

This money now totals at least \$100,000. The FBI should not, however, be publicized as the source of this reminder.

While the Bureau's continuing policy is to encourage the public to furnish information to law enforcement authorities as a matter of good citizenship, without expectation of financial reward, it is fully recognized that monetary rewards are often necessary to motivate some individuals. The knowledge of the existence of the substantial rewards available in the Murkin case could possibly prove of value in the solution of this major investigation.

Dr. King no Communist

TOLEDO (To the Editor) — In response to the letter by Jessie Hindman, in which specharged that Dr. Martin Luther King was used by the Reds to spread the Communist line, I would like to make a few comments.

Perhaps J. Hindman would like to stop kidding herself and face the rruth, too. If all Dr. King managed to do while he lived was to spread a blanket of collective guilt over all white Americans, then he served his purpose well. It is about time that white Americans felt guilty about the "equality" they have allowed the Negro. the Negro.

Whether or not Dr. King advocated constructive use of the money donated to the organizations Mrs. Hindman spoke of, I do not know. He certainly did not advocate wasteful use of it.

By extending the "collective" blanket of guilt to Communist collectivism, Mrs. Hindman hoped to brand anyone who hints at "collective" thinking as a Communist. The connection is not a rightful one. All who think collectively are not Communist. Nor are all who oppose the Vietnam war

It is not a well-established fact that Dr. King was used to promote the Communist line. I. Hindman took a quotation from the Readen's Digest which was supposed to prove that King was Communist influenced. The quotation, reported to have come from a presidential aide, read "My God, King has given a speech on Vietnam that goes right down the Commie line!"

In the first place, the Reader's Digest is not, by any means, considered the most reliable source of information. Even if it were, the fact that King spoke against the Vietnam war and went "right down the Commie line" does not in any way prove that he was Communist influenced. The Communist line is an ever changing line. It would be quite difficult for anyone to voice any opinion without following the Commin line sometime or other

the Commie line sometime or other.

Many are the churchmen who have spoken out against that war and who are neither Conmunist inspired nor communistically inclined. Dr. King, those churchmen and I are merely orposed to a war we do not believe is right.

On May 17, 1968, GEORGE ORMROD, Public Health Statistics Officer, Washington State Department of Health, Olympia, Washington, advised that their department maintains a centralized repository of death records and also maintains records of unidentified persons who have died. He stated that in the case of the latter, no filing is done until the passage of a year and then the record would not disclose information which would be helpful in identification such as the description of the deceased.

He said that the logical person to contact in determining if there are presently any deaths involving unidentified persons since April 5, 1968, would be the local county coroner. He said because some counties are relatively small, the local prosecutor serves as the coroner.

In view of this, it may be appropriate for a memo to all SRA's be prepared requesting that all county coroners or appropriate official, be contacted to determine if any unidentified person has died within the period of time since April 5, 1968, within their respective area.




