TOMMY LEE WEBB was interviewed at the Biffle Ranch, Route #1, Allen, Oklahoma, where he was visiting his step-father and mother, Mr. and Mrs. NED BIFFLE.

WEBB advised he is a Sergeant in the U. S. Marine Corps, Serial # [REDACTED], assigned to Schools Company, Schools Battalion, TVR, Camp Del Mar, Camp Pendleton, California.

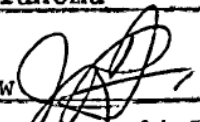
He advised he was on leave from on or about December 15, or December 16, 1967, until about the first of January, 1968, the exact dates unknown. He advised he drove from Camp Pendleton to San Antonio, Texas, with Sergeant RICHARD KRAWITZ, a member of the same organization to which he is assigned. He said he took a bus from San Antonio to Dallas, Texas, arriving in Dallas the third day after leaving Camp Pendleton. He advised he was not sure of the date on which his leave started, which could only be determined by checking his leave record, but did not believe he was in Dallas on December 16, 1967.

WEBB advised that after arriving in Dallas he stayed at his mother's apartment, 7140 Gaston Avenue, in Dallas. He said he occupied the above apartment throughout his leave period but was away from the apartment a great amount of the time.

WEBB advised he did not receive any long distance telephone calls at his mother's apartment during his leave period.

WEBB was unable to identify a photograph of JAMES EARL RAY exhibited to him at the time of his interview.

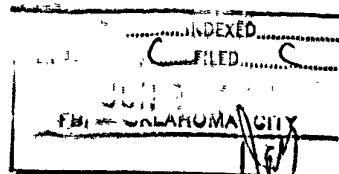

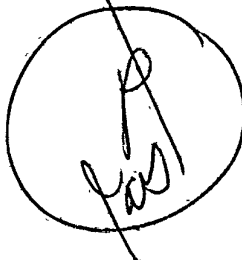

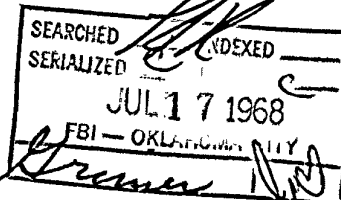

Hanes May Quit as Ray Counsel

MEMPHIS, Tenn. (AP) — Arthur J. Hanes raised the possibility Friday that he may withdraw as defense attorney for James Earl Ray, the man charged in the slaying of Dr. Martin Luther King jr.

"Serious difficulties have arisen between me and my client on the best way to handle this defense," Hanes told Shelby County Criminal Court. "At some future day I may have to withdraw as counsel for James Earl Ray."

Hanes' surprise statement, which he said was agreed to Thursday, came at the end of a day-long hearing on whether Hanes and three other persons should be held in contempt of court for newspaper articles concerning Ray's treatment in jail.

Hanes denied earlier that he had made any statements prejudicial to his client's case in the past and said, "I do not intend to do so in the future."

He will defend Ray when Ray goes to trial Nov. 12 on charges that he killed King here last April 4.

Hanes, Renfro Hays, a private investigator hired by Hanes, and reporters Roy Hamilton of the Memphis Press-Scimitar and Charles Edmundson of the Commercial Appeal were ordered into court. Judge W. Preston Battle, who will preside over Ray's trial, issued an order shortly after Ray was jailed here prohibiting any out-of-court publicity that might stand in the way of a fair trial for the prisoner.

The 3/24/69 issue of "The Daily Oklahoman," a newspaper published in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma, contained an article reflecting that ROY W. CLARK, age 45, from Houston, Texas, was arrested by the Oklahoma City Police Department on 3/23/69, and jailed on a drunkenness complaint. According to the article the police are investigating a notebook found on CLARK that included dates and information concerning the slaying of Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING. The article indicated the notations appeared to be in diary form and included the following dates and quotes:

"4-4-68--Martin Luther King shot in the face and neck"
"4-5-68--A visit from Ray."

On 3/24/69, Lt. WILLIAM MEAD, Robbery and Homicide Division, Oklahoma City Police Department, advised SA J. A. GRIMES that ROY W. CLARK, Negro, male, born 2/12/23 was arrested in Oklahoma City on the afternoon of 3/23/69 and charged with being drunk. He is being held also as a suspect in an armed robbery which occurred in Oklahoma City shortly prior to his arrest. Lt. MEAD advised that arresting officers found a small loose-leaf notebook in CLARK's automobile which contained about three pages of handwritten dates and notations in the general form of a diary. He made available the notebook and it was noted the first two items listed were as follows:

- 3 - Bureau
- 2 - Memphis (44-1987)
- 1 - Houston (Info)
- ① - Oklahoma City

Lt. MEAD advised that officers of the Oklahoma City PD interviewed CLARK regarding the notebook and he stated he kept this book to jot down items which he thought were of interest and which he wanted to remember at the time. He stated he wrote down the date of KING's murder since he wanted to remember the date of this event. When questioned about the entry on 4/5/68, he advised that this referred to a contact by FBI Agent VAN RAYE on 4/5/68, who at that time was contacting him periodically regarding racial and criminal matters in Houston. He stated he had originally been contacted by Agent VAN RAYE in regard to a relative who was a deserter from the Marine Corps and thereafter VAN RAYE contacted him periodically for a period of several months. He stated he has not been contacted by VAN RAYE for the last several months.

Lt. MEAD advised that the notebook maintained by CLARK contained no entries other than the above mentioned entries which would indicate CLARK had any interest or connection with the KING murder case.

On 3/24/69, SAC WESLEY T. WHALEY, Houston Division, telephonically advised that the files of that office reflect ROY W. CLARK, Negro male, born 2/12/24, was a PCI of the Houston Office during the period of KING's murder and was assigned to Special Agent OTTO VAN RY. He advised that a review of CLARK's file reflects CLARK was in fact contacted by SA VAN RY on 4/5/68, relative to racial matters.

In view of above circumstances, no further investigation being conducted.
