Re Memphis airtel to All Continental Offices dated 4/19/68.

Referenced airtel reflects that the FBI Laboratory advised that pillowcase and bed sheet were found in front of 1966 white Mustang registered to ERIC STARVO GALT, which was located at Atlanta 4/11/68. These items contained Thermo-Seal laundry tapes of approximately same size as tapes on items previously recovered but are yellow in color and contain code "20R-3." In opinion of Textile Marking Machine Company, Syracuse, New York, the tapes were produced by a different machine than previous tapes since the first three characters are 15 point type and the last two characters are 18 point type.

The Textile Marking Machine Company suggests the 20 in above code would be the lot number, the R may mean that this was a return of a batch of laundry, and the three is the bundle number.

Referenced airtel sets forth a lead to all offices to recontact laundries determined to be operating Thermo-Seal Marking Machines in an effort to locate laundry using the code "20R-3."

Review of San Antonio file reflects the following laundries in this Division are utilizing such machines, and this information is set forth in Albany airtel to Bureau dated 4/11/68:

M., to arrive San Antonio 11:16 A. M. The suspect was observed to be traveling with a Latin-American.

I instructed SAS KEMMY and MOODY to meet this plane and to observe all passengers, looking toward an individual resembling GALT.

This was done and no passenger departing from this plane had any similarity to GALT.

I called Houston back and told them that no individual resembling GALT had gotten off the plane.

This will record that at 12:10 P. M. today Assistant Legat JOHN FOARD, Mexico City, called and inquired if we could determine the time of day GALT crossed into Mexico on October 7, 1967.

As the file will indicate, a prior check in the Nuevo Laredo, Mexico entry point revealed that he entered Mexico on that date, I checked with SA SLIGHT, who in turn had inquired of a Mexican insurance firm in Nuevo Laredo and found that on October 8, 1967, at 11:00 A. M., GALT purchased automobile insurance for travel into Mexico. While it cannot be certain that he departed Nuevo Laredo at that time, it is highly probable that he entered Nuevo Laredo, Mexico on the 7th, spent the night and proceeded into Mexico the next day.

Mr. FOARD advised he desired this information so that he could better trace Galt's movements and approximate arrival time in Mexico City.

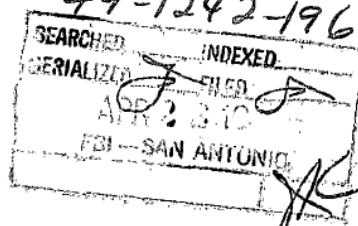

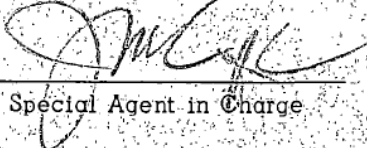

F.B.I. Says 'Galt' Is an Escaped Convict

WASHINGTON, April 19—The Federal Bureau of Investigation announced today that an escaped convict named James Earl Ray was the man being sought under the alias of Eric Starvo Galt for the murder of the Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.

The bureau pictured Ray as a trouble-prone "drifter" with a long record of erratic and violent behavior.

Galt's true identity was discovered after latent fingerprints uncovered in the King investigation were compared with the prints of more than 53,000 persons listed as wanted by the bureau.

Attorney General Ramsey Clark and J. Edgar Hoover, the director of the bureau, said in a joint announcement that Ray escaped from the Missouri State Penitentiary on April 23, 1967.

Ray, a 40-year-old native of Illinois, had served seven years

of a 20-year sentence for armed robbery and car theft in St. Louis.

The bureau released front and side "mug" photographs of Ray that were taken by Missouri prison officials in 1960. They bear a close resemblance to pictures of Galt taken in 1968, that the bureau released Wednesday.

Ray had close-cropped hair and a leaner face than the Galt

photo shows, but the protruding left ear, which the bureau emphasized in its initial description of Galt, appears to be the same in both photographs.

The F.B.I. announced Ray's identity after an around-the-clock check of fingerprint records.

Fingerprints can be matched quickly by an elaborate classification and filing system when the full 10 prints of the unknown person are available, on a card that identifies the finger and hand represented by each print.

