Records of the San Quentin Penitentiary reflect that KENNETH LEE WADE, FBI #56 81 23 B, was received at San Quentin Penitentiary on 9/19/67 to serve a five year to life sentence for armed robbery committed in the Los Angeles, California area.

The following interview of KENNETH LEE WADE was conducted by SAs DALE F. NORTON and MICHAEL T. GEARY:

KENNETH LEE WADE advised that he served a sentence in the Missouri State Penitentiary (MSP) at Jefferson City, Missouri from 1958 through 1965, where he was confined as a result of having been convicted of a robbery charge in St. Louis, Missouri. He advised that he knew RAY from about 1960 until 1965.

WADE advised that he served about one year of his sentence and then escaped, and after being recaptured, was

returned to MSP and served from 1962 to 1965. He advised that RAY came to MSP with a man by the name of RAY PRUITT. WADE stated that he and PRUITT were fall partners. He advised that both he and PRUITT were convicted at the same time but that PRUITT fought the conviction and did not enter MSP at the same time that he, WADE, did.

WADE advised that PRUITT and RAY may have met while both were in the City Jail in St. Louis, Missouri. WADE stated PRUITT knows RAY better than he does.

He advised that when PRUITT and RAY arrived at the penitentiary, that he, PRUITT and RAY all lived in "K Hall", and that because RAY and PRUITT were friends, he and his friends accepted the two of them and that PRUITT in effect, was RAY's sponsor. WADE advised that he and RAY worked in the bakery. WADE was a pastry cook and was fairly good.

WADE examined the photographs and drawings of RAY and stated that the drawing of RAY in which his eyes were open is not a good likeness in that it completely changes the appearance of RAY's eyes which are smaller and more slanted. WADE advised that his group in the prison consisted of the following individuals:

- (1) JAMES EARL RAY
- (2) RAY PRUITT
- (3) BOBBY BURNS
- (4) GLEN SHURNICK or SHERNICK (PH)
- (5) WADE

He advised that they, the five of them, had "a little thing going for them" in that they were selling amph@tamine pills and other stimulants to inmates at the prison.

He stated that while he was confined to the penitentiary, that they had a semi-riot at the jail as prison authorities sought to integrate the prison and as a result, a few Negroes were stabbed and that the jail was not integrated while he was there.

WADE stated, "I had a beef with a Negro over a debt about amphetamine powder. This beef was in 1962. I 'piped him', that is I hit him with a pipe a few times. He was hospitalized. This beef wasn't over RAY. This clique had a thing going for it."

He advised that he figures that they made about \$1,000 a month or more selling these pills each month. He advised they paid a guard \$100 to bring the jar in and after expenses, cleared about \$1,000 a month.

WADE stated that RAY is a very quiet individual. He stated he did not know what RAY's opinions were of Negroes.

He advised RAY had a friend who sent him some narcotics. He advised he did not know any more than this about that matter.

WADE advised that RAY was close-mouthed and never discussed anything with anyone, particularly he would not discuss any ideas or plans he had about escaping.

He described RAY as having a quick temper and a violent temper, but believed that RAY was in sufficient control of himself not to let his quick and violent temper unmask him. He said it was his opinion that if somebody got into an argument with RAY about something that RAY would control his emotions so as not to attract attention to himself, but he stated RAY was the type that would and could lay for the guy and later give him a good working over.

WADE stated, "I do not believe RAY would go to booze." He advised it was his belief that RAY liked narcotics but not hard stuff, and that he would probably just use the stimulant type. He advised that RAY could handle narcotics "real good."

He stated he did not believe that RAY at this time would engage in the sell of narcotics in view of the fact that he is an escaped convict.

WADE later stated, "RAY doesn't like Negroes. I believe

RAY is capable of killing KING. RAY could plan it."
He added it was his speculation "he must have had help."
He stated, "I don't believe RAY killed KING. I couldn't see RAY getting into that bag as he was an escapee."

WADE advised that he never met any of RAY's family or friends from the outside while they were in jail and RAY never met any of his family or friends from the outside either. He stated, "I have no idea where RAY may be. I have no knowledge of RAY's outside connections. I believe RAY could have saved about a good sum of money from his share of the profits of the sale of amphetamine." He advised in the event RAY was going to escape he believes the other people in the clique would loan or give RAY as much money as they had available to them He advised that RAY used to read about foreign countries in his cell. He advised that PRUITT, who was a cell block mate, worked in the library and would bring the books to RAY. He advised that BURNS and SHURNICK each got 75 years so they are still He advised he does not know where PRUITT is. in MSP.

He advised that he is presently confined as a result of some robberies which he committed in the Los Angeles area with HAROLD KLEMP, DONALD BUSSMEYER and SAM MASSY.

He advised that all four of them had been in MSP at one time or another and he believed that KLEMP, BUSSMEYER and MASSY might know RAY. He advised that KLEMP is in Folsom Prison, BUSSMEYER is in Mc Neil Island and SAM MASSY went insane and is confined in some mental hospital in the State of California.

