On 4/11/68 Dr. IRVING HALL, 712 39th Street W., Bradenton, Fla., telephonically advised the Sarasota RA that between the hours of approximately 8:00 and 10:00 p.m. 4/7/68 he and his wife viewed a television program over channel 3, educational television station WEDU-TV, Tampa, Florida. HALL stated the program was a panel-type discussion concerning the study of the march on Washington that was to be lead by Rev. MARTIN LUTHER KING in the Spring of 1968. HALL stated a white male who was a member of the panel who was sitting on the floor near a Negro who was standing and who was the moderator made several comments that dealt with KING leading the march. The white male, according to HALL, reportedly made a comment to the effect, "If KING leads the march on Washington the march will be a Negro march and the poor white people will be getting screwed."

HALL stated that upon viewing the artist's conception of the assassin of KING and comparing the description that had been set forth in local newspapers regarding the assassin, he believes the white male on the above television program who made remarks critical of KING's leadership appeared a similar description to the artist's conception of the assassin.

Mr. VERLE HARPER, Grandview Avenue, Elkins, W. Va., telephonically contacted SA LINNEY L. CONNOLLY, JR., on the evening of 4/22/68, and advised that an individual had very recently contacted HUGH CURRENCE, real estate dealer, at Elkins, relative to purchasing property and that the individual bore a strong resemblance to the photograph of ERIC STARVO GAULT that has been prominently displayed in leading newspapers.

Mr. HUGH CURRENCE, Manager, Randolph Real Estate Agency, 216 Randolph Avenue, provided the following information on 4/23/68:

He was contacted at his office by a man named JOHN JOSEPH O'HANLON on or about 4/18/68, relative to property located at 100 Central Street, that has been put up for sale. Mr. CURRENCE advised that O'HANLON bears a facial resemblance to newspaper photographs of ERIC STARVO GAULT, but that he appears to be considerably older than GAULT. He said that O'HANLON was seeking a temporary place to stay as well as permanent real estate, and he, CURRENCE, made arrangements for O'HANLON to stay at the residence of his father on Grandview Avenue at Elkins.

It later developed that O'HANLON's speech and talk would sometimes be irrational and disconnected, and his father became uneasy in O'HANLON's presence. HUGH CURRENCE informed O'HANLON that he would have to find another place to live and O'HANLON departed his father's residence on the evening of 4/22/68.

Mr. CURRENCE described O'HANLON as a white male, approximately 40 - 50 years of age, 5'7", 165,170 lbs.

Mrs. BONNIE MARSTILLER, Secretary, Cromwell Insurance Agency, Fifth Avenue, Elkins, provided the following information on 4/23/68: JOHN JOSEPH O'HANLON has been in contact with DORSEY FREY, real estate agent, concerning the purchase of property in Elkins. Mr. FREY is presently out of town. Mrs. MARSTILLER is completely familiar with the O'HANLON case and has talked to him on several occasions. She advised that O'HANLON does bear a facial resemblance to newspaper photographs of ERIC GAULT, but that she does not believe them to be one and the same individual. O'HANLON left with her office some personal papers showing a relationship with the Veterans Administration and she displayed a letter from the Regional Office, VA Hospital, 252 7th Avenue, New York, N.Y., dated 3/4/67, addressed to JOHN J. O'HANLON, 939 Onderdonk Avenue, Brooklyn, N.Y., VAC #21728520, which letter stated that O'HANLON was being awarded \$240 monthly beginning October 1, 1966. The letter also referred to previous payments to his account which had been discontinued.

Mrs. MARSTILLER stated that O'HANLON had been in her office the last year in an effort to buy real estate and her office subsequently received a post card from him postmarked Miami, Fla., 10/25/67, showing his return address

as c/o R. MC GRAW, JR., M.D., 1803 Granada Boulevard, Coral Gables, Fla.

As SA CONNOLLY was preparing to leave Mrs. MARSTILLER's office, Mrs. MARSTILLER identified a man who was walking past the office as JOHN JOSEPH O'HANLON. O'HANLON was observed to go to the General Delivery window in the Elkins Post Office, where he apparently inquired as to mail. Close observation of O'HANLON at this time reflected him to be a white male, age approximately 50 - 55 years, height about 5'7", weight approximately 190 lbs., gray eyes, black hair, streaked with gray, paunchy build.

This observation of O"HANLON, as well as information provided by BONNIE MARSTILLER, reflects that he is not identical with ERIC STARVO GAULT.

