JOHNSTONE was known to Mrs. INGRAM, when she worked for him in San Antonio, Texas, as ROBERT P. ANDERSON.

ANDERSON had no occupation, when living in San Antonio at 3320 North Flores Street, because he received \$600 monthly as a retired General. He was a former military man, according to Mrs. INGRAM, and was white.

ANDERSON wrote Mrs. INGRAM several times after he left San Antonio for Hollywood, using the name JOHNSTONE with the St. Francis Hotel address. One such letter bore the expression on the outside of the envelope: All my love, or words to that effect with the initials R.P.A.

On 4/29/68, JOHN LEMMONS, 4218 Waikiki, telephone number OL 5-1453, San Antonio, appeared at the San Antonio Office with the following information:

LEMMONS stated he had observed a photograph of JAMES EARL RAY broadcast by ABC-TV following the Sunday night, 4/28/68, episode of "The FBI", and believes an individual named JACK Q. HARBORT of Seguin, Texas, could possibly be identical with RAY.

LEMMONS explained on 4/20/68, he went to Seguin, Texas, in an effort to locate an ILENE RAY to collect a past due debt. After contacting a number of people concerning her whereabouts he learned she had changed her name and was presently residing on Lake Placid Drive in Seguin. LEMMONS went to the address, a new, Spanish style home where he observed two late model Cadillac automobiles parked in the drive.

He located the woman and during the course of their conversation he met HARBORT, whom he presumed to be the woman's husband.

LEMMONS described HARBORT as a white male in his late 30's, dark brown hair, wore hornrimmed glasses, medium complexion. LEMMONS stated he noticed no scars or marks, did not inquire about HARBORT's employment and made no further conversation upon receiving payment for the bill.

LEMMONS stated the home had no street address but recalled a sign reading "Rivers Rest" attached to a fence post in the front yard.

LEMMONS viewed Wanted Flyer 442-A and indicated HARBORT bore a strong resemblance with the photo of RAY taken in 1968.

LEMMONS stated he would cooperate with this Bureau in any way concerning the foregoing but requested his identityy remain confidential.

Mr. RAY HOSTUTLER, Post Office Box 3147, Corpus Christi, Texas, telephonically contacted San Antonio FBI Office 4/27/68 to say that he had information possibly related to the killer or killers of MARTIN LUTHER KING. He did not wish to talk over the phone, and requested an Agent contact him in the lobby of the Gunter Hotel, 205 East Houston Street, San Antonio.

Upon personal contact, Mr. HOSTUTLER described himself as a rancher specializing in Hereford cattle, and as partner with his brother, GLENN HOSTUTLER in Timportant developing oil property, in Hemphill County, southeast of Canadian, Texas.

RAY HOSTUTLER with his wife stayed about four months prior to the death of President KENNEDY in Dallas, Texas, at the Statler-Hilton Hotel. Learning of the arrival of the President at that time in Dallas, the HOSTUTLER couple left town, because of expected crowds.

At some time prior to departure from the Statler-Hilton, another guest using the name JOHN FOSTER engaged RAY HOSTUTLER in talk from time to time. FOSTER, who bore a physical resemblance to RAY, principal suspect in murder of KING, showed HOSTUTLER a deposit slip for \$7500, explaining to HOSTUTLER that this was a fee for arranging matters regarding four persons holding cotton land rights benefitting from BILLY SOL ESTES operations around Pcos, Texas. The money, \$7500, had been deposited to FOSTER's account at the bank across the street from the Statler Hilton.

Mr. HOSTUTLER described JOHN FOSTER as similar to the description of RAY in this case, but could not be more specific, except to say that FOSTER had a mannerism of clicking his heels together European or Continental style, when being introduced to someone.

FOSTER told HOSTUTLER of owning a souped-up P-38 plane, with which he could beat Government officials to the Capitol, Washington, D.C., from Dallas.

FOSTER reportedly attempted to interest another guest of the Statler-Hilton of this period, MICAEL STACK, and similarly described as to age and appearance as FOSTER, in a deal, whereby, with above plane, they would transport gold internationally, presumably through Mexico. FOSTER proposed to pay off STACK for his complicity in gold, according to HOSTUTLER.

