Gulf Credit Card No. 1312681552 is issued to a JAMES W. HAMMONS, Route 1, Antler, Oklahoma.

The purchase referred to in reairtel at Bartow, West Virginia on 4/22/68 was utilized for a 1962 white Chevrolet, Louisiana license 9H067. The purchase invoice for this purchase has been submitted by the dealer, KELTON PLYER, Bartown, West Virginia to Gulf Oil Corporation office at Philadelphia and is in the process of being forwarded to Houston, Gulf Oil Corporation Central Office for processing.

JIM ABSHIER advised that the reason for a "stop" being placed on the credit card of JAMES W. HAMMONS, Card No. [REDACTED] is because of the similarity in HAMMONS' name with that of a person named HAMMER who is also from

Antler, Oklahoma. ABSHIER stated that Gulf Oil Corporation is confronted with an extensive credit card ring operating out of Antler, Oklahoma area and one of the persons using the card in this ring is a person named HAMMER. In view of the similarity of the names HAMMER and HAMMONS, both being from Antler, Oklahoma, a stop was placed against HAMMONS' card.

Regarding the name S.G. STEINER, JIM ABSHIER advised as follows:

Gulf Oil Corporation has in its employ an S.G. STEINER who is the credit manager of the Gulf Oil Corporation Credit Office at Philadelphia, Pa. The above referred to KELVIN PLYER, Gulf dealer, Bartow, West Virginia, refers his credit invoices for purchases to the Philadelphia Office of Gulf Oil Corporation and it would appear that because of this process PLYER has confused the name of STEINER and the purchase made by JAMES HAMMONS.

It would appear that S.G. STEINER is in no way involved in this matter.

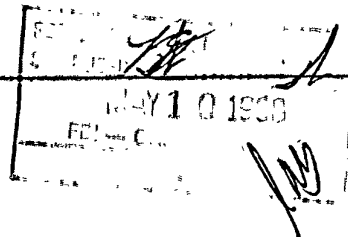
The Bureau has designated Memphis as office of origin in this case.

At El Reno, Oklahoma

On 5/7/68 records (card record only) of Federal Reformatory disclosed ROBERT G. BOSHERS, Inmate #26381 SW, FBI #754495C, a white male, born 5/28/38 at St. Louis, Missouri, was sentenced 7/2/59 in the Eastern District of Missouri to serve an indeterminate period under the Youth Corrections Act (5010b), following conviction for mail theft -- forging and uttering U. S. Check -- probation revoked. He was received at El Reno 7/13/59; paroled 4/1/61; parole violator's warrant executed 10/5/63 and BOSHERS was returned to El Reno 10/24/63, and was released 12/12/63 at the expiration of his sentence.

Inmate file for BOSHERS has been transferred to the Federal Records Center, Fort Worth, Texas.

In connection with the captioned case there has been speculation that James Earl Ray concocted the alias of Eric Starvo Galt by combining the names of characters from books by Ian Fleming and from a book "Atlas Shrugged" by Ayn Rand. This speculation is based on the fact that in the James Bond books by Ian Fleming there is a character named Ernst Stavro Blofield and in "Atlas Shrugged" there is a character named John Galt, as well as one named Eric Starnes. Ernst Stavro Blofield is a formidable person, John Galt is a "social drop out" and Eric Starnes is described in the book as a "whiner" from a low-class family.

In view of the above and in order that Agents handling this investigation can be alert to the possibility of Ray's utilizing an alias based on characters in Fleming's books, there is set out as an attachment to this airtel a list of various characters in those books for your assistance.

SUBJECT: MURKIN

At 10:40PM date, an unidentified woman called the office re the above saying that RAY was working for the Independent Postal Service here in Okla. City. Complainant, who refused to identify herself, advised she lives in the Park Estates and that subject while making his mail round, one day last week, stopped and talked to caller, while he was waiting for mail truck. Caller stated subject did not have name on his shirt or jacket, nor did she know his name, but would be working for this postal system. Caller was very sure of identity as Ray, as she had photo of Ray in her possession, and seemed to be frightened, saying that when we caught Ray, she would identify herself to us, but that she was scared to identify herself at this time, as subject had talked to her.

