Miss MILLER saw a poster with photographs of JAMES EARL RAY and noted a resemblance of the 1960 photograph to a man with whom she had the following dealings:

Miss MILLER put an ad in the Classified Sections of the Sunday Star and Washington Post advertising a sofa for sale for \$175.00. She believed that the ad appeared in the April 7 or 14th issues. On a Wednesday night after the ad appeared she received a telephone call from a man asking about the sofa. It was late, 11:30 p.m., and the man said he would come to see the sofa the next evening.

He came to Miss MILLER's residence in a station wagon with a male companion and bought the sofa. He paid for the sofa with a check drawn on the Suburban Trust Company, Hyattsville, Maryland. The names DAVID and LALAH COOPERMAN, Account # was printed on the check, but no address was listed. The purchaser of the sofa wrote the following addresses and telephone number on the check and signed it "DAVID COOPERMAN".

Telephone # 526-4042 (Miss MILLER learned from the Telephone Company that his phone is subscribed to by a person named PORTER, 1915 Otis St., N.E., WDC.) She has been unable to reach this person by phone.

Re the purchaser: Miss MILLER described him as about age 37, 5'10", slender build, sandy blonde hair, eye color not known, just a trace of Southern accent. She did not know the make of station wagon, thought it was late model, license number unknown, light colored with wood tone trim. The companion of the purchaser is described as early twenties, "cute, slim, blonde". No names were exchanged between the two men.

The check was returned with a note "Non sufficient funds" and was dated 4/26/68.

Miss MILLER said that last Sunday, 5/5/68, she drove out to the residence of DAVID and LALAH COOPERMAN and spoke to them. They knew nothing about the transaction, but stated that there checkbook had been lost about two months previously and that they had learned that someone had purchased a refrigerator using one of their checks.

Miss MILLER stated that she has the check for the sofa in her possession and can be reached at her home phone or at the Fairfax Recreation Department.

Richmond should show additional photographs of RAY to Miss MILLER for possible identification .

Baltimore should determine possible ITSP violations.

Mrs. SHIRK advised that she has not seen this individual since and was not positive how strong a resemblance the individual had to RAY since she passed him rather quickly.

INFORMATION CONCERNING

On May 23, 1968, a confidential source advised the Cleveland Office of the Federal Bureau of Investigation that his wife had recently returned from Miami, Florida, where she had worked in a bar. During her stay in Miami she met a man named Roland (last name unknown), who stated he was a Ku Klux Klan Grand Dragon and who drove a white Mustang. Roland stated to her after King's death that he had knowledge of it. and that Adam Clayton Powell, Stokely Carmichael, and H. Rap Brown were also scheduled for assassination and that "we will take care of Bobby Kennedy so he will never become president."

Roland reportedly carries weapons in his car and is accompanied by a large, vicious Doberman pinscher dog.

Roland was identified by the Miami Office of the FBI as Roland Chesley Talbott, Jr. Talbott operates a white Mustang and breeds Doberman pinscher dogs. He is a former member of Klavern #6, United Klans of America, Inc., Knights of the Ku Klux Klan, Ft. Lauderdale, Florida, and last attended a meeting of Klavern #6 on September 11, 1967.

A characterization of the United Klans of America, Inc., Knights of the Ku Klux Klan, is contained in the appendix section of this memorandum.

Talbott was interviewed on May 24, 1968, at his place of employment, McGahey Chrysler-Plymouth, 1930 N. E. 2nd Avenue, Miami, Florida. He stated he has been "shooting his mouth off" sympathizing with individuals responsible for or connected with the shooting of Martin Luther King, Jr. ever since April 4, 1968.

Talbott further stated that he is of the opinion that Adam Clayton Powell, H. Rap Brown, and Stokely Carmichael should also be assassinated and that Bobby Kennedy should be stopped by non-violent means so he can never become president. Talbott believes Kennedy is responsible for all the current racial unrest in this country.

Talbott advised that he believes in the supremacy of the white race and stated that he is a former Klansman. Talbott stated even though he makes many controversial statements, he has no intention of perpetrating any such act such as shooting a Negro or political leader and is not acquainted with anyone who would do so.

Talbott advised that on occasion he carries firearms in his automobile but not for the purpose of shooting anyone.

The employment records of McGahey Chrysler-Plymouth were reviewed with reference to Roland Talbott and these records indicate that Talbott was at work at McGahey, Miami, Florida, on April 4, 1968.

UNITED KLANS OF AMERICA, INC. KNIGHTS OF THE KU KLUX KLAN

Records of Superior Court of Fulton County, Georgia, reflect that this Klan organization was granted a corporate charter on February 21, 1961, at Atlanta, Georgia, under the name United Klans, Knights of the Ku Klux Klan of America, Inc.