But when only a few prints are available, and it is not known which fingers or thumbs made them, they can be checked only by comparing each latent print with all 10 prints on the card of each wanted person.

Ray was said to have used the names of James McBride, James Walton, W. C. Herron and James O'Connor during his criminal career. When the F.B.I. filed formal charges against Galt on Wednesday, it gave two other aliases, John Willard and Harvey Lowmyer.

The identification of Galt as the escaped convict explains some of the circumstances that led to speculation Galt might have established a false identity in contemplating the assassinating of Dr. King.

Galt first appeared, according to F.B.I. statements, on Aug. 30, 1967, when he purchased a white Mustang car in Birmingham, Ala. Despite efforts to check back on Galt's earlier activities, no trace of him before the fall of last year was disclosed.

On Wednesday, a fugitive warrant was obtained by the bureau accusing Galt of having conspired with a person "whom he alleged to be his brother" to injure Dr. King and violate his civil rights.

Dr. King was killed by a sniper on April 4, as the civil rights leader stood on the balcony of the Lorraine Motel in Memphis. The Tennessee authorities have sworn out an arrest warrant charging Galt with murder.

Bureau spokesmen declined to say whether Ray had a brother or to comment on reports that the bureau had the "brother" in custody.

No New Warrant Planned

BIRMINGHAM, Ala., April 19

The F.B.I. does not plan to issue a new warrant for the arrest of Ray.

Joseph H. Gamble, the agent in charge of the Birmingham office, said that because Galt was an alias used by Ray, the warrant issued on Wednesday was legally sufficient.

A source said that the bureau thought that Galt's "alleged brother" probably was not a relative. Galt had reportedly told a gun-store clerk in Birmingham that he and his brother planned to go hunting with a rifle he was purchasing.

The .30-'06 caliber Remington rifle was found on a Memphis street on April 4 near the site of Dr. King's murder.

HOW MANY GALT? WITNESSES DIFFER

Three Earlier Descriptions of Suspect Vary Widely

BIRMINGHAM, Ala., April 19—The descriptions given the police and the F.B.I. of the assassin of the Rev. Martin Luther King Jr. have varied so widely it appears that as many as four men may have been under suspicion.

A source in the Justice Department said that credible witnesses in Memphis and in Birmingham who saw Eric Starvo Galt, now identified as James Earl Ray, the accused murderer of Dr. King, seemed to be describing different men.

This, observers believe, is why the Federal Bureau of Investigation changed its view and decided that death of the civil rights leader may have resulted from a conspiracy.

Shortly after the murder, Attorney General Ramsey Clark said that there was no evidence of a conspiracy.

Before the bulletin on Ray, there were at least three separate descriptions from witnesses who had known a Galt in the last six months.

Galt had been described as follows:

• A long-nosed man in his 20's who was seen in a Memphis rooming house from which the shot was fired that killed Dr. King April 4.

• A 30-year-old quiet-spoken man who talked about the weather at a Birmingham rooming house last fall.

• A 36-year-old "avid dancer" who bought a rifle in Birmingham and who took dancing lessons in New Orleans at the time James Earl Ray was imprisoned in Missouri.

Ray Is Described

James Earl Ray, a five-time convict, was described by the F.B.I. as being 40 years old, 5 feet 10 inches tall, 163 to 174 pounds, with blue eyes and brown hair. He has a scar in the center of his forehead and on the palm of his right hand.

The witnesses who saw a Galt at a Memphis rooming house the day Dr. King was slain said that he was 5 feet 11 inches or 6 feet tall, slender, 165 pounds, with sandy hair. The highest estimate of his age was 32 years, the lowest, 26. He was said to have a long pointed nose and a Southern accent.

At a Birmingham rooming house where a Galt lived for six weeks last fall, he was described as being 5 feet 10 inches tall, 175 pounds, with brown hair and a slightly Southern accent. He was described as being about 30 years old.

The first F.B.I. description of Galt, which came principally from a gun dealer in Birmingham, from whom a Galt bought a rifle, and a gun dealer in Memphis, from whom he bought a pair of binoculars, was not precise.