On 5/9/68, the following investigation was conducted at Oklahoma City by SA'S DAVID J. LANG and MICHAEL F. HUTTER:

STEVE JOHNSON, Head of Operations, Independent Postal Service, 1840 West Reno, Telephone Number 232-5487, advised that his service includes the Park Estates area of Oklahoma City on Tuesdays. He stated this area is in the vicinity of Northeast 36th and Kelly, and that most of the employees who work in that area for his Service are Negroes. He further stated after viewing current photographs of JAMES EARL RAY that subject is not employed by the Independent Postal Service and has not been so employed in the past.

Current photographs of JAMES EARL RAY were also shown to RICK JOHNSON, Asst. Head of Operations, and JAMES WYATT, Supervisor of Personnel, and they stated that they had not seen anyone identical to subject.

Pursuant to rememo, Mr. LOWELL DIKES, 1611 North 26th Street, and EVELYN HOUSE, 1301 Irwin Street, Lawton, Oklahoma, were interviewed by the writer and displayed photographs of Subject RAY. Mrs. HOUSE stated that the individual in the situation recalled by Mrs. DIKES was not observed by her for any extended period of time. She stated she does recall the incident and the only picture of RAY that resembles the man she recalls in the diner is the side view of RAY taken in 1960.

Mrs. HOUSE recalled that the individual at the Big Town Truck Stop was a very pleasant person, did most of his talking with Mr. LOWELL DIKES and to the best of her recollection, he was dressed in a brown suit and for some reason she took him to be a fisherman. He appeared to be 40 or 50 years of age, well tanned, and his height and weight she could not determine because he was sitting during the period of time she was eating at the Big Town Truck Stop.

Mr. LOWELL DIKES, 1611 North 26th Street, Lawton, Oklahoma, was interviewed 5/3/68, and advised the only pictures of JAMES EARL RAY which looked similar to the individual he, his wife, and Mrs. HOUSE observed at the Big Town Truck Stop is the profile of RAY taken in 1960. He stated that the front view of RAY as taken in 1968, does not resemble the man who they observed at the Big Town Truck Stop.

DIKES recalled that the individual was rather pleasant, tried to make conversation with DIKES, his wife, and Mrs. HOUSE but was not unmannerly in doing so. DIKES

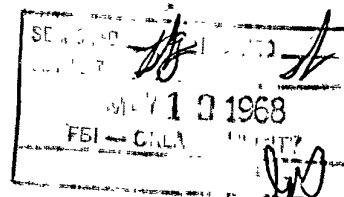

CLEO MYERS, Manager, Quo Vadia Motor Hotel, 212 South 14th Street, advised on April 22, 1968, that Desk Clerk NEAL HARRISON and Bellboy BOB GREEN had advised him a guest who had "skipped" without paying his bill resembled and was possibly identical with the individual being sought in connection with the murder of Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING. MYERS advised he did not see this guest himself. He furnished the registration card and three room service meal tickets of the guest.

NEAL HARRISON, Desk Clerk, residence 901 North Osage, advised on April 22, 1968, he observed RICHARD BURNS on only one occasion that being when he registered. BURNS registered at 4:34 PM, April 9, 1968, and was assigned Room 221. He was alone and on the registration card gave his address as 13008 East Avenue, Fort Worth, Texas, his employment as Elco Corporation, and vehicle information only as 1967 license (?)CL-721, Tex., the first letter in the license tag being illegible.

HARRISON became suspicious of 'BURNS' after he did not show himself in the lobby, did not visit the private club on the premises, and had two meals sent to his room. HARRISON requested BOB GREEN, Bellboy, to check for BURNS' vehicle to verify his license, etc., and GREEN reported he could find no Texas license resembling the number on the registration card at the motel. HARRISON then checked the parking area for Room 221, and found a late model, believed 1967, Ford Thunderbird bearing 1968 Texas license FDH-453, parked near that room, this being the only vehicle then in the area. He then called Room 221 on the telephone from the motel office, used the pretext that a possible car prowler had been reported in the vicinity of the motel, and asked what kind of car "BURNS" was driving. He was advised "BURNS" was driving a Texas Thunderbird. HARRISON then entered the "T-Bird" and "FDH-453" on the registration card.

