At approximately ll a.m., March ll, 1969, an individual identifying himself as Frederic L. Carrin appeared at the San Antonio Office of the FBI advising he had a "conspiracy theory" concerning the assassination of Dr. Martin Luther King which he wished to discuss with the FBI.

Carlin proceeded to explain his "theory" which among other things encompassed the Russian Revolution of 1917 and the Senate debate on the appointment of Abe Fortas as Chief Justice of the United States Supreme Court in 1968. Carlin contended the conspirators in the assassination of Dr. Martin contended the conspirators in the assassination of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. were Senator Phillip A. Hart (D-Mich.) for "being suspect" in the Detroit race riots; Senator Steven M. "being suspect" in the Cleveland race riots; Young (D-Ohio) for "being suspect" in the Cleveland race riots; Senator Eugene Mc Carthy for being so liberal on different issues and for stating he planned to visit Red China if he were elected President; former Attorney General Ramsey Clark for supporting anti-gun law legislation; and FBI Special Agent George Bonebreak (phonetic), if not the whole FBI in general.

Carlin elaborated the conspirators in this case were the product of Communist infiltration into every phase of the United States Government, civil rights groups, and church groups in the United States, and each of the conspirators had contributed large sums of money to finance spirators had contributed large sums of money to finance James Earl Ray and to keep Ray quiet, thereby protecting themselves.

Carlin stated if an investigation was launched to examine Congressional voting records, this would bear out his theory.

Carlin's main point in this theory centered around criticism of the FBI and Agent Bonebreak, stating the FBI acted too swiftly in issuing "two wanted flyers" on Ray. The

first flyer was on an Eric Starvo Galt while the second one was on James Earl Ray. Carlin contended the FBI could not possibly have known Eric Starvo Galt was an alias Ray might have used prior to actually identifying Ray by what was reported to be an exhaustive fingerprint examination. He, therefore, stated the FBI should be held accountable for possibly causing arrest and/or death of an innocent person.

Carlin, who throughout the foregoing conversation spoke in an extremely arrogant and belligerent manner, stated he had been discharged from the United States Navy in 1961. He exhibited a Navy identification card, No. 322795, showing him to be a "non petty officer".

Carlin stated he was a former letter carrier for the United States Post Office, San Antonio, having been employed by that office until mid-1968, at which time he "resigned" or was "removed" due to medical problem involving his blood sugar count and the fact he had overextended his sick leave privileges. He stated he was presently selfemployed as a farmer owning a small farm near Stockdale, Texas.

Carlin gave no exact address, stating he does not like to use a street address and that he received his mail through General Delivery or occasionally a box he might rent at the Post Office in San Antonio.

Carlin returned to an earlier statement of his concerning anti-gun law legislation and stated this was even more evidence to prove a Communist infiltration of the United States Government as he felt Americans should be allowed to own firearms as he felt they would be needed one day in the battle against Communism. He stated he personally owned firearms and described them as a .38 Special revolver and a "nice" 30.06 deer rifle.

Carlin indicated he had written the following individuals concerning his "conspiracy theory" and hoped they would see an investigation was launched to bear this theory out:

FREDERIC L. CARLIN

Governor Ronald Reagan of California (whom Carlin stated he backed in a bid for the Presidency of the United States);

Governor John McKeithan of Louisiana; Prime Minister Pierre Elliott Trudeau of Canada; Former President Lyndon B. Johnson while in office; President Richard M. Nixon; New Orleans, Louisiana, District Attorney James

Garrison; and

U. S. Senators Strom Thurman, Robert P. Griffin, James O. Eastland, Sam Ervin, Jr., Ted Kennedy, and John Tower.

From observation during the above conversation Frederic L. Carlin is described as a white male; in his early 30's; approximately 5'9"; 155-160 pounds; dark hair wears glasses; and has pock marked complexion.

At approximately 2 p.m., March 11, 1969, Deputy United States Marshal Mario Granados, San Antonio, Texas, telephonically contacted the San Antonio Office of the FBI advising he had received the following information from his brother Rudy Granados.

At approximately 12:45 p.m., March 11, Rudy Granados was in Cap'n Jim's restaurant located at the intersection of Loop 13 and Roosevelt, San Antonio, and overheard an unknown man state he had "a .357 magnum" in his car and was "leaving to take care of Garrison". Granados observed this unknown individual, described as a white male, 5'8", approximately thirty years of age, leave the restaurant and drive off in a light blue Chevrolet Nova automobile bearing 1968 Texas license plates GNS 308.

