He stated he understands B [REDACTED] bought this license plate for a Ford Falcon but switched it to the Mustang after selling the Falcon.

W [REDACTED] advised he works regularly at the Briarwood Texaco Service Station from 7:00 a.m. until 7:00 p.m. six days a week and has not been off from work any this year other than the trip to Nevada mentioned above. He stated he is off each Thursday all day which is his regular day off. W [REDACTED] advised he has not been in Memphis, Tennessee, or Birmingham, Alabama, during the past six months. He stated that on April 4, 1968, he was at Jackson, Mississippi. He stated he was working on a car behind the service station where he works at about 6:00 p.m. on April 4, 1968, and was talking to C [REDACTED] B [REDACTED], at which time he heard about Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING's being shot at Memphis, Tennessee.

Information received from the Oklahoma City FBI Office on April 14, 1968, reveals that Reverend S. H. [REDACTED] Oklahoma City, Oklahoma, observed an individual at 7:15 p.m. on April 13, 1968, proceeding east on Interstate Highway 40, about forty miles east of Oklahoma City, Oklahoma. This individual resembled the artist conception of the murderer of Doctor MARTIN LUTHER KING which recently appeared in an Oklahoma City newspaper. Reverend H. [REDACTED] a former Oklahoma City policeman, stated this individual was driving a black Mustang convertible with white top and the vehicle was bearing 1968 Mississippi license HB-9317.

Reverend H. [REDACTED] was interviewed by the FBI at Oklahoma City and advised that the artist sketch of the individual observed at Birmingham in connection with this case bears some resemblance to the individual observed by him in the above mentioned Mustang. He stated that the individual he saw had a long sharp nose and was dressed in green uniform type work clothes.

On April 15, 1968, Sheriff F. [REDACTED] T. [REDACTED] Hinds County Sheriff's Office, Jackson, Mississippi, advised that 1968 Mississippi license [REDACTED] was issued to D. [REDACTED] B. [REDACTED] [REDACTED], Jackson, Mississippi, for a 1962 Ford.

D. [REDACTED] B. [REDACTED] [REDACTED] Jackson, Mississippi, was interviewed by SA S. [REDACTED] J. [REDACTED] on April 15, 1968, regarding the 1968 Mississippi license HB-9317 which was issued to a 1962 Ford owned by B. [REDACTED] The interview is as follows:

Re Oklahoma City letter to Memphis dated 4/17/68.

Registration records of Lorraine Hotel, 406 Mulberry, Memphis, Tennessee, where KING was shot, fail to reflect name H [REDACTED] H [REDACTED] and owner W [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] did not recognize photograph of H [REDACTED] as anyone ever staying at his hotel. All persons at Lorraine Hotel on either 4/3/68 or 4/4/68 are being interviewed concerning any information they might have regarding assassination.

For information of Oklahoma City, KING was shot on 4/4/68 at approximately 6:00 p.m., while standing with his back to his room on the balcony of the second floor level. The shot came from a direction in front of KING. Interviewing Agents should endeavor to obtain only facts from individuals interviewed, keeping in mind high degree of emotion generated as a result of the assassination, which may affect the individual's ability to factually relate what he observed at time of assassination.

ATTORNEY GENERAL RAMSEY CLARK ANNOUNCED TODAY THAT THE FBI HAS IDENTIFIED JAMES EARL RAY, AN ESCAPEE FROM THE MISSOURI STATE PENITENTIARY, AS ERIC STARVO GALT, AGAINST WHOM A FEDERAL COMPLAINT WAS FILED LAST WEDNESDAY IN CONNECTION WITH THE FATAL SHOOTING OF THE REVEREND DR. MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR.

DIRECTOR J. EDGAR HOOVER SAID THAT A SYSTEMATIC AND EXHAUSTIVE SEARCH OF LATENT FINGERPRINTS UNCOVERED IN THE DR. KING CASE AGAINST THE FINGERPRINTS OF THE OVER 53,000 PERSONS FROM WHOM "WANTED NOTICES" HAVE BEEN POSTED IN THE FILES OF THE FBI'S IDENTIFICATION DIVISION LED TO THE DETERMINATION THAT GALT AND RAY ARE IDENTICAL.

