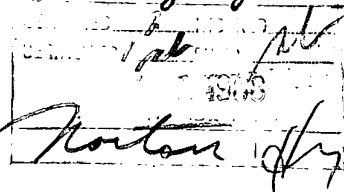

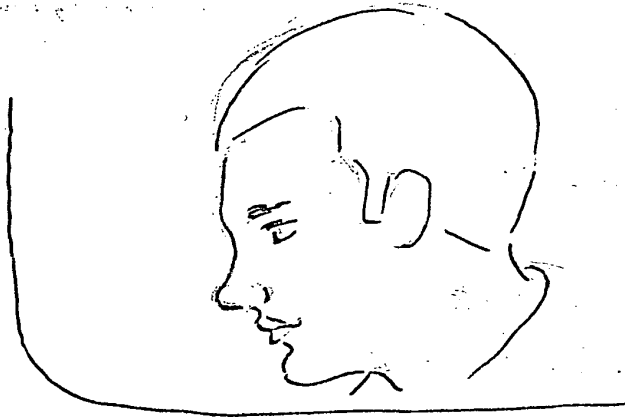

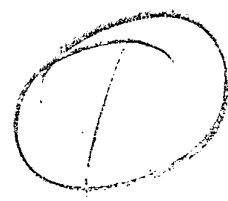

Hermosillo, Mexico — (AP) — An American arrested by Mexican officials because they thought he resembled pictures of the man wanted in the slaying of the Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., was released Thursday after questioning.

Daniel David Kennedy, 41, of Baltimore, said, "I guess anyone else would be mad, but I can't be angry with these people. They thought I looked like James Ray (wanted in the killing) and they were only doing their duty."

Kennedy arrived in Mexico March 27 and was hiking to Baja, California, when he was arrested about 80 miles south of the border.

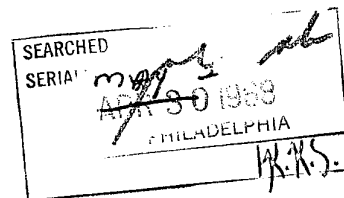

Mexico Quizzes Yank in King Slaying

CABORCA, Mexico (UPI). — Police said today they had arrested a bearded hitchhiker from Baltimore in their hunt for a suspect in the assassination of the Rev. Martin Luther King, Jr.

They said they had arrested Daniel D. Kennedy at a cafe yesterday in this town 80 miles southwest of Nogales, Ariz., and questioned him for 12 hours in his \$5-a-night hotel room. Kennedy was then taken, in handcuffs, 120 miles to the south to Hermosillo, capital of Sonora State.

More than 12 hours after Kennedy had been taken to Hermosillo the FBI said in Washington that "there has been no arrest" in the hunt for James Earl Ray, wanted by the FBI in connection with Dr. King's assassination.

In Baltimore, Kennedy's mother called the arrest "impossible." She said, "He's just a skinny old thing" and only a "blind man" would say her son resembled Ray.

HOTEL MANAGER Carlos Valancia Beltran, however, said he had told police his guest resembled pictures of Ray.

Mexican authorities did not immediately announce if any formal charge had been against Kennedy.

The hitchhiker registered at Caborca's San Carlos Hotel under the name of Daniel David Kennedy, 42, of 548 E. 38th st., Baltimore. Police said his U. S. passport was numbered 8527475.

Lt. Roberto Fletcher of the Mexican police made the arrest and led the questioning in the hotel room. He surrounded the hotel with officers armed with pistols.

Police said they found no weapons on Kennedy nor any in the Army-type pack he carried on his back.

BELTRAN SAID Kennedy told him he had entered Mexico at the Arizona border town of Nogales.

Kennedy checked into the hotel Tuesday night at 11 P. M., Beltran said. Yesterday, Kennedy asked about placing a telephone call to an unidentified person in Baltimore, the hotel manager said.

The manager watched his guest closely. He said Kennedy has a tattoo "something like a monkey" on his left arm.

When Kennedy stepped out of room 22 yesterday, Beltran telephoned police.

Fletcher arrived. Beltran pointed to the empty room and said Kennedy had stepped out, possibly to a nearby cafe. At the cafe, Fletcher found Kennedy seated at a table, drinking.

According to Beltran, Fletcher handcuffed the American almost immediately. Shortly thereafter, Fletcher and another officer—armed—led Kennedy back to Room 22.

THE INTERROGATION that began in midafternoon lasted until 3:30 A.M. today. Then Fletcher led Kennedy down the staircase and into the car, saying he was taking the American to Hermosillo.

A caravan of police cruisers escorted Kennedy and Fletcher to Hermosillo.

Officer Emilio Merazz of the Caborca police headquarters said they had been hunting suspects for Ray through drawings made by a Mexican federal police artist in Mexico City working from FBI information. Beltran quoted police as saying Kennedy identified himself as a walking tourist, bound for Sonora's desolate Altar Desert. Kennedy said he has a daughter in Baltimore and has been divorced, Beltran said.

Police said Kennedy had made his way to Caborca through the town of Saric.

The area between Nogales and Caborca is one of the North American continent's hottest, most arid stretches of territory. Its greatest population is that of rattlesnakes. One Mexican authority said, "Any man who walks across that has got to be something special."

