Suspect Ray Takes Stand, Denies Guilt

Lawyer Seeks to Prove Slaying Was 'Political'

LONDON (P) — James Earl Ray denied yesterday that he killed the Rev. Martin Luther King Jr. Fighting extradition to the United States to stand trial for the murder of the Negro civil rights leader, Ray professed innocence in Bow Street Magistrates Court.

The 40-year-old fugitive from the Missouri Penitentiary took the stand in his own defense after the U. S. Government unveiled a carefully detailed case against him in the assassination at the Lorraine Motel in Memphis, Tenn., April 4.

~~George~~ Jacob Bonebrake, a

fingerprint expert of the Federal Bureau of Investigation, testified that he found Ray's prints on the field, telescopic sight and binoculars that were dropped at the doorway of a shop near the motel shortly after King was slain.

Bore No Grudge

Under questioning by his court-appointed British attorney, Roger Frisby, Ray said that he had never met King and that he bore him no grudge.

"Did you kill Martin Luther King?" Frisby asked. "No, sir," the prisoner said.

Chief Magistrate Frank Milton later adjourned the hearing until next Tuesday. It is expected to be completed then. Ray went back to prison.

Ray resisted moves to extradite him to stand trial for King's murder with all the legal ammunition provided by Britain's clouded extradition laws.

If the court's decision goes against him, Frisby is expected to appeal to a higher court on the ground that King's assassination was a political crime, for which Britain does not permit extradition.

Ray was formerly addressed as Ramon George Sneyd, the alias under which he is held here on charges of entering Britain on a forged Canadian passport.

Asked by the court clerk to sign a summary of his testimony for evidence, Ray turned to his lawyer and said: "How would I sign it?"

Recorded Unsigned

It went into the record unsigned. At no point during the hearing did his lawyer admit that the prisoner was Ray.

The U.S. case was presented by British Lawyer David Calcutt. It took him one hour and 10 minutes sum up the case.

This was Calcutt's version of the evidence against Ray, drawn from the documents submitted by the U.S. embassy:

On March 29 Ray went into the Aero Marine Supply Co. in Birmingham, Ala., and bought a rifle with a telescopic sight from Donald Wood, the son of the owner.

The next day he came back and exchanged it for a Remington 760 rifle, Serial No. 461476, with a telescopic sight numbered A17350.

John Deshazo of Montgomery, Ala., another customer in the store, told FBI agents later that Ray—or a man he tentatively identified as Ray through pictures—had bought a rifle and said he was going hunting in Wisconsin with his brother or brother-in-law.

On April 3, according to a sworn statement by receptionist Henrietta Hagermaster, Ray checked into the Rebel Motor Hotel in Memphis. Then he went to a Memphis store run by a Mr. York and bought a pair of Bushnell binoculars numbered DQ408664 with a case and strap, in a yellow and black box, and wrapped in a gray-blue paper bag. He got a receipt for \$41.05.

The next affidavit came from Charles Stevens, 46, one of the government's key witnesses. On the day of King's death, he was living with his common

law wife in apartment 6B of the rooming house on 422½ South MAIN St., Memphis, which from the rear faced the motel where King was shot.

On that day, he said, he saw the manager, Bessie Brewer, standing near apartment 5B, just down the hall from his, with an unidentified man. Stevens' apartment was next to the common bathroom, separated from his kitchen by only a thin plywood partition.

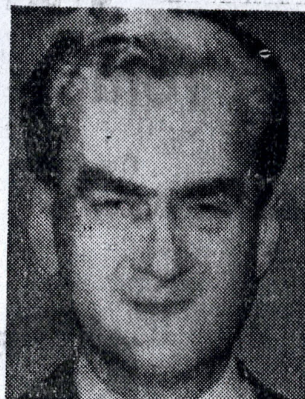
Stevens, who spent most of his time in bed, as he is a disabled veteran said he heard footsteps on April 4 leading from apartment 5B to the bathroom.

"On the first couple of times, he did not stay long. On the third time the person stayed there what seemed like a long time toward the end of the afternoon between 5 and 6 p.m. I wanted to use the toilet.

"I was in my kitchen working on a small radio when I heard a shot. I could tell that it came from the bathroom because it was very loud.

"Then I heard voices yelling and hollering in the Lorraine Motel. I went out and saw a man running and carrying a bundle about three or four feet long and six or eight inches thick, wrapped in newspaper. Although I didn't get a long look, I think it was the same man I saw earlier with Mrs. Brewer."

