William Bradford Huie has written a third article for "Lock" magazine. The article appears in the issue dated April 15, 1969, but this issue was circulated on April 1, 1969. A review of the article reveals that James Earl Ray allegedly registered at the Travelodge Motel, Five Points, Birmingham, Alabama, on March 29, 1968; at a motel near Plorence, Alabama, on April 1, 1968; and at a motel near Corinth, Mississippi, on April 2, 1968. It is to be noted that Ray, using the name Harvey Lowmyer, negotiated the purchase of a rifle at the Aeromarine Supply Company, Birmingham, Alabama, on March 29 and 30, 1969. On April 3, 1968, he was registered at the Rebel Motel in Memphis, Tennessee.

In an effort to establish whether or not Ray was in contact with any individuals immediately prior to the assassination, appropriate investigation should be conducted by the Birmingham and Jackson Offices. It should be understood that there is to be no indication made whatsoever that the following investigation has any connection whatsoever with the case involving James Earl Ray.

Birmingham and Jackson Offices should make inquiries of the motels in or near the cities indicated above to determine the identities of individuals registered during the period March 29 to April 3, 1968.

Efforts should be made to identify all individuals listed, as well as

obtaining descriptions and registrations for the automobiles of such persons. A review of such records might indicate whether any one individual might have accompanied Ray or been in contact with him during this period. Pertinent or questionable registration records should be obtained if possible for examination by the FBI Laboratory.

Memphis should insure that the Bureau is kept currently advised of pertinent developments in this case, particularly all aspects of court action since the death of Judge Eattle on March 31, 1969.

said Ray was "...just a gullible-type sort of fellow, easily influenced and led around. He had never been a high-powered criminal all his life, just penny ante stuff..."

Jensen described the investigation as a "good case, well worked, well handled. I'm satisfied with the results."

It is probably true, Jensen said, that King's slaying was one of the most thoroughly investigated murders in criminal history.

"There is little doubt that it was an extensive and in-depth investigation," he said. "It was

worldwide, involving the cooperation of Canadian authorities, the Royal Canadian Mounted Police, Scotland Yard and many, many others. We explored every angle and the only thing is that when the case developed, we could find no evidence of such a thing (a conspiracy)."

Jensen said when the FBI had compiled the facts, "a representative of the attorney general's office followed through and rechecked the material."

"The case was analyzed and it will continue to be analyzed," he said. "I don't think history buffs have ever put to rest the story of Lincoln and John Wilkes Booth.

"Fifteen years from now people will ask the same questions, but my personal opinion now lies with the public record. I have no personal theories whatsoever that differ with the record of the case."

Scandal, Slaying Link Seen

HAMPTON (AP) — The Rev. Jesse Jackson, refused permission to hold a news conference on the Hampton Institute campus, said Wednesday some of the same people involved in the Watergate scandals may have been involved in the assassination of the Rev. Martin Luther King Jr.

Jackson did not mention any names, but asked for an investigation of two alleged memos sent by the late Federal Bureau of Investigation director J. Edgar Hoover on Aug. 25, 1967, and March 4, 1968.

He said the first memo instructed FBI agents to "disrupt and discredit" black organizations and the second ordered them to prevent the rise of a "black messiah."

"One month later King was dead," Jackson said.

Jackson, here to attend the 60th annual Hampton Institute Ministers Conference, was refused permission to hold a news conference for what a conference spokesman said was his failure to get official permission from the college to meet with reporters.

The spokesman also indicated that the ministers wanted to keep the convention from being diverted to controversial political matters.

Reopen Trial
Jackson said also that the
trial of convicted King assassin
James Earl Ray should be
reopened.

"We believe it [King's slaying] was a conspiracy, and we believe the trial should be reopened so all evidence can come onto the table," said Jackson, who was with King the moment he was shot.

The Supreme Court cleared the way Monday for Ray to withdraw his guilty plea and change his testimony.

"Ray's lawyers are now saying they have two more people willing to testify, and they should be allowed to do so," Jackson said. (Indicate page, name of newspaper, city and state.)



Court Ruling Favors Ray

WASHINGTON (UPI) — The
Supreme Court cleared the way
today for James Earl Ray to
withdraw his guilty plea to the
1968 killing of Martin Luther
King. Ray contends he was influenced by the interest of his attorneys in profits from a book
about the slaying.

The action could mean Ray eventually will be retried for the King slaying after a plea of innocent.

The Supreme Court refused to hear appeals by Tennessee that Ray's original plea was voluntary and intelligently made and therefore he should not be given a shape to have it changed.

The 6th U.S. Court of Appeals ordered a hearing to decide whether Ray's constitutional 'rights to due process and assistance of counsel were violated and if he can change his plea to innocent.

Ray was sentenced to 99 years in the Tennessee state prison after pleading guilty in 1969 to killing the civil rights leader in Memphis.

Shortly after sentencing, Ray claimed he had been coerced into pleading guilty by his attorney, Percy Foreman, well known criminal lawyer from Houston, Tex.

Foreman took over the case at Ray's request after Ray dismissed his first lawyer, Arthur, Hanes. Hanes had signed a contract on Ray's behalf with author William Bradford Huie to write a book about the killing, with Hanes getting 30 per cent of the royalties.

When Foreman took over the changed the agreement so that he would receive 60 per cent of the royalties.

Ray contended that he was advised to plead guilty by Foreman so that information about the case would not be made public in open court at the fullscale trial, thus assuring the exclusive nature of the book.

He thought everybody thought like he thought and he thought the killing of Martin Luther King would make him the champion of the white race, that he would be the most popular man in America.