MR. HOOVER SAID THAT RAY, WHO IS 40 YEARS OF AGE, WAS REPORTED MISSING FROM THE MISSOURI STATE PENITENTIARY AT JEFFERSON CITY, MISSOURI, SINCE APRIL 23, 1967. HE HAD BEEN RECEIVED AT THAT INSTITUTION ON MARCH 17, 1960, TO SERVE A 20-YEAR SENTENCE FOLLOWING CONVICTION IN ST. LOUIS FOR ARMED ROBBERY AND FOR OPERATING A MOTOR VEHICLE WITHOUT PERMISSION OF THE OWNER.

IN SEPTEMBER, 1966, WHILE SERVING THIS SENTENCE, HE WAS CONFINED FOR A TIME IN THE MAXIMUM SECURITY WARD AT THE STATE HOSPITAL AT FULTON, MISSOURI.

ACCORDING TO MR. HOOVER, RAY HAS A KNOWN ARREST RECORD DATING BACK TO 1949. PRIOR TO THE 1960 CONVICTION FOR WHICH HE RECEIVED THE 20-YEAR TERM, RAY HAD BEEN CONVICTED OF BURGLARY IN LOS ANGELES, CALIFORNIA, IN 1949; ARMED ROBBERY IN CHICAGO, ILLINOIS, IN 1952; AND FORGING UNITED STATES POSTAL MONEY ORDERS IN MISSOURI IN 1955.

HE HAS SERVED TERMS IN THE LOS ANGELES COUNTY JAIL IN 1949; IN STATE PRISONS AT JOLIET AND PONTIAC, ILLINOIS, IN 1952-54; AND IN THE FEDERAL PENITENTIARY AT LEAVENWORTH, KANSAS, IN 1955-58.

RAY WAS AN ENLISTED MAN IN THE UNITED STATES ARMY FROM FEBRUARY, 1946, TO DECEMBER, 1948, AT WHICH TIME HE WAS GIVEN A GENERAL DISCHARGE DUE TO INEPTNESS AND LACK OF ADAPTABILITY FOR MILITARY SERVICE. WHILE IN THE ARMY, HE RECEIVED A THREE-MONTH SENTENCE AT HARD LABOR FOR BEING DRUNK AND BREAKING ARREST.

MR. HOOVER SAID THAT DURING HIS CRIMINAL CAREER, RAY HAS ALSO USED THE NAMES OF JAMES MCBRIDE, JAMES WALTON, W. C. HERRON AND JAMES O'CONNER. HE IS A WHITE MALE; CLAIMS TO HAVE

BEEN BORN [REDACTED] IN ILLINOIS; IS APPROXIMATELY 5 FEET 10 INCHES TALL AND WEIGHS ABOUT 163 TO 174 POUNDS. HE HAS BLUE EYES AND BROWN HAIR. THERE IS A SMALL SCAR ON THE CENTER OF HIS FOREHEAD AND A SCAR ON THE PALM OF HIS RIGHT HAND.

RAY HAS CLAIMED THAT HE ATTENDED SCHOOL THROUGH THE 10TH GRADE IN ALTON, ILLINOIS. HE HAS HAD THE REPUTATION OF BEING A "DRIFTER" SINCE LEAVING SCHOOL. HIS VOCATIONAL EXPERIENCE INCLUDES WORKING AS A BAKER, LABORER AND COLOR MATCHER.

IN CONNECTION WITH HIS ESCAPE FROM THE MISSOURI STATE PENITENTIARY, AN FBI COMPLAINT WAS FILED IN JEFFERSON CITY, MISSOURI, ON JULY 20, 1967, CHARGING RAY WITH UNLAWFULLY FLEEING FROM THE STATE OF MISSOURI TO AVOID CONFINEMENT. HE HAS BEEN A FEDERAL FUGITIVE SINCE THEN.

