The following investigation was conducted by IC.

On April 24, 1968 MR. How States, Special Service Representative, Veterans Administration Center, 5000 Wissahickon Avenue, Philadelphia, Pa., made available National Service Life Insurance (NSLI) Policy pertaining to JAMES EARL RAY and the following information was obtained:

JAMES EARL RAY made application for a \$10,000 term NSLI policy on February 21. 1946 at Fort Sheridan, ILL., listing his date of birth as and his beneficiary as his mother L Alton, Ill., Alton, Ill.

RAY entered on duty in the military service on February 19, 1946 under serial number His monthly insurance premiums were made to the VA by allotment from his military pay and amounted to \$6.40.

His monthly allotments were discontinued to the VA on March 31, 1947 at his own request and his NSLI policy lapsed on May 21, 1947.

On July 25, 1950 the VA sent RAY a 1948 Special Dividend which amounted to \$82.50. His address at that time was 215 Oak Street, Quincy, Ill. This is the last contact the VA had with JAMES EARL RAY and his file has been in a closed status since that time.

The records of the Fraud and Arson Bureau, American Insurance Association, which covers the Eastern parts of the State of Pennsylvania, the State of Delaware, and the Southern part of the State of New Jersey were reviewed with negative results relative to the names of ERIC STARVO GALT, JOHN WILLARD and HARVEY LOWMEYER.

The records of all dancing schools in the Philadelphia Division were reviewed and personnel at these schools were interviewed with negative results relative to the subject.

All laundries in the Philadelphia Division were contacted relative to the use of code 02B-6 on a thermoseal marking tape being used by the laundry for any customer with negative results. Laundries having textile marking machines were contacted pertaining to their use of marking code 20R-3 with negative results.

Contacts with the police departments in the Philadelphia Division failed to indicate the recovery of any car stolen from the State of Georgia and recovered subsequent to March 23, 1968.

Personnel at Police Departments within the Philadelphia Division maintaining latent print sections made comparisons between the unknown latents and the known fingerprints of RAY without effecting any identification.

Through the W. S. Ponton Company, Upper Darby, Pa., a circular letter was distributed to all laundries and dry cleaning establishments (approximately 14,000) in the United States.

He was subsequently identified as one FRED NEIBAUER, 2213 Spruce Street, Philadelphia, Pa. It was determined that he was a teacher in Philadelphia, Pa., at the West Philadelphia High School, and through a check with the Philadelphia Board of Education it was determined that he had been teaching at the above high school each day since March 7, 1968.

By letter dated April 16, 1968, the FBI Laboratory advised that the piece of white cloth containing six samples of thermo-seal marking tape obtained from the above mentioned laundry was found to differ in printing from the tapes appearing on Q 69 and Q70.

All laundries within the Philadelphia Division were contacted with negative results in an effort to locate a laundry utilizing thermo-seal marking tape and the marking code D-2H6.

The details of leads received and handled entirely within the Philadelphia Division concerning allegations of some individuals resembling RAY are recorded in the Philadelphia file.

The names of Special Agents and Investigative Clerks conducting the investigation in the Philadelphia Division along with the names of agencies and individuals contacted and all other pertinent details are maintained in the Philadelphia File.

On the evening of 4/11/68, at approximately 7:30 PM, at Gino's Restaurant, route 73 and 295 in Maple Shade, N.J., he was approached by an individual who resmebled ERIC STARVO GAULT whose picture he viewed in the paper and on televison on 4/18/68.

A stated that this individual who stated he resides at 2nd. and Girard Avenue, and works at a Brewery in that vicinity was inquiring directions as to how to get to Philadelphia. He said this individual indicated that he received \$3.25 and hour as an employee at this brewery and that his wife lived at 2nd. and Birard. Howver, after talking to this individual for a period of time he determined that he was not certain that he was empoyed at the brewery but that he had some knowledge of brewery work and was looking for a job. He also determined that he believed that this individual did not have a wife or at least did not believe this individual to have a wife.

In view of the above this lead is being considered covered.

