

# Police Are 'Optimistic' On Finding King Killer

Memphis — The official in charge of police here, indicating that an arrest in the assassination of the Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., was not as imminent as reported earlier, said last night he believed the crime was not a "spur of the moment" killing.

Frank Holloman, Memphis police and fire director, was questioned at a press briefing.

Holloman did not elaborate on the statement that he thought it was not a "spur of the moment" killing, but the implication was that the assassination was well planned.

## First Fatality

Meanwhile, Ellis Tate, 20, a Negro shot by police in a looting incident Thursday night, died in a Memphis hospital. Police Inspector N. E. Zachary said Tate shot at policemen with a rifle after they ordered him to drop it.

It was the first Memphis fatality in the unrest that erupted an hour after King's assassination. One death preceded King's — Larry Payne, 16, a Negro, shot by a policeman after the march King led in behalf of striking garbage workers March 28. Police said Payne was threatening an officer with a knife, but Negro leaders said he was surrendering.

## Few Incidents

There were only a few incidents of looting, arson and vandalism last night. Some windows were shattered and fire bombs tossed in heavily Negro

neighborhoods. With a 7 P. M. to-5 A. M. curfew in effect, a police spokesman said the situation was "under control."

A white motorist said three rifle bullets hit his car on an interstate freeway, shattering the glass but missing the driver.

Some 4,000 National Guardsmen are helping the city's 800-man police force restore order. As of last night there had been 169 arrests since trouble erupted an hour after King's slaying. Police reported 25 civilians and three policemen injured, and 200 fires including 17 major ones.

## 'No Evidence of Plot'

Attorney General Ramsey Clark said yesterday there "is no evidence of a widespread plot." He said the indications were that "a single individual" was involved.

Clark, in Memphis to direct the federal investigation, said the search for the killer had spread "several hundred miles from Memphis."

Clark also was quoted yesterday as saying that authorities were close to making an arrest, but the police chief's press briefing left some doubt about that.

"In regard to the investigation of the murder of Dr. King, it is proceeding," Holloman said, "I am optimistic as to the successful conclusion of the investigation eventually."

## Question on Progress

He was asked what he meant by "eventually."

"I can't say if the case will be finally resolved the next hour

six hours, or 12 hours," he replied.

Holloman said he didn't mean to give the impression the murderer will be found quickly.

He said it was not possible, as much as he would like to, to disclose the full details of the evidence in the hands of the police "because a successful outcome may depend on this."

The evidence includes a high-powered rifle and a suitcase which the killer dropped as he began his flight. These and any other physical evidence have been sent to the FBI laboratories in Washington.

Holloman did refer to the rifle shot at firemen battling blazes set by looters and arsonists on the West Side. Police and equipped with a telescopic sight, which police are convinced was the murder weapon.

He said the .30.06 caliber rifle was "fairly new" and of a type readily available from sporting goods stores.

The killer dropped the rifle and suitcase on the sidewalk next door to the rooming house which police refer to as a "flop-house." From a second-floor bathroom of the rooming house, the killer fired the fatal shot.

Investigators said that he had lain in wait in a room he had rented less than three hours before the killing, watching with binoculars purchased in Memphis for Dr. King, to present himself as a target at the Lorraine Hotel and Motel, across Mulberry st, from the rear of the rooming house at 420 S. Main st.

#### It Was Daylight

The killer, who gave his name as "John Willard" when he rented the room, fired one shot. It traveled 205 feet and struck King as he stood on the second-floor balcony of his motel shortly after 6 P. M. Thursday, while it still was broad daylight.

The killer made good his escape, although Holloman confirmed that 25 to 30 police officers were stationed in the immediate vicinity of the motel to guard Dr. King.

Holloman said neither Dr. King nor his associates had requested police protection.

"In a matter of one minute, a large number of police officers was on the scene," Holloman said.

#### Police Nearby

He said most of them had been in automobiles cruising in the area. It has been reported that one policeman was so close that he saw the bullet strike Dr. King.

The killer has been described by the manager of the rooming house, Mrs. Frank Brewer. She said he was a clean-shaven white man with a long sharp nose and a square chin, with thick hair at the front but which receded at each side.

She said he combed his hair straight back and was well-dressed in a dark suit, white shirt and dark, narrow necktie. She said he had what she described as "a silly smile" on his face.

She also said he was about six feet tall, weighed about 175 pounds and appeared to be between 26 and 32 years of age.

#### Rents a Room

Mrs. Brewer said the man appeared at the rooming house at 3.30 P. M. and asked to rent a room. She said she first showed him a room whose window was on the north side of the house, and he rejected that and chose a room that was near the common bathroom in the back of the house that overlooked the motel.

