LYNDA D. COBBLE was contacted at her residence 202 Crosswinds Apartments, Arnold, Missouri. Also present during the course of the interview was Arnold, Missouri Police Sergeant MICHAEL COLLIER.

COBBLE was advised of the identity of interviewing Agent by display of credentials. COBBLE was previously aware of identity of Sergeant COLLIER.

COBBLE stated that she had been the recipient of numerous threatening telephone calls subsequent to the death of Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING. She furnished the following information concerning those calls.

COBBLE received the first call at the residences of her mother in Cahokia, Illinois, telephone number 337-7267, shortly after the arrest of JAMES EARL RAY for the murder of Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING. She advised that this call was made by a male caller, no further description, who stated "If you keep your mouth shut you won't get hurt". She stated that shortly later while she and her mother were at the K-Mart Store in Belleville, Illinois, she was approached by a white male approximately 6'6" tall with a scar on the side of his face approximate age 35 or 36, and a tattoo on his right bicep. She stated that the individual stated that she had a very pretty baby and that she had better keep her mouth shut. COBBLE stated that she received four or five additional calls while she was staying at her mother's house in Cahokia, Illinois, during the period of time shortly after the arrest of JAMES EARL RAY. She advised that all of the calls contained threats advising her not to make any statement.

COBBLE stated that shortly after marrying her second husband, JAMES L. BIRCHETT, and while they resided at 40 Agnes Drive, Cahokia, Illinois, she received four or five additional calls advising her not to say anything about JAMES EARL RAY. She advised that these calls started approximately three to four months after she and BIRCHETT were married. Their wedding date was August 26, 1972. BIRCHETT and COBBLE were subsequently divorced.

COBBLE married JERRY COBBLE, her present husband, and moved to 621 5th Avenue, Conway, Arkansas, approximately one year ago. Approximately six months ago, she received several telephone calls of the same nature and shortly later received several more calls. She advised that some of the calls mentioned JAMES EARL RAY by name and during the calls she was told to keep her mouth shut and she or her kids would not get hurt.

LYNDA COBBLE and her husband, JERRY COBBLE, moved from Conway, Arkansas to their present address in Arnold, Missouri, approximately two weeks ago. She has received four or five calls, and in each case the caller sounds to COBBLE to be the same individual. During one specific call she was told to keep her mouth shut if she wanted to see daylight the next day. She recalls that the first call that she received at her new residence in Arnold, Missouri, occurred approximately 9:30 PM on an unrecalled date and then the next call occurred approximately 3:00 AM the next She claims to have also received several subsequent morning. calls at approximately 7:00 AM on various mornings. COBBLE states that the last call was received the morning that MIKE COLLIER of the police department, Arnold, Missouri, came out and interviewed her in response to her telephone call to the Arnold Police Department. She stated with regards to all of the aforementioned calls she is positive that none of the calls were collect calls and that there was never an operator on the line.

Upon questioning, COBBLE furnished the following information concerning the history of her association with JAMES EARL RAY:

COBBLE married JAMES ALLEN BENNEY, white male, date of birth , on March 11, 1968. When they first got married, they were living at Maplewood, Missouri, at an unrecalled address. At approximately the fourth or fifth month of their marriage, her husband JAMES BENNEY brought JAMES EARL RAY home with him on one occasion and introduced RAY to COBBLE. COBBLE was pregnant at that time with her daughter, ________, and RAY appeared to be very crazy about kids. On fact on numerous occasions,

RAY brought baby things during his visits to their residence for the expected arrival of the baby. COBBLE cannot recall any specific incidents involving criminal activity between her husband and RAY that occurred while they resided at Maplewood. Approximately two months after COBBLE met RAY, she and JAMES BENNEY moved to a new residence located at Florissant. Missouri. This was approximately four months before | was born. The baby's birth COBBLE and her husband resided date was at an apartment complex located behind the Ramada Inn or possibly a Holiday Inn near a Target Store and a Central Hardware Store in Florissant, Missouri. They lived at that apartment for approximately one year. During that year, JAMES EARL RAY visited their residence frequently.

COBBLE stated that she and her husband were still residing at the residence in Florissant, Missouri on when her daughter was born at Missouri Baptist Hospital. In fact, JAMES EARL RAY visited the baby, JANE BENNEY, at the Missouri Baptist Hospital at the approximate time of her birth and advised hospital officials that he was the baby's father. COBBLE stated that this all occurred prior to the death of Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING.