RAY SHOULD BE CONSIDERED ARMED AND EXTREMELY DANGEROUS. ANYONE HAVING INFORMATION CONCERNING HIM SHOULD IMMEDIATELY CONTACT FBI HEADQUARTERS IN WASHINGTON, D. C., OR THE NEAREST FBI OFFICE.

On 4/12/68 R [REDACTED] and D [REDACTED] Del City, Oklahoma, were interviewed by SAs B [REDACTED] C [REDACTED] and M [REDACTED] K [REDACTED]. Mr. and Mrs. B [REDACTED] after being advised of the nature of the inquiry stated they had known T [REDACTED] L [REDACTED] for a good many years as he lives with Mrs. B [REDACTED]'s mother in Apopka, Florida.

Mrs. B [REDACTED] stated she, on many occasions, had heard LEWIS talk about the possibility of killing MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR., and stated he would like to be the one who could kill KING. She stated he had frequently talked violently about killing KING and has stated he had been paid by the Ku Klux Klan to kill KING. Mrs. B [REDACTED] stated while she was living with her mother and father, E [REDACTED] and V [REDACTED] R [REDACTED] Apopka, Florida, she had heard "Klans men" came to her mother's house and talked to L [REDACTED] about killing MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR. She stated one time she heard a man tell L [REDACTED] he had been paid to go to Georgia to kill KING, and if he got caught, the Klan was to deny any association with him in connection with this killing. Mr. B [REDACTED] stated L [REDACTED] had told him Easter, 1966, the Ku Klux Klan had offered him \$250,000 to kill KING and during this conversation, L [REDACTED] kept mentioning the name, F [REDACTED].

Mr. B [REDACTED] stated on the night of 4/10-11/68 about 2:30 a.m., he observed L [REDACTED] his mother-in-law, V [REDACTED] R [REDACTED] his sister-in-law, J [REDACTED] M [REDACTED] and his brother-in-law, B [REDACTED] M [REDACTED], parked in a blue and white 1956 Buick, two-door, sedan, at the corner of Townsend and Fairview, two blocks from his residence. Mr. B [REDACTED] stated this 1956 Buick bore Colorado licenses, which licenses were of an orange background with black numerals.

Mr. B [REDACTED] stated L [REDACTED] had been released from Chattahoochee State Hospital, Chattahoochee, Florida, where he had been confined from June, 1967, to January, 1968. He stated he knew that L [REDACTED] had been confined to the Georgia State Prison at Reidsville, Georgia, where he had been confined for murder and had been given a life sentence. He stated he did not know the details of how L [REDACTED] got out of this prison.

Mr. and Mrs. B [REDACTED] described T [REDACTED] L [REDACTED] as approximate 45 years of age, 165-170 pounds, 5'10", brown-gray hair, parted in middle, wears brown horn-rimmed glasses, and has numerous tattoos on both arms.

Mr. and Mrs. B [REDACTED] stated L [REDACTED] is armed with a .38 caliber Smith and Wesson revolver, snub nose, nickel plated, and a double barreled sawed-off .12 gauge shotgun and has stated he had killed before and would not hesitate to kill again.

Mrs. B [REDACTED] stated her only relative in Oklahoma City is her sister, J [REDACTED] M [REDACTED] and her husband, B [REDACTED] M [REDACTED] who live in a trailer park east of Midwest City on the south side of Southeast 29th Street. She stated Mr. M [REDACTED] is in the U.S. Air Force, assigned to Tinker AFB.

On 4/12/68 Sgt. B [REDACTED] M [REDACTED] [REDACTED] was interviewed at Tinker AFB, Oklahoma City, telephone [REDACTED]. Mr. M [REDACTED] stated he last saw L [REDACTED] approximately two years ago when L [REDACTED] was in Oklahoma City with his mother-in-law, V [REDACTED] R [REDACTED]. He stated his wife had told him L [REDACTED] and V [REDACTED] R [REDACTED] had appeared in their home in January, 1968, however, his wife would not permit them to enter their home. He stated he last had contact with L [REDACTED] when he telephonically contacted his mother-in-law in Apopka, Florida, [REDACTED], for the purpose of permitting his oldest son to talk to his grandmother, inasmuch as it was his birthday. He stated T [REDACTED] L [REDACTED] answered the phone when he called.