The owner of a music store at 424 South Main St. was inside it at 6 p.m. He said he

heard a thud and found a bundle in front of his store. He saw a white man walk away, and then saw a small white car pull off. He could only see one man in it, the driver.

Memphis police retrieved the bundle. Inside they found binoculars, a rifle and a telescopic sight, all with the cited serial numbers. There was a receipt for the binoculars for \$41.05 and a yellow and black box. Inside apartment 5B, they

reported finding two straps to match the binoculars.

Calcutt reported that a Dr. Francisco performed an autopsy on King and removed "a battered lead slug." An FBI ballistics expert examined the bullet and said that it was of the type fired by a Remington 760, but he would not say if it had been fired by this one.

The only American witness was Bonebrake who said he had been FBI fingerprint expert since 1941.

He said he found these prints: on the rifle a left thumb print which had 14 characteristic points of identity to Ray's

on the sight of a right ring finger print with 11 points of identity to Ray's, and on the binoculars a left thumb print with 14 identical points.

As a guide, he had Ray's prints from Missouri State Penitentiary, from Los Angeles where he had registered for a bartending school, and from London where he was arrested June 8.

Ray listened impassively as he said: "They were all from one and the same man."

Political Questions

Peter Hopkirk, a reporter from the London Times who covered King's assassination,

was summoned as a witness and asked questions of a political nature as was Bonebrake.

"The whole burden of my case is that Dr. King was a political figure," Frisby said.

His argument was based on the British extradition law of 1870, which forbids the extradition of a suspect if his crime "is of a political character." The phrase has been much argued in extradition cases through the decades, and legally its meaning is cloudily. Frisby also quoted one English judge's opinion that: "We cannot inquire whether a fugitive is involved in a good or bad

cause." He was still pursuing his argument when the court adjourned.

Calcutt told the magistrate that King was "the victim of a calculated, senseless, brutal murder, which is bitter with irony . . . It is my case that this was the work of a single hand of this man."

U.S. officials have said they have found no evidence of a conspiracy in King's murder, but they have not stopped looking. In any case, it would be a tactically bad time to postulate a conspiracy since it could aid the defense's case that the assassination was political.

A dramatic high spot in Calcutt's case was a report by Detective Chief Supt. Thomas Butler of Scotland Yard of a jail cell meeting with Ray.

Butler testified the prisoner, on hearing that police had identified him as an American wanted for a killing rather than as Canadian Ramon George Sneyd, sat down, put his head in his hands and said: "Oh God . . . I feel so trapped."

In Ga., meanwhile, an organization calling itself the Patriot Legal Fund has offered to defend Ray if he is brought to trial on charges that he killed King.

Ray Extradition Drawing Nearer

LONDON (AP) — Minor British charges against James Earl Ray were dropped today, bringing his extradition to the United States a step closer.

Home Secretary James Callaghan was expected within a few hours to sign the extradition order returning the 40-year-old escaped convict to the United States to face trial on a charge of murdering Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.

The extradition order was issued by Chief Metropolitan Magistrate Frank Milton on July 2. Ray decided on Thurs-

day not to appeal against it, and the 15-day period for filing an appeal expired Wednesday.

The time of Ray's departure for America is a closely guarded secret. Unofficial reports said a U.S. Air Force transport was standing by at Northolt, a U. S. air base west of London, to take the prisoner and an escort of U.S. marshals to Memphis, Tenn., where the Negro civil rights leader was shot April 4.

The two British charges on

which Ray had been held since his arrest at London Airport June 8 were dropped at a brief hearing in the Bow Street Magistrate's Court, the theater for all the British legal processes concerning Ray.

The charges were using a forged Canadian passport, under the name of Ramon George Sneyd, and carrying a loaded gun for which he had no license.

Ray was not in court today.

Arthur Hanes of Birmingham, Ala., Ray's lawyer visited him in prison this morning. He said Ray was still extremely

anxious to have his lawyer fly home with him when he is sent back to the United States.

But Hanes said U.S. authorities were adamant in refusing him permission to board the plane.

"He fears intensive interrogation and grilling by Justice Department agents in the plane," Hanes said "They will have him captive for seven or eight hours and they can engage him in conversation."

The lawyer told newsmen he had called Consul General Jack Herfurt Wednesday night and was passed a message from Fred Vinson Jr., U. S. assistant attorney general.

Hanes said the message was: "I hope you understand why you cannot accompany this man to the United States and why you cannot see him in private."

To this, Hanes, replied, "My answer is no. I do not understand."

"I applied some weeks ago to go back on the plane with him and that he should not be questioned or interrogated by FBI men without my being present.

"This was refused. It is a violation of my client's constitutional rights."

