finally, he was subdued by a blow to the head with a service revolver.

But a few minutes later he made another break for freedom. Only when one of the detectives

fired a warning shot did he stop and allow himself to be handcuffed.

From Broken Home

Records at the Missouri jail showed that Ray was the son of a laborer. The father deserted his family in 1947 and never returned.

His mother, now dead, was listed as Mrs. Lucille Ryan of 1915 Hickory St., St. Louis.

Police in Los Angeles disclosed that a wanted poster issued by Missouri authorities in the original search for Ray said he had two brothers, John Ray of St.

Louis and Jerry W. Ray of Wheeling, Ill.

The federal warrant for "Galt" accused him of conspiring with an "alleged brother" in the death of King. There were indications, however, that the FBI referred to the brother merely because this allowed them to use the conspiracy charge.

On His Head: \$100,000

James Earl Ray, identified yesterday as the man sought in the slaying of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr., has a price of \$100,000 on his head. That is the total of rewards offered after the murder for information leading to the arrest and conviction of the killer.

FBI's massive identification unit can be credited with the identification of mystery man Eric Starvo Galt as murder suspect James Earl Ray.

The identification of Galt as Ray would have been impossible except for the systematic examination and comparison of latent prints found at the Memphis site of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.'s assassination with the prints of more than 53,000 persons on the FBI fugitive lists. The 53,000 prints were among 187 million in the Bureau's files.

FBI Names Jailbreaker

Washington, April 19 (NEWS Bureau)—James Earl Ray, 40, a Missouri prison escapee and "drifter" with a long criminal record, was identified today by the FBI as the mysterious Eric Starvo Galt, sought in a nationwide manhunt as the slayer of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.

FBI Director J. Edgar Hoover said that a check of the fingerprints of 53,000 fugitives in the FBI's files had established that Galt and Ray were the same man. Ray has been missing since he fled the Missouri State Penitentiary at Jefferson City on April 23, 1967.

The FBI gave no indication that it had any clue as to the whereabouts of the man who has been the object of a massive search since warrants were issued Wednesday under his alias as Galt charging him with murder and conspiracy.

A three-page statement identifying Ray as Galt and photos of the suspect—including an eight-year-old mug shot—were distributed to newsmen at FBI headquarters. Reporters were not permitted to leave the building until given the go-ahead by an FBI spokesman.

The FBI declined to elaborate on its announcement, which dealt mainly with Ray's criminal record, starting in 1949 and leading up to a 1960 conviction for armed robbery, for which he was serving a 20-year term when he escaped.

Silence on "Hired Killer"

Asked if the fact that Ray had a long criminal record lent support to the theory that the sniper who shot King April 4 in Memphis, Tenn., was a "hired killer," a FBI spokesman replied: "No comment."

August, also indicated that he might have been an entirely bogus personality created by the man wanted in the King assassination.

There were some conflicts on dates, however, between what the FBI announced Wednesday about Galt and what came out today,

identifying him as Ray. The Wednesday statement stated Galt was "said to be an avid dancer and took dancing lessons in New Orleans in 1964 and 1965," but today's announcement showed Ray was in the Missouri prison then. The Wednesday Galt announcement put his birthdate at July 20, 1931.

Born in Illinois, He Said

The FBI said today that Ray "claims to have been born March 10, 1928, in Illinois," but its announcement did not list the city of birth. It said Ray also stated that he attended school through the 10th grade in Alton, Ill.

Ray was received at the Missouri penitentiary on March 17, 1960, to serve the 20-year term resulting from his conviction in St. Louis for armed robbery and for operating a motor vehicle without the owner's permission. In September 1966, he was confined for a time in the maximum

security ward at the state hospital at Fulton, Mo.

An FBI spokesman, asked about Ray's confinement in the state hospital, declined to comment on whether he was a mental patient or had been found to be psychotic.

