Re Albany airtels 4/10/68 and 4/11/68, setting forth concerns who purchased Thermo-Seal marking machines, and Bureau teletype to Memphis, 4/12/68.

The FBI Laboratory advised that pillowcase and bed sheet were found in trunk of 1966 white Mustang registered to ERIC STARVO GALT, which was located at Atlanta 4/11/68. These items contain Thermo-Seal laundry tapes of approximately same size as tapes on items previously recovered, but are yellow in color and contain code, 120R-3." In opinion of Textile Marking Machine Company, Syracuse, New York, the tapes were produced by a different machine than previous tapes since the first three characters are 15 point type and the last two characters are 18 point type.

The Textile Marking Machine Company suggests the twenty in above code would be the lot number, the R may mean that this was a return of a batch of laundry, and the three is the bundle number.

Pursuant to telephonic information received by SA GEORGE NORTHUP on this date, he and SA/GALTER E. THOMAS interviewed the party calling, ANNA MAE HERRINGTON, phone 296-4177, the manager of the apartments at 1400 20th St., N.W., Washington, D.C., and she furnished the following in-On April 7, 1968, a white male came into her formation: apartment with many clothes, and a few pieces of luggage, and wanted to rent an apartment. She said that she did not take renters until she had ehecked out the references, but he said that he needed an apartment, and he left with her an expensive \$500 Omega watch as evidence of good faith, saying that he did not have any cash on hand. He made out an application, and the next day, came back with his clothing and 175 dollars for an apartment. She agreed to let him in on a temporary basis. He continued to live in Apartment 606, and on this date, said that he is going to move from the apartment to # 1 Washington, circle.

She said that, coming in as he did, she thought that he might have had some **connect**ion with the MARTIN LUTHER KING JR. Mirder.

She was shown wanted flyer # 442 on ERIC STARVO GALT, and she said that he did not resemble this person. She described him as being a white male, 5' 8" tall to 5' 10" tall, 175 pounds, blue eyes, fair colored hair, possibly described as light brown. He had balanced ears, and mild pit marks on his face. She said that he was working at the Eagles Nest Restaurant prior to this time that he came to her address for an apartment.

She furnished additional information reflecting background on this person. She said that his name was given by him as WAYNE KOFFS, that he was a bar-tender, and that she thought that he had come from California.

The totality of background is not set out in view of what was learned at the Eagles Nest Restaurant.

On 4/19/68, SAs NORTHUP and THOMAS interviewed the manager of the Eagles Nest Restaurent, CHRIS KRIKRIS, 2121 P St., N.W., Georgetowne Apartment House. He said that KOFFS, who said that he was retired from the Marine Corp arrived on April 1, 1968, saying that he was a bar-tender at the officer's club in Quantico, and that he wanted a job. He was hired as a bartender. He said the GALT photo did not resemble KOFF in any way.

Mr. KRIKRIS said that KOFFS is no longer employed with the Eagles Nest, having left to take another job, where he allegedly made more money. He said that he could personally verify that KOFFS worked from 9 AM until 6 PM on April 4, 1968.

In view of the fact that KING was Killed at Memphis, Tennessee, at 6:03 PM on April 4, 1968, investigation of this instant matter was discontinued.

photographs, which she stated were taken approximately ten minutes prior to the funeral procession passing the point in the photograph. Mrs. GUY pointed out one individual whom she believed may be identified as ERIK STARVO GALT. She also had blown-up shots of this individual.

Mrs. GUY's attorney was of the opinion that the individual mentioned by GUY was a much younger man than GALT. SAS JOHN J. CREAMER and JOHN BLAZEK observed these photographs and determined they did not resemble GALT's photograph as it appears on the wanted poster. Mrs. GUY advised that she did not wish to release her photographs, but stated they would be available in the future if a better likeness was obtained and appears to be the same as the individual in her picture.