The description, which was released Wednesday night, said that Galt was between 5 feet 8 inches and 5 feet 11 inches tall, weighed 160 to 175 pounds, was of medium build, and had brown hair and blue eyes.

A 'Rural' Accent

His birth date was given as July 20, 1931, a date that the bureau apparently got from an application that a Galt had made for an Alabama driver's license. The bureau said that Galt's voice had a "rural" accent.

Newsman showed copies of a picture released Wednesday of Galt to the people who had seen him in Birmingham and in Memphis.

Almost every witness said that the picture did not resemble Galt.

Two developments have tended to bolster the speculation that more than one man used the name Eric Starvo Galt.

On March 1, 1968, an Eric Galt telephoned the Alabama Highway Patrol to ask for a duplicate copy of the driver's license he got in September of 1967. The copy was mailed to a Birmingham address and a bill for 25 cents that was enclosed with the duplicate was returned to Montgomery on March 6 with the 25 cents.

The F.B.I. had said that Galt had been in California during this time.

In its bulletin describing Galt as an avid dancer, the F.B.I. said that he had taken dancing lessons in New Orleans in 1964 and 1965.

Today's bulletin said that Galt, under the name James Earl Ray, had been in prison in Missouri from 1960 until he escaped in April, 1967.

No Mention of Brother

It did not mention Galt's "alleged brother," who the F.B.I. had said entered into a conspiracy with Galt in Birmingham on March 29, 1968, to deprive Dr. King of his civil rights.

Statements by officials of the Justice Department have indicated confusion within the F.B.I.

The day after the assassination, Attorney General Ramsey Clark said that there was no conspiracy to kill Dr. King. He repeated this assertion three days after the slaying and again the following day.

Last Wednesday, the F.B.I. charged that Galt had "conspired" with an "alleged brother" to violate Dr. King's civil rights by injuring him.

On several occasions, the bureau has been reported as knowing the identity of the killer

and being close to arresting him. On April 7, for instance, Mr. Clark said that the killer was "on the run" many miles from Memphis with F.B.I. agents close behind him.

When the bureau acknowledged publicly for the first time that it was seeking a man named Eric Starvo Galt, it apparently did not know Galt's real name.

ABC to Show Picture Of Wanted Man on TV

A photograph of the man wanted by the F.B.I. in connection with the assassination of the Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. will be shown in color on "The F.B.I." program on ABC-TV from 8 to 9 P.M. tomorrow.

The original photograph is being shown at the request of the Federal Bureau of Investigation, the network announced. It said that as the picture was shown an actor on the program would ask the public to notify the F.B.I. if anyone has seen the man, identified as James Earl Ray.

Suspect Described as a Drifter Who Was Failure at Everything

Constantly in Trouble, Often Because of Drunkenness, Ray Left Trail of Violence

James Earl Ray, the man suspected of killing the Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., was described yesterday as a drunken drifter, prone to theft and violence, a failure at everything.

Ray was born March 10, 1928, in Alton, Ill., a manufacturing town of 53,000 persons along the Mississippi River 20 miles north of St. Louis.

His father, James Ray, was born in Carthage, Ill., and worked mainly as a laborer. His mother, the former Lucie Maher, was born in Alton. Both parents are dead.

Records of Madison County show that James Earl Ray was one of several Rays, believed to be either brothers or other relatives, who constantly caused trouble.

Oldest of 3 Brothers

The oldest of three brothers, he grew up in Alton and Quincy, Ill., and left school in the 10th grade.

"I just didn't want to go any more," Ray told a probation officer in Los Angeles years later.

According to the probation report, Ray began a life of drifting that took him first to Hartford, Ill., where he went to work at the International Shoe Company for 77 cents an hour. He was laid off in December of 1945 and several months later joined the Army.

Ray served for more than two years, mostly in Germany, as an infantryman and military policeman. He was given a general discharge in December 1948, because of "ineptness and lack of adaptability to military service."

While in service he spent three months at hard labor for drunkenness and resisting arrest.

