On April 24, 1968, Mr. RAY HORN, Plant Manager, American Linen Supply Company, 771 Valley Street, Seattle, advised he does not use tape on sheets, has no yellow tape, and the number of characters was too small since he uses seven to nine characters.

On April 24, 1968, Mr. W. J. McGEE, Proprietor, U. S. Naval Exchange Laundry, Sand Point Naval Air Station, Seattle, Washington, advised that he might use yellow tape on bed sheets or pillow cases at times, but the characters 20R-3 would not be used. He uses a letter followed by two numbers.

On April 24, 1968, Mr. JIM HART, Manager, Lakeside Cleaners, Bellevue, Washington, advised that his machine could make those characters and 15 point type on the first 3 characters and 18 point type on the last 2 characters. Mr. HART stated that he would check his records for the current year to ascertain the person receiving that number.

Re Bureau teletype to All SACS 4/18/68 ; Routing Slip from SA V. P. COYNE 4/19/68; memo to All Agents from SA VERNON P. COYNE 4/22/68; telephone call from SA JACK KETCHAM 4/20/68; telephone call from Clerk KENNETH YOUNG 4/21/68, and telephone call from SA JOHN CONNOR 4/26/68.

On 4/19/68 photographs of GALT were furnished by the writer to GEORGE BOYNTON, City Editor, Bellingham, Wn. "Herald", daily newspaper; ELEANOR HAMILTON, radio dispatcher, Bellingham Police Department; MIKE B. HINCHLIFF, radio dispatcher, Washington State Patrol, Bellingham, and R. TOM DARLEY, Border Patrol Inspector, Blaine, with the request that copies be distributed by the Border Patrol to Canadian Customs and Immigration Inspectors at the Border. Copies also were distributed to Undersheriff DON WILSON, Whatcom County Sheriff's Office, Bellingham.

On 4/20/68 Asst. Ticket Agent J. B. SHELLEY, Greyhound Bus Station, advised three buses left Greyhound Station, Seattle, that date at 12:15. Two buses were arriving Bellingham 2:00 & 2:10 PM, and third proceeding direct to Vancouver, to be stopped at Pacific Highway, Canadian Customs, Blaine, at 2:30 P.M. Drivers LAMBERT WOUTERS and HAROLD JOHNSON, drivers of the two buses which left Seattle at 12:15 PM that date, were interviewed, showed photos of GALT, and stated nobody resembling him or carrying a short jacket, wearing a cotton print shirt and denim trousers, had been on their buses.

Because of the telephone strike, a radio broadcast was made by Wash. State Patrol, Bellingham, at request of writer, to Border Patrol, Blaine, with request that bus # 7275, left Seattle 12:15, due Blaine 2:30 PM, be searched to determine if above described individual could be on that bus. Search confirmed by return radio, negative.

Bellingham, Wn. "Herald" reporter JACK MAYNE heard a portion of the above Wash. State Patrol broadcast to Border Patrol, and wrote article which appeared in that paper on page 1 on

4/21/68. MAYNE stated on 4/21/68 the City Editor on duty Saturday 4/20/68 "changed" his article, misconstrued the information, and a clerical employee put out a portion of the article on the UPI service. MAYNE stated there was no person on the bus who was checked and "cleared" by and allowed to go on to Vancouver. He stated he obtained the description of the man in the article from the Wash. State Patrol broadcast to the Border Patrol, and assumed such a person was supposed to be on the bus.

On 4/21/68 Bellingham Police Sergeant PARKER eliminated a salesman temporarily residing at the Leopold Motel, Bellingham, reported as a "look alike", as not identical with RAY, based on contacts by PARKER with reputable business men in Bellingham who have known the salesman for more than two years.