Mr. M [REDACTED] stated he had heard L [REDACTED] had had direct contact with the Ku Klux Klan and L [REDACTED] had spoken frequently of attending Klan meetings. Mr. M [REDACTED] stated, however, he had no concrete information that L [REDACTED] was a member of the Ku Klux Klan and his information, along this line, was merely second hand. He stated he had heard L [REDACTED] had been in a prison in Georgia for manslaughter, which involved L [REDACTED] "throwing a Nigger in a bonfire after beating him up." He always had heard from his wife's mother that L [REDACTED] had been involved in placing a bomb in a Negro school in Orlando, Florida, several years ago.

Mr. M [REDACTED] stated L [REDACTED] had often talked of persons of the Negro race in a derogatory manner.

Mr. M [REDACTED] stated he had never heard L [REDACTED] speak of killing MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR., even though he has heard him speak of wanting to kill various Negro people.

Mr. M [REDACTED] described T [REDACTED] L [REDACTED] as white male, 50 years old, 5'8", 180-185, brown complexion, dark brown, wavy hair, parted near the middle and balding.

Mr. M [REDACTED] stated he had heard his wife state L [REDACTED] was armed with a .38 caliber Smith and Wesson revolver.

Throughout the interview with Mr. and Mrs. B [REDACTED] it appeared each were attempting to say what they felt the interviewing Agents wanted to hear in connection with the MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR., murder. Mrs. B [REDACTED] voluntarily stated L [REDACTED] had stated to her even though he carried a pistol and a shotgun, he did not like to use these weapons, as he would rather use a rifle because with a pistol or shotgun, you had to get too close to someone to shoot them. Mrs. B [REDACTED] stated L [REDACTED] said he "just loved to snipe at people." It will be noted a review of file 62-3419 and through interview of Mr. and Mrs. B [REDACTED] that a child custody suit has taken place in the past between Mrs. B [REDACTED] and her mother, and this suit is still in process. Mrs. B [REDACTED] noted L [REDACTED] has been involved between her and her mother in this suit, wherein she is attempting to regain complete custody of her young daughter and obviously quite a bit of animosity toward L [REDACTED] is felt between the B [REDACTED]

Inasmuch as L [REDACTED] does not fit the general description of the Unknown Subject, who killed MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR., and upon the advice of the ASAC, no further investigation is being conducted with regard to this information.

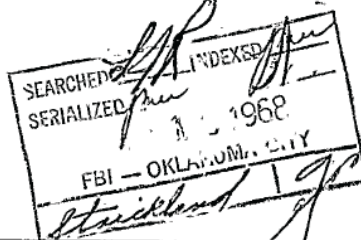

K█████ advised that they were listening to the car radio and the news of the shooting of M█████ E█████ was broadcast and the three of them were trying to figure out a route to Memphis which would bypass possible road blocks. During the conversation which took place K█████ recalled S█████ and W█████ discussing the fact that S█████ had been offered a \$10,000. payment to kill MARTIN LUTHER KING. They did not elaborate on this other than to indicate that when both were in the state penitentiary at McAlester, Oklahoma, some "agents" had come to interview S█████ concerning this alleged offer and payment and that he had "run them off" meaning that he had refused to talk to the agents about the matter.

K█████ was quizzed thoroughly concerning this incident and advised that it was not discussed further, nor would S█████ mention who had approached him with the offer.

K█████ stated that S█████ is perfectly capable of committing a murder and is a known hater of Negroes. According to K█████ S█████ is not known to make jokes and it was believable to K█████ that an actual offer was made to S█████ by someone.