WFO is taking no further action concerning photographs taken by Mrs. GUY of the unidentified individual, UACB.

Galt Had Money While in Birmingham

BIRMINGHAM, Ala., April 20 -The man whom the Federal Burgau of ivenstigation has accessed of conspiracy in the muder of the Rev. Dr. Martin Luder King Jr., seemed well supplied with money when he lived in Birmingham last fall creating a fictitious identity.

Agents have found that he spent more than \$4,000, but the have been unable to find where he worked during that period, or whether he worked at \$1.

The F.B.I. has said that the man named in their warrant as Erie Stravo Galt in actuality was a habitual criminal, James Ean Ray, who escaped from the Misouri State Penitentiary in April of 1967 where he had been since 1960 after being caught in a \$120 grocery store

Constantly in Trouble, Often Because of Drunkenness. Ray Left Trail of Violence

James Earl Ray, the man suspected of killing the Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr., was described yesterday as a drunk-en drifter, prone to thievery and violence, a failure at everything.

Ray was born

in Alton, Ill., a manurac-turing town of 43,000 persons along the Mississippi River 20 miles north of St. Louis.

His father, James Ray, was born in Carthage, Ill., and worked mainly as a laborer. His mother, the former Lucie Maher, was born in Alton. Both parents are dead.

Records of Madison County show that James Earl Ray was one of several Rays, believed to be either brothers or other relatives, who constantly caused trouble.

Oldest of 3 Brothers

The oldest of three brothers,

he grew up in Alton and Quincy, Ill., and left school in the 10th grade.

"I just didn't want to go any more;" But tolk probation officer in Lorangeles years later.

two years, mostly in Germany, as an infantryman and military policeman. He was given a general discharge in December, 1948, because of "ineptness and lack of adaptibility to military

Losses His Job

Ray was no more able to adapt to civilian life. After five nonths, he took a job operating a rubber mold in the Dryden Rubber Company in Chicago for

A 1947 Mercury he had bought in St. Louis was repossessed and a bank account in Alton of more than \$1,000 was used up by June of 1949.

Ray then moved on to Los Angeles, and on Oct. 4, 1949, Ray, then 21 years old, was surprised in the office of Forum Cafe by the assistant manager. A typerwriter had been placed on the fire escape.

on the fire escape.

He dashed away, but in trying to elude a parking attendant, he dropped his identification. Several days later he was seen in the same area by the cafe manager and arrested.

He was conviced on one count of second-degree burglary and septenced to eight months.

and sentenced to eight months in the County Jail, but the term was suspended on the condition that Ray spend at least 90 days in jail and stay away from alcohol.

'I Had Some Beers'

He told a probation officer that he had not entered the Forum Cafe to commit a crime. He said he knew nothing about the typewriter or about why he had been arrested.
Asked why he had entered

the building he said:
"I guess I had some beers or

something.

Ray told the officer that several times in Illinois he had tried to enter houses after drinking too much, but never knew what doing.
Ray then returned to Chi-

cago, where he worked as a laborer at a publishing com-pany. On May 6, 1952, ne en-tered a taxi and after several blocks put a gun against the driver's head and fled with \$11.

A passerby gave chase, but Ray seemed to be escaping. Then he ducked into an alley, which proved to be a dead end. He tried to climb a wall but

was shot by the police. Robert Everhart, the man who chased Ray, recalled yes-terday that Ray had said when he was captured, "What the hell are you getting out of this?"

Ray was sentenced to one to two years and released from the State Reformatory in Pon-tiac, Ill., on March 12, 1954, He also semed time in Joliet, Ill., before next appearing in Kan-

sas City, Mo., where he was convicted in 1955 of cashing forged money orders.

Arrested Again
After three more years in season Ray moved to St. tours, where he lived in a dilapidated boarding house in the once fashionable Lafayette Park area. He was arrested in his 10-by-10-foot room in 1850 after a grocery store hold-up.