Efforts were spent on 4/21-22/68 interviewing employees of the Horseshoe Restaurant, 113 E. Holly St., Bellingham, JOAN BRINKMAN and NELLIE MENZE, who had seen someone they stated resembled the subject's picture in the Seattle Post-Intelligencer and Bellingham "Herald", who had been in the Horseshoe Restaurant; and Mrs. GOFF, proprietor, GOFF's Dep't. Store, Blaine, Wn., who said a man resembling photos of subject appeared in her store Saturday 4/20/68, carrying a shoe box which he wanted wrapped. He inquired as to the charge, was told no charge, and left a quarter with Mrs. GOFF for her service. This individual was identified as identical with the salesman eliminated by Sgt. PARKER, Bellingham PD, the salesman who has worked for a St. Louis, Mo., company as a traveling salesman for more than two years, and makes regular visits to Bellingham in connection with his sales business.

On 4/26/68 SA JOHN CONNOR, Everett, telephonically advised that ROGER BUTTON, former Whatcom County Juvenile Probation Officer, presently affiliated with the Deaconess Home, Everett, advised CONNOR that three days previous one WILLIAM LUTHER SILLS, who was arrested by the Blaine, Wn., PD in 1964, for attempting to enter Canada without sufficient funds, and was a runaway from his home in Memphis, Tenn., and was sent back to Memphis in 1964 by BUTTON, appeared in BUTTON's office in Everett in a highly belligerent manner. BUTTON "quieted him down", took him to the apartment of BUTTON for relaxation. BUTTON and his roommate discussed the recent article in the newspaper in which a convict stated that RAY had stated there was a million dollar reward or bonus for the death of KING, and SILLS corrected them, stating the bonus or reward was only \$1500.00. BUTTON stated there was no similarity, because of the great difference in age, between SILLS and RAY, SILLS being about 22 now, but thought it unusual that SILLS said the bonus or reward was only \$1500.00. SILLS allegedly resides with KENNETH DOLAN, former Police Chief of Blaine, and is allegedly employed at Intalco Aluminum Co., Ferndale, Wn.

SILLS' employment at Intalco was verified; birth [redacted] Social Security # [redacted] person to be notified in case of emergency MARIE SILLS, 686 Pearce St., Memphis, Tenn., phone 526-3557. He began work at Intalco 4/19/68, and resides with KENNETH DOLAN, former Police Chief, Blaine, Sixth Street. DOLAN advised SILLS has made several remarks about KING, but he believes SILLS is "shooting off his mouth, trying to impress people about what a big shot he is, pretending to know a lot when he in reality knows nothing factual."

SILLS was located at the residence of DOLAN on 4/26/68, the writer being accompanied by Whatcom Deputy Sheriff CARL BOYD. SILLS reluctantly admitted he had made the statement reference to the \$1500.00, but claimed he did so in a joking manner to impress BUTTON and BUTTON's roommate, when he had no basis in fact, or information of any kind pertaining to the KING murder, except what he saw and heard on television, stating he does not read newspapers. He stated that on the date of the murder he was employed in Detroit City, Michigan, and had payroll check stubs in his possession to substantiate his story.

Records of the Whatcome County Juvenile Probation Department, Bellingham, made available by Mrs. FLORABELLE WILSON on 4/26/68, indicated SILLS was born [redacted] and was returned to Memphis as a runaway on 4/14/64. His mother's address was the same as in the ~~xxxxxx~~ top paragraph above.

On 4-30-68, Det. Larry French, Auto Theft Unit, Seattle PD, who continually checks impound lots and out-of-state vehicles, checked the records of his office and advised that he does not recall a vehicle with Georgia license plates being recovered in the Seattle area or being in impound, at the present time.

On 4-30-68, Lt. Ernest Jensen, Identification Division, Seattle Police Department, advised that his department has thousands of latent prints that have been collected over a period of time. Lt. Ernest Jensen stated that it would be possible to check latent prints, in majority robbery and burglary cases, that occurred subsequent to the escape of the Subject. Lt. Jensen noted that he is short of personnel and they have trouble keeping current with the daily work. However, Lt. Jensen stated that given a little time, he will have latent prints, in the major cases, checked against the prints of the Subject. This will be completed as soon as possible.

