



The tape was 1/4" wide and 1-1/16" long, and bore the letters and number 02B-6 or D2B-6. The beginning of the first character was slashed off so that it was difficult to tell whether it was an "O" or a "D." However, subsequent information would indicate that it was an "O" since the letters appear as the third character in the laundry marks of most machines used.

The Textile Marking Machine Company advised that the machine that made the pertinent tag is defective in that it produces a tape 1-1/16" long instead of 1-1/8" long, and is not projecting the tape far enough, resulting in the cutting off of a portion of the first letter.

Although the Textile Marking Machine Company indicated a standard code for the Northeastern United States, we have been getting various codes from various stores, which would indicate that the one suggested by the machine manufacturer is not utilized by each store, and that all set up their own codes. It is suggested that in contacts with the above establishments, the actual operators of the machines as well as supervisory personnel be contacted. It has been further learned from Textile Marking Machine Company that the letter "O" may have been used rather than a dash for the first character. If the code is recognizable by the insertion of a dash instead of the letter "O" or if the code is recognizable as it appears on instant tape, the office should be notified immediately so that the Bureau can be advised.

Samples of the tape with the O2B-6 designation should be obtained.

All leads should be handled immediately upon instructions from the Bureau.

Results of all investigation regardless of whether it was positive or negative should be put in writing and sent to instant file.

THE BUREAU HAS INSTRUCTED THAT IN CONNECTION WITH ANY INQUIRIES, NO INDICATION SHOULD BE GIVEN THAT THE INVESTIGATION IS BEING CONDUCTED IN CONNECTION WITH CAPTIONED CASE.

NEW LEAD

GALT has been reported as having attended dancing schools in Birmingham, New Orleans, and California. All Resident Agents should immediately check all dancing schools in their territories for any record of prior attendance at any such schools by GALT and follow any leads developed.

GALT reportedly signed up for a one-year dancing course in New Orleans in 1964 and took dancing lessons for several weeks in Birmingham in September, 1967. He also took a \$499 dance course from December, 1967, to February, 1968, at Long Beach, Calif.

The Bureau points out that GALT may have used the name HARVEY LOWMYER or JOHN WILLARD.

This memorandum is written to specifically consolidate leads which had previously been set out telephonically to the Resident Agents.

An individual utilizing the name of ERIC STARVO GALT is the principal suspect in instant case.

All Resident Agents have been notified telephonically to check all city and telephone directories, financial institutions, and to conduct credit and criminal checks in their territories and to contact other logical sources to obtain any information whatsoever regarding GALT.

GALT was known to have been the registered owner of a white 1966 Mustang, bearing 1968 Alabama license 1-38993. The car has since been recovered in Atlanta, Ga.

In his application for a driver's license, GALT was described as a white male, born 7/20/31 (place unknown), 5' 11" tall, 175 pounds, with blue eyes and brown hair.

One of the best leads in instant case stems from laundry tapes found on a pair of shorts and a T-shirt in a room believed occupied by the suspect in Memphis, Tenn., on 4/4/68. The laundry mark was on red tape with black lettering, and was of the thermo seal type, manufactured by the Textile Marking Machine Company, Inc., in Syracuse, N. Y.
