TITUTIONAL PS: This inmate is apparently wanted by the Indiana Reformatory authorities as a parole violator. He states that he still over them about 2 years and 10 months, and expects to be returned there to finish up the time after his release here. Due to this situation, he has made no definite plans for the future.

EIDANCY:

This inmate is single, and his nearest dependant would be his mother who is apparently receiving ADC assistance for the support of herself and the inmate's half siblings. He has had rather limited contacts with her in late years, and we seriously doubt that he would be of much financial assistance after his release.



The "Eric S. Galt" signatures on Q128, Q130, Q131, Q132 and Q135 were prepared by the writer of the signatures in this name appearing on items previously submitted in this case.

The typewritten impressions appearing on Q127, Q128, Q130, Q131, Q132 and Q135 were found to be the same style of type but the lack of identifying defects precluded a determination as to whether the same typewriter prepared all of these items; however, no significant differences were noted between the impressions appearing on these items. The style of type appearing on these specimens conforms to a standard for Royal pica style of type spaced ten letters to the inch. This style of type also appears on a typewriter sold under the Singer name.
