On 4/11/68 Dr. IRVING HALL, 712 39th Street W., Bradenton, Fla., telephonically advised the Sarasota RA that between the hours of approximately 8:00 and 10:00 p.m. 4/7/68 he and his wife viewed a television program over channel 3, educational television station WEDU-TV, Tampa, Florida. HALL stated the program was a panel-type discussion concerning the study of the march on Washington that was to be lead by Rev. MARTIN LUTHER KING in the Spring of 1968. HALL stated a white male who was a member of the panel who was sitting on the floor near a Negro who was standing and who was the moderator made several comments that dealt with KING leading the march. The white male, according to HALL, reportedly made a comment to the effect, "If KING leads the march on Washington the march will be a Negro march and the poor white people will be getting screwed."

HALL stated that upon viewing the artist's conception of the assassin of KING and comparing the description that had been set forth in local newspapers regarding the assassin, he believes the white male on the above television program who made remarks critical of KING's leadership appeared a similar description to the artist's conception of the assassin.

Mr. R. LEROY LASTINGER, General Manager, WEDU-TV, Educational Television Channel 3, 908 South 20th Street, Tampa, on 4/12/68 advised from approximately 8:30 to 10:30 p.m.

on 4/7/68 his channel experienced a live interconnection which was broadcast in the Tampa area under the auspices of Public Broadcast Laboratory which program originates from New York City and which the local station would not have any record of on radio or TV tape. He said that all he could say was the FBI would have to contact "AV" WESTIN, Director, Public Broadcast Laboratory, 342 Madison Avenue, New York City, and they would have the film. He volunteered the information that he recalled Public Broadcast Laboratory sent a crew along with Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING some time in the past sort of following his career and were closely following any plans to march on Washington. He said he personally had no way of even knowing in what cities or where the panel discussion took place that was broadcast on the night of 4/7/68 through his Channel 3 station.

Enclosed for Atlanta is one copy of referenced airtel and two photographs developed from questioned television tape.

"AV" WESTIN, Director, Public Broadcast Laboratory (PBL), 342 Madison Avenue, NYC, on 4/19/68, advised that an assistant would aid the FBI in making available tape on questioned broadcast of 4/7/68. He stated that PBL has had employees following the developments leading up to the "poor people's march on Washington" which was to have been led by Rev. MARTIN LUTHER KING in the Spring of 1968. He stated that the questioned portion of the broadcast was produced by GREG SHUKER of PBL.

On 4/19/68, PBL made available two film excerpts from the broadcast of 4/7/68 which shows two white males in

background of photograph, either of which could represent the person referred to by Dr. IRVING HALL, of Bradenton, Florida. It is further noted, however, that others in the room made similar remarks about the "poor white people getting screwed" if KING led the march.

It is noted that one individual, which according to the tape was located in the area of, or next to, the Negro moderator, who was HOSHA WILLIAMS, seemed to be pulling at his left ear lobe as depicted in the enclosed excerpt from the film.

GREG SHUKER, Producer, PBL, stated he was in the room during the filming of this sequence of events and identified the location as Paschal's Hotel, located on Hunter Street, Atlanta, Georgia. He stated he personally recalls most of the participants in the discussion other than the man with his hand up to his ear. He stated that the Southern Christian Leadership Conference Headquarters (SCLC) in Atlanta is believed to have a list of all persons attending this discussion. He stated that the events took place on 3/14/68 and that BILL RUMBERFORD, Executive Director, and TOM OPPENBERG, Public Relations, SCLC, Office # (404)-522-1420, possibly could furnish names of all persons in the room. RUMBERFORD's home number was given as 523-3301 and that of OPPENBERG, who is Director of the March as 522-1425.

SHUKER stated that other groups and races of people were meeting at the time in the same hotel in connection with the upcoming march, but indicated that the group in question was basically white and that HOSHA WILLIAMS came in late only to answer their questions and to convince them that KING would lead and speak for all the poor people, regardless of race, in the March on Washington.

SHUKER is in the process of preparing a copy of the entire tape for the FBI which is to be made available to the NYO possibly today, 4/22/68.

It has been requested by FBI that above excerpts from the tape as well as the other material to be made

available, be used solely by the FBI for their investigative purposes. The film is still being used by PBL and no publication otherwise should be made.

Atlanta, through appropriate officials of SCLC, obtain list of persons in attendance of white group discussion at Paschal's Hotel on or about 3/14/68 in order to identify persons appearing in attached photographs and further tie in with individuals referred to by Dr. IRVINGTON HALL in referenced communication.

HOUCK advised that the photographs were taken in a conference room at Paschal's Restaurant, but that the group at the conference was assembled as a result of a sign posted in the lobby of Paschal's Motel announcing that a white caucus would be held in this particular room.

HOUCK said he did not recognize the individual in the photographs with his hand to his ear, and that this individual would have to be one of the above-listed persons or someone who simply walked in as a result of seeing the sign, and in this case he would not be registered on the program lists which HOUCK supplied.