Attached hereto are five copies each of a blind memorandum for the SRAs, one copy for the Bank Robbery Coordinator and copies as designated for other Agents.

It is suggested that Agents review this blind memorandum, which concerns the finding of the body of an unknown White male near Mahanoy City, Pa., on 5/8/68, apparently killed in gangland fashion, on the possibility that unknown deceased may be identical with the subject of any racketeering investigation if that subject disappeared in about March or April 1968.

Agents should contact PCIs and CIs during regular course of business, for information as to identity of unknown deceased.

It should also be considered that unknown deceased may be identical with subject of a bank robbery investigation, as well as an anti-racketeering investigation.

#### UNKNOWN DECEASED WHITE MALE FOUND NEAR MAHANOY CITY, PA., 5/8/68

On May 8, 1968, the body of unknown deceased was found in shallow grave on Brandonville Mountain, near Mahanoy City, Pa. Body was badly decomposed and was clad only in shorts and undershirt. White powder, believed lime, was found in grave.

Local pathologist, Pottsville, Pa., examined body on May 10, 1968 and determined it was white male of heavy build. Three .38 caliber bullets were found in the chest cavity and a hole was found in the skull, behind one ear. Cheek bone was fractured and most of upper teeth knocked out or had fallen out. Due to decomposition no possibility existed of obtaining finger-prints. Pathologist of opinion body in grave about six months.

Teeth in lower jaw intact and contain several fillings of low quality, indicating dental work may have been done in prison or other institution.

A pair of Italian made pointed shoes, size 9D, and a pair of bifocal glasses were found near the grave. It is not known if these belonged to unknown deceased.

Lower jaw of unknown deceased in possession of Penn-sylvania State Police, Reading, Pa., who are retaining for comparison with dental records of missing persons.

On 5/20/68 D Director, BVS, Warrisburg, Pa., was requested to determine if there is any central record of unidentified deceased persons maintained by the State of Pennsylvania and to advise of the feasability of a search or review of same if it exists.

on 6/7/68 Common advised that he had determined that the only such file maintained by Pennsylvania is an index of the death certificates of unknown or unidentified dead maintained by BVS. We said that in 1967 there were only 16 such certificates filed for the entire state out of a total of 137,411 death certificates. It is not now possible, however, to cause a review to be made of the unidentified certificates for April and May, 1968, inasmuch as certificates are currently only indexed up to February, 1968, and generally lag four or five menths behind time. No search would therefore be possible until at least August or September, 1968.

On 5/23/60 Mrs. F J J BMV, Pa. Department of Revenue, Marrisburg, Pa., was requested to ascertain the feasability of causing a review to be made of all drivers license applications in Pennsylvania for the months of April and May, 1968, concerning all male caucasians over thirty and under fifty-five in an attempt to locate the subject of this investigation. She said that she was of the opinion that it was an impossible job but that she would check into the situation and determine what it would entail.

On 6/7/68 Mrs. James advised that BMV records are set up by date of birth. They are not filed by sex and there is nothing in the records to indicate the race or color of the individuals. All Pennsylvania licenses are renewed every two years so that there some 250,000 applications received every month at BMV, of which about 25,000 are new drivers or persons just entering the state. However, these 25,000 are not segregated in any manner from the others and are handled as part of the 250,000 per month. It would therefore be necessary to search 500,000 applications for April and May, 1968, which are located in 24 places in their files due to their filing system of odd and even year renewals.

In view of the above, no further effort is being contemplated as to a search as outlined by the Bureau.

It is possible your office is aware of the fact that in about the first week in April a human foot was found on the marshes of Tinicum Township and turned over to the Tinicum Township Police Department. Chief Township Police Department. Chief Township Police Laboratory. I am told that the foot was described as a man's foot, was in good condition at the time found and is now in the possession of the Delaware County Coroner.

I am concerned because as far as I can determine no effort has been made to recover the remainder of the body even though it appeared from the condition of the foot that it had been brought up by the dredge working in the Delaware River.

I was interested in the foot because I have been helping the family of a woman who has been missing since that time. You might be interested because of the Martin Luther King murder case and the disappearance of the alleged assailant.
