Synopsis:

JAMES BARL RAY. Inmate. Missouri State Penitentiary. (MSP), Jefferson City, Hissouri, missed at the Penitentiary on April 23, 1967. Subject known at MSP as a "hide out guy" due to his habit of concealing himself within the walls. Investigation indicated RAY concealed himself in bread box and escaped from truck making delivery to an auxiliary farm. He was dropped as an escaped prisoner on 7/10/67. RAY was serving 20 years on charges of Armed Robbery (1st) and for operating vehicle without owner's consent. Authorized complaint filed before U.S. Commissioner, Jefferson City, Missouri on 7/20/67, charging RAY with violation Title 18, Section 1073, U. S. Code, Warrant issued. Subject's criminal record dates back to 1949. He has been confined in Illinois institutions as well as serving time in Federal Penitentiary. His mother and brothers reside in St. Louis, Missouri. RAY confined at State Hospital, Fulton, Missouri in 1966. BECAUSE ray has been convicted of ecebery with a deadly weapon <del>and</del> BECAUSE OF HIS CONFINEMENT IN A STATE HOSPITAL. HE SHOULD BE CONSTDERED ARRED AND DANGEROUS.

DETAILS:

This case is predicated on a letter, dated June 19, 1967, from Assistant United States Attorney WILLIAM A. KITCHEN, Kansas City, Missouri, enclosing a letter, dated June 8, 1967 from H. F. LAUF, Identification and Records, Missouri State Penitentiary, Mr. LAUF's letter set forth the following information:

"The indicated subject was missing, from inside the walls of the main Penitentiary on April 23, 1967 and since that date information has been discovered giving us reasons to believe that he has escaped. We also have reasons to believe Ray has fled the state, to avoid prosecution, as all efforts to locate him have failed.

"This inmate is described as a white male, age 39, DOB height 5'll", dark brown hair, blue eyes, weight 163, medium complexion and medium build. He was received here March 17, 1960, from the St. Louis City Circuit Court, to serve 20 years for Robbery First Degree by means of a Dangerous & Deadly Weapon (2 chgs.); Operating a Motor Vehicle without permission of the Owner (20, 7, 5 Concurrent).

"We should appreciate it if your office would cause a Federal warrant to be issued against this individual. If he is apprehended, outside of the state of Missouri, the Department of Corrections will extradite him and pay the expenses thereof."

On June 19, 1967, Mr. WILLIAM A. KITCHEN requested an Unlawful Flight to Avoid Confinement complaint be filed against JAMES EARL RAY.

On June 23, 1967, Mr. H. F. LAUF, mentioned above, advised SA THOMAS H. WEAVER that subject is known as a "hide out guy" who stays hidden within the confines of the Missouri State Penitentiary for several days and has done so in the past. He said there is considerable speculation as to whether HAY had actually been able to leave the prison. He said investigation, to date, has failed to develop any information as to RAY's whereabouts.

The following investigation was conducted by IC WILLIAM C. MC DONALD:

AT JEFFERSON CITY, MISSOURI:

On July 11, 1967, Missouri State Penitentiary, MSP, file number 00416, was reviewed. The following information was obtained:

JAMES EARL RAY, MSP #W-00416, was received at the MSP, March 17, 1960, from St. Louis City, to serve a term of twenty (20) years for the crime of Robbery First, by means of a Dangerous and Deadly Weapon and operating a Motor Vehicle without permission of the owner. He was assigned to the Bakery Unit of the Food Service Department, RAY was dropped from the MSP count on July 10, 1967, "As it is assumed that he escaped",

RAY was discovered absent prior to the 5:00 PM count on April 23, 1967, after a thorough search, at which time RAY could not be found.

Relatives listed in this file are:

LUCILLE MYON, 1913 Hickory St., St. Louis, Missouri;

JOHN RAY, same address as mother; JERRY RAY, " "

RAY is described in this file as a white male, born at Alton, Illinois; height 5'll"; weight 163 pounds; hair dark brown; eyes blue; complexion medium; occupation baker; previously incarcerated Leavenworth Federal Penitentiary; build medium; U.S. Army General Discharge, 5N 16163129.