Approximately three months after birth, LYNDA COBBLE moved out with the baby and they moved in with her mother at Cahokia, Illinois. She was living in Cahokia, Illinois when Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING was killed.

At the same time that COBBLE moved out of the apartment in Florissant and in with her mother, JAMES BENNEY moved out of the apartment also and relocated at a house in Memphis, Tennessee. The money for the down payment for the house was given to JAMES BENNEY by JAMES EARL RAY. Sometime before Dr. KING's death, BENNEY contacted COBBLE and asked her to come down with the baby to visit. She went down to Memphis and visited BENNEY for two or three days.

During the period of time that COBBLE was visiting with BENNEY at the aforementioned house in Memphis, Tennessee approximately five different men came and visited BENNEY at the house. She described the individuals as all being large white males wearing business suits and carrying attache cases and ranging in age from 25 to 30. JAMES EARL RAY and his

brother, JERRY RAY, were also at the house in Memphis during her visit on numerous occasions. COBBLE recalls specifically overhearing a paticular meeting between the aforementioned individuals at the house in Memphis, Tennessee. She recalls they were discussing a bank robbery to occur in Florissant, Missouri. JERRY RAY appeared to be the leader of the group and all of the individuals referred to a floor diagram of the bank to be robbed. The bank was to be robbed by JERRY RAY, JIM BENNEY, and two other individuals who were not at the meeting and who she never had occasion to meet. COBBLE believes that the business men had floor plans for several different banks and that the intent of the people in the group was to rob several different banks.

Upon questioning, COBBLE advised that she could not recall any mention during these meetings concerning the death of MARTIN LUTHER KING or any mention of MARTIN LUTHER KING or any mention of anybody named RAOUL.

COBBLE recalls that there were several conversations that occurred behind closed doors but she assumed they made reference to bank robberies.

COBBLE stated that the night before Dr. KING was killed, she and JAMES EARL RAY were watching television and RAY was playing with her baby, _____, on the floor in front of the television set when mention was made over the television concerning Dr. KING's visit in Memphis. COBBLE recalls that RAY made a statement to the effect "that black sonofabitch all he does is raise hell somebody ought to waste him". COBBLE advised that it was obvious from her numerous conversations with RAY that he absolutely hated black people and he made that hatred very clear. recalls that on several occasions prior to that evening that she heard JAMES EARL RAY make statements to the effect that he would like to waste him. (Referring to Dr. KING). COBBLE stated that she got into an argument twith JAMES EARL RAY that evening concerning the fact that she wanted to go back to Cahokia with the baby. RAY became enraged because he wanted COBBLE to stay there with the baby for a while.

COBBLE stated that same evening which was the evening before Dr. KING's murder, she left Memphis and went back to her mother's residence in Cahokia, Illinois and never saw JAMES EARL RAY in person again.

COBBLE stated that two or three weeks after she returned from Memphis, the bank robbery occurred at Florissant, Missouri, and it was her understanding as related to her by JIM BENNEY that the money was obtained to raise lawyer fees for JAMES EARL RAY.

On the night of the aforementioned bank robbery, JAMES BENNEY came to visit COBBLE at her mother's residence in Cahokia, Illinois. COBBLE went out to the car in which BENNEY was riding and observed approximately four bags of money with currency scattered in the back seat. COBBLE described that car as fairly new at that time, green over green Charger. She recalls that BENNEY had several sets of registration certificates and several different sets of license plates for that car. She advised that BENNEY told her that he was supposed to meet the others involved in the bank robbery at Memphis, Tennessee to split up the money, however, he wanted her to heave with him and move out to Portland, Oregon and just keep all the money for themselves. COBBLE refused to go with BENNEY.

COBBLE recalls that JERRY RAY was apprehended on the very day of the bank robbery several hours after the bank robbery. She advised she observed JERRY RAY on television at the time of his arrest and that she has seen him on numerous occasions on television subsequent to that date. She stated that the individual that she has seen has identified as JERRY RAY on television is the same JERRY RAY that she saw at the aforementioned residence in Memphis, Tennessee.