Investigators said the killer was able also to watch the motel from his bedroom window. The man who spoke with a southern drawl gave Mrs. Brewer a fresh \$20 bill to pay the \$8.50 she charged for a week's rent.

Police took possession of the bill and the carbon copy of a receipt Mrs. Brewer gave the man.

# Clues Indicate Assassin Was By Himself

## Friends Describe Civil Rights Leader's Murder in Memphis

Memphis Tenn. — Attorney General Ramsey Clark said today that police are "very close to identifying" the man who assassinated the Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., here last night.

Clark told newsmen that investigators have so far turned up "no indication of a conspiracy" by more than one person.

Clark, saying he feels "confident that this case will be solved," declared that all the evidence indicates the murder was the act of a white man operating on his own.

He also said the investigation extends beyond the immediate Memphis area, hinting the killer may have fled the city.

Clark, who flew here with several aides, said "substantial evidence has been obtained" and indicated it included more than the discarded rifle found near the scene.

### Memphis Police Agree

Memphis, Tenn. — (AP) — A lone white man, following an apparently well-planned procedure, was the assassin of the Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., Police Director Frank Holloman said today.

Holloman said the investigation showed the assassin checked into a flophouse at 418 S. Main st., in midafternoon, yesterday, shot King from a rear second-floor window of the building three hours later, then disappeared.

The civil rights leader who had roamed the country for years preaching nonviolence was standing on a balcony outside his second-floor room at the Lorraine Motel at 400 Mulberry st., opposite the rear of the flophouse, when he was shot in the neck.

### Shot Fired 205 Feet Away

The fatal shot was fired from the window of a common bathroom in the flophouse, Holloman said.

King's room was 205 feet away, through trees and across a street but in "clear view" of the window.

King, 39, was pronounced dead at St. Joseph Hospital less than an hour later.

King was in the city preparing to lead another march in support of the city's 1,300 striking garbage collectors, most of whom are Negroes.

### Killer's Description

Holloman said the assassin was a white male, between 26 and 32, standing six feet tall and weighing 165-175 pounds.

Police radios said he had dark to sandy hair, medium build, a ruddy complexion and was wearing a black suit and white shirt.

After the shooting, Holloman said, the assassin left the building through its front door on Main st., discarded his weapon and suitcase two doors away, and fled.

Holloman refused to disclose the name the man had signed on the register of the place, but said "certain evidence has been found."

### Had Binoculars

The murder weapon apparently was a new .30-.06 Remington pump rifle with telescopic sights, Holloman said.

The assassin also carried a new set of binoculars and a new suitcase.

A .30-.06 Remington pump rifle was one of 15 weapons stolen a night earlier from a Memphis sporting goods store, but Holloman refused to say that gun was the death weapon. The weapon, Holloman said, was sent to the FBI laboratory in Washington for ballistics tests.

Shelby County Sheriff William E. Morris, asked if officers had a palm print from the weapons, replied, "We hope we do."

### Police in Area

"As far as we know, and from the evidence at this time, there was only one man in the physical area of the slaying," Holloman said, referring to the point from which the shot was fired.

He said one of the 30 to 40 officers on duty in the vicinity of the motel saw the bullet strike King and all rushed to the scene.

Police said they gave chase to a white automobile immediately after the shooting. State police in Arkansas were later asked to look for the same car.

Two men were picked up by police in the area of the shooting, but were released after questioning.

### Ready for Dinner

King was with some of his closest associates and friends when he was shot.

"We were just getting ready to go to dinner," said the Rev. Jesse Jackson, director of King's Operation Breadbasket campaign to help poor Negroes. "Dr. King was up on the balcony."

Solomon Jones, King's chauffeur, said he and some others in the party were standing below beside King's car.

Jones fought back tears as he described the assassination.

"I was standing beside the car looking right into his face. He had just come out of his room and I had told Dr. King, 'It is getting chilly. Why don't you put on your topcoat.'"

"He said, 'OK, I will,' and smiled.

### Man Seen Running

He had just finished smiling when I heard the shot. Dr. King was looking right at the man and when I turned around I saw a man with something white over his head running away.

"I ran up the fire escape and when I got to him, Dr. King looked like he was dead. I was in shock and the others pulled me away. I did not see the wound. A white man was the first to comfort him with a towel. I think he was staying at the motel."

Jackson, who standing beside King, said the civil rights leader's only utterance after the shot was, "Oh!"