Mr. VERLE HARPER, Grandview Avenue, Elkins, W. Va., telephonically contacted SA LINNEY L. CONNOLLY, JR., on the evening of 4/22/68, and advised that an individual had very recently contacted HUGH CURRENCE, real estate dealer, at Elkins, relative to purchasing property and that the individual bore a strong resemblance to the photograph of ERIC STARVO GAULT that has been prominently displayed in leading newspapers.

Mr. HUGH CURRENCE, Manager, Randolph Real Estate Agency, 216 Randolph Avenue, provided the following information on 4/23/68:

He was contacted at his office by a man named JOHN JOSEPH O'HANLON on or about 4/18/68, relative to property located at 100 Central Street, that has been put up for sale. Mr. CURRENCE advised that O'HANLON bears a facial resemblance to newspaper photographs of ERIC STARVO GAULT, but that he appears to be considerably older than GAULT. He said that O'HANLON was seeking a temporary place to stay as well as permanent real estate, and he, CURRENCE, made arrangements for O'HANLON to stay at the residence of his father on Grandview Avenue at Elkins.

It later developed that O'HANLON's speech and talk would sometimes be irrational and disconnected, and his father became uneasy in O'HANLON's presence. HUGH CURRENCE informed O'HANLON that he would have to find another place to live and O'HANLON departed his father's residence on the evening of 4/22/68.

Mr. CURRENCE described O'HANLON as a white male, approximately 40 - 50 years of age, 5'7", 165-170 lbs.

JOHN E. BUSCH, JR., Attorney, Hippedrome Building, Elkins, W. Va., advised on 4/23/68, that he is an attorney for HUGH CURRENCE and he telephonically contacted the Veterans Administration Hospital at Huntington, W. Va., in behalf of CURRENCE relative to JOHN JOSEPH O'HANLON. He spoke to a Mr. HAMBLIN and was informed that O'HANLON was refused a loan in August or September, 1967, on grounds that he was "medically incompetent." Mr. BUSCH said he was referred to the Regional Veterans Administration Hospital in New York City for further information. BUSCH said he observed O'HANLON in CURRENCE's office and that O'HANLON does bear a facial resemblance to GAULT. He said, however, that O'HANLON appears to be considerably older than GAULT.

Mrs. BONNIE MARSTILLER, Secretary, Cromwell Insurance Agency, Fifth Avenue, Elkins, provided the following information on 4/23/68:

JOHN JOSEPH O'HANLON has been in contact with DORSEY FREY, real estate agent, concerning the purchase of property in Elkins. Mr. FREY is presently out of town. Mrs. MARSTILLER is completely familiar with the O'HANLON case and has talked to him on several occasions.

She advised that O'HANLON does bear a facial resemblance to newspaper photographs of ERIC GAULT, but that she does not believe them to be one and the same individual. O'HANLON left with her office some personal papers showing a relationship with the Veterans Administration and she displayed a letter from the Regional Office, VA Hospital, 252 7th Avenue, New York, N.Y., dated 3/4/67, addressed to JOHN J. O'HANLON, 939 Onderdonk Avenue, Brooklyn, N.Y., VAC #21728520, which letter stated that O'HANLON was being awarded \$240 monthly beginning October 1, 1966. The letter also referred to previous payments to his account which had been discontinued.

Mrs. MARSTILLER stated that O'HANLON had been in her office the last year in an effort to buy real estate and her office subsequently received a post card from him postmarked Miami, Fla., 10/25/67, showing his return address

Coral Gables, Fla.

As SA CONNOLLY was preparing to leave Mrs. MARSTILLER's office, Mrs. MARSTILLER identified a man who was walking past the office as JOHN JOSEPH O'HANLON. O'HANLON was observed to go to the General Delivery window in the Elkins Post Office, where he apparently inquired as to mail. Close observation of O'HANLON at this time reflected him to be a white male, age approximately 50 - 55 years, height about 5'7", weight approximately 190 lbs., gray eyes, black hair, streaked with gray, paunchy build.

This observation of O'HANLON, as well as information provided by BONNIE MARSTILLER, reflects that he is not identical with ERIC STARVO GAULT.

Being forwarded under separate cover is a supply of newspaper mats and proofs for expeditious distribution to all cooperative daily and weekly newspapers in your territory. Additional publications such as shoppers' guides should not be overlooked in obtaining the greatest possible publicity regarding this fugitive.

In most cases, these mats and proofs may be distributed by mail but when circumstances warrant they may be personally delivered by Special Agents. A form letter over the signature of the Special Agent in Charge may be utilized in distributing this material by mail and this letter should point out that the FBI is requesting the aid of the Nation's press in bringing about the prompt apprehension of this badly sought fugitive.

Prompt distribution should be made and additional supplies, if needed, are available at the Bureau. The following number of mats and proofs are being forwarded to your office under separate cover: 500.

As an additional means of securing widespread publicity concerning Ray, offices covering the place of publication of magazines which have previously cooperated in publicizing FBI fugitives should request the assistance of such publications in carrying an article on captioned fugitive. The Bureau press release, copies of which are available in each office, along with a glossy photograph of this fugitive can be furnished. The earliest possible utilization of this material should be encouraged and special attention should be given to publications aimed at minority groups.