COBBLE stated that after she refused to go to Portland, Oregon with JIM BENNEY, he went out there on his own and started working in a bar. She advised that he was shot and killed in a bar on November 28, 1971. She stated that at the time of his death he had only been out to Oregon several months.

COBBLE further advised that on the day of her husband's death, she went to the office of the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) located in St. Louis, Missouri and conferred with an Agent known to her as PETE concerning her husband's death.

Upon questioning COBBLE advised that she and her husband, JAMES BENNEY, previously owned the Grape Vine Bar located on Arsenal Street in St. Louis. She stated that they had purchased the bar from JERRY RAY.

COBBLE originally stated that the bar was sold to them by JERRY RAY after the death of Dr. KING and she was 17 years old at that particular time. She stated that they operated the bar for approximately six to eight months before they sold it. When confronted with the conflict in time concerning the death of MARTIN LUTHER KING COBBLE stated that actually she and JAMES BENNEY purchased the bar before Dr. KING was killed, but while they were separated and not living together. She stated that JAMES BENNEY subsequently sold the bar after Dr. KING's death at the request of JERRY RAY in order to raise money for JAMES EARL RAY's lawyers.

COBBLE was confronted with the fact that Dr. KING had been killed on April 4, 1968 and that it would be impossible for JAMES EARL RAY to have seen the baby prior to that date inasmuch as the baby was not born until, and COBBLE stated that there must be a mistake in dates. She further stated that she is absolutely sure that JAMES EARL RAY was very fond of her daughter, who was born in December, 1968, and that on the night before Dr. KING was killed, RAY was playing with the baby in front of the television set at the residence in Memphis, Tennessee.

COBBLE stated that she believes that JAMES BENNEY and JERRY RAY had been involved in several bank robberies and service station holdups; however she was not cognizant of the details.

Caller at times during the message was incoherent, but did leave a phone number and possibly an address. Mr. Mitchell thought that the FBI should be notified. Mr. Mitchell further stated that since he has another job during the day he would be hard to contact. Upon trying to make arrangements to pick up the tape, Mr. Mitchell suggested that his wife Jonita Mitchell drop the tape off at 8:15 8/16/78. Referenced memo reflects a contact from Mr. FELTON MITCHELL concerning a telephone message which was received on MITCHELL's answering service. The text of the conversation reflected on the tape, furnished by Mrs. JONITA MITCHELL, is set forth in FARHAT's memo.

This tape was heard on two occasions and the caller, who slurred his words, appears to be drunk. The telephone number which the caller furnished, 555-6481, is a nonexistent telephone number. There is no exchange in the St. Louis area with the prefix "555". The caller did not furnish any street address. The caller identified himself as EBIDAY BUDDAY ADOBENEDICT. The files of the Missouri Department of Revenue reflect no driver's license in this name. Records of the telephone, city, and county directories also failed to show a listing for this name.

The tape which bears the conversation from the caller is being returned to Mr. FELTON MITCHELL.

LYNDA D. COBBLE (white female, DOB) Arnold, Missouri, advised she has been the recipient of numerous anonymous threatening telephone calls since the death of victim KING. COBBLE states caller warns her not to talk on threat of physical harm. First call received shortly after KING's death and have continued until present time. COBBLE states she married JAMES ALLEN BENNEY in 3/68. Four or five months following marriage, BENNEY brought JAMES EARL RAY to their residence in Maplewood, Missouri, when COBBLE was pregnant. COBBLE's daughter was born at St. Louis, and RAY visited COBBLE during maternity confinement and advised hospital officials that he, RAY, was the child's father. According to COBBLE, the birth of her daughter and RAY's hospital visits occurred prior to the death of victim KING. In early 1969 COBBLE moved to her mother's residence, and her husband, JAMES ALLEN BENNEY, relocated in Memphis, Tennessee, after purchasing a house. The downpayment on BENNEY's residence in Memphis was paid by RAY. COBBLE advised the night before victim KING was killed she was at BENNEY's residence in Memphis, Tennessee. COBBLE and JAMES EARL RAY were watching television when reference was made on the television concerning KING. RAY made a statement referring to KING, "Somebody ought to waste him." COBBLE never saw RAY after that evening. COBBLE advised her former husband, JAMES BENNEY, was shot and killed in Portland, Oregon, on 11/28/71.