On July 10, 1967, Mr. BERARD C. POIRRY, Custodial Assistant Warden, Missouri State Penitentiary, advised that he had conducted an investigation into the escape of RAY. He said he had determined that an associate of RAY's who worked with RAY in the bakery, had let RAY get into one of the large boxes consigned to the church farm, near Jefferson City, Missouri, and then had covered him up. He said one of the bread boxes had been received at the church farm in an exploded condition, and bread scattered over the truck. He said, therefore, it has been assumed by the prison officials that RAY actually escaped from the Penitentiary and is not inside the walls as previously thought possible. He said RAY was being dropped as an escaped inmate, as of July 10, 1967.

On July 19, 1967, Warden HAROLD SWENSON, Missouri State Penitentiary, said he has contacted several inmates of the Penitentiary who knew RAY, and they indicated to him that RAY had indicated he wanted to escape from the Penitentiary and leave the State of Missouri.

On July 20, 1967, a complaint, as authorized, was filed before United States Commissioner W. C. SHELKY at Jefferson City, Missouri, charging RAY with Unlawful Flight To Avoid Confinement in connection with the commission of a crime of Robbery First, in violation of Title 18, Section 1073, United States Code. Bond returnable was set by the United States Attorney at \$5,000.00 to the United States Commissioner at Jefferson City, Missouri.

Mr. SHELEY issued a warrant on the above complaint on July 20, 1967, which has been transmitted to the Office of the United States Marshal at Kansas City, Missouri.

On August 18, 1967, Mr. H. F. LAUF, Records Officer, Missouri State Penitentiary, advised no further information has been developed regarding the whereabouts of subject.

On July 14, 1955, Mr. WILLIAM L. RUDDELL, Post Office Inspector, Kansas City, Missouri, advised the Kansas City Division that JAMES EARL RAY and WALTER PERRY RIFE were arrested in Hannibal, Missouri, on March 22, 1955, and

were charged with forgery of U. S. Postal Money Orders. He advised that their investigation reflected that the burglary in which the money orders were stolen, was perpetrated at Kellerville, Illinois, at approximately 1:30 AM on March 7, 1955, and that sixty-six blank Post Office money orders and a validating stamp were stolen. He advised that some of these money orders were cashed at St. Louis; Miami, Florida; Tallahassee, Florida; St. Petersburg, Florida; New Orleans, Louisiana; Memphis, Tennessee; Hot Springs, Arkansas, and Kansas City, Missouri, and that thirty-four orders were recovered.

He stated that subjects had advised him that RAY owned a 1946 or 1947 Nash automobile, license number unknown; that it had been traded for a 1949 Lincoln at the Amacker Motors, 135 NB 36th Street, Miami, Florida, on May 14, 1955; and had been titled to WALTER P. BERRY, an alias of RIFE. He said that RIFE and RAY claimed to have obtained the money orders from an unknown man in Quincy, Illinois.

The following investigation was conducted by SA CLETIS B. BIDEWELL at St. Louis, Missouri:

A check of the records of the St. Louis Police Department on September 5, 1967, reflected the details surrounding the arrest of subject, RAY, in connection with the armed robbery of the Kroger Store, 3417 Ohio Street in St. Louis, on October 10, 1959, and also reflected that on April 23, 1967, a teletype was received from the warden at Missouri State Penitentiary at Jefferson City, Missouri, in connection with the recent escape of subject, RAY, from that institution. Detectives FRANCIS AUER and CHARLES BILLINGS, assigned to the 3rd District, St. Louis Police Department, conducted investigation on the same date, in an effort to locate subject. A check by these officers at 1918 Park Avenue, 2015 Park Avenue, and 1913 Hickory Street, previous addresses listed for subject, his mother and other relatives developed no information whatever of subject or other members of his family.

On October 3, 1967, HELEN CREAMER, residing at 1915
Hickory Street, advised she had resided at that address for the
last coule of years and had never seen subject or any of his
relatives. Investigation in the neighborhood of 1913 Hickory
Street, revealed this to be a blighted area and the majority of
the residences have been evacuated preparatory to being demolished.
Members of families still residing in the area were interviewed
and all denied ever having known a RAY family residing in the
area since they have resided there.

At the time of the contact with officers AUER and BILLINGS at the 3rd District, Detective ROBERT FREIHAUT and several other members of the 3rd District Detective Bureau, who are personally acquainted with subject, RAY, were advised of his fugitive status and all promised to be alert for any available information concerning the whereabouts of subject or members of his family.

A review on September 13, 1967, by IC EARL M. RANEY of the military service records on file at the Military Personnel Records Center, St. Louis, Missouri, for JAMES EARL RAY, Serial Number 16 163 129, indicated he enlisted in the United States Army on February 19, 1946, at East St. Louis, Illinois,

and served on active duty until December 23, 1948, at which time he was given a General Discharge as a Private First Class at Camp Kilmer, New Jersey, by reason of inaptness and lack of adaptability for military service.

