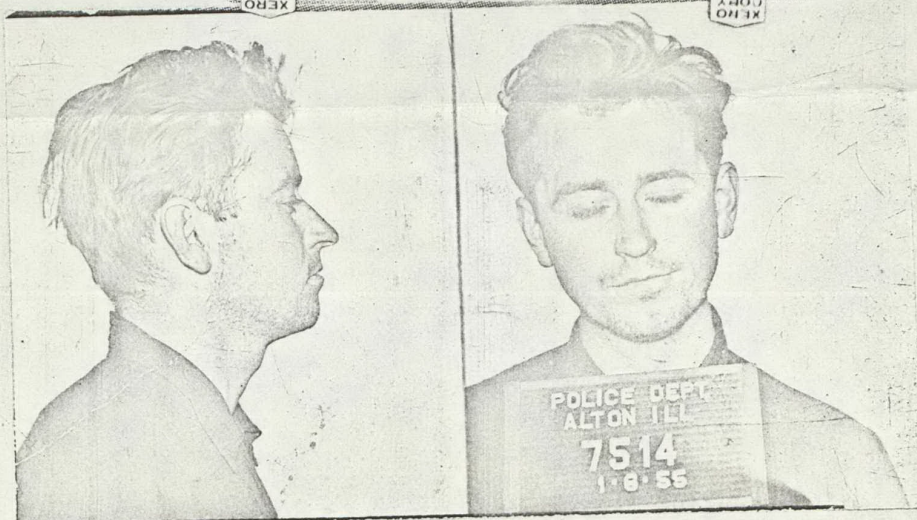

URT TWO ROBBERS AREA ARRESTED SOON ENTS AFTER HOLDUP

lower Both Former Convicts
Crash — Police Recover
Pedes- \$120 They Obtained
From Kroger Store.

Two men who held up a Kroger store at 3417 Ohio avenue today were arrested about 20 minutes later in the 2000 block of Park avenue. A total of \$120, taken in the robbery, was recovered from the men, police said.

The robbers were identified by police as James L. Owens, 40 years old, a barber, 4000 block of Olive street, and James Earl Ray, 30, a baker, 2000 block of Park avenue. Police said both men are former convicts.

Donald Schaefer, co-manager of the store, said Ray approached him in the office. Schaefer said Ray, armed with a revolver, ordered him to open the safe.

Schaefer said he explained to the robber that two persons are required to open the safe and for that reason he could not comply.

As Wayne Chapman, head grocery clerk, approached the office, the robber went to a cash register and ordered Mrs. Hazel Meyer, a cashier, to hand over the contents of the register.

Drive Away in Stolen Car.

Owens stood behind Ray while he took the money from Mrs. Meyer, Schaefer said. The two men ran from the store and drove away in a stolen automobile, police said.

A customer pursued the robbers and saw them switch to another automobile at Potomac street and Ohio avenue. A description of the car was broadcast by police.

Patrolmen Ralph King and Edward McGrath saw an automobile fitting the description in the 2000 block of Park. They placed it under surveillance.

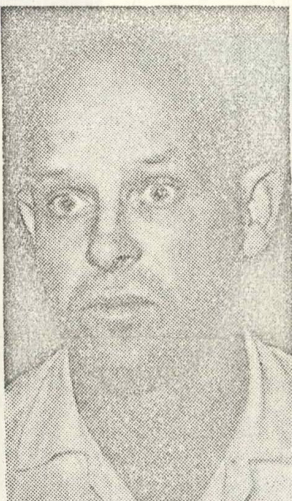
A few minutes later, Owens entered the car and started it. The patrolmen blocked his path, and Detectives Harry Connors and Emmett Rimmer arrived.

While the patrolmen guarded Owens, the detectives went to the second floor of a nearby apartment building. They said they saw Ray coming from a bathroom in a hallway.

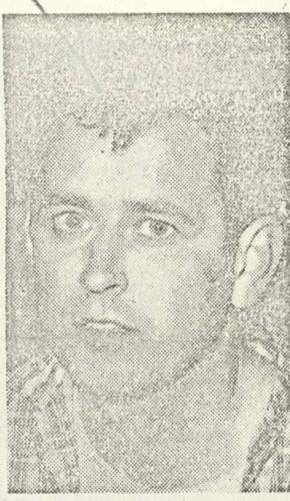

4 HELD IN \$21,000 WAREHOUSE THEFT

Four men were arrested in the theft of merchandise valued at \$21,000 over a period of three years from the Sears, Roebuck & Co. warehouse, 1024 South Vandeventer avenue.