HARRISON advised it is his recollection this person resembled, and could be identical, with Subject. HARRISON had previously observed an artists' conception in a newspaper, and was shown copies of the 1968 photograph of Subject. He described this person as follows:

He is age 52, wife LOIS, and has an excellent credit rating. ALEXANDER is self-employed as a carpenter and his wife is a nurse at an Ardmore hospital.

ARTHUR STEWART, Undersheriff, Carter County, in which Wilson, Oklahoma, is located, advised on 5/9/68 that he has known LEE CLINT ALEXANDER and his wife all his life. They are reputable citizens of excellent character and reputation. They have never been active politically and have never been in any trouble.

The following investigation was conducted at Oklahoma City, Oklahoma, by SA's DAVID J. LANG and MICHAEL F. HUTTER:

On 5/8/68, JEAN JOFFRION, 1529 Northeast 9th, advised that she is the subscriber to telephone number 424-4153, and was the subscriber to this number during December 1967. She stated that she does not recall receiving any telephone calls from Houston, Texas, as she does not know anyone in that city. She stated that prior to a month ago, she had a tenant by the name of DOROTHY WILLIAMS, and that the relatives of WILLIAMS resided in the Houston area. She stated WILLIAMS was about six months pregnant and left Oklahoma City to return to her relatives home. She further stated that WILLIAMS did on occasion receive and make telephone calls to the Houston area. She stated that she does not know of the current whereabouts of WILLIAMS or any of her friends or relatives. She further stated her husband, RICHARD RIGGS, travels

throughout the Houston area in his job, and could have made this telephone call to the residence during December of 1967. Current photographs of JAMES EARL RAY were exhibited to Mrs. RIGGS and she stated the person in the photographs was unfamiliar to her.

On 5/8/68, Mrs. JO (DUANE) WILLIAMS, 4621 Northwest 33, advised she has been the subscriber to telephone number 946-2137 for many years. She stated that she does not specifically recall receiving the telephone call from Houston, Texas, on 12/16/67, but believes it was her husband calling, inasmuch as he was traveling in business in the vicinity of Houston during that time period. She stated he is employed for Jeffries Company, and that this company is engaged in hauling heavy equipment. Mrs. WILLIAMS was shown current photographs of JAMES EARL RAY without effecting an identification.

Mr. and Mrs. LEON BUTCHER, Rt. A, advised SA JHB on 5/10/68 their telephone (918-846-2996) is actually listed in the name of Mrs. BUTCHERs mother LILLIAN COBB, who is elderly and infirm. Mr. BUTCHER advised he is a trucker, and that in December, 1967 he was hauling wheat from Oklahoma to Houston, Texas, and was in Houston every other day prior to Christmas, 1967. He on several occasions called his wife from a pay telephone in Houston located near the Continental Grain Co. loading dock. At that time he was paying for these calls when made rather than making them collect to his home phone number, as he had run up a large bill a few months before without realizing it, and made the calls only when he had the money in his pocket to spare.

Both Mr. and Mrs. BUTCHER advised the photographs and the description of Subject RAY is unfamiliar to them.

In order to cover the possibility that subject may have died since commission of the crime, the U. S. Census Bureau and Department of Health, Education and Welfare were contacted and they advised that no central records of unidentified deceased are maintained by those agencies. It was suggested that each state may maintain such a record in their Bureau of Vital Statistics or similar agency.

There is no known Federal law requiring the maintenance of such information; and it is possible that if any record of unidentified dead is maintained, it would only be maintained at local police departments, morgues, medical facilities, or the like.

Each office covering state capitals should check to ascertain if such records are maintained, and if so, should check records for the period from 4-5-68, to date, for any information which might possibly identify subject Ray with unidentified deceased person over that period.

If there is no central record repository maintained in the various states or nationally in the case of Mexico and Canada, you should, in connection with your contacts with law enforcement agencies on this case or other Bureau matters, make appropriate inquiries relative to

unidentified dead for the period beginning 4-5-68; and if fingerprints on such dead are maintained, they should be compared with those on the Identification Order on Ray in order to effect identification or nonidentification. This should be handled in the normal course of business and only reasonable investigation should be pursued along these lines.

The Identification Division has placed an appropriate stop on unidentified deceased inquiries it may receive. If feasible, appropriate offices and Legats, Mexico City and Ottawa should place similar stops with appropriate state, local or national agencies in your territories.