This investigation was predicated upon LYNDA BENNEY, residing 202 Crosswind Drive, Arnold, Missouri, advising the St. Louis Office on August 17, 1978, that she had received several threatening anonymous telephone calls in which the caller states that she would be "wasted" if she contacted any official regarding JERRY RAY or his brother, JAMES EARL RAY. She did not know the origin of the telephone calls as to whether they were local or long distance. She stated that her former husband, JAMES ALLEN BENNEY, who is now deceased, once robbed a bank with JERRY RAY in which part of the loot was never recovered.

FEDERAL BUREAU OF INVESTIGATION

LYNDA D. COBBLE was contacted at her residence 202 Crosswinds Apartments, Arnold, Missouri. Also present during the course of the interview was Arnold, Missouri Police Sergeant MICHAEL COLLIER.

COBBLE was advised of the identity of interviewing Agent by display of credentials. COBBLE was previously aware of identity of Sergeant COLLIER.

COBBLE stated that she had been the recipient of numerous threatening telephone calls subsequent to the death of Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING. She furnished the following information concerning those calls.

COBBLE received the first call at the residences of her mother in Cahokia, Illinois, telephone number 337-7267, shortly after the arrest of JAMES EARL RAY for the murder of Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING. She advised that this call was made by a male caller, no further description, who stated "If you keep your mouth shut you won't get hurt". She stated that shortly later while she and her mother were at the K-Mart Store in Belleville, Illinois, she was approached by a white male approximately 6'6" tall with a scar on the side of his face approximate age 35 or 36, and a tattoo on his right bicep. She stated that the individual stated that she had a very pretty baby and that she had better keep her mouth shut. COBBLE stated that she received four or five additional calls while she was staying at her mother's house in Cahokia, Illinois, during the period of time shortly after the arrest of JAMES EARL RAY. She advised that all of the calls contained threats advising her not to make any statement.

cobble stated that shortly after marrying her second husband, JAMES L. BIRCHETT, and while they resided at 40 Agnes Drive, Cahokia, Illinois, she received four or five additional calls advising her not to say anything about JAMES EARL RAY. She advised that these calls started approximately three to four months after she and BIRCHETT were married. Their wedding date was August 26, 1972. BIRCHETT and COBBLE were subsequently divorced.

cobble married JERRY COBBLE, her present husband, and moved to 621 5th Avenue, Conway, Arkansas, approximately one year ago. Approximately six months ago, she received several telephone calls of the same nature and shortly later received several more calls. She advised that some of the calls mentioned JAMES EARL RAY by name and during the calls she was told to keep her mouth shut and she or her kids would not get hurt.

LYNDA COBBLE and her husband, JERRY COBBLE, moved from Conway, Arkansas to their present address in Arnold, Missouri, approximately two weeks ago. She has received four or five calls, and in each case the caller sounds to COBBLE to be the same individual. During one specific call she was told to keep her mouth shut if she wanted to see daylight the next day. She recalls that the first call that she received at her new residence in Arnold, Missouri, occurred approximately 9:30 PM on an unrecalled date and then the next call occurred approximately 3:00 AM the next morning. She claims to have also received several subsequent calls at approximately 7:00 AM on various mornings. COBBLE states that the last call was received the morning that MIKE COLLIER of the police department, Arnold, Missouri, came out and interviewed her in response to her telephone call to the Arnold Police Department. She stated with regards to all of the aforementioned calls she is positive that none of the calls were collect calls and that there was never an operator on the line.

Upon questioning, COBBLE furnished the following information concerning the history of her association with JAMES EARL RAY:

COBBLE married JAMES ALLEN BENNEY, white male, date of birth ______, on March 11, 1968. When they first got married, they were living at Maplewood, Missouri, at an unrecalled address. At approximately the fourth or fifth month of their marriage, her husband JAMES BENNEY brought JAMES EARL RAY home with him on one occasion and introduced RAY to COBBLE. COBBLE was pregnant at that time with her daughter, _______, and RAY appeared to be very crazy about kids. In fact on numerous occasions,

RAY brought baby things during his visits to their residence for the expected arrival of the baby. COBBLE cannot recall any specific incidents involving criminal activity between her husband and RAY that occurred while they resided at Maplewood. Approximately two months after COBBLE met RAY, she and JAMES BENNEY moved to a new residence located at Florissant, Missouri. This was approximately four months was born. The baby's birth before date was COBBLE and her husband resided at an apartment complex located behind the Ramada Inn or possibly a Holiday Inn near a Target Store and a Central Hardware Store in Florissant, Missouri. They lived at that apartment for approximately one year. During that year, JAMES EARL RAY visited their residence frequently.

cobble stated that she and her husband were still residing at the residence in Florissant, Missouri on when her daughter was born at Missouri Baptist Hospital. In fact, JAMES EARL RAY visited the baby, at the Missouri Baptist Hospital at the approximate time of her birth and advised hospital officials that he was the baby's father. COBBLE stated that this all occurred prior to the death of Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING.

