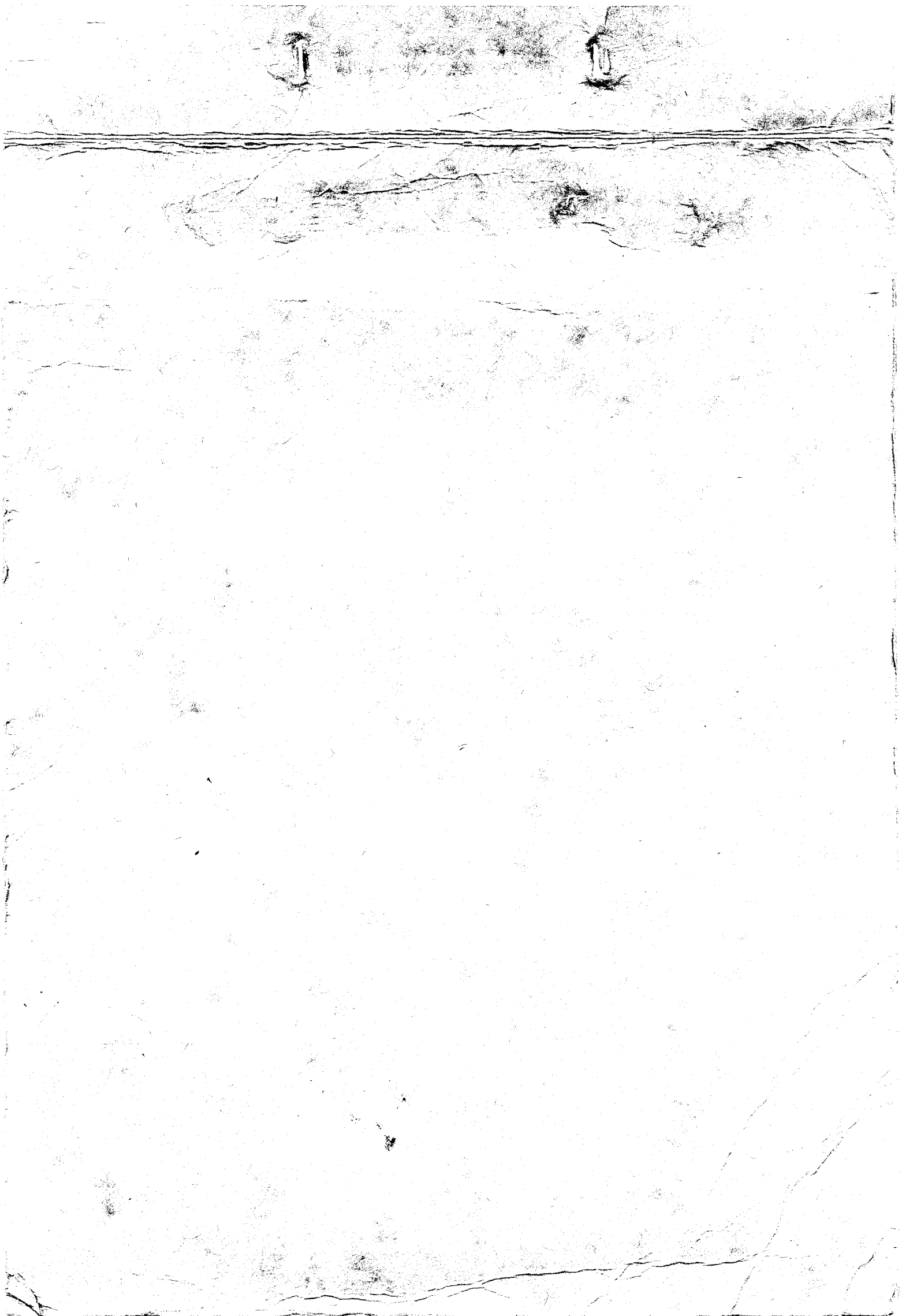

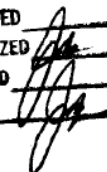

At 11:30 a.m., 4/26/68, I received a call from SA RAYMOND HOWE of the Kansas City Office who is working on captioned matter. He stated that Kansas City has directed a teletype to St. Louis containing the information previously requested regarding the contacts the subject had prior to his escape from prison.

