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





The following information has been supplied by confidential sources of this Bureau who have furnished reliable information in the past.

Recently, Stanley Levison and Clarence Jones were in conference. Both men are advisors to Martin Luther King, Jr., President of the Southern Christian Leadership Conference. At this meeting, they discussed King's massive civil disobedience campaign called the "Washington Spring Project" and the issues King should raise during the demonstrations.

Jones informed Levison that Harry Wachtel, another advisor to King, had drafted some material in this regard which calls for full employment, a guaranteed wage, and a guaranteed annual income. Also, the Reverend Frederick Kirkpatrick, a coordinator in the New York area for ding's project, had furnished Jones with a pamphlet entitled "Declaration of Principle on the Larch in April." Jones commented that this item was three to four pages in length and was being distributed under the auspices of the "Committee of National Negro Churchmen."

Levison rentioned to Jones that he had sent out a mailing to 80,000 individuals, who have contributed to hing's organization in the past two years, soliciting funds. Levison remarked that the returns are running ahead of last year's response with \$15,000 being received in one day. Levison advised this letter soliciting funds was

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carefully written to conter on the Washington Spring Project's and to explain the rationale for it. Decruse of the success of this letter, Levison advised he will send it to 250,000 more people in the middle-class income group.

A fourth source adviced in April, 1964, that Stanley Levison was a secret member of the Communist Party, USA, in July, 1963.

In March, 1944, a sixth source advised the name Harry Wachtel was on the list of names, significance not known, which was maintained at the headquarters of Kings County Communist Party, Brooklyn, New York. The same source advised at the same time that the name and address of Leonora Wachtel, wife of Harry, were on a list of names of newly elected officers of the Bath Beach Club of the kings County Communist Party.

Levison also told Jones that things are going well in the mobilization for the project and King informed him that people from Alabama and Mississippi are "just raring to go."

OBSERVATIONS:

On February 28, 1968, a WFO informant informed us that Bernard Lafayette, project Director for SCLC, had informed him King's organization is experiencing difficulty with recruiting demonstrators for the "Washington Spring Project." Because of this, the demonstrations would not start the first week of April as originally planned.

Another WFO informant learned from Lafayette's assistant, Anthony Henry, that a secret meeting had been held by King's group and they had set April 27, 1968, as the date for the project to start. Henry indicated this date can be moved up or back depending on future developments.

It is felt that the President would be interested in receiving information showing the communist help King is receiving in his proposed "Washington Spring Project."

RECOMMENDATION:



He had before him our memorandum of October 7, 1963, requesting authority for technical surveillances on Martin Luther King at his residence at Atlanta and at the office of the Southern Christian Leadership Conference of which he is president, at New York City. The Attorney General said that he recognized the importance of this coverage if substantial information is to be developed concerning the relationship between King and the Communist Party. He said there was no question in his mind as to the coverage in New York City but that he was worried about the security of an installation covering a residence in Atlanta. Georgia. He noted that the last thing we could afford to have would be a discovery of a wire tap on King's residence. I pointed out to the Attorney General the fact that a residence was involved did not necessarily mean there was any added risk because of the technical nature of the telephone system. He was informed that the Bureau had had years of experience in this field and that we continually reviewed our procedures to insure that every measure possible to secure such installations was taken. It was nevertheless noted that of necessity we had to deal with established contacts in the telephone company to get the necessary leased lines, but once again we had procedures which minimized the risks to the nth degree. After this discussion the Attorney General said he felt we should go ahead with the technical coverage on King on a trial basis, and to continue it if productive results were forthcoming. He said he was certain that all Bureau representatives involved would recognize the delicacy of this particular matter and would thus be even more cautious than ever in this 312 46.5 125% assignment. The following is a brief summary of information in this Dureau's files concerning Abner V. Berry, Aubrey Williams and Myles Horton:

Winston Barry, & Mogro, was born on Hardoines the Communist Party 1929, and from 1939 to 1950ahs hely high-level positions Within the Party. He resides in Newark, New Jersey, and is currently employed as an editor by the Antara Indonesian Move Agency, with offices in the United Nations Building, New York City. This agency publishes a daily bulletin which has been described as an Indonesian propaganda outlet owned and operated by the Government of Indonesia; however, investigation indicates it actually appears to be a privately owned firm with no subsidization by the Indonesian Covernment. Upon being interviewed on three occasions by Special Agents of the FBI, 2 Berry has refused to cooperate, indicating that he had severed his connections with the Communist Party because it became a futile organization.

🐎 Aubrey Willis Williams is Chairman of the Hatlonal Committee to Abolish the House Un-American, Adtivities Committee; cited as an organization set up to lead against the Communist Party's "operation abolition" campaign. This committee was organized by Williams and Frank Wilkinson, on individual with a known and admitted past Communist Partial Libership. years Williams has spoken before, and supported, a number of left-wing and communist-led groups, although he has publicly,

and in appearances before Senate investigating committees. disclaimed any connection with, or knowledge of, the Communist Party. We has worked energetically to discredit the FBI and the Pirector. As of July, 1931, Williams was President and a member of the Board of Directors of the Southern Conference Educational Fund, Incorporated, previously known as the Southorn Conference for Human Welfare, cited as a communist front. A listing of the officers of the Southern Conference Educational Fund dated in January, 1963, indicates Williams is now president emeritus of this organization. According to a confidential informant, in June of 1955, during the time the Southern Conference for Human Welfare was in existence. Communist Party members were affiliated with it and worked actively in it. Since the formation of the Southern Conference Educational Fund, rank and file Party members have not been encouraged to work in it; however, certain Party members in the New Orleans area had been assigned to participate in the organization to further communist principles.

On June 29, 1983, Myles Borton identified himself to the FDI as Director of the Highlander, Research and Education Contor of Knoxville, Tonnessee. This is the successor to the Highlander Folk School, originally at Montcagle, Tennossee, of which Norton was also the director. The latter school was supported primarily by donations from individuals and labor unions and it offered courses of instruction in labor organization, social economics and the general field of labor education. It was known to have Communist Party members on its starf and it followed the practice of securing communists as students. However, according to information received, it was never known to have offered courses of instructions in communism, nor was the Party known to have succeeded in gaining control of the school. There were many allegations that it represented the headquarters for communism in eastern Tennessee; however, these claims were never substantated. The Tennessee Courts revoked the Mighlander Folk School's charter on the grounds that it violated the criminal laws of the state. A state charter for the Knoxville school was issued on August 23, 1931.

On April 21, 1942, a confidential informant advised that Myles Morton was a speaker before the Southern Conference for Muman Welfare. On April 19, 1949, Paul Crouch, a self-admitted former Communist Party member, described Morton as

a left-wing socialist who was always close to the Communist Party, meeting with officials and representatives to discuss policy and procedure during the period from 1930 to 1941. This informant also described Horton's wife, Zylphia, as being even closer to the Party in 1941. Another confidential informant advised this Eureau in 1950 that Horton continued to follow the Communist Party line during the period 1947 to 1950 and that he associated with known Party members. This informant doubted that Horton was actually a Communist Party member. In 1950 and 1951 a third confidential informant, who is a former member of the Party, advised that Horton was, not a member even though he had close association with Party members. He stated Horton had been criticized by the Party members as an opportunist who used the Party for his own purposes.

Horton was reported to be listed as one of the speakers for a "Bill of Rights Dinner" which was to be sponsored by the Emergency Civil Liberties Committee on December 15, 1959.