Records indicated he was tried and convicted by a Special Court-Martial for being drunk in quarters and breaking arrest. He was sentenced to be confined at hard labor for three months and forfeit \$45.00 per month for four months.

The following investigation was conducted by TC WILLIAM C. MC DOWALD:

At Fulton, Missouri:

On August 31, 1967, ROBERT ROSSON, Registrar, State Hospital Ho. 1, advised that JAMES EARL RAY was received on September 8, 1966, and discharged on October 21, 1966. Mr. ROSSON stated that RAY had been sent for examination due to his attempted escape from the Missouri State Penitantiary; however, it was determined that RAY was actually hiding out inside the walls and no escape charge was filed.

Mr. ROSSON stated that after examining RAY is was determined that he had no mental disease or defect and recommended his return to the Missouri State Penitentiary, Jefferson City, Missouri.

Mr. ROSSOW advised that according to his records there is no information to reflect that RAY is dangerous.

Mr. ROSSON stated that the only relative listed in this file is JERRY RAY, Brother, Box 27, Wheeling, Illinois.

The following investigation was conducted by Special Agent ROBERT F. PEVAHOUSE:

On November 29, 1967, Chief MARVIN HORCHER, Wheeling, Illinois, Police Department, advised a check of his records failed to reveal any record for subject or JERRY RAY.

On December 12, 1967, Mrs. RUTH MEYER, Palatine, Illinois, Credit Bureau, which maintains listings in Wheeling, Illinois, advised a check of their records failed to reveal any information concerning subject or JERRY RAY.

On December 18, 1967, Chief HORCHER, Wheeling, Illinois, Police Department, advised he had been unable to locate any additional information concerning a JERRY RAY, however, he will continue to make inquiries to determine if he can locate JERRY RAY.

By communication dated January 4, 1968, the Spring-field Office advised as follows:

# At Quincy, Illinois

On Hovember 8, 1967, Detective Emphant RAMAND MISSON, Quincy, Illinois, Pelico Department, advised that JAMES RAMA, RAY, 1438 Cherry Street, Quincy, Illinois, was arrested on March 34, 1955, for forgary. Dargoent MANDON seid that this was the only time RAY had been arrested in Quincy but that the files of the Quincy, Illinois, Pelico Department, indicated RAY had been arrested on other occasions and his FBI marker was 306-443-5 and that he had Illinois State Bureau number 463857.

Surgent Minor stated that the files of the Quincy, Illinois, Police Department ware magnitive on James Man, MAY since August 24, 1955.

Sargeant MANNON said that the files of the Quincy, Illinois, Police Department Indicated a LUCILLE REAL, no address, was expected on August SS, 1997, for largeant MANNON said that the files indicated LUCILLE REAL was been on April 27, 1900, at Alben, Illinois, and that this was the quly time she had been arrested at Quincy, Illinois.

On November 8, 1967, Deputy CHCEL THORNELL, Adams County Sheriff's Office, salvised that the files of the Adams County Sheriff's Office were segative concerning JAMES SAIL BAY and LHCELLE RYAN.

the Devember S, 1967, Rims M.S.M.M. Motel, Manager, Quincy Credit Deress, advised that the filter of the Quincy Chedit Deress indicated that LUCILLE REAF had resided at Quincy, Illinois, prior to 1967. Miss BOTH said that her files swetch very little information consuming LUCILLE BYAH, and the light information she had on LUCILLE BYAH. On Movember 8, 1967, Riss M.IMARKER ROTH, Quincy Credit Bureau, advised that the files of the Quincy Credit Bureau indicated JAMES MARL RAY resided at 1803 Cherry Street, Quincy, Illinois, in 1948 and that her files contained mething on JAMES RANL RAY since 1948.

On Morember 20, 1987, Mrs. MARION A. REED, 3142 Spring Street, Quincy, Illinois, advised that she has resided at present address for serveral years and that the names JAMES MAIL RAY AND LUCILLE RYAN meant nothing to her.

On November 20, 1067, CHANGE A. REIDVERDER, 215 Onk Street, Quincy, Illinois, advised that he has been at present address for povered years and the names of JAMES MAN, MAY and LUCILLE SYAN meant nothing to him.

