





Referenced Butel reads as follows:

During automobile trip of subject RAY and CHARLES STEIN departing Los Angeles on 12/15/67 and arriving New Orleans on 12/17/67, subject RAY made about six telephone calls from various pay stations in Texas.

They traveled via automobile on Interstate 10 through El Paso to Van Horn, Texas, and went south on Route 90 to San Antonio, then Route 90 or Interstate 10 to Houston, Texas, and to New Orleans.

Each office should check with telephone company and determine the long distance calls placed at each public telephone on the above mentioned routes during period of 12/15, 16, and 17, 1967, and have each call checked out.

On 4/30/68, Mrs. HELEN ORNELAS, Service Representative, West Texas Telephone Company, Pecos, Texas, made available duplicate bills on pay stations from Van Horn, Valentine, and Sierra Blanca, Texas.

Noted that these bills reflect the telephone numbers of the individuals receiving the telephone calls from the pay stations in the above mentioned communities. As noted above, the pertinent dates are 12/15, 16, and 17/67. The teletype codes of the respective offices have been added to these duplicate bills, indicating the telephone numbers to be checked out by the various offices receiving this airtel.





### AT D'HANIS, TEXAS:

Telephone communications for D'Hanis, Texas, are handled by the Rocksprings-Nueces Canyon Telephone company.

SA WEBB is contacting this company per request in memo.

### AT KNIPPA, TEXAS:

On 5/1/68 Mr. ANDREW ANDERSON, Owner, Knippa Telephone Co., advised there are only two pay phones handled by that company in its entire system. One is located on US Hgwy. 90 at EDE's Cafe, Knippa, telephone number 512 93467116 and the other is at Sunny Clime Farms, approximately miles southeast of Knippa, approximately one mile off US Hgwy 90, located in the jockey room at the racetrack. ANDERSON pointed out that the pay phor at Sunny Clime Farms is generally not used by the public since it is in an out-of-the-way place; well-off the main road, and generally only used by persons having race horses trained at the farm.

ANDERSON Reviewed telephone records for number 934-7116 for 12/15,16,17/67 and located only one long distant telephone call from this number: 12/17/6% to Houston, 695-0588




This telephone number belongs to GILBERTO VILLARREAL at 35 Boca Chica, Brownsville, Texas. VILLARREAL is Principal of the J. T. Canales School, and Mrs. VILLARREAL is a stenographer for Cox & Wilson, Attorneys. They own a small building in front of their residence where the Triangle Barber S hop is located. There is an extension of this telephone in the house and in the barber shop. The barber shop would not have been open or occupied before 8:00 AM.

Both Mr. and Mrs. VILLARREAL were interviewed. They never heard of JAMES EARL RAY and do not recall receiving a telephone call that would have awakened them at 5:43 am. They know no one in Sanderson. They have relatives in California who call now and then and who visit other relatives in Kingsville and in Rio Grande City. VILLARREAL and his wife were the only ones who would have answered the telephone. They recall the California relatives calling them sometime before Christmas and feel that they might have called from Sanderson en route to Texas and did not tell them where they were. The VILLARREALS took it for granged that the call came from California; however they actually do not know where it originated.

The VILLARREALS are personally known to me and are citizens of good moral character and reputation and would cooperate with the FBI. It is not likely that they would know RAY, and I think that they are telling the truth.

Subject subsequently robbed Blanchett who was on duty at the Grande Courts. During the robbery Williams stated that he was the 7th most wanted man of the FBI. Blanchett stated that subject told him not to call the FBI during the May 4 robbery because if Blanchett did subject would get him. Caller stated he did not give any of this information to the PD which investigated the robbery. Blanchett stated that he decided to change his story and advise the FBI. Subject did not appear to have a gun in the robbery. Subject further informed Blanchett prior to the robbery that his mother was going to wire him some money from Virginia, city unknown.

Blanchett described Williams as being about 27, 5'10", 170 lbs, strong heavy build, sandy mussed hair. While at the Grande Courts subject register as Earl Williams listing his friend's name as Jerry Evans. Subject later stated that he was Johnny Ray. 





The following investigation was conducted by SA THOMAS H. WEAVER:

AT JEFFERSON CITY, MISSOURI:

On April 29, 1968, a former inmate of the Missouri State Penitentiary advised as follows:

He knew JAMES EARL RAY at the Missouri State Penitentiary (MSP). From his conversations with RAY, he learned that RAY's maximum ambition in life was to make a "score" of about \$20 - \$30,000.00, after which he would go to Mexico to "hide out", living simply on the loot at the favorable Mexican exchange rate. RAY had spoken to him about his previous trips to Mexico, following "two or three" armed robberies, involving small scores, where he would "cool off" and live on beer, beans and milk. RAY spoke of Campeche Bay, near the Yucatan Peninsula, and he spoke of living with peasants on the outskirts of the town of Campeche, Mexico. RAY also spoke of a cheap "red light district" he favored located in the town of Torreon or Torrejon (phonetic), which the former MSP inmate thought was located in north central Mexico. Cost was a factor in anything RAY did, and he apparently lived frugally and budgeted his money carefully.

RAY did not like Negroes in general, but he expressed no particular feeling toward MARTIN LUTHER KING, although he has heard RAY refer to Dr. KING as "MARTIN LUTHER COON". RAY read enthusiastically, especially the weekly news magazines available at the MSP, and he would react in an outspoken manner opposing H. RAP BROWN and STOKELY CARMICHAEL when he read of their activities, as well as in opposition to publicity Dr. KING received in certain instances.
