On 4/20/68 Asst. Ticket Agent J. B. SHELLEY, Greyhound Bus Station, advised three buses left Greyhound Station, Seattle, that date at 12:15. Two buses were arriving Bellingham 2:00 & 2:10 PM, and third proceeding direct to Vancouver, to be stopped at Pacific Highway, Canadian Customes, Blaine, at 2:30 P.M. LUTHER SILLS, who was arrested by the Blaine, Wn., PD in 1964,
for attempting to enter Canada without sufficient funds, and



FBI Grumbling About Handling Of King Case

By ROWLAND EVANS and ROBERT NOVAK WASHINGTON — The delp-seated unhappiness of J. Edgar Hoover's Federal Bureau of Investigation with its boss, Alty. Gen. Ramsey Clark, was aggravated by Clark's misleading public optimism about a quick solution of the Martin Luther King murder.

FBI agents working on the King case grumbled privately that Clark's repeated statements hinting at imminent capture of Dr. King's assassin were not justified by the actual progress of the investigation. On the contrary, some agents complained that what legitimate information the attorney general did let drop risked drying up the killel's trail.

Calm Said Sought
In Justice Department conferences, Clark justified his contribution to the credibility gap on the grounds that optimistic talk about closing the case "worlld help morale" — that is, calm down Negro anger in the turbulent days immediately following the murder.

Simultaneously, there is considerable skepticism inside the Justice Department and FBI that the present renewed investigation of black power extremist Stollely Carmichael will result

in any action.


FBI agents are making detailed probes into Carmichael's role in fomenting the Washington, D.C., riots of April 4-6 following King's death, but many feel Clark will never push for a Carmichael prosecution. The Justice Department staff overwhelm-ingly recommended a year ago that the government seek an irdictment of Carmichael, but the attorney general vetoed the a lvice on grounds that it would olly make him a martyr.

FISHER, Snohomish County Sheriff's Office, Everett, Washington, advised that by letter dated April 10, 1968, his office received from the Office of the Director of the Division of Fire and Police, Memphis, Tennessee, a copy of a letter from DARYL GEMMER, Box 6, Lakewood, Washington, 98259, addressed to the Police Director FRANK HOLLOMAN, Memphis, Tennessee. Mr. FISHER advised that the letter is as follows:

"Dear Sir:

"May I express my appreciation to the man who killed that black son of a bitch, MARTIN LUTHUR KING.

"I think a statute ought, to be erected in his name and a few airports named after him.

"I hope you don't look very hard for him as there was truly a great American. If he is caught you can expect me to make a contribution to his legal defense fund.

"I don't care if anyone burns our flag or not anymore as when they lower it on account of that son of a bitches death it can't be worth a damn anyway. If the killer comes this way, I would be proud to hide him out.