Check of these license plates through Bexar County automobile registration records reflected they had been issued for a 1963 Chevrolet, Vehicle Identification No. 30411K127278, registered to F. L. Carlin, 511 Monticello, San Antonio, Texas.

A check of the current San Antonio city directory

reflected 511 Monticello is the address for one Clifford T. Carlin, a printer for the San Antonio Express Publishing Company. This directory further carried the listing for one Frederic L. Carlin, who was a carrier for the United States Post Office, San Antonio, and has a Post Office Box of 10039.



Mr. CHARLIE TRONCALE, owner-manager, Granada Hotel, 2230 Fourth Avenue, North, made available the guest registration cards for his hotel during the period August 22 - 28, 1967, inclusive. A review of these cards resulted in the location of guest registration No. 9022 for one JOHN L. RAYNS, residence 1825 Lafayette St., St. Louis, Mo., who checked in at 9:05 a.m. on Saturday, August 26, 1967, and was assigned to Room 210 by Desk Clerk ADRIAN M. KOONCE at a rate of \$4.50. No record was maintained as to the time of checkout or method of travel. The card reflected the guest had luggage. The original of this card has been forwarded to the FBI Laboratory at Washington, D. C., for appropriate handwriting comparison.

A record was obtained of the names and addresses (where recorded) of the approximately 150 guests, other than permanent residents, during the period for which the cards were reviewed and two copies of the list are being transmitted to the Memphis FBI Office. No guest card was observed for any "RAOUL" or similar name during the period involved.

Upon observing the guest registration card of RAYNS, Mr. ADRIAN M. KOONCE identified his initials as having roomed RAYNS, but stated that due to the elapsed time he had no independent recollection of him. he had previously been exhibited a photograph of RAY and was unable to identify that individual.

No further information was obtainable from Mr. KOONCE or other personnel of the Granada Hotel.

In that teletype, it was pointed out a representative of Newsweek contacted the telephone company, Houston, and advised LOMAX and STEIN had identified a coin telephone located at Enco service station, Route 90, Uvalde, Texas, as one allegedly used by RAY to make call to New Orleans 12/16/67.

At that time Mr. LONG had instructed we check and attempt to verify this.

Today in his conversation, Mr. LONG called attention to our teletype dated November 11, 1968, which indicates that we check ed seven "major" motels and hotels in Nuevo Laredo, Mexico, for the month of October, 1967, with negative results. Mr. LONG said that the subject has never been known to stay in "major" or even good hotels and motels and he was of the opinion that we should make further checks in Nuevo Laredo and vicinity among the lesser motels and hotels so that we may be certain that there is no record there.

Serials 611 and 614 should be sent to Armijo and a full and complete check must be made of hotels and motels in Nuevo Laredo in order to promptly resolve this matter.

I told Mr. LONG we would do this and we would send an airtel reflecting results.

At 3:30 p.m. today I received a telephone call from Supervisor RICHARD LONG of the Civil Rights Section in the Bureau. Mr. LONG has this case assigned to him and is busily engaged in refuting, confirming, and/or running out leads stemming from the story on JAMES EARL RAY which appears in the November 12, 1968 issue of Look Magazine and which apparently has already been issued to the newsstands.

Mr. LONG says that in the article RAY makes reference to the fact that he had stayed across the border from Laredo in a motel where he had some dealings between Nuevo Laredo and Laredo and back again with a person named RAOUL, who was apprently from Canada.

Mr. LONG desired that we pursue all possibilities of further identifying RAOUL with the objective of either eliminating him or connecting him with the alleged conspiracy involved in the murder of Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR. Mr. LONG noted that RAY at the time he was supposed to have stayed in Nuevo Laredo prior to departure for Acapulco, Mexico, was using the names of ERIC S. GALT and JOHN L. RAYNS.

I have obtained a copy of the magazine referred to and the magazine is dated November 12, 1968, with a black cover and the printing in white which reads "The Story of James Earl Ray and the Conspiracy to Kill Martin Luther King." The authoriof the article appears to be WILLIAM BRADFORD HUIE who claims this is an exclusive report on the accused assassin's escape from prison and his journey on the lam that led to a fateful trip south. The story appears on pages 96 through 113.