Caesar Sorrentino, superintendent of the warehouse, was booked suspected of stealing more than \$50. He admitted selling the goods for \$7000.

Booked suspected of buying and receiving stolen goods were: Isadore L. Finocchiaro, a tavern owner, of the 6400 block of Colletta drive; Burford C. Shy, a carpenter, of the 6500 block of Southwest avenue; and Francis X. Jansen of Pevely, a heating and plumbing contractor.

Sorrentino, of the 2800 block of Sulphur avenue, said that in the three-year period he had been stealing merchandise from the warehouse and selling it for about one-third of its actual value, police reported. He told police he had been working for the company for about 10 years.

Police recovered a truckload of merchandise at Jansen's home and in a barn in Jefferson county. Jansen told police he stored heating and plumbing equipment and appliances, which he bought from Sorrentino, until they were installed at various buildings.

Shy said he has a country place near DeSoto, and he bought some items for use there, police said. Finocchiaro told police he purchased only a few things for himself.

Sorrentino said he received about \$3000 from Jansen for the merchandise, about 75 per cent of which already has been installed in several new houses in Jefferson county.

DR. FRANK FINNEGAN, INTERNIST, IS DEAD

Member of Old Soper-Mills Clinic — Former Head of De Paul Staff.

Dr. Frank R. Finnegan, St. Louis internist, died of cancer today at DePaul Hospital. He was 65 years old and lived at 560 Bedford avenue, University City.

A native of Beloit, Kan., he took his medical degree at St. Louis University and interned at St. Luke's Hospital. Dr. Finnegan was a member of a group of specialists which organized the old Soper-Mills Clinic in 1928. He headed the staff of DePaul Hospital from 1941 through 1944.

He was a diplomate of the board of the American College of Physicians and Surgeons, a member of the Catholic Physicians' Guild and a charter member of the local chapter of Serra International, Catholic laymen's organization.

He is survived by his wife; one son, Frank R. Finnegan Jr.; three daughters, Mrs. Clinton A. Bliss, Mrs. F. Wallace Maull and Mrs. Thomas J. Ryan; a brother, Dr. F. J. Finnegan, who is a dentist in Logan, Kan.; two sisters, Miss Anna Finnegan, Beloit, and Mrs. John Gretner, Junction City, Kan., and 17 grandchildren.

SPECIAL SCHOOL BOARD VOTE FOR BROOKLYN, ILL.

A special election to select three members of the Brooklyn Board of Education was ordered by Circuit Judge Harold O. Farmer at Belleville yesterday. Date of the election will be set by Clarence T. Blair, superintendent of schools for St. Clair county.

Judge Farmer said the former school board secretary, Robert Boatner, failed to enter the names of three certified candidates on the ballot in the election last April 11. He said only the incumbent's names were listed. They are Lester Hill, Isaiah Anderson and Raymond Winston.

The petition contesting the election was filed by Ulysses Jackson, Meyer Wilson and Jesse Woolfork. Judge Farmer ruled that the three incumbents still are seated as members of the board until their successors are qualified. The names of all six candidates shall appear on the ballot in the special election, he said.

CUTBACK IN ROAD FUNDS DEFENDED BY EISENHOWER

WASHINGTON, Oct. 10 (AP)—President Eisenhower yesterday defended the Administration's cutback in funds for the interstate highway program as "the only prudent and equitable course to follow."

The Government has limited federal spending on roadbuilding to \$1,800,000,000 in the fiscal year which began July 1 and set strict limits on the amount each state may spend in any one quarter. Earlier it had been planned to spend 2½ billion dollars on the highway program in the year.

The Administration's action had been anticipated by Senator Albert Gore (Dem.), Tennessee, in a letter to the President last month, in which Gore said such a slowdown in payments was a "deliberate default in payment of obligations to the states."

