Re memo of SA JAMES L. O'CONNOR dated 4/30/68.

Trooper Lamar Green, BCI, Pennsylvania State Police, Mansfield, Pa. advised 5/3/68, that he will search latent prints on file at that troop headquarters to establish if any could be identical to those of JAMES EARL RAY.

Trooper Joseph Perechinsky, BCI, Pennsylvania State Police, Towanda, Pa. advised 5/3/68, that a search of latent prints maintained by that troop headquarters disclosed that none are identical with those of JAMES EARL RAY.

Trooper Carl Aciukewicz, BCI, Pennsylvania State Police, Coudersport, Pa. advised 5/6/68, that while the troop headquarters does maintain any unidentified latent prints on a normal basis, they do not have any on file at that time.

Trooper Green, BCI, Mansfield, Pa. subsequently advised on 5/17/68, that a complete search of latent prints on file at that station, do not include any which are identical with those of JAMES EARL RAY.

All other law enforcement agencies contacted in the territory covered by the Wellsboro RA, do not maintain any latent fingerprints in connection with matters under their jurisdiction, but depend upon the Pennsylvania State Police to handle these matters.

This date, ROBERT BENKOVICH, Apartment E154 Devon - Stratford Apartments, Devon, Pa., telephonically contacted the writer. He advised that he was employed as a Bibliographic Searcher at the Franklin Institute Laboratories.

BENKOVICH stated that he had been doing dream study research under hypnosis with his wife, REGINA BENKOVICH. He stated that during one of these sessions he had asked his wife where JAMES EARL RAY was. She responded that he was in Atlantic City, N.J., but that he was soon leaving for the state of Washington.

She also divulged that RAY was not the killer of MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR., and that he had a witness to prove this if he were ever apprehended. The real killer is in Europe.

REGINA BENKOVICH has no personal knowledge of RAY, but has only divulged the above through dream studies.

The alleged killer had had a brother killed in a civil rights demonstration, and that was the motive for his killing KING.

SUBJECT: JAMES EARL RAY

The following investigation was conducted by the writer:

At Phoenixville, Pa.

Major MILTON GEORGE MC GAUHEY, 119 Camp Council Road advised on 5/13/68 that the only additional information regarding the individual who he observed on 5/3/68 at the Valley Forge General Hospital (VFGH) and who he thought had a resemblance to RAY came from a conversation he had with this man. He added that the man mentioned to him that he had been in the United States Air Force for 19 years and that he had achieved a pay grade of E-7. He added that when he last saw this individual the man asked directions to the Non-Commissioned Officers Club at the VFGH. He concluded that he has not seen this man before or since the incident. MC GAUHEY explained that he himself, was retired from the military and thought this individual he saw was also probably a retired military person but thought he should report the incident anyhow.

DR. DOUGLAS REITSMA, civilian doctor under contract to the VFGH advised that he does not keep an appointment book and that he sees all of the patients at the Out Patient Department at the VFGH and that prior to their appearance at his office at VFGH they are checked by the duty Non-Commissioned Officer to see if they have identification ~~xxx~~ cards which entitle them to the medical service he performs. He added that he does not specifically recall who he saw on 5/3/68, but that he did remember the patients were ones which he has seen several times in the past and that they were all military dependants or retired military persons or they could not have gotten in to see him. He examined a photograph of JAMES EARL RAY and he stated that he could not recall anyone who had been in to see him during the month of May who would even resemble in any way this photograph.

PUBLICITY ON REWARDS OFFERED

Each Special Agent in Charge and Legal Attache is instructed to promptly remind their established cooperative news sources, in a discreet and tactful manner, of the existence of substantial reward money for information leading to the arrest and conviction of the killer of Dr. Martin Luther King. This money now totals at least \$100,000. The FBI should not, however, be publicized as the source of this reminder.

While the Bureau's continuing policy is to encourage the public to furnish information to law enforcement authorities as a matter of good citizenship, without expectation of financial reward, it is fully recognized that monetary rewards are often necessary to motivate some individuals. The knowledge of the existence of the substantial rewards available in the Murkin case could possibly prove of value in the solution of this major investigation.