Va., RA on 4/26/68, and advised SA MIRE he was certain of the person responsible for murdering Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR. BASHAM said he had been a long-time associate of one "RED" LNU, and FNU FOLKS, who are both past employees of L & M Cylinders, Jacksonville, Florida. BASHAM claimed he met the above two individuals while he was employed with L & M Cylinders in 1966.

He remarked "RED" is presently a ranking influential lieutenant in the KKK in Florida, and at one time "RED" pledged to murder KING. He said that he is positive the FBI photograph of JAMES EARL RAY and/or ERIC STARVO GALT is the "RED" LNU, he knew in Jacksonville. He said "RED" is an excellent con artist and one who uses numerous disguises.

BASHAM stated information leading to the whereabouts of "RED" and FOLKS could probably be obtained from appropriate officials at L & M Cylinders, Jacksonville. He suggested also contacting a ~~PAUL BAILEY~~, a high-ranking KKK member, Jacksonville, for pertinent information concerning this matter.

It should be noted that an inquiry regarding CLARENCE BASHAM was made to the Jacksonville Office at an earlier date, and a reply is known to the Pittsburgh files. BASHAM, at a prior date, visited the Charleston RA and requested he be designated an informant. He claimed that he had rendered invaluable service to the FBI, Jacksonville.

He stated he had seen this person's picture on TV for the past two weeks and that he observed him in Easy Bill's Tavern, 14th Street West, Huntington, W. Va., approximately 20 minutes prior to calling. PELFREY was reluctant to furnish information as to where he could be located but agreed to meet with an agent. He stated he would recontact the FBI Office in 30 minutes in order to learn where he could meet an FBI Agent. PELFREY advised that he had never seen this particular individual before and that he looked the same as the pictures shown on TV except that he now had a black beard.

It was determined that all agents assigned to the Huntington RA were in Williamson, W. Va. Officer DON BOLLING of the Huntington Police Department was contacted and advised that there is a "BOOTS" PELFREY in Huntington, who is a trouble maker and loud mouth and he stated that since there may be some basis for PELFREY's call, he would send a car to the area of Easy Bill's Tavern in an effort to observe anyone resembling the fugitive RAY.

BALL advised he returned to Lakeland in 11/67 and immediately opened an office for PROFFITT. He explained that PROFFITT sends him a schedule every Saturday, listing the destination in Florida, and the time of arrival, of every company truck, for the following week. It is his job to arrange a load, as close to the period of unloading as possible, for the return trip north.

BALL exhibited the weekly dispatch sheet for the week ending 4/6/68. It showed return loads, arranged by him, for 4/4, 5, 6, 7/68

53,000 Fingerprints Checked To Identify 'Galt'

~~MEMPHIS~~ HAM, Ala. (UPI)

The FBI has identified an habitual criminal and escapee from the Missouri State Prison as the mysterious Eric Starvo Galt, object of an international manhunt in the slaying of the Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.

Agents said James Earl Ray, 40, who fled prison 51 weeks ago by hiding in a bread truck, was identified through fingerprints after a 15-day check of the prints of more than 53,000 wanted criminals in FBI files.

The prints, FBI Director J. Edgar Hoover said in Washington, prove "that Galt and Ray are identical."

Mr. Hoover's announcement came as sources close to the investigation into Dr. King's slaying theorized the name Eric Starvo Galt may have been a code name for the murder of Dr. King at Memphis April 4. The name appears in too many scattered places at about the same time under varying descriptions of its user to be one man, these sources said.

U. S. and Mexican officials were reported to be hunting "unofficially" for Ray in Mexico, where rumors have spread of his presence in the past two weeks.

An FBI alert has been issued in southeast California, near Arizona and Mexico, for a man fitting Ray's description.

The FBI said Ray had assumed such aliases as Galt, Harvey Lowmyer, John Willard, James McBride, James Walton, W. C. Herron and James O'Conner.

The man who checked into a rooming house from where Dr. King was shot by a sniper registered as John Willard.

Announcements said Ray, ~~born~~ in Alton, Ill., had a criminal record dating to 1949 and was serving a 20-year, habitual criminal sentence at Jefferson City, Mo., for armed robbery and auto theft when he escaped April 23, 1967. Ray was working in the food service section of the Missouri State Prison and fled by hiding in a bread truck. A year earlier, he had tried to escape by hiding in the prison's ventilation system, but was discovered.

Probation records in Los Angeles, where he served a county jail term for burglary, showed that Ray, eldest of three sons, quit school in Ewing, Mo., in ninth grade.

He spent two years and four months with the Army in Germany as an infantryman and military policeman and received a general discharge in 1948 due to ineptness and a lack of adaptability for military service. He received a three months sentence in the Army for being drunk and breaking arrest.

The FBI said Ray is 5 feet, 10 and weighs about 163 to 174 pounds, with blue eyes and brown hair. He has a small scar in the center of his forehead and a scar on the palm of his right hand.