Long Known as Drifter

"He has had the reputation of being a 'drifter' since leaving school," the FBI said. "His vocational experience includes working as a baker, laborer and color matcher."

None of these occupations had been ascribed to the phony Galt, who was supposed to have worked as a cook on Mississippi River vessels, and as a merchant seaman, and to have attended a bartenders' school in Los Angeles earlier this year.

Ray's arrest record dates back to 1949 when he served a term in the Los Angeles County Jail. He also served time in Illinois state prisons at Joliet and Pontiac in 1952-54 and was held in the federal penitentiary at Leavenworth, Kan., in 1955-58.

First Jailed as Burglar

His first conviction in 1949 was for burglary and he was convicted of armed robbery in

Chicago in 1952 and for forging postal money orders in Missouri in 1955.

Hoover said that Ray was an enlisted man in the Army from February 1946 to December 1948, when he received a general discharge, given to persons found unsuited for military service, but not considered a dishonorable or a bad conduct discharge.

Ray got this type of discharge, The FBI said, "due to ineptness

and lack of adaptability for military service." It added: "While in the Army, he received a three-month sentence at hard labor for being drunk and breaking arrest."

According to the FBI, Ray also has used the aliases of James McBride, James Walton, W. C. Herron and James O'Conner during his criminal career.

"Ray should be considered armed and extremely dangerous," the FBI said.

Under the name of Galt, Ray has been hunted from coast to coast and in Mexico since King, winner of the 1964 Nobel peace prize, was shot to death April 4 while standing on the balcony of a Memphis motel.

The killer fired from a locked bathroom of a flophouse opposite the motel and fled. Several fingerprints were found.

FBI Under Fire on King Case

By RALPH BLUMENFELD

The FBI today faced mounting criticism of its tactics in tracking down the sniper who killed the Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. 18 days ago.

Police in Memphis and other cities charge that federal officials have discouraged local investigations of King's murder and caused confusion with varying descriptions of alleged slayer James Earl Ray, 40, alias Eric Starvo Galt.

"You don't know what to look for," complained Asst. Police Chief Bill Price in Memphis, citing "a whole lot of discrepancies" in the FBI's Friday identification of Ray.

An while FBI director J. Edgar Hoover ordered a special Mexican border alert to keep fugitive from leaving the country, Memphis detectives continued working on their own theory—that Galt was amnyth carefully created by conspirators to hide the killer's real identity.

Little on His Past

"Somebody has muddled the waters," said Price.

Until three days ago, a major problem was the limited federal dossier on Galt's past. The FBI resolved that problem by saying that a fingerprint check showed Galt was actually Ray, an escapee from Missouri State Prison missing since April 23, 1967.

Police in Atlanta, Birmingham and Los Angeles as well as Memphis quickly noted discrepancies between the FBI's description of Ray and its earlier data on Galt.

Ray was four years older, a native of Alton, Ill. with a Midwestern twang. Galt had a Southern drawl. Ray was an indifferent drinker but Galt liked beer and vodka. Ray was a sloppy dresser. Galt neat and clean.

Took Dancing Lessons

Galt liked country and Western music and reportedly took dancing lessons in New Orleans in 1964 and 1965—a time when Ray was still in prison on a 20-year sentence for armed robbery. A fellow inmate said Ray "never expressed any liking for music or dancing and he was tight to gamble. He was tight as a tick. Boy, if you owed him money, even a few cents, he'd bug you to death."

In contrast, Galt was depicted as a free spender. He paid at least \$500 for dancing lessons, plus tuition for bartending school, and \$2,000 cash for the white 1966 Mustang which was his alleged getaway car in Memphis, later found abandoned in Atlanta.

Ray's fellow inmate expressed doubt that he could be a "hired assassin" who killed

King for profit. And the prison's warden, Harold Swenson, said: "I won't believe he did it until it's proven."

Dr. Donald B. Peterson, a prison psychiatrist who examined Ray for five weeks in 1966, said he was a recidivistic habitual criminal whose crimes were all associated with money. "We didn't find anything to indicate he was a killer or had tendencies to kill."