By communication dated February 8, 1968, the Chicago Office advised as follows:

The following investigation was conducted by Special Agent ROBERT F. PEVAHOUSE:

On January 23, 1968, Chief MARVIN HORCHER, Wheeling, Illinois, Police Department, advised he had determined a JERRY RAY had resided at 2897 Techny Road, Northbrook, Illinois, but he does not know if JERRY RAY still resides at that address or if he is the brother of the subject.

On January 23, 1968, inquiry at 2897 Techny Road, Northbrook, Illinois, revealed the present residents have lived there since October, 1967, although there was a JERRY RAY residing there prior to that time. They had no information as to the present location of JERRY RAY.

On February 7, 1966, JERRY RAY was located and interviewed at the Sportman's Country Club, 3535 Dundee Road, Northbrook, Illinois, where he is employed and resides. advised he is the brother of subject but has seen subject. only three times in the last 15 years, that being the three times he visited subject at the Missouri State Penitentiary, Jefferson City, Missouri. He advised subject left home about the time he was 14 or 15 years of age and has not maintained regular contact with any of the family since that time. Subject has always been a drafter and he has no knowledge of friends or associates of subject with whom he might be in contact. Their father, GEORGE RAY, and their mother, LUCILLE RAY, separated and LUCILLE was subsequently known as LUCILLE RYAN. Both GEORGE RAY and LUCILLE RYAN are now deceased. He has no sunt by the name of LUCILLE RYAN and anyone by that name would have had to been their mother. He has another brother, JOHN RAY, who is single and a drifter, travelling and changing jobs frequently. He has no regular address but as of three days ago, was staying at the Mc Arthur Hotel on Broadway Street, St. Louis, Missouri. He had a younger brother, FRANK, who was killed in an automobile accident four yeurs ago. He also has a sister, Mrs. ALBERT (CAROL) PEPPER, who just moved from 712 Shenandoah, St. Louis, Missouri, to Bellview, a suburb of St. Louis, but he does not have the

address or phone number for CARGL. He is sure the phone company will have a new number for CARGL as that would be the way he would try to contact her. These are the only relatives subject has.

JERRY RAY advised he has been in contact with CAROL and JOHN as of three days ago, and both stated they have had no contact with subject or any knowledge where subject can be located. He does not believe subject will centact any of the relatives as long as he is in a fugitive status; however, should he receive any information concerning subject, he will immediately advise the FBI.

The following investigation was conducted by SA ROWEN B. AYERS:

AT JEFFERSON CITY, MISSOURI.

On Pebruary 1, 1968, Warden RAROLD SWINSON, Missouri. State Penitentiary, advised he has, received no further information which might aid in locating JAMES FARL RAY. He said he had disposed of all of his notes regerding the original investigation of this escape. He said, for this reason, he could not fermish the names of any person or persons, who had furnished him with details regarding either the escape of RAY, or his possible whereabouts. He said the investigation had been handled by Captain DENTON STEELE and Major PERNARD POIRY.

On February 1, 1968, Captain STERLE said the only information he could recall about the escape of RAY was that his glark, WILLIAM SOCKLE, told him it was a waste of time to look for RAY in the walls because he had escaped. He said he heard this same thing "on the prison grapevime" from others, but he did not know the source of this information and believed SOCKLE might know. He said SOCKLE is working at the University of Missouri Medical Center.

On Pebruary 1, 1968. Major BERNARD POTRY stated that a GEORGE OWENS covered RAY up in a box in a bread truck so RAY could get out of the walls. He said there was another inmate involved, but he could not recall his name.

On February 14, 1965, Major POTRY, further advised be could not recall the name of the other inmate refered to by him, He said the investigation, as far as he was concerned, left no doubt that RAY got into a bread bee for Church Farm and was sovered by another immate and gained access to an "out truck". After he cleared Jefferson City, RAY apparently got out of the truck and departed. Major POTRY said he has not developed any information as to the whereabouts of RAY.

### AT COLUMBIA, MISSOURI:

On February 15, 1968, WILLIAM SOCKLE, Sunset Trailer Court, formerly on immate of the Missouri State Penitentiary, said he worked with RAY in the kitchen for a time. He said he also knew him well later because he took his meals in the kitchen, as a clerk, and RAY was there most of the time at meals. He said RAY talked all the time about escaping and "getting out of the area". He did not have any associates and did not divulge his plans to othere. SCCKLE dould not recall that RAY ever said where he would go if he escaped. SOCKLE said all he knew about the background of BAY was that he "fell" from St. Louis. He said BAY is guite intellectual and would be hard to find. He said he tried to escape on previous occasions, but was not determed. He did not recall telling Captain STEELE that RAY had left the walls, but said this was possible as all the innates who knew RAY, knew that he had left, in spite of the fact that he had previously "bidden out" within the walls.