For the information of offices receiving, D█████ S█████ is presently incarcerated at Fort Payne, Alabama and has been incarcerated during the period of the MARTIN LUTHER KING murder which would definitely eliminate S█████ as a suspect.

At about 6 p.m. on 4/4/68, while standing on the second floor balcony outside Room 306 of the Lorraine Motel, 406 Mulberry Street, Memphis, Tennessee, Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR. was struck in the right side of the face by a single bullet fired from a 30-06 rifle. The bullet severed KING's spinal cord and death was almost instantaneous.

This investigation, predicated upon a specific request from the Attorney General of the United States, disclosed that the fatal shot had been fired from the bathroom of a cheap rooming house located at 422½ South Main Street, Memphis, which bathroom was located at the rear of the rooming house, and had a window overlooking the Lorraine Motel.

At about 3 p.m. on 4/4/68, an individual using the name JOHN WILLARD had rented Room 5-B in the rooming house at 422½ South Main Street and had paid one week's rent. After hearing the rifle shot at about 6 p.m. on that same day, other tenants in the rooming house observed a man presumably identical with WILLARD, fleeing from the rooming house carrying a large package which was subsequently abandoned by him on the sidewalk in front of the Canipe Amusement Co., 424 South Main Street, Memphis. A neighborhood investigation in the vicinity of 424 South Main Street disclosed that the subject had fled from the scene in a white Mustang.

Found abandoned in front of 424 South Main Street was a 30-06 Remington model 760 rifle which was determined to have been

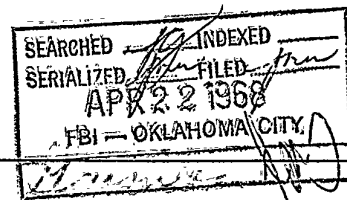

sold to one HARVEY LOWMEYER on 3/30/68 by Aeromarine Supply Co., Birmingham, Alabama.

Investigation at Memphis disclosed that an individual had purchased a set of binoculars at the York Arms Company in Memphis on 4/4/68. These binoculars were among the material abandoned with the rifle and recovered in Memphis. Also recovered was a brown and green herringbone bedspread. The items abandoned in Memphis were all wrapped in this bedspread. The blue bag which was inside the bedspread contained numerous items, among which were the binoculars and a set of underwear consisting of a T-shirt and shorts. The T-shirt and shorts are those on which appears the laundry mark which has been a matter of interest in this case.

A search of motel records in the Memphis area disclosed that an individual using the name ERIC S. GALT had spent the night of 4/3/68 at the Rebel Motel, Memphis, Tennessee, and was driving a 1966 white Mustang bearing Alabama License 1-38993. Investigation at Birmingham disclosed that this automobile had been purchased by ERIC S. GALT on August 30, 1968, from a private person in response to a newspaper ad. He paid a total of \$1995 cash. While in Birmingham he furnished the address of 2608 South Highland Avenue, Birmingham. This is also the address which appeared on a driver's license issued to him by the State of Alabama. The driver's license identifying data listed his birth date as [REDACTED], his height as 5'11", his weight as 170 and his eyes blue and hair brown.

The automobile in question, the white Mustang bearing the Alabama tags mentioned above, was recovered in Atlanta on 4/11/68 and determined to have been abandoned there prior to 9 a.m. on 4/5/68.

In connection with the evidence submitted by Atlanta, Birmingham, and Memphis, identifiable latent prints were recovered. It was on the basis of these latents that identification was made of JAMES EARL RAY. In handling future leads, all offices should be particularly interested in securing an identifying number, military, police, or FBI, in connection with suspects so that the necessary check can be made through the Identification Division.

On 4/17/68, AUSA [REDACTED] T [REDACTED], Birmingham, authorized the filing of a complaint charging ERIC STARVO GALT with a conspiracy to violate Section 241, Title 18, U. S. Code, and

recommended bond in the amount \$50,000. On that same date, SAC J [REDACTED] G [REDACTED] filed a complaint before USC M [REDACTED] S [REDACTED] Birmingham, and warrant was issued that same date.