Investigation reflects subject RAY can be placed in the Atlanta, Georgia, area 3/24/68. In view of the above, all resident agents are requested to review car recoveries within their respective territories of cars stolen from the State of Georgia subsequent to 3/23/68, and where the transporter of same is not otherwise eliminated or accounted for, consider subject RAY as suspect. 



CLARENCE BASHAM, Star Route 1, Tornado, W. Va., phone 727-7669, appeared at the Charleston, W. Va., RA on 4/26/68, and advised SA MIRE he was certain of the person responsible for mardering Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR. BASHAM said he had been a long-time associate of one "RLD" LNU, and FNU FOLKS, who are both past employees of L&M Cylinders, Jacksonville, Florida. BASHAM claimed he met the above two individuals while he was employed with L&M Cylinders in 1966.

He remarked "RED" is presently a ranking influential lieutenant in the KKK in Florida, and at one time "RED" pledged to murder KING. He said that he is positive the FBI photograph of JAMES EARL RAY and/or ERIC STARVO GALT is the "RED" LNU, he knew in Jacksonville. He said "RED" is an excellent con artist and one who uses numerous disguises.

BASHAM stated information leading to the whereabouts of "RED" and FOLKS could probably be obtained from appropriate officials at L & M Cylinders, Jacksonville. He suggested also contacting a PAUL PAILEY, a high-ranking KKK member, Jacksonville, for pertinent information concerning this matter.

It should be noted that an inquiry regarding CIA RENCE BASHAM was made to the Jacksonville Office at an earlier date, and a reply is known to the Pittsburgh files. BANHAM, at a prior date, visited the Chardeston RA and requested he be designated an informant. He claimed that he had rendered invaluable service to the FBI, Jacksonville.

Va., and advised that he had seen the individual being sought by the FBI in connection with the murder of MARTIN LUTHER KING. He stated he had seen this person's picture on TV for the past two weeks and that he observed him in Easy Bill's Tavern, 14th Street West, Huntington, W. Va., approximately 20 minutes prior to calling. PELFREY was reluctant to furnish information as to where he could be located but agreed to meet with an agent. He stated he would recontact the FBI Office in 30 minutes in order to learn where he could meet an FBI Agent. PELFREY advised that he had never seen this particular individual before and that he looked the same as the pictures shown on TV except that he now had a black beard.

It was determined that all agents assigned to the Huntington RA were in Williamson, W. Wa. 

53,000 Fingerprints Checked To Identify 'Galf'

HAM, Ala (IIPI)

The FBI has identified an habitual criminal and escapee from the Missouri State Prison as the mysterious Eric Starvo Galt, object of an international manhunt in the slaying of the Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.

Agents said James Earl Ray, 40, who fled prison 51 weeks ago by hiding in a bread truck, was identified through fingerprints after a 15-day check of the prints of more than 53,000 wanted criminals in FBI files.

The prints, FBI Director J. Edgar Hoover said in Washington, prove "that Galt and Ray are identical."

Mr. Hoover's announcement came as sources close to the investigation into Dr. King's slaying theorized the name Eric Starvo Galt may have been a code name for the murder of Dr. King at Memphis April 4. The name appears in too many scattered places at about the same time under varying descriptions of its user to be one man, these sources said.

U. S. and Mexican officials were reported to be hunting "unofficially" for Ray in Mexico, where rumors have spread of his presence in the past two weeks.

An FB alert has been issued in southeast California, near Arizona and Mexico, for a man fitting Ray's description.

The FBI said Ray had assumed such aliases as Galt, Harvey Lowneyer, John Willard, James McBride, James Walton, W. C. Herron and James O'Conner.

The man who cherked to a rdoming house from where Dr. King was shot by a saider registered as Joh William.

in Alton, Ill., had a criminal record dating to 1949 and was serving a 20-year, habitual criminal sentence at Jefferson City, Mo., for armed Libbery and auto theft when he escaped April 23, 1967. Ray was working in the food service section of the Missouri State Prison and fled by hiding in a bread truck. A year earlier, he had tried to escape by hiding in the prison's ventilation system, but was discovered.

Probation records in Los Angeles, where he served a county jail term for burglary, showed that Ray, eldest of three sons, quit school in Ewing, Mo., in ninth grade,

He spent two years and four months with the Army in Germnay as an infantryman and military policeman and received a general discharge in 1948 due to ineptness and a lack of adaptability for military service. He received a three months sentence in the Army for being drunk and breaking arrest. The FBI said Ray is 5 feet, 10 and weighs about 163 to 174 pounds, with blue eyes and brown hair. He has a small scar in the center of his forehead and a scar en