SUCKLE said be could not suggest the name of any innate or wothers who might formish information regarding the whoreabouts of subject.

## AT KANSAS CITY, MISSOURI:

On January 18, 1968, Miss FRANCES M. ZIMMERMAN, U. S. Parole and Probation Office, 419 U. S. Post Office and Court House, made available a presentence report regarding subject JAMES EARL RAY, which had been prepared by that office on April 26, 1955. This report reveals that the subject on April 1, 1955, had entered a plea of guilty to an Information charging him with forging United States Post Office Money Orders. His companion in forging a large number of these money orders in numerous states was WALTER TERRY RIFE, who also entered a plea of guilty to a similar charge after which both he and the subject were sentenced on July 1, 1955, in Kansas City, Missouri, to the Federal Penitentiary at Leavenwerth, Eansas. Both were apparently released from that institution on April 5, 1958.

A further review of the files of the U. S. Parole Office indicates that after the subject's release from the U. S. Penitentiary at Leavenworth, Eansas, he reportedly returned to the Eansas City, Missouri, area briefly to reside at the Blackstone Botel and to contact the Missouri State Employment Service regarding employment possibilities. Accordingly, the following individuals were contacted on the indicated dates in a negative affort to develop information regarding the current lecation of the subject:

The following investigation was conducted by SA CLETIS B. BIDEWELL at St. Louis, No.:

On 2/22/68, H. A. HARORR, Desk Clerk, McArthur Hotel, Chestnut and Broadway, advised after checking his records they contained no information indicating a JOHN RAY had been a resident of that hotel. He viewed subject's photographs and stated he did not recall seeing an individual resembling subject in the hotel. He spoke with other desk and service personnel at the hotel and they advised they recalled no JOHN RAY having resided at or frequented the hotel.

On 3/5/68, Mrs. ERWEST N. COOK, 712 Shenandoah, advised that she recalled the ALBERT S. PEPPER family as having resided supstairs at that address. She stated, however, they had recently moved to a new address, 2025 Bellview, Maplewood, Mo.

On 3/19/68, Mrs. CAROL RYAN PEPPER, 2025 Bellview (telephone 645-2948) was interviewed. She was most uncooperative and denied that her maiden name had been RAY, stating, however, that it had been MRSSAME RYAN. She advised that her father and mother, GEORGE and LUCILLE RAY, were deceased and that she had a brother, JERRY RAY residing somewhere in Illinois. She also advised that she had another brother, JOHN RAY, whereabouts unknown, whom she had not seen in several years.

Upon viewing a photograph of subject, she denied being related to this individual and stated she had never seen him. When questioned concerning her husband's employment, she advised he worked for some hardware store and stated she was unable to furnish the name or address of this business place.

In view of Mrs. PEPPER's uncooperative attitude the interview was terminated.

On 3/20/68, Mr. and Mrs. ERNEST M. COOK, 712 Shenandoah, were interviewed. They advised after viewing subject's photograph they had never observed an individual resubling him visiting the PEPPERS who had resided upstairs over their apartment for a period of several months up until two or three months ago. They advised that an individual reportedly a brother of Mrs. PEPPER had visited the PEPPERS on various occasions and that he and his family supposedly resided in the St. Louis area. They stated this individual did not resemble subject in their estimation.

They further advised that an individual referred to as "DADDY" by Mrs. PEPPER visited the PEPPERS on numerous occasions and this person reportedly recently bought a home and moved to Poplar Bluff, Mo., or somewhere in the Poplar Bluff area.

When questioned concerning other relatives or close associates of the PERPER family, they advised that JAY and ROSEMARY SHIRLEY and their three children, SHERILL, JAY and ANNETTE, had been frequent visitors at the PEPPER home. They were of the opinion that Mrs. SHIRLEY was the sister of ALBERT PEPPER. This family had resided at the 712 A Shenandoah advess prior to the time the PEPPER family moved in. The COOKS were of the opinion that the SHIRLEY family had recently bought a home somewhere in the St. Louis area. They can furnish no other information concerning the identity or the location of the SHIRLEY family.