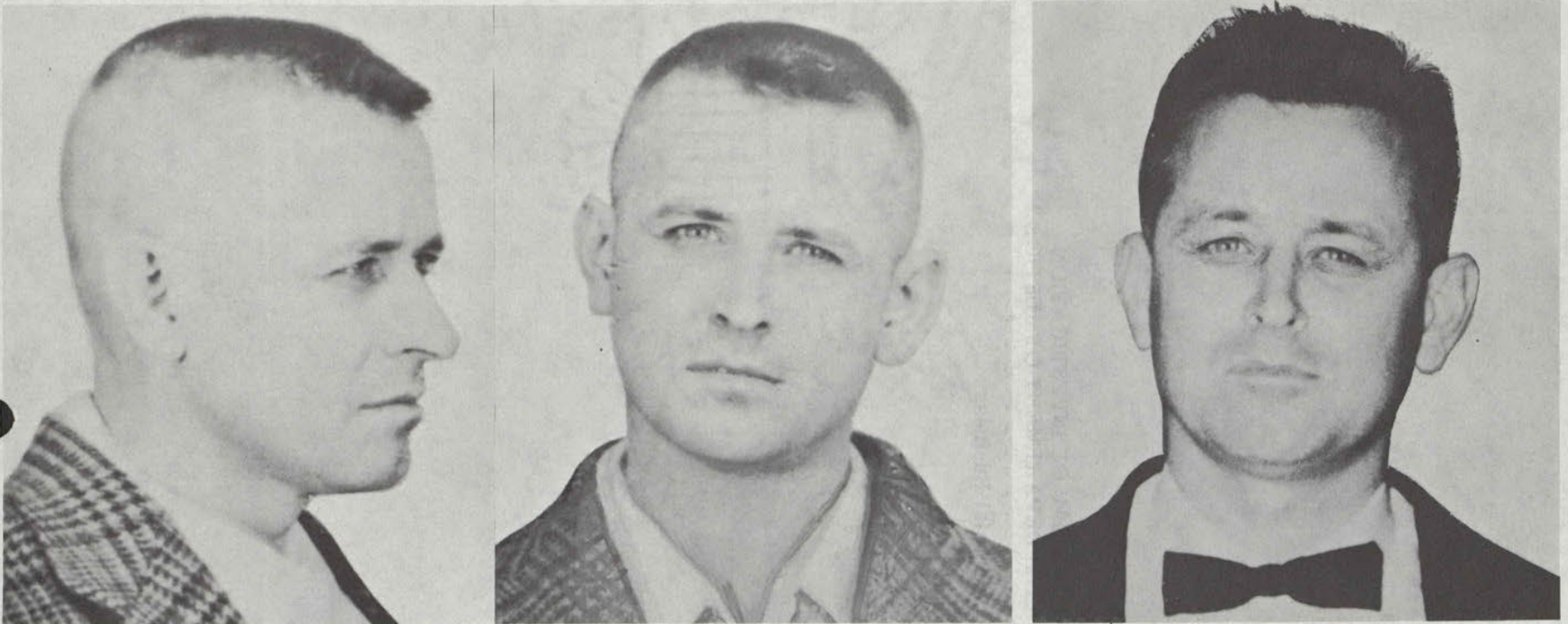

The FBI Laboratory advised that pillowcase and bed sheet were found in trunk of 1966 white Mustang registered to ERIC STARVO GALT, which was located at Atlanta 4/11/68. These items contain Thermo-Seal laundry tapes of approximately same size as tapes on items previously recovered, but are yellow in color and contain code, "20R-3." In opinion of Textile Marking Machine Company, Syracuse, New York, the tapes were produced by a different machine than previous tapes since the first three characters are 15 point type and the last two characters are 18 point type.

The Textile Marking Machine Company suggests the twenty in above code would be the lot number, the R may mean that this was a return of a batch of laundry, and the three is the bundle number.
