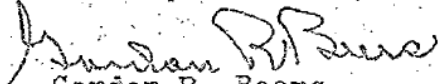

We refer to the Classification Report of 10-1-53 for an account of inmate's offense, previous record, social background, and an earlier appraisal of his personality makeup. Inmate has been assigned to the kitchen during his entire time here, and current reports indicate that he is considered an excellent worker whose adjustment there has been good. He has had three disciplinary reports, two of which were minor while the other was for fighting. There are no health problems. Inmate says he corresponds with his mother and a sister at Quincy, but does not receive visits. One brother who was formerly an inmate at Pontiac is now serving a term in the Missouri prison, while another brother, also formerly at Pontiac, is in Chicago. Inmate is subject to a Indiana detainer as a parole violator there, and he has no developed extramural plans.

This young man comes from a family in which there has been considerable criminality. His personal major difficulties with the law began in 1949. Temperamentally he is a poorly motivated individual who has no apparent constructive goals. His attitudes impresses as being rather strongly inclined toward continuing criminality, and there has evidently been no constructive change in his thinking during his time here. He seems to have a somewhat resistive feeling toward authority and control, and assumes a rather nonchalant attitude toward his difficulties. While his outlook may change somewhat as he becomes older, his present attitudes impress us as a very poor basis for successful social adjustment. Extremely doubtful prognosis.

This 22 year old white man came to us on 6-2-53 from Adams County under a 5-10 year sentence for larceny of a motor vehicle. The official report indicates that on 4-5-53, inmate and an associate stole a car in Quincy, Illinois, and that on 4-7-53, inmate was discovered sleeping in said automobile in Riverview Park, located in Quincy. The front seat of the automobile was on fire, and he had to be aroused to permit the police officers to extinguish the fire. Inmate claims that he was alone when he stole the automobile, and that he needed it to perform "one or two" burglaries. He successfully completed the burglary, but these charges were not pressed when he entered a plea of guilty to the present charge. He also maintains that he was about 200 feet from the automobile when he was apprehended, but believes the State's Attorney claimed he was inside to make it easier to prosecute him. In January of 1950, inmate was indicted on two counts of burglary in Adams County but was never apprehended. This is because on 3-23-50, inmate was also convicted of second degree burglary in Vincennes County, Indiana. He was sentenced to 2-5 years at the Indiana State Reformatory under the name of John L. Hagan, and was released on parole on 3-21-52. He absconded from his placement in Alton, Illinois on 4-30-52 and was declared delinquent on 5-2-52. Inmate is now wanted by the Indiana authorities. While awaiting trial on the present charge, inmate attempted to escape from the Adams County Jail by cutting the bars with smuggled hatch-saw blades. He had made his way to a surrounding pasture before being apprehended.

SOCIAL FACTORS:

Inmate was born on 2-14-31 in St. Louis, Missouri, the second of six siblings in a home which remained organized until the separation of his parents about two or three years ago. A younger brother Jerry has been incarcerated in the reformatory at Sheridan for robbery. The family moved to Palmyra, Illinois when inmate was about six or seven, and he completed the fourth grade there. The family then moved to Daleberry, Alton, Adams and Quincy, Illinois, but inmate does not remember the amount of time spent in each town, nor what education he received in each one. He claims that he received an eighth grade diploma while in Adams, however, and attended one year of high school while incarcerated in Indiana. His last residence was Chicago, where he was making his home at the time of the offense. Inmate went to work as a grounds keeper for the Springfield Golf Course at the age of 16, but was discharged after three weeks for a reason he claims to have forgotten. He then worked at the Kings Laundry in Quincy for four months before quitting. He held odd jobs around Quincy until the time of his arrest in Indiana, at the age of 19. But this employment was of an extremely intermittent nature. He was working as a helper for the Chicago and Northwestern Railroad at the time of his arrest. Inmate is single and has no girl friend. His recreation consisted mainly frequenting taverns and dances, and admits that he drank heavily getting intoxicated a couple of times a week. He has made no definite plans for the future, though he feels that he would like to join the Merchant Marine.

PERSONALITY:

Inmate is of average size and his health is good at this time. Kahn reaction under date of 6-9-53 is reported as negative. Psychometric tests indicate low average intelligence (AA 69). During the interview he was quite friendly but did not remember too many details about his past residences and education, since he moved so often. Inmate is an inadequate personality who seems to have little or no ambition, positive plans or desire to obtain steady employment. His sporadic work record and choices of recreation facilities give the impression that he has had little or no guidance in his more formative years. He apparently did not benefit from his previous incarceration and unless he obtains steady employment at a job where he can become more stationary, he will not be able to make the healthy, permanent associations that he needs to avoid improper guidance and control. At present he is working in the kitchen, but does not desire to remain there.

CLASSIFICATION:

Group III. Without psychosis or mental defect. Adult very questionably improvable offender.

Average intelligence (AA 69). Inadequate personality reactions. Doubtful prognosis.

RECOMMENDATIONS:

Reveal general divisions. In light of his attempted escape at the Adams County Jail, he should have maximum security for the present. Routine work assignments depending on his abilities as you see them.

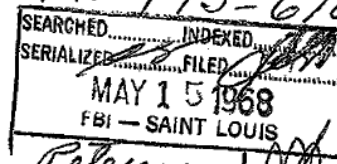

GALT enrolled in a correspondence course, July, 1967, with initial correspondence coming from Montreal, Canada. The records indicate changes of address to Los Angeles, Birmingham and Atlanta. The most recent address is in Atlanta as of March, 1968. Investigation at local banks located photograph of payments by GALT to the Locksmithing Institute. These payments were in the form of two (2) Bank of America Money Orders, two (2) US Postal Money Orders and one (1) Canadian Postal Money Order. The FBI Laboratory has concluded that the hand printing and signatures on the material furnished by Locksmithing Institute was prepared by the individual responsible for preparing other specimens in this case attributed to ERIC S. GALT. Laboratory reports set forth. ARMED AND DANGEROUS.

Mr. DURYEA made available an enrollment form dated stamped July 31, 1967, with the heading Locksmithing Institute-Little Falls, New Jersey 07424. The enrollment form was a pre-printed blank containing the following information:

"Please enroll me for the complete course in professional locksmithing (subject to your liberal money back agreement). I agree to follow your plan of teaching and to submit at least one lesson and/or payment each month. I will pay tuition or payment each month. I will pay the tuition fee according to the payment plan below:

"Plan A

"I enclose \$10 enrollment fee. I will pay \$7.50 with each completed lesson (not less than \$7.50 per month) until I have paid \$220.50. I may proceed as rapidly as I wish.

"Plan B - Double Quick Plan

"I enclose \$25 enrollment fee. I will pay \$15 with each completed lesson (not less than \$15 per month) until I have paid \$219.50. I may proceed as rapidly as I wish. I save \$10.

"Plan C

"I enclose \$199.50 in full payment. I may proceed as rapidly as I wish and save \$30.