During this same period, - about four months prior to the death of President KENNEDY, FOSTER and STACK were to be seen in Dallas, as was JACK RUBY. RUBY also about this same time met HOSTUTLER at the Shamrock Hotel in Houston, and then tried to interest HOSTUTLER in buying an expensive diamond ring.

HOSTUTLER speculated that the assassination of KENNEDY occurring while the above three were frequenting the Statler-Hilton at Dallas might have arisen over complicity between a man like FOSTER, with his fast plane, and RUBY.

HOSTUTLER went on to speculate that the Memphis murder of MARTIN LUTHER KING, having equally high national significance, may have been done through conspiracy involving such as JOHN FOSTER, described above.

HOSTUTLER stated that the above vein of thought arose upon seeing present with his wife and family at the Gunter Hotel one, JOSEPH R. CAVAGNARO, Sales Manager in Dallas currently of the Statler-Hilton. CAVAGNARO, according to HOSTUTLER, was to be seen frequently drinking coffee with JOHN FOSTER and MICHAEL STACK, and would accordingly be able to identify them.

HOSTUTLER recommended that an Agent make personal contact with CAVAGNARO, and not disclose HOSTUTLER's identity, but ask CAVAGNARO to identify FOSTER and STACK, the two having fremented the Statler-Hilton the four months prior to death of JOHN KENNEDY in Dallas.

FOSTER was suspected by HOSTUTLER of having been possibly implicated in the death of a Govenment man, an expected witness in the forthcoming BILLY SOL ESTES prosecutions, - based on his seeming willingness to enter dangerous and shady ventures, his fast airplane, and his strange or foreign mannerisms.

JOSEPH R. CAVAGNARO, Sales Manager, Statler-Hilton Hotel, Dallas, Texas, in response to a written note left for him at the Gunter Hotel desk, contacted writer telephonically 4/27/68. Mr. CAVAGNARO said he was in San Antonio with wife and children to see Hemisfair. He stated that he did not recognize by name or description either of the persons above named: JOHN FOSTER or MICHAEL STACK. Mr. CAVAGNARO advised that across the street from the Statler-Hilton is the Mercantile Bank of Dallas. None of the circumstances as related by RAY HOSTUTLER, above, bore resemblance to anything which Mr. CAVAGNARO could recall. The identity of Mr. HOSTUTLER was not disclosed to Mr. CAVAGNARO, since the former had requested such anonymity.

The above is set out for the record and for such relevence as it may seem to have in this case.

Mr. HOSTUTLER furnished the telephone TU 3-2222, where he can usually be reached, it being his residence phone in Corpus Christi, Texas.

ANGEL STICKELBAULT, 931 Delgado Street, advised on instant date that he was accompanied to Mexico City on 4/5/68 by his wife OLGA and his mother MARIA STICKELBAULT. They left San Antonio on a Greyhound bus and in Laredo, Texas, transferred to a Transportes del Norte bus. He made available tickets 4905, 4906, and 4909 which were their tickets on the Transportes del Norte bus. He said that they did not change buses until they arrived in Monterrey, Mexico but that he remembered seeing a broken down bus near Sabinas Hidalgo. On the bus to Monterrey his wife and mother sat in the first two seats towards the front on the right side of the bus facing forward. He sat immediately behind them and no one sat with him. The UNSUB look-alike sat on the left side of the bus approximately 2 seats be hind him and next to the window. No one sat near him.

In Monterrey they changed buses. ANGEL sat in the next to last seat on the right rear of the bus and his wife and mother sat directley in front of him. Again he was alone. The look-alike sat approximately 2 seats in fromt of the women (wife and mother) and on the left side of the bus (about ½ back) and again near the window.

The bus stopped for a while in San Luis Potosi; and the passengers debarked for food. ANGEL stated that when the bus reloaded, the look-alike did not get on the bus. He did not know where he had gone.

STICKELBAULT advised that he worked in the Identification and Fingerprint Division of the Bexar County Sherif's Office.