A source advised on Fe bruary 27, 1961, that United Klans was formed as a result of a split in U. S. Klans, Knights of the Ku Klux Klan, Inc. According to the source, the split resulted from a leadership dispute and United Klans has the same aims and objectives as the parent group. These are the promotion of Americanism, white supremacy, and segregation of the races.

The first source and a second source advised on July, 1961, that United Klans, Knights of the Ku Klux Klan of America, Inc., merged with Alabama Knights, Knights of the Ku Klux Klan. The merged organization established headquarters in Suite 401, Alston Building, Tuscaloosa, Alabama. (The organization is directed by ROBERT SHELTON, Imperial Wizard, and is the dominant Klan group in the South, with units in several southern states.)

Second source advised that at a meeting in Prattville, Alabama, on October 22, 1961, the W. S. Klans, Knights of the Ku Klux Klan, merged with the United Klans of America, Inc., Knights of the Ku Klux Klan.

Third source advised on May 25, 1966, that the UKA is currently an active organization, with Klaverns in several states. This source said that ROBERT M. SHELTON is the Imperial Wizard of this organization and was elected to this position on September 5, 1964, at a National Klonvocation in Birmingham, Alabama. Source stated that during April, 1966, the National office was moved from Suite 401, Alston Building, Tuscaloosa, Alabama, to the carport of SHELTON's residence, #18 Lake Sherwood, Star Route, Northport, Alabama, which space he had converted into a room.

Trail of King's Killer Leading to Dead End

The disappearance of the slayer of Dr. Martin Luther King becomes more eerie and revolting with every passing

The FBI has not come up with a single meaningful trace of James Earl Ray, the number one suspect, since I revealed 21 days ago that the investigation had taken on international implications.

Even with \$100,000 or so of reward money lying around, the FBI hasn't so much as a hot tip or a rumor worth pursuing with hope.

In my earlier column, I deliberately did not reveal that a massive dragnet had been set up in Mexico. It was there that Ray had met with some characters who led FBI and other intelligence agents to suspect involvement of a foreign power. But investigators did not want the suspect tipped off as to the intensity of the search south of the border.

But it has revealed nothing. "We've covered Mexico, Canada, and the United States like a blanket," one high-level source tells me. "If Ray were alive in any of these places, I ing him by now."

Thus, the men who were clinging doggedly to the theory that King's killer was a berserk loner have now swung over to the belief that a hired killer planned the murder and the escape meticulously. But was it Ray-or were the seemingly clumsy clues left behind just decoys? And who did the hiring?

The truth is that the FBI has not located a single trace of Ray since he supposedly abandoned his white Mustang in Atlanta on April 5, the day after the Nobel Prize-winning Negro clergyman was slain in a Memphis, Tenn., motel. In fact, the FBI does not really have solid evidence that it was Ray who abandoned the car in Atlanta.

But the massive investigation has turned up more information about Ray and his family. The most significantand most galling in some Washington circles — is that Ray was peddling dope while in prison in Missouri State Penitentary from 1960 to April

As the magnitude of Ray's

can't conceive of our not locat- narcotics peddling has been revealed, top law enforcement officers here have stared aghast at the evidence that guards in most prisons are so easily bribed into sending almost anything into or out of a prison.

> Some investigators have concluded that our penal system is rotten to the core, and they have sent screams to the top of our government that it is high time someone planned a complete overhaul.

A serious question arises now as to how long the FBI can, or will, continue a con-centrated search for Dr. King's killer. Already, student turmoil on scores of campuses has dictated the shifting of considerable manpower to the watching of these activities.

There are some worrisome connections between rioters on the various campuses. For example, one of the leaders of the Columbia University demonstrations recently showed up at American University here, trying to agitate students into putting some "muscle" into their protest.

So this confluence of do-

mands on the time of the agents has led even some FBI personnel to echo earlier pessimistic predictions that "they'll never catch Dr. King's killer."



POSSIBLE LOOK-A-LIKE OF JAMES EARL RAY AT SHOREHAM HOTEL, WDC, ON 6/1/68.

On 6/1/68, at about 4:45 p.m., Detective CHASE, Intelligence Division, Metropolitan Police Department, Washington, D. C., telephonically advised SA ALLAN M. POWER that STEVE ISAACS, City Editor, "The Washington Post," reported a female reporter covered a meeting that date where RALPH ABERNATHY for the Poor People's Campaign was supposed to speak. For some reason, ABERNATHY was replaced by ANDY YOUNG. The female reporter mentioned to ISAACS that a "red neck" in the crowd closely resembled JAMES EARL RAY. This reporter noted the "red neck" left abruptly when it was learned ABERNATHY would not speak. ISAACS indicated another reporter covering this meeting also thought the "red neck" resembled RAY.

