AT QUANTICO, VA.

On 4/17/68, Mr. C. F. MEEKS, Marine Retail Outlet, Building 2011, Marine Corps Schools, advised SA JOSEPH A. AMRHEIN, JR., that the Thermo-Seal marking machine listed as assigned to this building is not here. He suggested the Post Laundry as being the only place on this base having such a machine.

On 4/19/68, Capt. DENNIE DAMON, in charge of Building 20D1, MSC, advised SA AMRHEIN that this building has never had any Thermo-Seal machine in it.

On 4/19/68, Capt. PHILIP CISNEROS, Post Laundry, MCS, advised SA AMRHEIN that his records show that he has a Thermo-Seal marking machine assigned to him with serial number 32665. He stated that he has never used laundry marking O2B-6 or -2B-6 on any of his clothing. This is not a Quantico laundry marking. His markings are usually a number, a letter, and then another number, for example 77K6. This indicated ticket number of 77, k for the name of the person handling the laundry, and 6 for the number of pieces in this bundle. He stated that he did not know of any organization in this area who would use such a designation.

Re airtel indicated that Mrs. JEROME POLAHA. Arlington, Va., had telephonically advised Washington Field that her husband had recognized the artist sketch of unsub as a former college schoolmate.

On 4/18/68, Mr. JEROME POLAKA, 2413 Utah St., Arlington, Va., advised he viewed the photo of the artist sketch of the unsub which had appeared in the "Washington Daily News" 4/17/68, and that this sketch reminded him of a person whom he knew at the University of Nevada who was in the Class of 1963. He could not recall this person's name but recalled he was approximately 5'7", small build, with brown hair, and that he recalled this individual was one of the few persons who owned an MG at the time.

Mr. POLAKA was shown a photograph of the subject and stated that there was no resemblance between this person and the University of Nevada graduate who resembled the artist sketch in the newspaper.

In view of the above, no further efforts are being made to identify this individual.

Re SAC memo to all agents in captioned matter, 4/19/68.

Bureau has advised that subject JAMES EARL RAY should be considered as a possible suspect in any unsolved bank robberies, burglaries, or armed robberies (possible ITSP violations) occurring after April 23, 1967. RAY should also be considered suspect in any future such violations and the Bureau should be advised telephonically of any tentative identification.

Any pertinent leads developed during review of past violations should be expeditiously run out and the Bureau advised.

Subject's handwriting and handprinting has not been identified in bank robbery note file and his fingerprints are being searched against latents submitted in insolved bank robberies and bank violations.

The Bureau has also instructed that all criminal informants and appropriate racial and security informants should be contacted concerning subject.

The Bureau reminded that ALL LEADS IN THIS CASE MUST BE COVERED WITHIN 24 HOURS AND ALL LEADS MUST BE SET FORTH BY TELEPHONE OR TELETYPE.

The FBI issued a conspiracy warrant last Wednesday for Eric Starvo Galt. Two days later the agency said a comparison of fingerprints found in the King investigation revealed that Galt in reality was James Earl Ray, a 40-year-old escapee from a Missouri prison.

A murder warrant issued here in Galt's name subsequently was amended to carry the name of Ray.

The penitentiary inmate said he did not think Ray was the kind of man who would kill for profit. And the warden, Harold Swenson, who remembers Ray, these were rather large words, added, "It's odd, but I won't believe he did it [killed King] until it is proven.

"None of the inmates gave us any feedback after the first pictures of Ray were published. They usually talk about an inmate after he's done something. They really blab about it But while he's doing something, you don't hear a word."

Hospital No. 1 at Fulton, Mo., from Sept. 8, 1966, to Oct. 17, 1966. Dr. Donald B. Peterson, hospital superintendent, said they had been asked only to determine whether Ray was mentally capable of standing trial.

"He showed no more nervousness than the average person awaiting trial," Dr. Peterson said. "He was rather reserved, but we just didn't find anything unusual.