"I shall apply again for permission to fly back with him. Even if I am not allowed on the plane, I want to be allowed to spend a few hours with my client before he will be immediately put up in court in Memphis."

Ray Is Whisked To Memphis Jail

MEMPHIS, Tenn. (AP) — James Earl Ray, handcuffed and wearing what appeared to be a bullet-proof vest, was whisked into the Shelby County Jail before dawn today to await trial on a charge of murdering Dr. Martin Luther King.

Ray was placed in his cell at the jail at 4:34 a.m. CDT, 46 minutes after he arrived at the nearby Memphis Naval Air

Station aboard a U.S. Air Force Boeing jet transport from London. He had left London about midnight — 6 p.m. CDT — so that the entire trip took about 10½ hours.

From the Navy base, a blue-and-white prison van, escorted by a half-dozen police cars and an equal number of motorcycles, roared into the parking lot behind the jail building at 4:29 a.m. CDT.

PHOTOS DISTRIBUTED

No newsman was allowed to see Ray, but Sheriff William Morris distributed photographs of the prisoner showing him dressed in what the sheriff told a news conference was "protective gear." He appeared to be dressed in a bullet-proof vest and he was handcuffed to a heavy leather belt.

"We took custody of Mr. Ray at 3:48 a.m. aboard a Boeing 707 at Millington," the sheriff said, referring to the Navy base at suburban Millington. "He arrived at the jail at 4:29 a.m. and was in his cell at 4:34."

The sheriff said Criminal Court Judge W. Preston Battle has been chosen to hear the murder trial, but "no courtroom has been selected for the trial yet." He added that no date for arraignment on the murder indictment has been set.

There was speculation that Ray may be tried in a basement courtroom at the jail-courthouse building, so that he would never have to leave the jail.

Judge Battle already has is-

sued his first order in the case, the sheriff said. This forbids cameras, tape recorders or other similar devices in the courthouse-jail building, its grounds or sidewalk surrounding the structure — and forbids anyone connected with the case, from giving interviews or otherwise discussing the case outside the courthouse or with anyone but lawyers connected with the case.

As photographers took Morris' picture during the news conference, the sheriff went on to explain that the "no publicity" order would go into effect immediately after the news conference.

SECURITY DETAIL

The van carrying Ray to the jail was preceded by another police car loaded with officers who immediately jumped out and joined a security guard of deputies who had taken up stations across the parking lot driveway 11 minutes before the prisoner arrived.

One other car, carrying Criminal Court Judge John A. Coulton, had driven into the parking lot a short time earlier. There was no indication why Coulton came to the jail.

Officials in London disclosed that Ray left aboard a U.S. Air Force transport from the World War II base at Lakenheath just north of Cambridge. Supt. Thomas Butler of Scotland Yard, who arrested Ray June 8, escorted him from Wandsworth jail to Lakenheath, where the jet transport waited with the U.S. marshals who escorted Ray to the United States.

VIGIL KEPT AT JAIL

Officials said the marshals took custody of Ray at the base, put him aboard the plane and took off. It was not known how many marshals were on the trip.

Throughout the night in Memphis, deputies and city policemen had guarded the jail and court complex. Then, at 4:15 a.m., a large bus was backed across a driveway, blocking the view of the jail entrance.

Three minutes later, 10 sheriff's deputies carrying riot guns marched out of the building and blocked the entrance. Four deputies sealed off the other side of the parking lot.

In Washington, FBI Director J. Edgar Hoover said the inter-

national transfer of Ray was accomplished "without incident."

'WITHOUT INCIDENT'

Ray's American lawyer, Arthur J. Hanes of Birmingham, Ala., was refused permission to speak to Ray once he was turned over to U.S. authorities in London. Hanes' request to accompany Ray on the flight was denied.

Hanes took a commercial flight to New York today. He told newsmen at London airport he would protest "this bizarre affair — the spiriting away of a man in the night."