On Easter Sunday, 4/14/68 Rev. HAL B. LLOYD, Pastor, Germantown Presbyterian Community Church, Green and Tulpehocken Streets, Philadelphia, Pa., made a sermon which was televised to several states. Since that time LLOYD has received numerous letters in response to his sermon, some of which were complimentary and some of which were uncomplimentary. These letters concern the present conditions of the Negroes in this country.

MRS. ALBERT A. ALLEN, 7 Caswallen Drive advised on 5/21/68 that a 1959 Rambler, Station Wagon, Black, 1968 Pennsylvania License 7D4-618 is presently owned by her son, MELVYN R. ALLEN, who is presently enrolled as a student at Syracuse University, Syracuse, New York. She added that during April 1968 her son got several parking tickets on this car in Syracuse and the Syracuse Police Department impounded the car. She added that subsequent to this action by the police department the car was released to MELVYN on the condition that he would pay the parking tickets. She stated that MELVYN went to Syracuse recovered the car and that the car is presently being utilized by her husband, ALBERT A. ALLEN, to commute to his place of employment in West Chester, Penna. She added that MELVYN returned to school in Syracuse in his father's Volkswagon and he left the 1959 Rambler in West Chester as he had been having motor trouble with the car and did not think it capable of making a long trip.

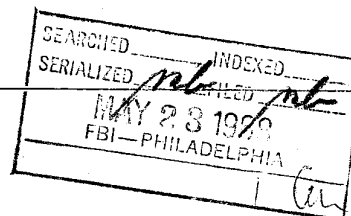

No indented writing or other identifying features were noted on Q347 and Q348 which might indicate the immediate source of these two items. The typewriting on Q347 and Q348 is not identical to that on other typewritten items which emanated from "Eric S. Galt." The signature on Q348 bears a pictorial resemblance to other signatures in the "Galt" name appearing on items previously submitted; however, the poor line quality and the presence of certain characteristics indicate that the signature on Q348 was not prepared by the subject, James Earl Ray. Identity Sought For Body Found In Lime Grave

The Federal Bureau of Investigation and state police have joined with Schuylkill County authorities in an attempt to identify a bullet-riddled body found in a shallow grave about 20 miles north of Pottsville on May 7.

Three 38 caliber bullets were found in the remains after an autopsy and the victim's right cheekbone had been fractured and some of his upper teeth knocked out. Authorities said it appeared to have been a gangland killing.

The body was so badly decomposed that little more than a skeleton remained. Investigators said dental records would be about the only means of identification.

Originally they believed that the body had been in the grave at least a year. Then it appeared that lime had been poured over it to hasten its disintegration.

The body was found near Route 339 two miles north of Mahanoy City by two state forestry workers.

The FBI here said there was no evidence to link the body with James Earl Ray, 40, being sought in the assassination of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. A spokesman said the chance of the body being that of Ray is about "one in 200 million."

Upstate Gun Victim**Body Probed for King Slaying Link**By **GEORGE INGRAM**
Of The Inquirer Staff

MAHANAY CITY, Pa., May 23.—The discovery of the body of a murdered man in a shallow, hurriedly-dug grave in the Schuylkill county pinelands has led to an investigation into the possibility that the victim is James Earl Ray, the accused

slayer of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr.

Joe D. Jamieson, agent in charge of the Philadelphia office of the FBI, is among authorities who have cast considerable doubt that the murdered man is Ray. But the investigation, initiated by Schuylkill county officials, is continuing, it was disclosed Thursday.

The body was found in the Buck Mountain area of the county, 2½ miles north of Mahanoy City. It was in a grave dug among scrub pine about 600 feet west of Route 339.

The body was discovered by two State Forestry Service employees on May 8, but it was only in the past few days that local

investigators began to note some similarities between the facial characteristics and those of Ray.

Charts were set up and facial measurements were taken. Local investigators decided there was sufficient reason to call in Hugh C. Norton, of the FBI in Schuylkill county.

Jamieson said there was no reason to believe that the skeleton and other remains were those of Ray, who authorities say shot and killed Dr. King on April 4 in Memphis, Tenn.

Schuylkill County District Attorney Richard Russell said he believed it was more likely the body was that of a victim of a gangland slaying, an angle he said also was being probed by the FBI.

Dr. Wilton Krogman, of Philadelphia, an expert "bone detective," said he took "a dim view" of the possibility that the remains were those of Ray, but like Jamieson he was awaiting what he called the "clincher"—a foolproof dental comparison. He was called in on the case by State police.