"There, was nothing in his mental makeup or background to indicate anything but a recidivistic habitual criminal whose crimes were all associated with money. We didn't find anything to indicate he was a killer or had tendencies to kill.'

The official report from the hospital said Ray had "no ha lucinations or illusions, was or,ented as to time, place and person." His "mood effect" was described as "somewhat tense and anxious and at times showed mild depressions, but not of psychotic proportions."

Ray's IQ was listed as 105, considered normal.

In a separate psychological report, Dec. 20, 1966, for the Missouri State Board of Probation and Parole, Ray was reported to have a number of complaints, such as pain in the 'solar plexus [pit of the stomach], tachycardia [rapid heart action], and intracranial [inside the skull] tension."

'Galt' Really Escapee Named Ray, FBI Says

WASHINGTON-The Federal Bureau of Investigation announced Friday that an escaped convict named James Earl Ray, 40, is the man being sought in the killing of the Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. under the alias of Eric Starvo Galt.

Background information released by the FBI pictured Ray as a trouble-prone "drifter" and habitual criminal with a long record of erratic and violent behavior.

J. Edgar Hoover, director of the FBI, said in a joint announcement with Atty. Gen. Ramsey Clark that Ray escaped from the Missouri State Penitentiary on April 23, 1967.

Ray, a native of Illinois, had served seven years of a 20year sentence for armed robbery and car theft in St. Louis.

They bear a close resemblance to pictures of Galt, taken in 1968, that the FBI released earlier this week.

The convict Ray had closecropped hair and a leaner face than the Galt photo shows, but the protruding left ear, which the FBI emphasized in its initial description of Galt, appears to be the same in both photographs.

Full details of Ray's background were not known Friday night, because the FBI announced his true identity soon





after an around-the-clock check of fingerprint records disclosed

Fingerprints can be matched quickly by means of an elaborate classification and filing system when the full 10 prints of the unknown person are available on a card that identifies the finger and hand represented by each print.

But when only a few prints are available and it is not known which fingers or thumbs nade them, they can be checked only by the tedious process of comparing each latent print with all 10 prints on the card of each "wanted" person.

The FBI announcement said Ray has a known arrest record dating back to 1949, when he was convicted of burglary in Los Angeles. In 1952, he was convicted of armed robbery in Chicago and in 1955, he was found guilty of forging U.S. postal money orders in Missiuri.

Jailed in Los Angeles

He served a jail term in Los Angeles County in 1949 and in the Illinois State Prisons at Joliet and Pontiac in 1952-54. He served a term in the federal penitentiary at Leavenworth, Kan. in 1955-58.

While he was serving the latest sentence Ray was confined for a time in 1966 in the maximum security ward at the state hospital at Fulton, Mo.

that Ray made three unsuccessful attempts to escape before he finally got away last September. One attempt came when he bolted from sheriff's deputies who were guarding him during his trial. He was quickly caught and given 20 years as an habitual offender on Dec. 17, 1959.

He tried again in 1961 and 1966. In the attempt in 1966 he escaped from his penitentiary cell but was found two days later hiding in a ventilation shaft.

Given General Discharge

The FBI statement said Ray was an enlisted man in the Army from February 1946 to December 1948 when he was given a general discharge due to "ineptness and lack of adaptability for military service." While in the Army he was given a three-month sentence at hard labor for being drunk and breaking arrest.

Ray was said to have also used the names of James Mc-Bride, James Walton, W. C. Herron and James O'Connorduring his criminal career. When the FBI filed for matcharges against him on Wednesday in the name of Galt, it gave two other aliases, John Williard, and Harvey Lowmyer.

The FBI's description of Ray was much more detailed than that given for Galt. Ray was said to be a b o u t 5 feet 10 inches tall and to weigh about 163 to 174 pounds. He has blue eyes, brown hair and a small scar on the center of his forehead and a scar on the palm of his right hand.

Reputation as "Drifter"

According to the FBI, Ray claimed to have been born on March 10, 1928, in an upstate location in Illinois. He said he attended school through the 10th grade in Alton, Ill. Since then, the FBI said, "he has had the reputtaion of being a direction."