The armed robbery conviction carried a 20-year sentence. He was also facing charges for robbery and auto theft at the time, and the jury deliberated just 20 minutes.

As he was led away from court Ray tried to escape by jumping into an elevator, but he was recaptured and sent to the Missouri State Penitentiary. Twice he tried to escape, the second time by hiding in a ventilator shaft.

He was confined for a time in the maximum security ward at the state hospital in Fulton, Mo., but was back at the pententiary last year when he finally succeeded in escaping by hiding under a batch of bread.

Ray's travel since his escape

are uncertain.
Harold Swenson, the Missouri prison's warden, said yes-terday that Ray's stay at the hospital for mental observation had turned up no personality problems not common to confined men.



WITNESSES DIFFER

Three Earlier Descriptions of Suspect Vary Widely

BIRMINGHAM, Ala., April 19-The descriptions given the police and the F.B.I. of the assassin of the Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. have varied so widely it appears that as many as four men may have been

under suspicion.

A source in the Justice Department said that credible witnesses in Memphis and in Brimingham who saw Eric Starvo Galt, now identified as James Earl Ray, the accused murderer of Dr. King, seemed to be describing different men.

This, observers believe, is why the Federal Bureau of Investigation changed its view and decided that death of the

civil rights leader may have resulted from a conspiracy. Shortly after the murder, At-torney General Ramsey Clark said that there was no evidence

of a conspiracy.

Before the bulletin on Ray, there were at least three separate descriptions from witnesses who had known a Galt in the last six months.

Galt had been described as follows:

¶A long-nosed man in his late 20's who was seen in a Memphis rooming house from which the shot was fired that

which the salt was fired that killed Dr. King April 4.

¶A 30-year-old quiet-spoken man who talked about the weather at a Birmingham room-

ing house last fall.

¶A 36-year-old "avid dancer" who bought a rifle in Birming-ham and who took dancing lessons in New Orleans at the time James Earl Ray was imprisoned in Missouri.

Ray Is Described

James Earl Ray, a five-time convict, was described by the F.B.I. as being 40 years old, 5 feet 10 inches tall, 163 to 174 pounds, with blue eyes and brown hair. He has a scar in the center of his forehead and on the palm of his right hand.

The witnesses who saw a Galt at a Memphis rooming house the day Dr. King was slain salt that he was 5 feet 11 inches on feet tall, slender,

The highest estimate of his age The highest estimate of his age was 32 years, the lowest 26. He was said to have a long pointed nose and a Southern accent.

At a Birmingham rooming house where a Galt lived for six weeks last fall, he was described as being 5 feet 10 inches tall, 175 pounds, with brown hair and a slightly Southern accent. He was described as being about 30 years old.

The first F.B.I. description of Galt, which came principally from a gun dealer in Birming-ham, from whom a Galt bought Memphis, from whom he bought a pair of binoculars, was not precise.

The description, which was released Wednesday night, said that Galt was between 5 feet 8 inches and 5 feet 11 inches tall, weighed 160 to 175 pounds, was of medium build, and had brown hair and blue

A 'Rural' Accent

His birth date was given as a date that the bureau apparently got from an application that a Galt had made for an Alabama driver's license. The bureau said that Galt's voice had a "rural" accent.

Newsmen showed copies of picture released Wednesday of Galt to the people who had seen him in Birmingham and in Memphis.

Almost every witness said that the picture did not resemble Galt.

Two developments tended to bolster the speculation that more than one man used the name Eric Starvo Galt.

On March 1, 1968, an Eric Galt telephoned the Alabama Highway Patrol to ask for a duplicate copy of the driver's license he got in September of 1967. The copy was mailed to a Birmingham address and a bill for 25 cents that was enclosed with the duplicate was returned to Montgomery on March 6 with the 25 cents.

The F.B.I. had said that Galt had been in California during this time.