At 5:03 p.m. on 6/1/68, Mr. STEPHEN ISAACS, City Editor, "The Washington Post", advised SA ROBERT W. DAWSON that reporter CAROL HONSA (Mrs. CARL BERNSTEIN) covered a

conference of the Capital Trust Club at the Shoreham Hotel this date, and that at about 10:30 a.m. she saw a white man, who was wearing no socks, that she believed to look like an old photograph of JAMES EARL RAY and like the artist's sketch which appeared in the "Commercial Appeal," a Memphis, Tennessee, newspaper. She said that LARRY STILL, who was formerly a reporter for "The Evening Star," a Washington, D. C., newspaper, had also seen this individual.

On 6/1/68, CAROL HONSA, City Editor, "The Washington Post." whose married name is Mrs. CARL BERNSTEIN, advised that she was assigned to cover the Capital Press Club, Washington, D. C., conference at the Shoreham Hotel concerning the urban She said that she arrived at the Palladium Room of crisis. that hotel at about 10:45 a.m., at which time a conference concerning religion and the ghetto was just ending. She observed a young white man sitting in the rear of the room studying the program of the conference. This individual did not appear to be listening to the proceedings, and he was not observed to talk to anyone. HONSA stated that because of his dress he appeared out of place; and she was suspicious of him. that most persons were dressed in business clothing, but this individual wore a sport shirt, open at the neck, possibly beige or dirty white, a long sleeve rust colored cardigan sweater, dark trousers, possibly gray, and black shoes with no socks. She said that she had never seen this individual attending any meeting of this type on previous occasions. HONSA stated that this individual appeared to be waiting for the next sermon of the conference, which concerned civil rights organizations and the ghetto; Rev. RALPH ABERNATHY, President of the Southern Christain Leadership Conference, was scheduled to speak.

HONSA stated that after a coffee break, about 11:00 a.m., speakers for the conference were introduced; and at this time the above mentioned individual was standing at the rear of the

room near a steel service door. He appeared to be confused, and shortly after the speakers were announced, he left the room by the steel service door. She said that she did not know why he was standing, as there were plenty of seats with only about 70 - 75 people present at the meeting. About 10 minutes later he re-entered the room but left again almost immediately.

HONSA stated that because of this man's appearance and actions, she was suspicious of him; and when he left immediately after it was learned that Rev. RALPH ABERNATHY would not be a speaker, she suspected he might be there to cause some harm to ABERNATHY. She said that she spoke to LAWRENCE STILL, President of the Capital Trust Club, about this individual; and at the time she talked to STILL, AL SWEENEY was present.

HONSA stated that she had never seen this individual before or since he left the meeting, and that she could furnish no information to identify him. She suggested that he might be known to STILL or SWEENEY.

HONSA commented that her husband considers her an "alarmist".

HONSA advised that as she returned to the Washington Post offices around 4:00 p.m., she was thinking about this individual and about the possibility of ABERNATHY being assinated as KING was; and at this time she thought about this individual possibly looking like JAMES EARL RAY. Upon arriving at the newspaper offices, she had the photographs of RAY obtained from the newspaper morque and reviewed them. She stated that the individual she had seen somewhat resembled the 1966 Missourt State Penitentiary photograph of RAY and the "Commercial Appeals" artist's sketch.

HONSA described the individual she had seen as a white male, approximately 30 - 35 years of age, 6 feet tall, slender build, 160 - 180 pounds, thin face, light brown cropped hair with side burns to the middle of the ears, fair complexion which was slightly pink as though sun burned or wind burned. She said the individual reminded her of a "red neck".

At approximately 7:00 p.m. on 6/1/68, SA DAWSON was unable to find any individual in the lobby of the Shoreham Hotel fitting the description as furnished by HONSA.

On 6/2/68, Mr. LAWRENCE STILL, 5704 New Hampshire Avenue, N. E., advised SA DAWSON that he did not see the individual that HONSA had spoken to him about. He said that he may have seen the individual, but did not recall him. STILL stated that he did not have any recollection of seeing anyone at the meeting mentioned by HONSA that looked like RAY STILL stated that he would immediately report any such thing to authorities. STILL advised that ALFRED L. SWEENEY, who is Chairman of the conference, Telephone 593-5023, could possibly furnish additional information.

On 6/2/68, Mr. SWEENEY, who resides at 1105 Lamberton Court, Silver Spring, Md., advised that he had seen the individual pointed out by CAROL HONSA, and that he had not been disturbed by this person present at the above mentioned conference. He said that his first thoughts were that the person was a worker at the hotel, but he had no information in this connection. He said that he had no way of identifying the individual. Mr. SWEENEY stated that he has seen photographs of JAMES EARL RAY and he does not consider the individual mentioned by HONSA to at all resemble RAY. SWEENEY further stated that because of his interest in civil rights and the urban crisis, he would be the first to notify authorities in the event he saw an individual he believed to resemble RAY.

In view of no identifying information being obtained by HONSA, and since other individuals do not believe the individual resembled JAMES EARL RAY, WFO is taking no further action in this matter.
