ROYAL CANADIAN MOUNTED POLICE REPORTS IN POSSESSION OF THE HOUSE SELECT COMMITTEE ON ASSASSINATIONS

The House Select Committee on Assassinations (HSCA) has been conducting extensive investigation into the assassination of Martin Luther King, Jr., and has made several requests of FBIHQ for various documents relating to the FBI investigation into the murder. It has been the position of the FBI that information received from the Royal Canadian Mounted Police (RCMP) reporting its investigation in this matter was on a confidential basis and all reference to the RCMP investigation has been deleted from any responses by FBIHQ to the Committee.

On July 21, 1977, RCMP Ottawa advised that subsequent to their denial of a request in March 1977 by the HSCA for production of all RCMP records in this matter, a request was received at the Canadian Embassy, Washington, D.C., concerning the refusal. After several discussions with their Canadian External Affairs Department, the RCMP stated they would consider answering specific questions if drafted by the Committee.

RCMP Ottawa advised that a list of questions had been received in Washington, D.C., and from a cursory study they believed the House Committee was in possession of many original documents furnished by RCMP during that period of time. A detailed study would be undertaken as soon as the documents arrived in Ottawa.

On July 29, 1977, FBIHQ advised Legal Attache that pursuant to a review of this matter at FBIHQ, it appears that on July 12, 1968, Legal Attache Ottawa was advised that in view of the apprehension of James Earl Ray on June 8, 1968, and his prosecution to be undertaken by Tennessee authorities, it would be necessary to furnish information to the Tennessee authorities that had been obtained from the RCMP and other foreign law enforcement agencies. On July 18, 1968, former Legal Attache advised FBIHQ that Assistant Commissioner H. S. Cooper, Director of

Criminal Investigations, RCMP, had advised that there was no objection to furnishing Tennessee authorities with any information developed as a result of RCMP investigation. On July 29, 1968, the former Legal Attache furnished FBIHQ with a two-page list of RCMP reports relating to this matter and advised that all or any portion of the documents could be made available to Tennessee authorities. It is not clear at this time at what time the documents were furnished to the Tennessee authorities or the quantity of these documents.

The Memphis Office of the FBI has determined from the District Attorney's Office, Shelby County, Tennessee, that in response to a subpoena from the HSCA all records relating to this matter have been furnished to the Committee, including the copies of the RCMP reports.

On this date, RCMP advised Legal Attache that the Canadian Ministry of External Affairs is fully aware of this situation and RCMP is working closely with the Ministry in preparing responses to the Committee. RCMP advise that it is the position of the RCMP, and, presumably, the Canadian government, that it wishes to cooperate fully with the Committee investigation; however, there may be various questions which, for one reason or another, may be unanswerable.

To date, there has been no publicity given to this situation by either the Canadian or American press and the RCMP has requested that the request of the HSCA be considered confidential at this time.

Legal Attache will follow this matter and keep you advised.

Congressman ROBERT EDGAR (D-Pa.), HSCA member, travelled to Ottawa, Ontario, with three staff members and on 4/14/78 met with Deputy Solicitor General P.A. BISSONNETTE and later met with RCMP officers, including the Officer in Charge of Federal Policing Branch.

The purpose of Congressman EDGAR's trip was, according to sources, to obtain a promise of cooperation from the Canadian Government in the HSCA investigation relating to JAMES EARL RAY while he was in Canada. Congressman EDGAR advised Mr. BISSONNETTE that some investigative activity would be directed toward determining if there had been any connection between RAY and J.B. STONER and others of the National States Rights Party.

Congressman EDGAR was received cordially by Mr. BISSONNETTE but no definite commitments were made by the latter beyond the desire of the Canadian Government to cooperate with the U.S. Government whenever it is possible to do so.

Congressman EDGAR got off to a bad start at RCMP Headquarters with an initial remark that one of the purposes of HSCA investigation was "to inquire into the adequacy of the

(prior) investigation." He was informed that the RCMP considered the prior investigation to be adequate in every degree and Congressman EDGAR made repeated efforts to explain away the remark.