IN BALTIMORE, Kennedy's 68-year-old mother, Pearl, said of the arrest. "That's impossible. That's impossible."

"He's just a skinny old thing. It would take a blind man to say that he resembled the man the FBI is looking for," Mrs. Kennedy said, her voice breaking with sobs.

The mother said her son was wounded and awarded the Purple Heart in combat in Germany during the Second World War. "He is a mixed-up kid and has been ever since they found him paralyzed from the waist down on that battlefield in Germany."

"He wouldn't harm a flea, he

wouldn't kill a fly," she said.

MRS. KENNEDY said her son "was especially partial to colored people and thought they were not getting a fair break. That's one of the reasons he decided to go to Mexico."

She said her son left Baltimore March 24 after answering a newspaper advertisement from someone wanting to drive to Tucson, Ariz., with expenses shared. She said her son hitchhiked from Tucson to Caborca and called home Tuesday night.

"I wired him \$30 yesterday," she said.

But she said he has never been able to hold a steady job because of his war wounds and has no "trade." She said Kennedy receives a monthly veteran's compensation check from the Government.

Mrs. Kennedy, a widow, said her son's daughter, Karen, was expecting a child.

King Slay Suspect Cleared

HERMOSILLO, Mexico (UPI).—A bearded American tourist from Baltimore, Md., arrested and questioned yesterday by Mexican police in their hunt for a suspect in the slaying of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., has been released with apologies by State authorities.

Daniel D. Kennedy, 42, left State Police headquarters in Hermosillo saying he wanted to continue his trip to Guaymas, a small fishing and resort town on the Pacific Coast about 80 miles south of Hermosillo.

"We turned him loose less than two hours after he was brought here," State police said. "We had a complete set of photographs here from the FBI, and fingerprints of the real suspect. This man didn't match the photographs or fingerprints at all."

FBI Again Seeks 'Galt' In Fla. in King Slaying

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. (UPI) — The search for the slayer of the Rev. Martin Luther King, Jr., has taken another mysterious twist and was turned toward Florida today.

The FBI last night issued a pickup order for Eric Starvo Galt and asked that it be transmitted to law enforcement agencies

in Florida. The order said Galt was wanted for "civil rights conspiracy" and had used the aliases of Harvey Lowmyer and John Willard.

IT MADE NO MENTION of James Earl Ray, the 40-year-old escapee from the Missouri State Prison whom FBI Director J. Edgar Hoover said fingerprints had proved was the same person as Galt. "Ray and Galt are identical," Hoover said last week.

The FBI in Miami refused comment. Earlier yesterday, the FBI in Washington clamped a lid on any public progress report on the manhunt. The policy was expected to prevail until a suspect is captured or some dramatic new development occurs.

Ray was placed on the list of the FBI's 10 most wanted criminals Saturday, and alerts have been issued in Canada and Mexico as well as the U. S.

THE FLORIDA ALERT was the State's second in 12 days for Galt. On April 11, the day a white Mustang car registered to Galt was found abandoned in Atlanta, the FBI issued a "locate and observe" order for Galt in Florida. About five hours later, it was canceled and the FBI indicated later the order was a mistake.

A Miami police official was skeptical of the current alert's failure to mention Ray's name.

"Maybe in about another week the correction will catch up with the message," he said.

A Federal warrant charging conspiracy has been issued against Galt. Police in Memphis, Tenn., where Dr. King was slain by a white sniper April 4, have charged Galt with murder.

King Fugitive Was a Rebel, High School Principal Says

New York — (AP) — James Earl Ray, suspected assassin of the Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., began his rebellion against authority during a poverty-stricken childhood in the Midwest and was always known as a troublemaker, said an article in the current issue of Life magazine.

Ray, alias Eric Starvo Galt, continued his troublemaking career in the Army, then turned to a life of small-time, usually unsuccessful crime, the article said. Life quoted one of Ray's brothers as saying that if he killed King, it was probably for money.

The article said Ray was absent from school 25 to 30 percent of the time when a child. Virgil Oscar Graves, who was principal of the Ewing, Mo., school Ray attended, was quoted as saying, "He was a rebel. He rebelled against authority and his approach to most of his teachers was very bad . . ."

Money Motive

Ray's brother, Gerald, was quoted as saying Ray knew that

if he were recaptured he faced a stiffer prison sentence, even without a murder accusation.

"A deal with a lot of money would have looked pretty good to a man in that circumstance," the brother said. "He sure didn't have any love for colored people, but I know he wouldn't have put himself in a spot like this unless there was something in it for him."

'Clownish Crimes'

In 1949, the article said, Ray went to Los Angeles and began a series of "almost clownish crimes." He was caught almost every time he tried a robbery, the magazine said, and did not succeed until 1959 when he and a partner stole \$800 from a grocery store in St. Louis.

In prison, having been sentenced late in 1959 to 20 years in the Missouri State Penitentiary for armed robbery, Ray "distinguished himself only by a series of (unsuccessful) solitary escape attempts." Finally, a year ago, he succeeded in escaping by hiding in a truck from the prison bakery.