The Associated Press reported Friday that the City,
clerk in Alton, Ill. said a James
Earl Ray was born there
March 10, 1928, the son of a
laborer. The principal at Alton
Senior High School, according
to the AP, said his records
showed three James Rays attended the school during the
period Ray would have been
there, and the principal was
trying to determine whether
any of them was the Ray wanted by the FBI.]

The identification of Galt as the escaped convict Ray explains some of the strange circumstances about Galt that led to some speculation that he might have established a false identity in contemplation of killing King.

Galt first appeared, accord-

ing to FBI statements, on Aug. 30, 1967, when he purchased a white Mustang car in Birmingham. Despite efforts to check Galt's earlier activities, no trace of himi prior to the fall of last year was ever disclosed.

On Wednesday, a fugitive warrant was obtained by the FBI accusing Galt of having conspired with a person "whom he alleged to be his brother" to injure King and violate his civil rights.

FBI spokesmen declined to say Friday whether James Earl Ray had a brother, or to comment on reports that the FBI already has the "brother" (https://www.stody.

The FBI Laboratory advised that pillowcase and bed sheet were found in trunk of 1966 white Mustang registered to ERIC STARVO GALT, which was located at Atlanta 4/11/68. These items contain Thermo-Seal laundry tapes of approximately same size as tapes on items previously recovered, but are yellow in color and contain code, "20R-3." In opinion of Textile Marking Machine Company, Syracuse, New York, the tapes were produced by a different machine than previous tapes since the first three characters are 15 point type and the last two characters are 18 point type.

The Textile Marking Machine Company suggests the twenty in above code would be the lot number, the R may mean that this was a return of a batch of laundry, and the three is the bundle number.





Mrs. SMITH advised that her husband recently took a vacation to Kansas City, Mo., visiting a friend from the Army, a CHARLES DON WATSON, having left Charlottesville on Friday, 4/12/68.

Mrs. SMITH advised that her husband had been in Charlottesville and was employed by Van Lear Construction Co. during the week of the KING murder and in fact, had been working nights for Sgt. ELWOOD CASON of the Charlottesville, Va. PD at CASON's residence. SMITH also pointed out that her husband has two fingers missing from his left hand and stated that her husband's presence in Charlottesville at the time of the KING murder could be easily confirmed.

On 4/23/68, Sgt. ELWOOD CASON, Charlottesville, Va. PD, advised that he is well-acquainted with WILLIAM H. SMITH, having known him for a period of several years as a resident at 913 Montrose Ave., Charlottesville. CASON pointed out SMITH has two fingers missing from his left hand and that although he does have the same physical build as JAMES EARL RAY, including some close physical facial attributes as with the photograph distributed on RAY, he does not have a scar in the center of his forehead. CASON also pointed out that SMITH had been doing some carpentry work at CASON's residence for a period of several weeks, working every night, including the night of 4/5/68, at which time he had been paid by CASON for completion of the work.

On 4/20/68 Sheriff C.P. WITT, Henry County, Martinsville, Va. advised that one HENRY SHEFFIELD, Villa Heights Grill, Henry County, Highway 220 North, Martinsville, Va. had informed the SO he had observed a person in his place of business who resembled the photograph of the person wanted in connection with the death of Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING JR.

On 4/20/68 HENRY SHEFFIELD, Villa Heights Grill, Highway 220 N., Martinsville, Va. informed that at about 11:45 AM 4/17/68 a stranger came into his place of business and ordered two or three beers. He paid some attention to the man because he was a stranger for fear the man might rob him. The man played the juke box some and asked about the men's room. After being directed to the men's room the man apparently visited it, and when he came back into the tavern he took a seat in another booth. The man was dressed in a white shirt with short sleeves, and dark pants. He was about 35-40 years of age, approximitely 5'll" in height, and weighed about 150 Lbs. SHEFFIELD stated he got busy with customers, and later noticed that the man had left. He estimated that the man was in his place about 2½ hours. He had never seen the man before, had no idea how he was traveling, and did not observe him speak to anyone. He does not recall the identities of anyone else who may have been in his place at the same time or who may have seen the man.