#### March Became Riot

It was in Memphis on March 28 that King's stance of non-violence suffered perhaps its most severe setback. A march led by him in support of the garbage strikers turned into a riot.

It was the only time that King had lost control of one of his nonviolent demonstrations.

Both police and Negro leaders saw the violence was sparked by a group of about 200 Negro youths on the fringe of the march and that the main body of 6,000 marchers proceeded peacefully with King.

One Negro youth was killed by police in the outburst of vandalism and looting that followed.

King said later he would not have come here to lead the march if he had known the violence was possible.

#### New March Set

Another march had been planned for next Monday with as many as 10,000 participants, their ranks swelled by sympathizers from labor and civil rights organizations from around the country.

City officials had gained an injunction against the march, saying they feared it would bring more violence.

U. S. District Court Judge Bailey Brown yesterday took under advisement King's request that the injunction be dissolved.

King had told the Wednesday night rally that the march would be held, regardless of the court's decision, declaring, "We're not going to let any injunction turn us around."

A union official said today that Monday's mass march will go on.

#### Bigger Than Ever

"It will be bigger and better than ever," said P. J. Ciampa, field director of the American Federation of State, County and Municipal Employees. "It's a shame it will have to me a memorial march."

Young in testifying at the court hearing on the injunction six hours before King was shot was asked what effect violence in the planned march would have on King.

"I would say Dr. King would consider it a repudiation of his philosophy and his whole way of life," Young replied.

King came to Memphis first on March 18 to speak in support of the strikers. He drew a crowd of 10,000 to a rally, in which he termed the strike a new phase of the Negro's struggle.

The strike, which began Feb. 12, took on early racial overtones because 98 percent of the striking force are Negroes, and King called the strike a fight for "economic equality."

The strikers have asked for a written union contract, payroll deduction of union dues and higher wages.

The union asked a 5 percent pay rise this year and a similar increase next year. Hourly rates now range from \$1.65 for laborers to \$2.10 for truck drivers.

Mayor Henry Loeb has said he will never grant the written contract or dues checkoff.

#### Washington March

The Memphis involvement had been unexpected for King, who was actively engaged in planning a big demonstration in Washington scheduled in a few weeks.

He and his Southern Christian Leadership Conference planned a massive "camp-in" of poor people at the capital to demand

jobs and higher income for Negroes.

But after the march in Memphis had turned into violence, King and several members of his staff had returned here to organize a campaign for the strikers and for other civil rights aims here.

King's associates said today that the Washington demonstration will be carried out.

# Faked Clues Hinted in Hunt For King Killer

Memphis, Tenn. — The search for the killer of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., widened today as police ran down various leads. There was suspicion some clues had been left deliberately by the killer to throw pursuers off his trail.

Rolando Veloz, Mexican counsel here, told authorities there was a resemblance between a composite sketch of the killer carried in a local newspaper and a young man who applied for a tourist card the day before King was shot.

The young man turned out to be a 19-year-old student at Memphis State University, Memphis police said.

## Hitchhiker Picked Up

A hitchhiker, fitting the description of the assassin, was arrested for vagrancy in Joplin, Mo., last night, but police said he had all but cleared himself of any link to the killing.

Police said they had never seen a case where there was so much evidence left behind. The assassin not only left fingerprints and hand prints in his room and in the bathroom from which he shot Dr. King, but he also left a blue piece of luggage and a new rifle on the sidewalk outside.

The rifle's serial number showed it was not among those stolen from a sporting goods store two days before the slaying.

## Faked Radio Calls

The Memphis Commercial Appeal, said in a copyrighted story today that conspirators may have faked a series of police radio calls to confuse authorities after King was shot.

The story, written by George Bryan, said police radio reports of a car chase involving a white Mustang automobile apparently were faked.

"Could someone have used a transmitter tuned to the police frequency to put out misleading information—information which would take the focus of the search north from the city and open up escape routes . . . into Arkansas or south into Mississippi?" the story asked.

The newspaper said seven transmissions were heard over the Memphis police radio system about the chase shortly after King was slain. The messages told of a speeding Mustang pursued by a blue Pontiac. The reports said shots were fired at the Pontiac from the Mustang.

# King Rifle Purchased In Birmingham Store

MEMPHIS, Tenn., April 10.—The rifle believed used to assassinate Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., was purchased in Birmingham, Ala., it was learned Wednesday. The FBI

refused to comment, but informants said FBI agents had traced the rifle through its serial number to a Birmingham store and that it had been purchased new over the counter a few days before the slaying here last Thursday. The weapon, which has been undergoing tests at the FBI

laboratory in Washington, is a Remington 30.06 pump rifle with a telescopic sight. It fires the same bullet as the Army's M-1 rifle. Results of the laboratory tests have not been disclosed.