The Federal Bureau of Investigation released these two photographs today in Washington, identified as two additional pictures of James Earl Ray who is being sought in connection with the slaying of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. The FBI said the picture of Ray wearing dark glasses was taken in Mexico in November, 1967, while the one of Ray in a business suit was made in California during the last part of January or the early part of February, 1968.—AP Wirephoto.

Photos Issued James Earl

WASHINGTON (AP) - The tographs of James Earl Ray, who is being sought in connection with the murder of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.

An FBI spokesman said one of the latest photos is "considered to be the best possible likeness of Ray."

So far the FBI now has issued five photos of Ray.

The one the FBI considers the FBI issued today two more photographs of James Earl Ray, or early February of this year somewhere in California. It shows Ray wearing a dark checked jacket, striped tie and button-down collar shirt. There is a curtain directly in back of him and a lamp nearby.

The FBI would not say where it obtained the picture, or where precisely it was taken, or by whom.

The other new photo, which the FBI said was taken last No-vember at an undisclosed location in Mexico, shows Ray wearing dark glasses and a light colored shirt open at the collar.

The two new photos confirm what FBI descriptions say—that his weight has been known to vary widely. The Mexican picture discloses a man with a thin face and pointed chin, much as he appeared in 1960 photos.

But the picture taken in California shows him edging up to pudginess, with a clear cleft in his chin.



Mr. JAECH pointed out that Rocky Mt. does not have insurance agencies in Texas, but some possible holder who has moved to Texas, or was passing through that state, might have called Seattle on some type of claim.



Mr. LYLE WANISKA, Plant Manager, Navy Exchange Laundry, Naval Air Station, advised all laundry processed at the plant is identified by a letter followed by two numbers as follows:

- (1) First digit of the laundry mark must be either a M,T, W, H, F. These letters represent the day of the week with H representing Thursday.
- (2) Second digit is a number and represents the lot number. This can be any number depending on the number of lots processed on a given day.
- (3) Third digit is a number representing the bundle in a given lot. This number is 1-20 since there are 20 bundles in a lot.

Mr. WANISKA advised that M-4-17 would be an example of a laundry mark .

Mr. WANISKA advised that dry cleaning at the laundry is identified by a letter followed by two numbers as follows:

- (1) First digit represents the day of the week when dry cleaning turned in. This must be the letters M, T, W, H, F.
- (2) Second digit is a number which represents the number of items submitted by an individual.
- (3) Third digit represents the number in a particular lot. This number is from one to 100.

Mr. WANISKA advised T-2-62 would be an example of a dry cleaning mark.

Mr. WANISKA was specifically asked if "02B-6" or"D2B-6" could represent marks used at the Navy Exchange Laundry, and he stated definitely not.



The following inquiry was conducted based on information furnished Seattle May 6, 1968 by WALLY MAY, Manager, Aurora-Midway Branch, People's National Bank, of Washington, indicating that a MRS. ROGER L. MILLER, aka KATHRYN MILLER, 19274 80th West, Edmonds, Washington, had issued a check on her checking account at this branch to MRS. EARL RAY which check had been cashed in the Liberty Super Market, Memphis, Tennessee, with the telephone number notation 743-9797.

Records of the Seattle Credit Bureau and the Edmonds Police Department were negative.

Records of the Credit Bureau of Snohomish County, Everett, show that the MILLERs have been listed since January, 1965, coming to the Edmonds area from Seattle. He was listed as a driver for Darigold Farms. His wife, KATHRYN, and he had previously been employed by Muffler City in Seattle, having lived in the Seattle area since at least 1958. record was satisfactory.

Next door neighbor, MRS. JAMES FARMER, 19730 80th Place West, advised that MR. and MRS. MILLER and their teenage daughter live next door, that both MR. and MRS. MILLER work in Seattle, and that one is a native of the Seattle area and the other is a native of the Memphis, Tennessee area and still has relatives in that area.

On the evening of May 6, 1968, MR. and MRS. ROGER L. MILLER, 19724 80th West | advised that MRS. MILLER comes from Memphis, Tennessee originally and that her sister, MELVA, has been married to EARL RAY for the past approximately eleven years, and that they presently live at 2680 Frisco Street, in Memphia, with their two children.

RAY is approximately 38 years of age, is a white male, 5'6", height; weight 140 lbs., has coal black hair. He has lived in Memphis all of his life to the best of their knowledge and has been employed in ornamental iron work and in a battery shop there. He was previously in the military service and has never

been in prison to their knowledge. He and his wife have lived in Memphis ever since they were married and his mother still lives next door. His father died approximately a year ago. He has sisters and brothers in the same area.

MRS. MILLER stated that as soon as they read in the newspapers the identity of the suspect in the KING killing, that they thought the name of MRS. MILLER's brother-în-law, but having known of his whereabouts and activities over the past eleven years and knowing what he looked like, realized that this was only a similarity in names. They concluded that to their knowledge, MRS. MILLER's brother-in-law's relatives are all in the Memphis area and they were in no way connected with or related to the person charged in the King killing.