RCMP agreed to assist the HSCA by making available any of its members for interview; attempting to locate persons previously interviewed by RCMP and determine if the person was agreeable to interview by HSCA investigators, in the presence of RCMP; and doing name checks on any new names surfaced in the HSCA investigation. RCMP did not agree to allowing HSCA to review its files, to conduct any new investigation for the HSCA or to allow the committee to conduct any investigation in Canada. Congressman EDGAR was told that any requests for investigation in Canada must be presented to the RCMP through the FBI or through diplomatic channels.

John indicated that they have asked for no assistance from the Department or the Embassy and that they are dealing directly with the RCMP.

Four staff members of HSCA recently completed interviewing a number of RCMP personnel at RCMP Headquarters who had been associated with the James Earl Ray investigation in Canada. According to RCMP sources, nothing unusual was discussed and the members were not asked any questions that would indicate that any new material had been uncovered by the staff members, who were very amiable and courteous throughout the contacts.

The RCMP is now in the process of contacting approximately 50 residents of Canada, who were interviewed by the RCMP during the course of the investigation, to determine if they would be willing to be interviewed in Canada by HSCA staff members.

The Canadian Government has taken the position that no federal employee, with exception of RCMP personnel, can be made available for interview and, therefore, people such as the person(s) who accepted application for and issued Canadian passport cannot be interviewed.

NEW YORK (AP) - A St. Louis han claims that he has offered \$50,000 by two Nissouri businesshen to arrange the murder of civil rights leader Nartin Luther King Jr. Hore than a year before he has assassingted, the New York Times reported today.

THE MANS IDENTIFIED AS RUSSELL G. BYERS: 46: A FORMER AUTO PARTS DEALER; TOLD THE TIMES HE TURNED DOWN THE OFFER AND LATER INFORMED THE FBI.

THE HOUSE SELECT CONNITTEE ON BESASSINATIONS, WHICH IS PROBING THE KING DEATH, IS INVESTIGATING THE ALLEGATION BECAUSE OF CIRCUMSTANTIAL CONNECTIONS. LEADING FROM BYERS TO THE PRISON WHERE JAMES EARL RAY WAS INCARCERATED AT THE TIME; THE NEWSPAPER SAID.

Aft the prison; it has hipely runored in 1965 and 1967 that a conservative business group has hilling to pay a large sum of money to anyone who hould number Dr. King, " The Jines said.

KING WAS ASSASSINATED IN NEMPHIS ON APRIL 4: 1968. RAY: WHO IS SERVING A 99-YEAR SENTENCE IN TENNESSEE FOR THE MURDER: INITIALLY PLEADED GUILTY BUT IN RECENT YEARS HAS SOUGHT A NEW TRIAL.

According to the Tines, Byers said the offer has made to him "in late 1966 or early 1967" by John R. Kauffmann and patent lawyer John R. Sutherland, who shared ownership in a small mater company in Imperial, No. Widows of both men denied that their husbands would have participated in such a scheme.

THE TIMES SAID BYERS AND THE BUSINESSMEN ARE LINKED BY SEVERAL FACTORS TO THE MISSOURI STATE PENITENTIARY IN JEFFERSON CITY, WHERE RAY HAD BEEN SERVING TIME PRIOR TO AN ESCAPE IN APRIL, 1967.

Syers, brother-in-lan, John Spica, was serving a term for murder at the prison during the time kay was there, and the Jimes said it was believed that at one point the men were six cells apart. Byers denies mentioning the offer to Spica, who was parolled in 1973 and mould not comment.

# Ray says he was framed by 'Montreal connection'

WASHINGTON — A nervous James Earl Ray swore to a congressional committee yesterday that he "did not shoot Martin Luther King," and hinted that the mysterious "Raoul" he supposedly met in Montreal pulled the trigger.

Ray, who is now 50, claimed he was nine blocks away getting a tire fixed when the black civil rights leader was assassinated in Memphis on April 4, 1968.

