On June 13, 1968, Mr. JOHN V. CLARK, Corporate Manager, Security Section, The Boeing Company, 7755 E. Marginal Way S., Seattle, Washington, referred SA CHARLES N. GIESE to Mr. CHESTER ALFRED DAHL, Boeing Supervisor in Organization 6-7900, who has a Secret Clearance. DAHL resides at 23024-99th W., Edwards, Washington and according to CLARK he had information pertaining to a remark made by Mr. JOHN FREDERICK GRACE, a Boeing chemist in Organization 6-3020, who also has a Secret Clearance and who lives at 1009 Tenth Place S., Edmonds, Washington.

ALL MEMBERS OF THE DAHL FAMILY WHO WERE INTERviewed requested that their identities remain confidential.

Seattle Indices are negative concerning the DAHL family members and the GRACE family members.

On June 14, 1968, DAHL was interviewed at work; and he advised his daughter, is a friend of DEBBIE GRACE, who is the daughter of GRACE above. summation of Mr. DAHL's information was that learned from DEBBIE GRACE that three days prior to the KING assassination, GRACE had remarked that KING would be shot. Further, GRACE has attended many John Birch meetings "and others", types unknown. GRACE reportedly has a violent temper.

On June 14, 1968, , who is 17, was interviewed at her home in the presence of her mother. DEBBIE DAHL related the substance of the information outlined above and added that GRACE is "violently" anti-Communist.

On June 25, 1963, GRACE was interviewed at work by SA GIESE who prefaced the interview by stating merely that it had been reported to the Seattle FBI Office that GRACE proportedly had advanced information that KING would be shot.

GRACE stated that it was his feeling that since KING had been so much in the public eye and since some people were opposed to what he had been doing, he would not have been surprised if KING were shot. GRACE stated that he may have passed this remark to someone but he could not recall to whom or when. He said that he most certainly did not have any foreknowledge that KING would be shot although he was not surprised that it did happen for the reason stated above; but he deplored the shooting. GRACE said he most certainly did not have anything to do with the shooting itself, and he remarked that he has heard other persons remark that they would not be surprised if KING were shot in the connotation noted above.

Mr. RICHARD CHAPIN, attorney in Bellevue, telephone GL 4-8189, called and advised that MARTINSON, his client, had complained that he was interviewed by SA FREDERICK J. McFAUL, of the FBI, in the presence of other people and within their hearing was told that he was identical with JAMES EARL RAY.

I told Mr! CHAPIN that I would check on this matter and let him know. I talked to SA McFAUL. He advised that he did interview MARTINSON his sole purpose being to determine MARTINSON's whereabouts during the pertinent period of this case. He did not advise MARTINSON in the presence of others that he thought MARTINSON was identical with JAMES EARL RAY.

I called Mr. CHAPIN back on 7/2/68, and advised him it had been reported to us that MARTINSON may be identical with RAY, which was typical of many similar reports we received during the time we were seeking RAY's whereabouts; that our sole purpose in talking to MARTINSON was to determine his whereabouts during the pertinent period in this case. At no time did we directly or indirectly imply that we believed MARTINSON was identical with RAY.

He expressed his appreciation for our thoughtfulness in letting him know.

On this date JOE GARSKE, a card dealer at Carlo's Tavern, Yakima, who resides at 910 East Knob Hill Ave., Yakima, stated that he was formerly a dealer at Tonasket, Washington. While he was in Tonasket in the fall of 1967 he recalled a man coming to his place of business on at least two occasions, who never played cards, and who appeared to be of the fruit worker type. This man talked of having come from some southern state, not recalled by GARSKE, and that his brothers were rather influential people there and possibly in the filling station business.

GARSKE stated that he never did receive any information as to phthe name of this individual, but that he probably stayed at the local hotel where the bus station is located, since he had made a statement that his brothers were sending him a bus ticket to come home. He surmised that someone at the hotel might recall the incident and be able to furnish the name of the man. He did not visit with the man very much, however one time the man stated to him that he was going "back home" and kill MARTIN LUTHER KING. When pressed for details, the man would only say, "You can read about it in the newspapers". GARSKE stated that this man bears no resemblance to JAMES EARL RAY. He described him as follows:

GEORGE ROBERT LETSINGER

On June 11, 1968, Mr. JOSEPH FORROR, Assistant Postmaster, Main Post Office, San Diego, California, advised as follows:

Found on the incoming mail belt was a piece of paper not in an envelope written in green ink which was addressed to "Post Office Post Master". This note reads as follows:

"If the F.B.I. wonts Ray,s buddy go to 124 Broadway Metropole Hotel Room 117. He may be under the name Geore Letsinger or George Anderson. He knows about Kennedy and also King,s death,s. He may have part in Kings death. I know he was in Tenn. before and after King was killed. I know Letsinger is wonted in Seattle. Also in Big Stone Gap, Virginia, by the F.B.I."