Approximately three months after
birth, LYNDA COBBLE moved out with the baby and they moved
in with her mother at Cahokia, Illinois. She was living
in Cahokia. Illinois when Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING was killed.

At the same time that COBBLE moved out of the apartment in Florissant and in with her mother, JAMES BENNEY moved out of the apartment also and relocated at a house in Memphis, Tennessee. The money for the down payment for the house was given to JAMES BENNEY by JAMES EARL RAY. Sometime before Dr. KING's death, BENNEY contacted COBBLE and asked her to come down with the baby to visit. She went down to Memphis and visited BENNEY for two or three days.

During the period of time that COBBLE was visiting with BENNEY at the aforementioned house in Memphis, Tennessee approximately five different men came and visited BENNEY at the house. She described the individuals as all being large white males wearing business suits and carrying attache cases and ranging in age from 25 to 30. JAMES EARL RAY and his

brother, JERRY RAY, were also at the house in Memphis during her visit on numerous occasions. COBBLE recalls specifically overhearing a paticular meeting between the aforementioned individuals at the house in Memphis, Tennessee. She recalls they were discussing a bank robbery to occur in Florissant, Missouri. JERRY RAY appeared to be the leader of the group and all of the individuals referred to a floor diagram of the bank to be robbed. The bank was to be robbed by JERRY RAY, JIM BENNEY, and two other individuals who were rot at the meeting and who she never had occasion to meet. COBBLE believes that the business men had floor plans for several different banks and that the intent of the people in the group was to rob several different banks.

Upon questioning, COBBLE advised that she could not recall any mention during these meetings concerning the death of MARTIN LUTHER KING or any mention of MARTIN LUTHER KING or any mention of anybody named RAOUL.

COBBLE recalls that there were several conversations that occurred behind closed doors but she assumed they made reference to bank robberies.

COBBLE stated that the night before Dr. KING was killed, she and JAMES EARL RAY were watching television and RAY was playing with her baby, on the floor in front of the television set when mention was made over the Television concerning Dr. KING's visit in Memphis. COBBLE recalls that RAY made a statement to the effect "that black sonofabitch all he does is raise hell somebody ought to waste him". COBBLE advised that it was obvious from her numerous conversations with RAY that he absolutely hated black people and he made that hatred very clear. She recalls that on several occasions prior to that evening that she heard JAMES EARL RAY make statements to the effect that he would like to waste him. (Referring to Dr. KING). COBBLE stated that she got into an argumentitwith JAMES EARL RAY that evening concerning the fact that she wanted to go back to Cahokia with the baby. RAY became enraged because he wanted COBBLE to stay there with the baby for a while.

COBBLE stated that same evening which was the evening before Dr. KING's murder, she left Memphis and went back to her mother's residence in Cahokia, Illinois and never saw JAMES EARL RAY in person again.

COBBLE stated that two or three weeks after she returned from Memphis, the bank robbery occurred at Florissant, Missouri, and it was her understanding as related to her by JIM BENNEY that the money was obtained to raise lawyer fees for JAMES EARL RAY.

On the night of the aforementioned bank robbery, JAMES BENNEY came to visit COBBLE at her mother's residence in Cahokia, Illinois. COBBLE went out to the car in which BENNEY was riding and observed approximately four bags of money with currency scattered in the back seat. COBBLE described that car as fairly new at that time, green over green Charger. She recalls that BENNEY had several sets of registration certificates and several different sets of license plates for that car. She advised that BENNEY told her that he was supposed to meet the others involved in the bank robbery at Memphis, Tennessee to split up the money, however, he wanted her to heave with him and move out to Portland, Oregon and just keep all the money for themselves. COBBLE refused to go with BENNEY.