COURTS BUILDING BREAK FOILED

Ex-Convict Gets 20 Years After Escape Attempt Fails

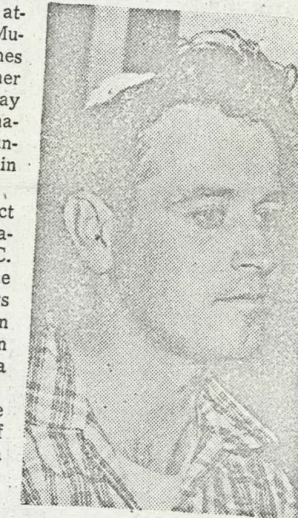
Three hours after he attempted to escape from the Municipal Courts Building, James Earl Ray, 30-year-old former convict, was convicted Thursday of armed robbery under the habitual criminal act and his punishment fixed at 20 years in prison.

The jury returned the verdict after only 20 minutes deliberation and Circuit Judge John C. Casey immediately announced he would sentence Ray to 20 years imprisonment. Any defendant in a criminal case has 10 days in which to file a motion for a new trial.

Ray was being taken to the courtroom by Deputy Sheriff Earl Riley when he made a break as the deputy removed the handcuffs. The former convict pushed Riley aside and leaped into a self-service elevator on the third floor.

OFFICER HALTS

However, the deputy was able to pull the outside door of the

elevator open before Ray could get the elevator operating. Ray jumped out of the elevator and started running down the hall but was halted by Patrolman Ed-

ward G. Bright, who is assigned to the circuit attorney's office.

He was taken to the courtroom for the concluding part of his trial. Ray was convicted of being one of two bandits who held up a Kroger store at 3417 Ohio ave. on Oct. 10 and escaped with \$191 taken from the cash register.

CARS SWITCHED

He and James L. Owens, 40, also a former convict, were arrested 20 minutes after the robbery after a customer followed their getaway car, saw them switch to another machine and obtained the license number. The charge against Owens is still pending.

Five witnesses identified Ray at the trial. He took the stand and denied any part in the robbery, asserting he was in his room all that day. He was released from an Illinois prison in 1954 after serving two years for robbery. He also has served two other prison terms, police said.

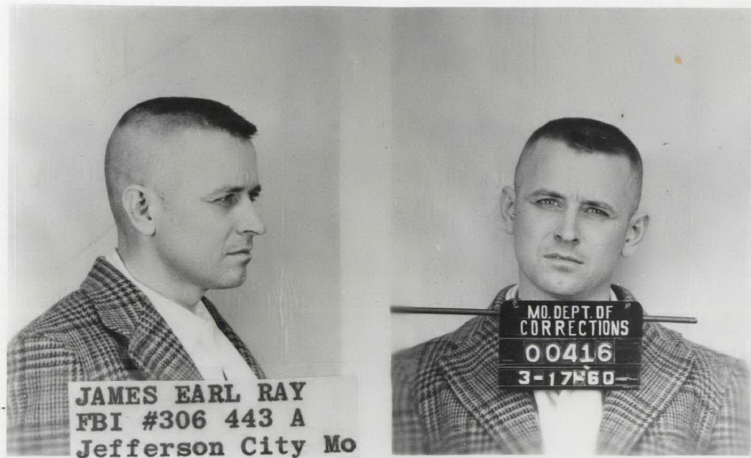

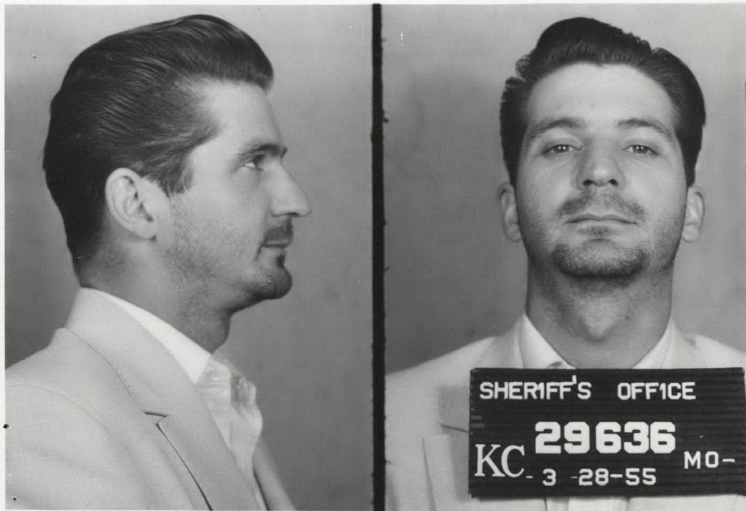