On June 12, 1968, information was received from the Seattle Division, Federal Bureau of Investigation, that one GEORGE ROBERT LETSINGER, FBI Number 584 742 F, born at Macomb, Missouri, was arrested at Jacksonville, Florida, on April 11, 1968, charged with grand largerny having stolen \$550 to \$60 from a restaurant in Seattle, Washington, for which he was employed.

LETSINGER was returned to Seattle, Washington, and on the basis of the charge against him, received a three-year deferred sentence, six months in the county jail and ordered to make restitution.

LETSINGER appealed this sentence and was placed on bond, however, departed the State of Washington and a bench warrant was subsequently issued by the Superior Court, Seattle, Washington.

GEORGE ROBERT LETSINGER

Information was also furnished that authorities at Seattle, Washington, desired his apprehension and would extradite LETSINGER to Seattle, Washington. Based on this information, the San Diego Police Department arrested GEORGE ROBERT LETSINGER at Room 117, Metropole Hotel, 124 Broadway, San Diego, California, on June 12, 1968. At time of arrest, LETSINGER admitted his identity and the fact that he knew he was wanted by the State of Washington.

GEORGE ROBERT LETSINGER was interviewed by Agents of the Federal Bureau of Investigation at San Diego, California, on June 13, 1968, at which time he advised as follows:

LETSINGER advised that in 1963 he went to England and visited the Russian Embassy, Grovesner Square, London, England, for the purpose of renouncing his United States citizenship.

He was arrested while in England by New Scotland Yard, based upon a check which he had deposited in a bank prior to his departure to England and later determined it was a fraudulent check.

LETSINGER was asked why he desired to renounce his citizenship, to which he replied the country is no longer a country for the white people and is eventually being taken over by the "niggers."

LETSINGER exhibited a strong anti-Negro sentiment and stated that at one time he had been a member of a clantype organization at Big Stone Gap, Virginia.

LETSINGER was questioned as to his association with JAMES EARL RAY and whether he had any knowledge concerning the assassinations of Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING, Senator ROBERT E. KENNEDY and President JOHN F. KENNEDY. LETSINGER merely replied "I do not wish to talk about these subjects."

LETSINGER did say, however, that if Senator TED KENNEDY and Vice President HUBERT H. HUMPHREY continue to seek the Presidency of the United States, they will be assassinated. LETSINGER did not desire to elaborate regarding this information.

GEORGE ROBERT LETSINGER

LETSINGER admitted previous mental history, having been confined during 1961 for a short period of time at St. John's Hospital, Springfield, Missouri.

Handprinting was obtained from LETSINGER and was compared with the note received by the U.S. Post Office, San Diego, California, and because of a close resemblance of these, LETSINGER was asked if he, in fact, had written the note himself.

He categorically denied having written this note.



Seattle Police Department records showed that LETSINGER gave the address of 133 East Church St., Jacksonville, Florida, was a cook by occupation, attended high school presumably at Ava, Missouri, where a relative, Mrs. TROY STANPER, lived at Rt. 2, Ava, Missouri. It is also noted that he has FBI No. 584742F and his Ident Record shows that he was first arrested on March 1, 1965, by the Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis C-3 Branch, New Scotland Yard, London SWL England, as GEORGE ROBERT LETSINGER, No. 18123, and charged with obtaining credit by means of fraud which he was fined \$75.

His other arrests related to the aforementioned Seattle charges. The records of the Seattle Police Department reflect that following his return to Seattle, he was given a three-year deferred sentence, served six months in the County Jail and appealed this sentence on July 28, 1966. He was also required to make restitution of \$1,100.

The records of the Superior Court, King County, reflect that a warrant was issued under number B/W 44334 on June 15, 1967, at which time bail of \$3,000 was set and that on September 15, 1967, another warrant was issued for his arrest, which warrant is outstanding.

King County Deputy Prosecutor ROBERT DIXON advised SA DEAN C. ROLSTON on June 12, 1968, that he would extradite GEORGE ROBERT LETSINGER on the above charge. King County Prosecutor's Office will forward warrant if necessary to San Diego and desires report if warrant executed. AUSA CLARK BROWN telephonically advised of above facts.

A check of the records of the Washington State Parole Board reflected that a case had been pending against GEORGE ROBERT LETSINGER based on a bench warrant issued September 1, 1967; however, the file was closed inasmuch as LETSINGER's whereabouts is unknown.

The name GEORGE ANDERSON has been checked against the Seattle Indices, Seattle Credit Bureau, Seattle Police Department and King County Sheriff's Office; however, it is impossible to identify any particular GEORGE ANDERSON in view of the many such names listed and the fact that there is no identifying data concerning him.