Losses His Job

Ray was no more able to adapt to civilian life. After five months, he took a job operating a rubber mold in the Dryden Rubber Company in Chicago for \$45 a week but soon lost it.

A 1947 Mercury he had bought in St. Louis was repossessed and a bank account in Alton of more than \$1,000 was used up by June of 1949.

Ray then moved on to Los Angeles, and on Oct. 4, 1949, Ray, then 21 years old, was surprised in the office of Forum Cafe by the assistant manager. A typewriter had been placed on the fire escape.

He dashed away, but in trying to elude a parking attendant, he dropped his identification. Several days later he was seen in the same area by the cafe manager and arrested.

He was convicted on one count of second-degree burglary and sentenced to eight months in the County Jail, but the term was suspended on the condition that Ray spend at least 90 days in jail and stay away from alcohol.

I Had Some Beers

He told a probation officer that he had not entered the

Forum Cafe to commit a crime. He said he knew nothing about the typewriter or about why he had been arrested.

Asked why he had entered the building he said:

"I guess I had some beers or something."

Ray told the officer that several times in Illinois he had tried to enter houses after drinking too much, but never knew what he was doing.

Ray then returned to Chicago, where he worked as a laborer at a publishing company. On May 6, 1952, he entered a taxi and after several blocks put a gun against the driver's head and fled with \$11.

A passerby gave chase but Ray seemed to be escaping. Then he ducked into an alley, which proved to be a dead end. He tried to climb a wall but was shot by the police.

Robert Everhart, the man who chased Ray, recalled yesterday that Ray had said when he was captured, "What the hell are you getting out of this?"

Ray was sentenced to one to two years and released from the State Reformatory in Pontiac, Ill., on March 12, 1954. He also served time in Joliet, Ill., before next appearing in Kansas City, Mo., where he was convicted in 1955 of cashing forged money orders.

Arrested Again

After three more years in prison, Ray moved to St. Louis, where he lived in a dilapidated boarding house in the once fashionable Lafayette Park area. He was arrested in his 10-by-10-foot room in 1959 after a grocery store hold-up.

The armed robbery conviction carried a 20-year sentence. He was also facing charges for robbery and auto theft at the time, and the jury deliberated just 20 minutes.

As he was led away from court Ray tried to escape by jumping into an elevator, but he was recaptured and sent to the Missouri State Penitentiary. Twice he tried to escape the second time by hiding in a ventilator shaft.

He was confined for a time in the maximum security ward at the state hospital in Fulton, Mo., but was back at the penitentiary last year when he finally succeeded in escaping by hiding under a batch of bread.

Ray's travels since his escape are uncertain.

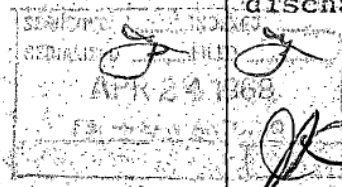

Referenced memo reflects that an individual who identified himself as MEL DAVIS telephoned the office from the Greyhound Bus Station and said he knew who killed MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR. This call was received at 11:45 p.m.

Shortly after midnight on the morning of 4/5/68, SAs THOMAS E. MOODY, IV, and the writer conducted investigation at the Greyhound Bus Depot in an effort to locate DAVIS. HUGO SPAETH, Greyhound Ticket Agent, pointed out an individual standing just outside the bus station and said this individual had asked him to call the FBI to investigate. He did not say why he wanted an investigation and he had done this on this evening.

The individual pointed out by SPAETH was interviewed by SAs MOODY and the writer. He advised that his name is MALLETTE DAVIS and he denied telephoning the FBI Office. He appeared to be in a state of intoxication inasmuch as his speech was slurred. He produced an Oregon Driver's License #676901, which reflected that his DOB was [redacted] in Ala. He was described on this driver's license as 5'8", 170 lbs., blond hair, with address of the Broad Hotel, Portland, Oregon. DAVIS said he presently resided at 1933 July Street, Houston, Texas. He said that he was an alcoholic and was en route to an alcoholic ward of the State Hospital in Austin, Texas, for treatment. He said he had no information as to who killed KING.