In addition, he stated that investigation in Kansas City has developed information indicating that RAY's escape was probably on 4/23/67. He stated that RAY probably effected his escape by hiding himself in a bread basket or bread container which is used to deliver the bread from the prison bake shop to the prison farm. According to HOWE, investigation has determined that the driver of the delivery truck stated that the only unusual thing that he could recall was that on 4/22 and 4/23/67, the container of bread for delivery to the prison farm was on the loading dock, whereas he normally had to go to the bake shop to bring the container to the truck. The truck driver likewise stated that either on the 23rd or the day thereafter the prison farm cook, or the person in charge of the prison mess, complained to the truck driver that the bread on the 23rd arrived in a "smashed" condition.

Based on the above, Kansas City theorizes that subject RAY probably effected his escape on the 23rd. Kansas City notes the coincidence of the subject's brother, JOHN RAY, having visited the subject on the 22nd. Kansas City likewise speculates the possibility that JOHN RAY might possibly have been informed by the subject of his plans for escape and might have followed the delivery truck on the 23rd and picked up the subject somewhere en route.

The above information was immediately relayed to SA's JUNG and BIDEWELL, who are going to interview JOHN RAY today. It was pointed out to BIDEWELL and JUNG that they should make every effort to establish where JOHN RAY was on the day of the 23rd of April, 1967.

On 4/12/68, LEE OSBORNE, Room 322, Orpheum Hotel, 821 Chestnut, SLMO, was interviewed by SAs Dearborn and Donald DeFonce at Union Station, 1820 Market St., SLMO. OSBORNE advised he suspected a resident of the Orpheum Hotel as the individual who killed DR. MARTIN LUTHER KING. OSBORNE said he based this on the individual's "suspicious" actions and his resemblance to the composite drawing of the killer as it appeared in the newspapers.

He did not know the person's name but described him as a white male, age 40-45, 6'2" - 6'4" tall; 180-200 pounds, ruddy complexion, speaking with "eastern" accent.

OSBORNE said the individual had been staying at the hotel for about a week and had been "drunk most of the time". He said the individual stayed on the 4th floor.

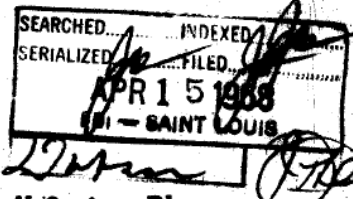
OSBORNE also stated he knew LEE HARVEY OSWALD as LEE HARVEY when he (OSBORNE) worked as a desk clerk at the Texas Hotel, Dallas, Texas, in 1956.

OSBORNE is a white male, age 81. He admittedly has poor eyesight and stated he is almost blind in one eye.

ELMER LOBERK, Desk Clerk, Orpheum Hotel, was interviewed on 4/12/68. He advised there was no one registered at the hotel that fit the description of the UNSUB in the KING assassination or artist's conception as shown in the newspapers. He said the youngest man in the hotel was 45 years old, 6'2", 200 pounds. His name is MARK TALLENT, 4050 Oak St., Evansville, Ind. He said TALLENT has been a regular customer for a number of years. He said TALLENT usually checks in for about a week and "goes on a drunk", then checks out.

He said TALLENT does not resemble the composite sketch of the UNSUB in the KING case.

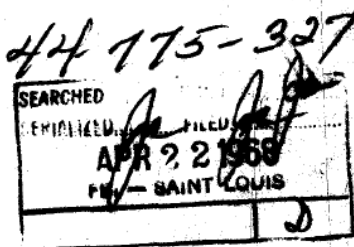

On 4-20-68, Mrs. HENRY LANDMANN, aka "DOLLIE", 9929 Reavis Rd., Affton 23, Mo., telephone #ME 1-0570, was contacted at her place of residence whereupon she advised that shortly after 12:15 a.m. this date she was in the process of adding her tickets for sales at the Marlborough Lanes, 7777 Watson Rd., where she is employed as a waitress and in doing so she engaged in conversation with a man who was seated across the counter.

She stated that the man was carrying a small portable radio and appeared to be having trouble with it. She said that the radio was approximately 6" to 8" x 4" x 2" of gray plastic or metal casing with a small extended antenna. She advised that the man, who she described as having a slight build, not taller than 5'10", fair complexion, brown hair, blue eyes, slim pointed nose, well-mannered, no accent to a medium-pitched and direct voice, and approximately 40 years old, was wearing a plaid shirt with very fine lines with a gray background.

LANDMANN stated that the man asked her if this was #4 Tower in the area of the Marlborough Lanes to which she replied that she was pretty sure and that maybe he was getting interference from the tower. The man then commented, "You know when I lived in Los Angeles, California, we had interference with a colored TV set." He said that he had fixed the interference by putting something in the attic. He also stated that there were five broadcasting studios in California on Mt. Wilson and that there was always interference on the radio.

LANDMANN further advised that the man drank two cups of coffee and took one cup of coffee to go.