There was growing concern that when Ray is tracked down he might be shot by his captors, since the FBI has labeled him "armed and extremely dangerous."

An Atlanta newspaper questioned the wisdom of that label, warning that if the No. 1 suspect in the King case is killed the motive for the assassination may never be known and the country may be wracked with rumors and doubts as it has been since President Kennedy's murder.

Needs Protection

"We regard it as imperative that James Earl Ray be taken into custody alive and closely protected thereafter," the paper said in a lead editorial. "If this is the killer, every possible step must be taken to see that he is not silenced before he talks. The country can be done great harm if the truth is not established."

Ray's trail ended in Atlanta in the early morning of April 5, some 12 to 14 hours after the Memphis assassination, when a man believed to be Ray was seen leaving the Mustang in an Atlanta public housing project.

Police in the four cities where the manhunt is concentrated have practically been shunted aside by federal agents. In Birmingham a detective lieutenant who tried to question a clerk who allegedly sold Ray a rifle was called off by the FBI when the clerk refused to talk.

The FBI investigation is being handled at the highest level. Its only two press releases have been issued by Atty. Gen. Ramsey Clark and Hoover. They have given no indication why more widespread police efforts have been discouraged in a case that technically concerns a state offense—murder.

Alert Mexican Border in Manhunt

Washington, April 21 (UPI)—The FBI said today it was hunting the assassin of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. with "all possible vigor," but that there was nothing new to report in the nation's largest manhunt, now in its 17th day.

Prison escapee James Earl Ray was given an "extraordinary emergency" listing on the FBI's roster of most wanted criminals

and a special alert was ordered along the Mexican border to prevent him from leaving the country.

"All Possible Vigor"

But the FBI, which is directing the massive search, had nothing new to report since yesterday, when it made Ray alias Eric Starvo, the 11th man on its 10 most wanted list. The FBI would only say that the search

"is going along with all possible vigor."

FBI Director J. Edgar Hoover put Ray on the most-wanted list to insure the widest possible dissemination of the 40-year-old criminal's picture and description to the police and public. In addition, he made arrangements to have Ray's picture shown tonight on the ABC's TV program The FBI.

On 4/23/68, the newspaper files of the New York City Public Library, Annex Building, 43rd Street between 16th and 11th Avenues, New York, New York, were searched for the Friday, July 30, 1965 edition of the New York World Telegram - The Sun, for a photograph of one Jack Barnes.

On page number 17, second section, of the aforementioned paper appears a photograph and its caption is, "Jack Barnes, National Chairman, Young Socialist Alliance". Below this photograph is an article entitled "The Extremists Cry Revolt", by David Smothers - United Press International.

A comparison was made between the photograph in the paper and photographs of James Earl Ray appearing on Bureau I.O. 4182 dated 4/20/68 and a slight resemblance was noted particularly concerning the ears, nose and mouth features, however, the hairline and eyebrows bore marked dissimilarities.

A review of the article by David Smothers disclosed that Jack Barnes left arm is missing at the elbow.

that in 1965 he was age 25, and that Barnes had stated that he left Dayton, Ohio to attend Carleton College in Minnesota. That as a graduate student in economics he studied at Northwestern University before becoming a professional socialist and leader of about 1,000 YSA (Young Socialist Alliance) members scattered in fifty university based chapters.

The article contained two comments of interest, however; one concerning Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. read as follows: "He and others have built an illusion by telling the colored people they can gain freedom now under the present system of government. The second comment allegedly made by a leader of Barnes's following was quoted as saying, "We'd assassinate the president if it suited our ends. Don't think we couldn't do it."

However, based upon the facts that Barnes's left arm is reported missing at the elbow and the age and description differences, as well as apparent background differences it is felt that James Earl Ray and Jack Barnes are not identical but two separate and distinct individuals.