It could not be determined whether the telescopic sight also was obtained in the Birmingham store or whether the purchaser left any information about his identity. Authorities also have traced binoculars left near the scene by the suspected slayer. The binoculars were purchased at a York Arms Co., a sporting goods store six blocks from the run down rooming house on South Main Street where the slayer set up his ambush.

The rifle and a rectangular blue leatherette case containing

the binoculars were dropped on the sidewalk a few feet from the rooming house by a man seen leaving the building minutes after the slaying.

The binoculars were purchased the afternoon of the slaying. The clerk who sold them has been interviewed several times by Memphis police and the FBI.

If the man who fled the rooming house purchased the rifle in Birmingham and the binoculars in Memphis, at least four persons have seen his face.

Besides the sales' clerks, the others are Mrs. Bessie Brewer, the landlady who rented an \$8.50-a-week room to the suspect and Charlie Hugh Stephens, one of her tenants.

## 2 SHOWN DRAWING

Mrs. Brewer and Stephens were re-interviewed Tuesday by FBI agents and shown a drawing of the suspect developed by the FBI from descriptions of the man.

Stephens said the drawing did not resemble the fugitive and was much younger looking than the man he remembered. Mrs. Brewer said she wasn't able to remember what the fugitive or the drawing looked like.

In Atlanta Wednesday, a plain-

clothesman stood guard over the white marble tomb of Dr. King, urging visitors not to bother the heaps of flowers wilting on the grave.

In Joplin, Mo., an itinerant preacher booked for vagrancy and questioned by the FBI in connection with the assassination has been cleared of suspicion of any crime. The police chief said here the man had identified himself as Lynn R. Cleveland, 33, St. Louis.

Cleveland received a three-day jail sentence in magistrate court on a vagrancy charge. Such a charge can be brought against anyone not having a visible means of support.

After Judge Stewart E. Tatum passed sentence he stipulated Cleveland should be released to the man's father.

Many wreaths were stripped by souvenir seekers shortly after Dr. King was interred on Tuesday following day-long tributes, but police put a stop to

the practice when they took up the watch.

#### CLOSED UNTIL DAWN

Southview Cemetery, where Dr. King was interred, was sealed off by four officers from midnight to dawn to prevent any tampering with the crypt. At daybreak the security force was cut back to one plain-clothesman.

A soaking, spring rain accompanied the bleak gray dawn and flower petals floated in muddy puddles of water around the gleaming crypt.

Daylight disclosed a jaunty bush hat, bearing the insignia of the Royal Australian Engineers, which someone had left on the grave.

#### 'FREE AT LAST'

After the rain ended, seven white women, dressed in slacks and cotton print dresses, visited the tomb and inspected a legend on the crypt, which reads, "Free at last, free at last, thank God Almighty, free at last."

They also straightened the wreaths.

#### MARCH DELAYED

Dr. King's civil rights organization named Mrs. King and entertainer Harry Belafonte to its board of directors Wednesday and announced plans to pursue its nonviolent activities "more militantly than ever."

The Rev. Ralph D. Abernathy, Dr. King's successor as president of the Southern Christian Leadership Conference, told a press conference

that demonstrations would be

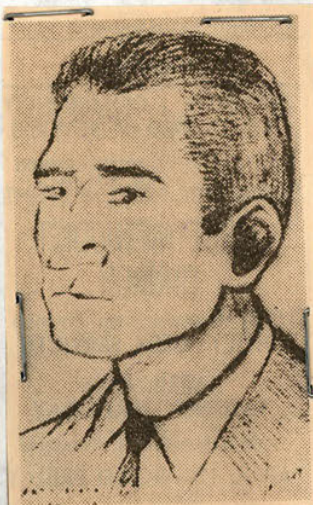
continued in Memphis, Tenn., but delayed in Washington, where Dr. King had planned to launch a Poor People's campaign later this month.

Mr. Abernathy, who plans to go to Memphis "early next week," said the death of Dr.

King and the continuing Memphis protest had caused SCLC to delay the beginning of Washington demonstrations for about two weeks, until the middle of May.

Belafonte was a longtime friend of Dr. King and supporter of SCLC. He has given many benefit performances in behalf of the organization.

The SCLC leadership is expected to gather at Penn Community Center in Frogmore, S. C., this weekend to continue planning the organization's future. Dr. King often used the secluded center, founded by the Quakers, for such conferences.