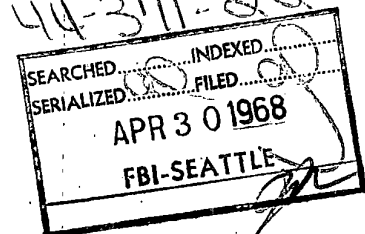

FBI Grumbling About Handling Of King Case

WASHINGTON — The deep-seated unhappiness of J. Edgar Hoover's Federal Bureau of Investigation with its boss, Atty. Gen. Ramsey Clark, was aggravated by Clark's misleading public optimism about a quick solution of the Martin Luther King murder.

FBI agents working on the King case grumbled privately that Clark's repeated statements hinting at imminent capture of Dr. King's assassin were not justified by the actual progress of the investigation. On the contrary, some agents complained that what legitimate information the attorney general did let drop risked drying up the killer's trail.

Calm Said Sought

In Justice Department conferences, Clark justified his contribution to the credibility gap on the grounds that optimistic talk about closing the case "would help morale" — that is, calm down Negro anger in the turbulent days immediately following the murder.

Simultaneously, there is considerable skepticism inside the Justice Department and FBI that the present renewed investigation of black power extremist Stokely Carmichael will result in any action.

FBI agents are making detailed probes into Carmichael's role in fomenting the Washington, D.C., riots of April 4-6 following King's death, but many feel Clark will never push for a Carmichael prosecution. The Justice Department staff overwhelmingly recommended a year ago that the government seek an indictment of Carmichael, but the attorney general vetoed the advice on grounds that it would only make him a martyr.

Mr. FISHER advised that the letter is as follows:

"Dear Sir:

"May I express my appreciation to the man who killed that black son of a bitch, MARTIN LUTHER KING.

"I think a statute ought to be erected in his name and a few airports named after him.

"I hope you don't look very hard for him as there was truly a great American. If he is caught you can expect me to make a contribution to his legal defense fund.

"I don't care if anyone burns our flag or not anymore as when they lower it on account of that son of a bitches death it can't be worth a damn anyway. If the killer comes this way, I would be proud to hide him out.

Driver of a 1956 cream-colored Chrysler, 4 dr. he thought, had backed into the island for getting gas in a man that his rear of car not visible. Front license bent and WEATHERMAN did not even know state in which car licensed.

The driver of the car, alone, WM, about 35-42 years of age, southern accent, no scars, no hat, no glasses. He was 5'8 - 5'9" at best. He was wearing a dirty white shirt and dark wash wear pants. He had a week's growth of beard. Hair a dark brown. Smoked Camels.

WEATHERMAN went thru 6 photos and picked out photo of RAY, taken in 1966 as looking like the driver of the car.

The driver appeared to have been living in the car for several weeks. He had maps all over the car. No newspapers noted. Driver had a closed box behind the driver's seat on the floor. Dirty clothes in back seat. A large sack was on front seat, used for litter.

Driver bought ethel for the car, yet would not put in oil at Boise where told it was 1 1/2 quarts low on oil. Paid cash. Got gas subsequently in Ontario, Ore and at Pendleton, Oregon.

Driver did not know the area and only at last minute decided where he was going, he said he was going to Hood River, Oregon. He said once he was going to La Grande, Ore. They did go thru La Grande. WEATHERMAN woke up to see driver coming out of a grocery store, folding some money and putting it in his pocket. He did not appear to have purchased anything in the store.

On introduction, driver mumbled something that was supposed to be his last name. No idea. He acted like he has always lived in the country near a town.

Driver did not say much, but what he did say did not appear to be the truth. Man said he had come from La Grande and was raised in Hood River, but did not seem to know the areas ~~xx~~ at all.

On one occasion driver said he had gone to east coast to buy some library books. On another occasion WEATHERMAN woke up to find driver opening a knife, looking kind of "Wild-eyed."

He appeared real concerned any time he saw a police car, appeared to be afraid of the toll bridge at Umatilla.

It was a Umatilla bridge in Oregon where driver left Weatherman off; driver stating he was going to Hood River. Driver pulled in behind cafe on SW corner of turn off for bridge at Umatilla. This was about noon, 4/28/68.

WEATHERMAN said this man may not be RAY, but he is running from the police for something.