Local authorities considered significant the discovery of a car, a Mustang, at the bottom of a 45-foot strip mine pond, recalling that the killer of Dr. King escaped in a white Mustang.

However, after the assassination of the Negro civil rights leader, a white Mustang registered in one of Ray's assumed names was found abandoned in

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Atlanta, Ga., and was impounded by the FBI.

Skin divers employed to trace the Mustang discovered in Schuylkill county were not sure the car was white and had to abandon attempts to remove it from the water.

The pond is on the St. Clair Port Carbon rd., between communities by the same names and about 18 miles from the spot where the body was found. It is in East Norwegian town ship.

The body was in a grave 24 inches deep, 15 inches wide and about 40 inches long, according to State Police Sgt. John R. Dalinsky. Clad only in shorts and T-shirt, the body was on its left chest cavity, one behind the ear, a third in the brain.

VICTIM BATTERED

Dr. Thomas Patrick Buckley, pathologist at Good Samaritan Hospital, Pottsville, reported after an autopsy that the murder victim had multiple fractures of the cheek and the upper teeth had been knocked out.

Dr. Krogman, a University of Pennsylvania professor and chairman of its department of Physical Anthropology, said the victim had been pistol-whipped. He said there was a "superficial facial resemblance" with Ray, a resemblance suggested by a restoration he performed with an "identi-kit."

The anthropologist, who is also director of the Growth Research Center at Children's

Hospital, 1701 Fitzwater st., said the murder victim had had a "very specific" dental work when Chaplinsky noticed a small excavation he thought to be a groundhog hole and then noticed a bone in the hole about seven inches in length.

'NORMAL PROCEDURE'

Jamieson said there was nothing that would indicate the remains were those of Ray, and added it was "normal procedure" to check out the possibility just is it was with many other body discoveries in other parts of the country.

"If the results of the check turn out to be him, fine, it was a good guess," he said.

Authorities said dental records of Ray would be obtained from veterans' hospitals where he had been a patient and the prisons where he served time. Jamieson would not say when those records would be available, pointing out it came under "a normal administrative procedure."

IDENTITY CLUES

Dr. Krogman said his study indicated the murder victim was white, had dark brown hair, a muscular build, and was between 5 feet, 9 inches, and six feet in height. He was also believed to be between 39 and 44 years of age.

Dr. Krogman said the murder victim found in Schuylkill county — and since buried in a potter's field in Pottsville — weighed 180 to 210 pounds. Ray, who was 40 and 5 feet, 11 inches, weighed between 160 and 175 pounds.

The disappearance and subsequent murder of Dr. King's killer has been considered a distinct possibility by investigators who believed he might have been "used" as a tool to commit the assassination.

The mystery body was found by Winfield Morgan, district supervisor of the State Department of Forests and Waters.

The anthropologist, who is also an employee of Mitchell Chaplinsky, during a survey of the search area at Children's

Hospital, 1701 Fitzwater st., said They said they were following the murder victim had had a "very specific" dental work when Chaplinsky noticed a small excavation he thought to be a groundhog hole and then noticed a bone in the hole about seven inches in length.

The two men dug further and discovered the skeleton. The area was cordoned off by police.

GANG THEORY

District Attorney Russell said Thursday night that establishment of the body as that of Ray was "a million to one shot" and reiterated his belief the body was that of a gangland slaying victim.

"We don't have any local Mafia as such in our area," he said, "but the type of burial and the beating looks like a professional Mafia job."

The medical experts who examined the body were of the opinion it was that of an Italian or central European.

State Police Detective George Durilla of Reading said a shoe made in Italy and fitting the foot of the dead man was found 10 feet from the body, along with a pair of black bifocal glasses.

DUMPING GROUND

One side result of the probe was the discovery by authorities of a dumping ground for stolen cars, and it was believed possible several would be turned up.

When three teenagers were arrested in Elizabeth, N. J., for stealing a car from the Schuylkill Haven Acme Market, they gave information about other thefts and described the Lower Mill Creek mine area as a depository for stolen cars.

Members of the Schuylkill Scuba Diving Club descended in the pond in that area and found a stolen 1957 Chevrolet on the bottom, under 45 feet of water, the Mustang balanced precariously above it.