COBBLE recalls that JERRY RAY was apprehended on the very day of the bank robbery several hours after the bank robbery. She advised she observed JERRY RAY on television at the time of his arrest and that she has seen him on numerous occasions on television subsequent to that date. She stated that the individual that she has seen has identified as JERRY RAY on television is the same JERRY RAY that she saw at the aforementioned residence in Memphis, Tennessee.

COBBLE stated that after she refused to go to Portland, Oregon with JIM BENNEY, he went out there on his own and started working in a bar. She advised that he was shot and killed in a bar on November 28, 1971. She stated that at the time of his death he had only been out to Oregon several months.

COBBLE further advised that on the day of her husband's death, she went to the office of the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) located in St. Louis, Missouri and conferred with an Agent known to her as PETE concerning her husband's death.

Upon questioning COBBLE advised that she and her husband, JAMES BENNEY, previously owned the Grape Vine Bar located on Arsenal Street in St. Louis. She stated that they had purchased the bar from JERRY RAY.

COBBLE originally stated that the bar was sold to them by JERRY RAY after the death of Dr. KING and she was 17 years old at that particular time. She stated that they operated the bar for approximately six to eight months before they sold it. When confronted with the conflict in time concerning the death of MARTIN LUTHER KING COBBLE stated that actually she and JAMES BENNEY purchased the bar before Dr. KING was killed, but while they were separated and not living together. She stated that JAMES BENNEY subsequently sold the bar after Dr. KING's death at the request of JERRY RAY in order to raise money for JAMES EARL RAY's lawyers.

COBBLE was confronted with the fact that Dr. KING had been killed on April 4, 1968 and that it would be impossible for JAMES EARL RAY to have seen the baby prior to that date inasmuch as the baby was not born until and COBBLE stated that there must be a mistake in dates. She further stated that she is absolutely sure that JAMES EARL RAY was very fond of her daughter, who was born in December, 1968, and that on the night before Dr. KING was killed, RAY was playing with the baby in front of the television set at the residence in Memphis, Tennessee.

COBBLE stated that she believes that JAMES BENNEY and JERRY RAY had been involved in several bank robberies and service station holdups; however she was not cognizant of the details.

The following investigation was conducted by Special Clerk WILLIAM J. EBERT:

On August 24, 1978, review of personnel records on file at the National Personnel Records Center, Civilian Personnel Records, disclosed that BURGESS AUDIE WILSON, JR., Social Security Number was employed on August 3, 1966, by the Department of the Air Force, 442nd Military Airlift Wing, Richards-Gebaur Air Force Base, Missouri, as a flight engineer (with dual status as Air Reserve technician). Records disclosed that WILSON resigned on March 10, 1968, to go into business for himself. Records failed to show that WILSON was employed by the U.S. Government on April 4, 1968.

The following background information was contained in the records:

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Inmate ROBERT E. HART, inmate number 23747, date of birth was interviewed at his request at the Bureau of Prisons Facility, the Federal Correctional Institution, El Reno, where he is confined. HART advised he is currently serving a two year sentence from St. Louis on a possession of firearms charge with anticipated release June, 1979. He stated he has information with reference to JAMES EARL RAY and that he has previously been approached by congressional committees and the Secret Service and that to date, he has refused to co-operate. He stated that he is soon due for release and it is his desire to now co-operate so that he will not be bothered following release from prison.

HART stated that JAMES EARL RAY, a former neighbor in a neighborhood in vicinity of Mississippi and Park Streets, St. Louis, Missouri, came to his, HART's, residence at 1921 Rutger (phonetic), shortly after midnight the day KING was assassinated, and that RAY remained at the residence until daybreak. HART stated that RAY asked that a note be delivered to his brother, JERRY RAY, who owned a bar on Broadway in St. Louis, and attempt was made to deliver that note, HART stated, but the bar was closed. The note stated that, "The black son-of-a-bitch won't be f----- any more white broads". Note was short and consisted of one handwritten page.

HART said that he has more information, but will not disclose that information until he has been given assurance of no prosecution by Missouri State authorities. He explained that at the time RAY came to his residence, he (HART) knew that RAY was an escapee from the Missouri State Penitentiary and that if he admitted that RAY visited his residence the night of the KING assassination, that he felt he could be prosecuted for harboring a state fugitive.