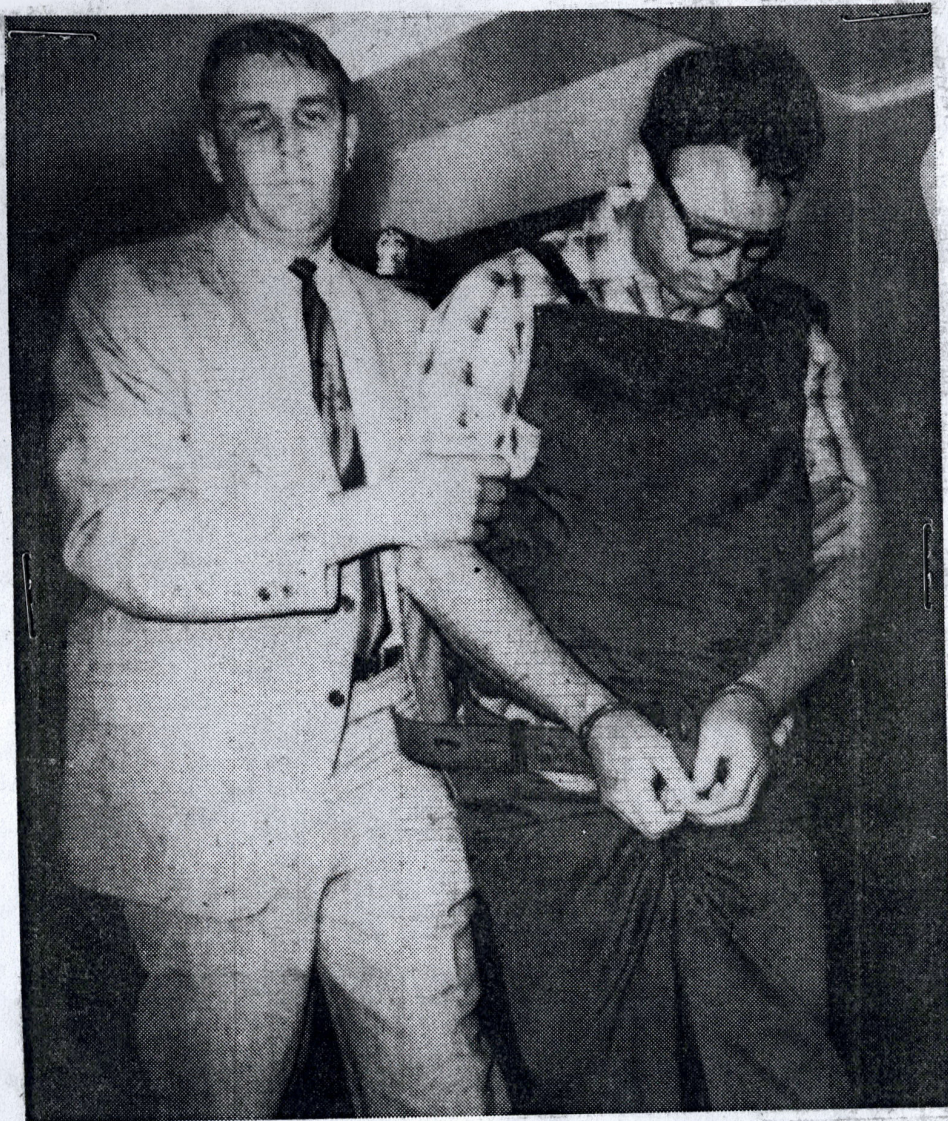
"For all I know," said Hanes, "my man could still be in Britain. I knew at 9:30 last night that a move was imminent. I was told that I should appreciate that I could not travel with my client. I said I most certainly did not."

VIEWED AS BIZARRE

"The entire affair was bizarre in the extreme — undercover and secretive . . . I don't know what the U.S. attorney general is up to in not giving permission for me to go with my client. I shall be taking this matter up most strongly when I get home."

As Ray left Britain, the London Daily Sketch reported that his fingerprints had been matched with those of a gunman who robbed a London bank a few days before he was arrested June 8. The report had circulated in London for several weeks, but British law bans the publication of such information involving a man facing legal proceedings.

Scotland Yard officials refused to confirm or deny the report in the Daily Sketch, which said a gunman on June 4 thrust a "give me cash" note at a teller in the Trustee Savings Bank in London's Fulham District and escaped with about \$240 in British pounds.

The only explanation for the source of RAY's legal defense fund we have seen appeared in a recent issue of the conservative publication, *Human Events*, of Washington, D.C. The fol-

lowing paragraph appears in the issue of July 20:

An anti-Negro, anti-Semitic hate group, the National States Rights Party, has set up a "Patriot Legal Fund" to defend James Earl Ray, accused slayer of Martin Luther King Jr. Dr. Edward R. Field, a party leader who serves as the fund's secretary, said: "We have offered to defend free of charge, pay all legal costs, attorney fees, court costs, costs of appeal if there are any, and bonds."

That's all we know about the matter. It could be correct.

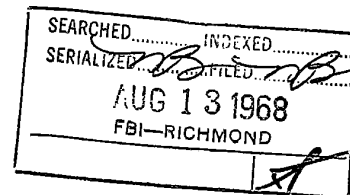