TOO DANGEROUS

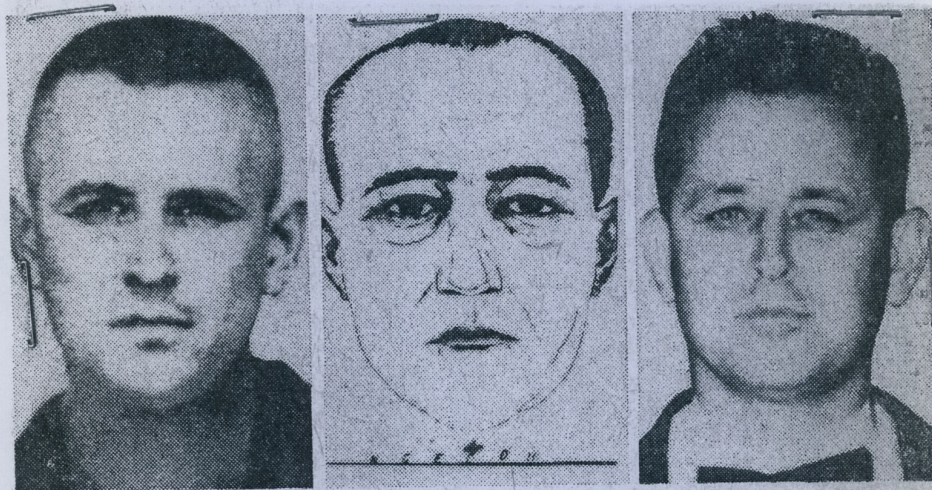
One of the divers, Vincent Lucas, of Minersville, said, it was too dangerous to approach the Mustang in the murky waters. He said the divers planned to renew their efforts in a sunny weather and when the water had cleared.

Dr. King's slayer at first was identified as Eric Starvo Galt. Later, however, that name proved only one of many aliases used by Ray, who was known as a "loner."

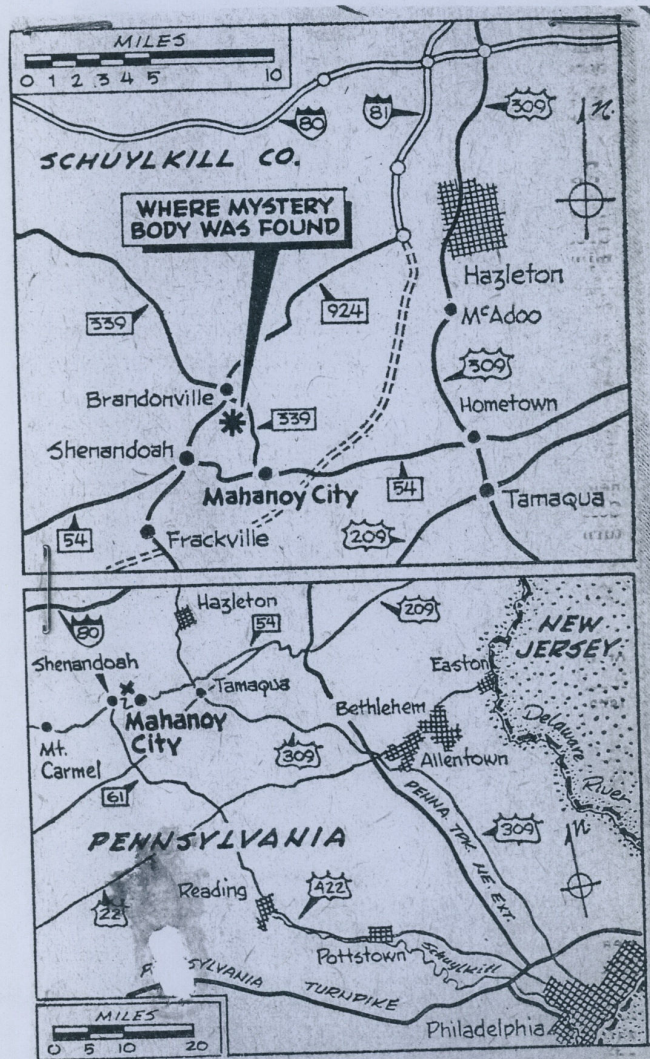
Ray's last known address was a boarding house in Birmingham, Ala. Investigators discovered that less than a year ago he peeled off \$2000 in cash — although listing himself as unemployed — to purchase the white Mustang.