Ray, who pleaded guilty to killing King and later recanted, was brought to Washington under tight security from he Tennessee prison where he is serving a 99-year sentence for the murder to testify before the U.S. House of Flepresentatives Assassinations Committee.

For nearly a decade now Ray has been talking about Raoul. It all started when they met, Ray claims, in the Neptune Tavern in Montreal in the summer of 1967. Expo 67 was in full swing, attracting not just tourists, but fast-buck operators and crooks as well.

Both Ray and Raoul fitted into the latter category — Ray was an escapee from Missouri State Prison — and Ray says they embarked on a partnership in crime.

Raoul provided the leadership and money for their criminal activities, Ray says, and that was all he needed to know.

"I usually don't like to know too much information about someone else's business, because that's an easy way to get killed," he said yesterday.

Then he described how he and Raoul pulled off capers together off-and-on for nine months in 10 cities and three countries, including smuggling contraband across the U.S. borders with Canada

and Mexico and buying rifles for illegal resale.

Ray said he and Raoul last saw each other in a Memphis bar hours before King was shot. The meeting was for the purpose of handing over a high-powered rifle Ray had bought. It was later shown to be the murder weapon — and it bore Ray's finger-prints.

Ray was apparently suggesting Raoul himself was the assassin and had carefully planned to frame Ray.

He also said it was at Raoul's direction that he rented a room in the flop house from which King is believed to have been shot—although Ray claimed he was not there when the killing occurred

In addition, Ray said, he bought some binoculars at his partner's instructions and handed those over too.

As he has in the past, Ray suggested that he may have been set up by the FBI and the Memphis police. He said recently uncovered FBI documents show that one of the first people to reach King after he was shot turned out to be an undercover agent for the FBI and the local police.

That, man was quoted in FBI field investigations as

saying the fatal shot was fired from the boarding house, and Ray seemed to suggest the man was lying.

"It was not I who sent (King) the note that he should kill himself; it was the FBI," Ray said in a disjointed part of his statement yesterday.

This apparently referred to disclosures in 1975 by a Senate committee investigating intelligence community abuses which included memos showing that the late FBI chief, J. Edgar Hoover, had King's room bugged by while King was in a Washington hotel with a woman.

Tapes resulting from the bugging were mailed anonymously to King's wife and an anonymous note was sent to King suggesting he should commit suicide.


Ray testified for close to two and a half hours under heavy security. Fearing a slaying attempt such as the one which ended the life of Lee Harvey Oswald, the committee kept him surrounded by federal marshals and warned the few spectators allowed in the committee room (admittance was by ticket only) to "remain seated and stationary" as Ray entered and left the room.

On November 21, 1980, Jewitt Miller, Executive Administrative Assistant to Hugh Stanton, District Attorney General, Memphis, Tennessee, was contacted by a Special Agent of the FBI regarding exhibits which pertain to the captioned matter.

Mr. Miller advised by court order, Hugh Stanton has been removed from legal proceedings in this case since he was with the Public Defender's Office during the defense of James Earl Ray and at the time the Public Defender's Office was the court appointed co-counsel for Ray. The court decided it would be a conflict of interest for Stanton to be involved in this matter, and it is the opinion of Stanton the order extends to the assistant district attorneys of his office. The last motion for a new trial by Ray was handled by the State Attorney General's Office, Nashville, Tennessee, and responsibility for the case now rest with the State Attorney General, Nashville, Tennessee.

On December 5, 1980, Joe Haynes, Trial Attorney, State Attorney General's Office, Nashville, Tennessee, informed a Special Agent of the FBI all evidence in the captioned matter should be retained for an indefinite period of time. Haynes advised James Earl Ray has filed at least four petitions for post conviction relief and one of the petitions is now pending in the State Criminal Court of Shelby County. While Haynes believes these petitions to be wholly without merit, he is also of the opinion it will take a considerable length of time for all of the petitions to clear the full appellate process in Tennessee. It is also believed Ray may continue to file motions, in which case the evidence would be required to be available.