Mr. SHEFFIELD stated that on 4/20/68 he was reading the Roanoke Times newspaper, and in this paper saw a photograph of one JAMES EARL RAY wanted in connection with the shooting of Dr. KING. After looking at this photograph in the newspaper it occurred to him that the man in his place on 4/17/68 looks like the photograph of RAY. SHEFFIELD observed a photograph of ERIS STARVO GALT including enlarged photographs appearing on a wanted flyer, and stated that the man in his place does not in any resemble the photographs or drawings of GALT. He does however think

the man he saw looked somewhat like the photograph of RAY appearing in the 4/20/68 issue of the Roanoke Times.

Mr. SHEFFIELD said he does not know of anyone else who may have seen the person he referred to and could furnish no other information concerning the man.

The photograph of GALT was exhibited to Deputy Sheriff RALPH HILL, Henry County, Va. and other law enforcement officers who work the area in the vicinity of Villa Heights Grill. Each said he had not seen anyone in the area on 4/17/68 or any other time who looks like the photograph.

Mr.SHEFFIELD informed that should he see the unknown man again he would immediately advise, and it was observed that there are no other taverns or eating establishments in the immediate vicinity of the Villa "eights Grill. This grill is located on highway 220 North of Martinsville in Henry County, Va. and approximitely one mile north of the Martinsville City limits.

Ray Wanted Bounty' On King, Convict Says

DALTON, Ga. P - A convicted murderer who was in prison with James Earl Ray, now hunted in the slaying of the Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr., said Tuesday that he once heard Ray say he would be willing to try to collect \$1 million for killing the civil rights leader.

Raymond Curtis, 40, the same age as Ray, is in the Whitfield County, Ga., jail awaiting action on appeal of a murder conviction. Curtis said that he and Ray were prisoners at the Missouri State Penitentiary when John F. Kennedy was assassinated Nov. 22, 1963, in Dallas, Tex.

"Another boy said, 'Well, there's a million-dollar bounty to get King.' King was running his mouth pretty good then. Ray said, 'If there is a million-dollar bounty on King, I believe I can collect it,' "Curtis said.

Curtis said he met Ray in 1955 when both were prisoners in Jackson County jail at Kansas City, Mo. He said they shared a cell for seven months.

Then, Curtis said, Ray was transferred to the Leavenworth federal prison to serve a term of or forging postal money orders. Curtis said that two weeks later he also was sent to Leavenworth.

He said after about six months he was transferred to the Atlanta prison and did not see Ray again until late 1961 or early 1962, when Curtis went to the Missouri State Penitentiary on a 10-year armed robbery sentence.

Ray was there, Curtis said

serving a 20-year armed robbery sentence. Prison records confirm that Curtis and Ray were inmates at the same time.

The two saw each other "almost daily" Curtis said.

It was in the prison yand, Curtis said, that he and Ray saw television news reports of Kennedy's assassination. A few days later, he said, a new prisoner came in and said that a \$1 million bounty had been put on King by a "KKK businessman's association."

"The only thing he would make a long conversation out of was when he was planning something and you were a part of it," Curtis said. "Anything he did was thoroughly planned."

Curtis said he heard Ray mention a King bounty several times. At one point, Curtis said, Ray referred to the Kennedy assassination by saying, "Boy, probably somebody made a nice little penny off of that. Sure wish it was me."

In Los Angeles the Federal Bureau of Investigation is seeking a woman in connection with the hunt for Ray, the Los Angeles Times reported Tuesday. The FBI refused to comment.

The paper said it learned the bureau is looking for a blonde, blue-eyed woman, about 27, who was reportedly seen with Ray in Los Angeles this year. She disappeared about the same time Ray did, the paper said.