In its bulletin describing Galt as an avid dancer, the F.B.I. said that he had taken dancing lessons in New Orleans in 1964 and 1965.

Today's bulletin said that Gatt, under the name James Earl Ray, had been in prison in Missouri from 1960 until he escaped in April, 1967.

No Mention of Brother was "on the run" many miles from Memphis with F. B. I agents close behind him.

It did not mention Galt's "alleged brother," who the authorities stated that Ray's grandmother, Mrs. Mary Maher, conspiracy with Galt in Birmingham on March 29, 1968, to deprise Dr. King of his civil rights.

Fingerprints can be matched quickly by an elaborate classification and filing system when the full 10 prints of the person to be identified are available and it is known which finger and hand each prints represents.

But when only a few prints are available and it is not known which fingers or thumbs made them, they can be checked only by comparing each latent print with all 10 prints on the card of each wanted person.

This can be a monumental task, since the bureau's wanted list includes a cumulative file of all tersons who have been reported as fugitives by the local police forces around the country and who have not yet been caught,

Latent fingerprints are not readliy apparent and are discovered only by careful search and sometimes chemical development. There was no indication by the authorities where these prints were found.

Ray was said to have used the names of James McBride, James Walton, W. C. Herron and James O'Connor during his criminal career. When the F.B.I. filed formal charges against Galt on Wednesday, it gave two other allases, John Willard and Harvey Lownyer.

The identification of Galt as the escaped convict explains some of the circumstances that led to speculation Galt might have established a false identity in contemplating the as-assassination of Dr. King.

On Wednesday a fugitive warrant was obtained by the bureau accusing Galt of having conspired with a person "whom he alleged to be his brother" to injure Dr. King and violate his civil rights.

Dr. King was killed by a sniper on April 4 as the civil rights leader stood on the balcony of the Lorraine Motel in Memphis. The Tennessee au-

Bureau spokesmen declined to say whether Ray had a brother or to comment on reports that the bureau had the "brother" in custody.

What Is a Conspiracy? A.24

The most troubling aspect of the charge laid by the Federal Government against the suspected murderer of Dr. Martin Luther King is that it is drawn in terms of a conspiracy. To the non-lawyer, a conspiracy means a plot hatched by many men, worked out in great detail, and executed with precision. This meaning may attach particularly to that word's use in the King case because of the charge by Negro extremists that white America conspired to kill Dr. King. But the legal meaning of a charge of conspiracy, and the reason such a charge is used in cases like this one, are often quite different from the image the word conspiracy is likely to raise.

In legal terms, a plot laid by two men to commit a crime is just as much a conspiracy as a plot hatched by two hundred. So far, no information has been released that indicates this conspiracy against Dr. King involved more than two men—one of them allegedly Eric Starvo Galt and the other a man described as one the accused said was his brother. If that is the extent of any conspiracy, it is a far cry from the kind of conspiracy the extremists have been shouting about.

More importantly, however, the Justice Department may or may not think it has a valid conspiracy charge in the works when it uses that charge in this kind of case. There is probably no Federal charge other than conspiracy that can be laid against the killer of Dr. King. A murder charge

can be filed only by a state, not by the Federal Government. In several civil rights cases in the past, the Government has used the conspiracy charge as a way of keeping full control of the investigation and of bringing its full resources into play. A few years ago, for example, a conspiracy charge was filed in the murder of Medgar Evers, but once the suspect was arrested the conspiracy charge was dropped and no evidence was ever presented to indicate that more than one man participated in that murder. The only other handle the Federal Government has in cases like this is to turn its evidence over to state officials, let them obtain a murder warrant and then ask the FBI to pursue the man as a fugitive. And the FBI is always reluctant to let go of its evidence until a case is sewed up.

It may, of course, turn out that two or more persons were involved in planning the murder of Dr. King. But, on the basis of the information released so far and on the kind of charge placed against Eric Galt, it is presumptuous to leap to such a conclusion.