WALDRUD and claimed to be an escapee from Wastington State Frison, Walla Walla, Washington. he advised that he is aware that JAMES EARL MAY is under arrest and there has been some publicity about a "fat" man who supposedly met MAY on several occasions. The caller advised that he is the "fat" man referred to in the papers and stated that he is en route to Washington State by car to turn himself in to authorities. The advised that se escaped to February, 1967.

.Caller further advised that, following his escape, he went to Dallas, Texas, where he met an individual by the name of GRME BASS, owner of a meat packing company to Dallas. Caller claimed that BASS gave him \$1600 to do the job that was done by JAMES BARL RAY; he accepted the money, then contacted SAY on several occasions to give him money which he had obtained from MASS. He delivered money to MAY at Mobile, Montgomery, Birmingham, Alabama, and Windsor, Ontario, Canada.

Caller advised that BASS is not the sole supplier of money for assassination, but there are namerous people involved, primarily at Montgomery, Alabama. He claimed that

he can furnish names of individuals involved, but preferred not to give them over the phone. He stated that he feels certain that RAY will talk and he wants to avoid having to run from authorities. He stated that he will be available for interview, upon his return to Washington State. He indicated that he preferred to serve Federal time in prison, was invited to come to the office and stated that he would arrive shortly.

Caller has not appeared at Chicago Office as of 9:00 a.m., 6/11/68, During the call, he indicated that he was in the Chicago area and apparently was calling from a pay phone since the operator cut in advising that his initial time had been used up. He then stated that the \$1600 paid to him by BASS was in postal money orders. He would furnish no further information other than set forth above, but again stated that he would come to the Chicago Office this date.

Excellent Efforts in Suspect's Arrest

The apprehension of the chief suspect in the mysterious murder of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr., should give our people a temporary sense of relief.

More than that, however, the arrest in London of an ex-convict identified as James Earl Ray should bolster the reputation of the U.S. Federal Bureau of Investigation.

The unsolved King case is quite unlike that of the assassination of Sen. Robert F. Kennedy whose New York tuneral and Arlington burial yesterday have preceded this day of national mourning.

The personal friendship and the common goals of these notables have linked the two in a unique dual tragedy having momentous impact upon the entire nation.

With the suspected assassin of Sen. Kennedy quickly jailed and indicted there still had been lingering doubts that the killer of Dr. King in Memphis last April would ever

be found.

Much yet needs to be done to provide a trial in the proper jurisdiction for the King murder suspect. He is entitled to the presumption of innocence until gullt can be determined, and the maintenance of that presumption is going to be difficult for law-

enforcement authorities.

Likewise, the American reputation for justice under the law must be carefully guarded in the handling of the trial of the young Jordan-born suspect, Sirhan B, Sirhan, about whom the evidence in the Los Angeles killing last week is more clear to the American public.

What is most remarkable about the arrest of the King-case suspect is the painstaking work of the FBI; the splendid cooperation of the Royal Canadian Mounted Police and the man's actual apprehension by England's Scotland Yard.

The men in these investigative and law-enforcement agencies of three nations have performed in excellent fashion. Their devotion to daty is worth high praise. They have provided the American public with a new sense of security and a renewed faith and belief that justice can triumph.

This is a most important aspect in the aftermath of two national tragedies amid all the other conflicts and frustrations that now beset our society.

RCMP Check Leads to Ray Arrest

OTTAWA (AP) —A "colossal investigation" by the Royal Canadian Mounted Police led to the arrest in London Saturday of James Earl Ray, wanted for the slaying of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr., an external affairs spokesman here said.

Ray was traveling under the name of Ramon George Sneyd and had two Canadian passports in that name, one issued in Ottawa and the other in the Canadian Embassy in Lisbon, Portu-

The RCMP came across a picture that looked like Ray after going through 200,000 to 400,000 passport applications in the files of the Canadian External Affairs Department. They quickly discovered that the application

was fraudulent.

Continuing their investigation, they got on the trail of Ray, traced his journeys in Canada and learned that he was heading for Britain and possibly elsewhere in Europe, an RCMP spokesman said. They tipped off the FBI and Scotland Yard.

A person applying for a Canadian passport must have someone, usually a professional man, sign a declaration that he has known him for two years, or else swear an affidavit before a notary public.

The external affairs spokesman said he is not at liberty to say whether Ray had a guarantor on his application or swore an affidavit.

He said Ray's application was submitted by mail "from a point in Canada" and issued from here April 25.

The RCMP search of passport files, begun shortly after the FBI started looking for Ray, "took many days," the external affairs spokesman said. Discovery of the fraudulent application was made "some days ago."

Embarrassed officials here did not know that Ray had picked up a second passport at the embassy in Lisbon May 16, again using the Sneye identity.




