

TWO ROBBERS ARRESTED SOON AFTER HOLDUP

Both Former Convicts

— Police Recover
\$120 They Obtained
From Kroger Store.

Two men who held up a Kroger store at 3417 Ohio avenue today were arrested about 20 minutes later in the 2000 block of Park avenue. A total of \$120, taken in the robery, was recovered fro the men, police said.

The robbers were identified by police as James L. Owens, 40 years old, a barber, 4000 block of Olive street, and James Earl Ray, 30, a baker, 2000 block of Park avenue. Police said both men are former convicts.

Donald Schaefer, co-manager

Donald Schaefer, co-manager of the store, said Ray approached him in the office. Schaefer said Ray, armed with a revolver, ordered him to open the safe.

Schaefer said he explained to the robber that two persons are required to open the safe and for that reason he could not comply.

As Wayne Chapman, head grocery clerk, approached the office, the robber went to a cash register and ordered Mrs. Hazel Meyer, a cashier, to hand over the contents of the register.

Drive Away in Stolen Car.

Owens stood behind Ray while he took the money from Mrs. Meyer, Schaefer said. The two men ran from the store and drove away in a stolen automobile, police said.

A customer pursued the robbers and saw them switch to another automobile at Potomac and Ohio avenue. A description of the car was broadcast by police.

Patrolmen Ralph King and Edward McGrath saw an automobile fitting the description in the 2000 block of Park. They placed it under surveillance.

A few minutes later, Owens entered the car and started it. The patrolmen blocked his path, and Detectives Harry Conners and Emmett Rimmer arrived.

While the patrolmen guarded Owens, the detectives went to the second floor of a nearby apartment building. They said they saw Ray coming from a bathroom in a hallway.

4 HELD IN \$21,000 WAREHOUSE THEFT

Four men were arrested in the theft of merchandise valued at \$21,000 over a period of three years from the Sears, Roebuck & Co. warehouse, 1024 South Vandeventer avenue.

Caesar Sorrentino, superintendent of the warehouse, was booked suspected of stealing more than \$50. He admitted selling the goods for \$7000.

CUTBACK IN ROAD FUNDS DEFENDED BY EISENHOWER

WASHINGTON, Oct. 10 (AP)
—President Eisenhower yesterday defended the Administration's cutback in funds for the
interstate highway program as
"the only prudent and equitable
course to follow."

The Government has limited federal spending on roadbuilding to \$1,800,000,000 in the fiscal year which began July 1 and set strict limits on the amount each state may spend in any one quarter. Earlier it had been planned to spend 2½ billion dollars on the highway program in the year.

The Administration's action had been anticipated by Senator Albert Gore (Dem.), Tennessee, in a letter to the President last month, in which Gore said such a slowdown in payments was a "deliberate default in payment of philipations to the states"





Ex-Convict Gets 20 Years After Escape Attempt Fails

Three hours after he attempted to escape from the Municipal Courts Building, James Earl Ray, 30-year-old former convict, was convicted Thursday of armed robbery under the habitual criminal act and his punishment fixed at 20 years in

The jury returned the verdict after only 20 minutes deliberation and Circuit Judge John C. Casey immediately announced he would sentence Ray to 20 years imprisonment. Any defendant in a criminal case has 10 days in which to file a motion for a new trial.

Ray was being taken to the courtroom by Deputy Sheriff Earl Riley when he made a break as the deputy removed the handcuffs. The former convict pushed Riley aside and leaped into a self-service elevator on the third floor.