Ray served two years in the Army but was discharged for ineptitude. He was jailed for three months while in the Army for drunkenness and resisting arrest.

He has a criminal record dating back to 1949. In 1960, he was sentenced to 20 years in the Missouri State Penitentiary for armed robbery and car theft and escaped from there on April 23, 1967.

JAMES EARL RAY, also known as Eric Starvo Galt, Harvey Lowmyer, John Willard, James McBride, James Walton, W. C. Herron and James O'Conner.

James Earl Ray, a Missouri prison escapee, sought under the alias Eric Starvo Galt in connection with the gunshot slaying of civil rights leader Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., is one of the FBI's "Ten Most Wanted Fugitives." FBI Director J. Edgar Hoover ordered the special addition of Ray to the "Top Ten" list to insure widespread dissemination of Ray's photograph and description to speed his location.

Ray has been intensively sought since the murder of Dr. King on April 4, 1968, as he stood on the balcony of a Memphis, Tennessee, motel. An exhaustive FBI fingerprint search, comparing latent fingerprints uncovered in the Dr. King case against fingerprints of over 53,000 persons on whom wanted notices were posted, determined that Galt and Ray are identical.

A Federal warrant, issued at Birmingham, Alabama, on April 17, 1968, charges Ray, under the alias of Galt, with conspiring to interfere with a Constitutional Right of a citizen. Ray, who escaped on April 23, 1967, from the Missouri State Penitentiary, is also sought for unlawful flight to avoid confinement for robbery. His long criminal record also includes convictions for burglary and forging U.S. Postal Money Orders.

A white American, born in Alton, Illinois, on March 10, 1928, Ray is 5'10" tall, weighs 163 to 174 pounds, has blue eyes and short brown hair. He has a nervous habit of tugging at an ear lobe and his left ear protrudes noticeably. Known as a "loner" and "drifter," Ray has worked as a baker, laborer and color matcher. He has taken dancing lessons and completed a course at a school of bartending.

Consider Ray armed and extremely dangerous. Report any information concerning him to the nearest FBI office.

Informant further advised that one EDDIE LEE WHARTON of 2013 Oakwood, would know who borrowed the money from REDD. This money was loaned at a rate of \$.25 on the dollar returned.

PCI advised that JACK OLIPHANT of Local 332 is working for DIC Concrete. He was at 17th and Market Streets on the project there. He is now being moved from job to job in order that he can carry on his money lending activities. PCI said he understands that JACK is being moved by PETE CIOFFIE, a superintendent at the 17th and Market project, who is probably getting a piece of the action. Money here is loaned at the return of \$.25 on the dollar.

PCI identified a man known as "Money Bill" as WILLIAM HALSTEAD, a chronic numbers player, and possible money lender. He is now working at the parking lot near the South Street bridge at 34th Street.

PCI suggested a talk with TOMMY SHANK, a former assistant business manager of Local 332, who was recently fired. He lives at 2621 West Jefferson Street and may be ready to reveal whatever he knows because of having been fired.

PCI stated that ROBERT MILLS, one of the men in on a planned holdup of Local 332 which did not come off, borrowed the car of one RAYMOND KELLOM (phonetic), a laborer, and subsequently ran into a telephone pole breaking it. MILLS told KELLOM he had an old Buick he would sign over to him and that the Local 332 would pay for the pole. This indicated to the PCI that MILLS has a hold on someone in the Local.

Attached is a copy of a photograph of JAMES EARL RAY taken in the Fall of 1967. It was obtained from a prostitute in Mexico.

By airtel dated 5/21/68 the Bureau advised, for the Field's information and investigative assistance, that RAY had been known to consort with prostitutes and "street bums."

The Bureau instructed that this information should be borne in mind in the daily contact with informants, officers of vice squads and prostitutes in covering leads in connection with this and other cases.

The Bureau also advised by airtel that RAY took a bar tending course in Los Angeles, Calif., during the early part of 1968. Prior to his departure from Los Angeles in March of 1968, he made several telephone calls to country clubs in an effort to obtain employment.

The above should be borne in mind in covering leads in connection with this and other cases.
